

EDUCATIONAL

MARILYN, A POPULAR MILLERSBURG PATTERN



This month we will discuss a tumbler that was produced by the Millersburg Glass Company of Millersburg, Ohio, a company that was in business for only a few very busy years. During this comparatively short life John & Robert Fenton, founders of the company, along with their artists and workers produced some of the finest and most sought after carnival glass pieces that we have today. While the "Marilyn" water set is cetainly not the most rare or the most sought after Millersburg pattern, it is one of the most well known and popular Millersburg pattern. Pieces of this excellent water set beautify a good many carnival glass collections across the nation.

Mrs. Marion Hartung, who gave this pattern its name, named it in honor of Marilyn Gaida of Victoria, Texas. Ed and Marilyn Gaida had helped her so much in bringing new or different patterns to her for addition to her pattern books that she felt she owed them something, so named this pattern in Mrs. Gaida's honor. Mrs. Hartung was so impressed with this pattern that she devoted two sketches and two full pages to this pattern. This pattern can be found in book six of her carnival glass series.

The accompaning photograph shows this tumbler in three colors, green, marigold and amethyst. These same three tumblers, from our collection, are shown in color in Bill Edwards book on Millersburg carnival glass. Comparatively speaking, it is not too hard to find a "Marilyn" tumbler in amethyst. Most tumbler collectors should be able to find this one for their collections. The marigold tumbler in this pattern is somewhat harder to find and I would class the green "Marilyn" tumbler as being rare. Mr. Owens, in his tumbler book states that the marigold is harder to find than the amethyst, but does not even mention it as being produced in green so he evidently had not seen one in green. Mrs. Collier once told me she had searched in vain for years to find just one green "Marilyn" tumbler. I could count on my fingers the number of green "Marilyn" tumblers I have seen. No doubt there are more than this number around, but comparatively speaking the green tumbler is by far the hardest to find in this particular pattern.

We are very proud of our "Marilyn" tumblers and it was a thrill indeed to find our green tumbler in a shop in Florida priced for less than an amethyst "Peacock at the Fountain" tumbler. I think the shop owner thought we were crazy for buying this tumbler and leaving the one that contained the (\underline{N}) .

The "Marilyn" tumblers averag about 4 1/8 inches tall. Some may be slightly taller or shorter. Some tumblers may be factory ground on the base in order for them to set level. The base diameter is 2 3/8 inches. The rim diameter can vary slightly but is usually 2 3/4 inches. A 36 point rayed star figure is pressed into the underside of the base.

The "Marilyn" tumbler is indeed a fantastic piece of carnival glass and should be in every tumbler collection. Millersburg also made other beautiful tumblers. Some, such as Gay Nineties, Multi Fruits and Flowers, Perfection, Hobnail and Morning Glory are much harder to find than the "Marilyn". Millersburg Diamond is probably the easiest one to find of the Millersburg tumblers. Millersburg Cherries,

sometimes called Hanging Cherries, and Feather and Heart are two other outstanding Millersburg tumbler patterns. We will discuss these fine Millersburg patterns in later issues of this series. "The Fluffy Bird Peacock", once thought by some to be Millersburg, has been proven beyond doubt to have been made by the Fenton Art Glass Company of Williamstown, "st V, rginia.

This is No. 8 of a series on Carnival glass tumblers. Next month we will feature what is probably the most famous tumbler in America, at least for the present time--- the "BUTTERFLY". It recently sold for a new record high price for a tumbler at Five Thousand Five Hundred dollars.

GRAPE & CABLE PUNCH CUP AND NAPPY: This is the most famous of all Carnival glass patterns. It was made by the Northwood Company in a wide range of items. The punch cup on the left goes with the punch set which was made in three different sizes and a host of colors. The so-called nappy on the right is from the same punch cup mold but has been shaped differently while still pliable. Some collectors feel this was designed as a hair pin receptable and so they use it as a part of the dresser set. Pictures from old trade catalogs have established, however, that it was not a part of the dresser set when originally issued.


