The first newsletter came out in September 1989.

Our second convention was held at Howard Johnson, Lenexa, Kansas. The third convention was held at Knights Inn Marietta, Ohio. The fourth convention was held at the Ramada Inn Joplin, Missouri.

Next year will be our fifth convention. Our goal is to bring people together who enjoy the same glass we do, so we can meet and see each others glass. We want to have fun and not be tied down by so many rules that take the fun out of the club like we've seen happen to other clubs.

It was a big undertaking to start a club. It has been a rewarding experience, meeting a lot of super nice people either over the phone or in person, I'm sure Annetta will agree with me.
