

FARMYARD MOLDS

The Farmyard pattern is a very interesting and pretty piece of glass, one of the most detailed inside and outside. The interior pattern has two hens and one rooster. The exterior pattern is the jeweled heart pattern. These two patterns together makes a beautiful piece of glass.

This mold was made for Richard Stone of Columbus, Ohio. The glass was made by Fenton Glass Company of Williamstown, West Virginia.

There were two items made in two different colors for the Stones. One was the Orange or Red/Amberina made in bowl and chop plate, and the other color was Amethyst, also made in the bowl and chop plate. All their glass was signed on the bottom MIMI, this was Mrs. Stone's name and the company that marketed them. This was not the original Farmyard mold that the old bowl was made from.

The Stones did not get to enjoy their glass. They had an automobile wreck and Mr. Stone was killed and a few weeks later Mrs. Stone died of pneumonia. An unknown person acquired this mold a few years later and had the bowl pressed in Cobalt Blue carnival, it also has the MIMI logo on it. This bowl is scare as there were not many made. It does not have the same ruffle as the Stone's bowl does. I believe this was made by Mosser Glass Company of Cambridge, Ohio.

Singleton Bailey of Loris, South Carolina now owns the mold and changed the MIMI to DSB, this is his initials. He had several pieces made from this mold by Fenton Art

Glass Company. They are always very limited in small numbers. The following are the colors and items he has had made with the Farmyard pattern.
