The above legend is embossed on the back of each plate. The figure is that of the old glassworker depicted in the Fenton Trademark. Each commemorative plate is packed with an attractively finished American made plate rack. This carnival glass collector's plate will be made only in 1970.




This collector's grouping of "Carnival Glass" was created from the original formula that Fenton used in 1907 when we introduced this unique hand glass treatment to the American public.

From 1907 until 1920, Iridescent Glass, the original name for Carnival Glass, was the Company's major product. Several different colors with their changing hues were created by spraying secret mixtures of metallic salts on various colors of hot glass. The most popular color proved to be the blue-green treatment reproduced on this piece.

Carnival Glass authorities have acclaimed Fenton's reproduction of this treatment as the closest thing to the antique Iridescent formula ever produced. Each piece of Carnival Glass bears the Fenton hallmark and will have a descriptive tag attached.

Original Formula Carnival Glass

Just a year ago we decided to try a small grouping of ten items in our old Iridescent formula that Fenton was first to introduce in the early 1900's. The retail response to this treatment has been amazing. In fact, we have had to significantly increase our production capability to meet the Carnival demand. There are now 35 items to start off our second year. Many of these pieces are made from the same moulds that were used more than 60 years ago. Others are authentic antique reproduction and a few are simply items that we feel lend themselves so well to the Carnival treatment.


















The First in Fenton's Mother's Day Plate Series


An Annual Series of Collector's Plates by Fenton

On our first plate we commemorated the first glass craftsman of New America. The second plate is a tribute to the printer. The back of the plate reads as follows: With this handmade plate Fenton commemorates the earliest printer of Colonial America. This printing press was set up in Cambridge, Mass. by Stephen Daye in 1638. He printed the first book in English America, "The Bay Psalm Book"-1640.



This is No. 2 in a series of limited edition collector's plates commemorating Mother's Day. (Plate No. 1-1971-was ''Madonna With The Sleeping Child'' by Michelozzo.)

"Madonna Of The Goldfinch" was painted in 1760 by Giovanni Battista Tiepolo, considered by many to be the last great master of the Venetian School of Painting.

In ancient pictures, the bird held by the Christ child was symbolic of the soul, or the spiritual side of life, in contrast to life's material embodiment.

The goldfinch's fondness for feeding on thistles and thorns led to its identification with the Crown of Thorns placed on Christ's head. This is how this beautiful bird came to be an accepted symbol of the Passion of Christ, depicting the association between the Incarnation and the Passion.

The plate is available in three unique Fenton treatments: Carnival Glass, Satin finished Blue Marble and White Satin. After a limited production of the plate, January 1, 1972 to June 30, 1972, the moulds will be destroyed.







Original Formula Carnival Glass

These collector's pieces of "Carnival Glass" were created from the original formula that Fenton used in 1907 when we introduced this unique hand glass treatment to the American public.

In recent years antique Carnival Glass has become extremely valuable as one of the most collectible types of Larly American glassware.

Carnival Glass authorities have acclaimed Fenton's reproduction of this treatment as the closest thing to the antique Iridescent formula ever produced. Most people would be unable to distinguish the difference except for the Fenton hallmark which identifies each current piece.











This Limited Edition Collector's Plate is dated and the moulds will be destroyed on December 31, 1973.




The Gunsmith



"Madonna and Child with Pomegranate"

No. 7 in an Annual Collector's Series

The "Madonna' and Child With Pomegranate" is the creative work of Pompeo Girolamo Batoni, one of the last great exponents of classicism in painting. Born February 5, 1708, Batoni passed into history on February 4, 1787. The pomegranate was frequently used as a religious symbol. It is regarded as a symbol of deep religious hope. In Christian representations, the pomegranate is used as a symbol of the joy and love of the Church, "—because of the inner unity of countless seeds in one and the same fruit."



"THE POTTER"... This is No. 8 in a series of Annual Craftsman Plates made by hand in limited number in the finest tradition of Fenton Art Glass. These specially designed plates commemorate Early American Craftsmen and their role in the growth of America. Pottery is perhaps the second oldest surviving craft, next in age only to the making of weapons. Exactly who should be credited as the first colonial potter is uncertain, but Philip Drinker is thought to be the first American potter "of historical record". He came to Charlestown, Massachusetts in the year 1635. Some three hundred potters were located in New England alone before 1800. The early potters' work included architectural ceramics such as building brick, structural pipe and roof tile, in addition to household items like cups, earthen jugs, porringers, plates, jars and clay tobacco pipes.




