#### EDUCATIONAL

#### OCTAGON VARIENT-OCTAGON

This month we will feature one of Imperial's so called Near Cut disigns, or probably better described as an imitation cut glass pattern. Until now, we have presented rare or unlisted pattern tumblers. We thought perhaps we should include one or the more common patterns occasionally. This time we will bring you a tumbler that is in that catagory. Even so, some of the colors of the "Octagon Varient" are very hard to find as will be noted below.



From the above photograph you can see the difference between the "Octagon Varient", on the left, and the "Octagon". The "Octagon", on the right, is a short tumbler with no collar and has a ground base. The "Octagon Varient" on the other hand, has a distinct collar and is somewhat taller tumbler. Otherwise the pattern on the two tumblers are of the same design. The pitchers too, will show the same difference. The little "Octagon" tumbler is very easy to find and will usually be priced at around \$20 or less. I have seen the small "Octagon" tumbler only in marigold.



The "Octagon Varient" however, was made in a variety of colors. T' above photograph shows it in five different colors. Note t. It the number two and number four tumblers have been turned to show the opposite side of the tumblers. Starting on the left, we find it in the tru aqua color. The one shown here is the only one in this color that I have seen. This is a beautiful tumbler and is indeed rare in that color. We found this one in Ohio, not very far from the Imperial factory. Next comes the one in marigold. The vast majority of the tumblers made in this pattern are of the marigold color. In the center we show it in helios green. Since Imperial made a lot of carnival glass in this color, one would think there should be a great many of "Octagon Varient" tumblers in the helios green. This is not the case, however. In fact, I have seen only two of these tumblers in the green color. Next comes the dark purple. While these are not at all common, they can be found with a little searching. On the far right, we find one in the true smoke color. This is the only "Octagon Varient" tumbler I have seen in the smoke color I' came from the well known Preheim collection in California, a. is the exact tumbler shown in the Owens tumbler book. Needless to say, we are very proud of our five colors in this Imperial pattern. While this is a common pattern, tumblers in some carnival glass in the amber and clambroth colors, it is possible that an "Octagon Varient" tumbler could exist in those two

colors also. After all, we have a "Lustre Rose" tumbler in frosty white, as well as in the amber and clambroth colors.

We would like to point out here, and stress the fact, that you don't need to have the very rare tumblers to have a beautiful carnival glass tumbler collection. We have seen so very fine tumbler collections that did not contain any of the very rare tumblers. Such tumblers as Acorn Burrs, Blueberry, Blackberry Block, Diamond Lace, Windmill, Fentonia, Heavy Iris, and Grape Arbor, just to name a few, have tremendous beauty and are not real hard to find. While searching for some of these fine tumblers, it is also possible that you will find a rare one now and then. Ocasionally you will have the thrill of finding one at a very modest price. This is one of the things that makes carnival collecting so much fun. Tumblers do ofter a wide variety of patterns and colors, and at the same time do not take up a lot of space in which to display them.

This is no. 12 in a series on carnival glass tumblers. Next month we will feature one that was made in Australia and is called "Banded Diamonds". We will show you a picture of a complete water set in this rather interesting pattern, along with some information on Australian Carnival from Mrs. Murie Triplett of Australia.

## ORANGE TREE LOVING CUP IN AQUA OPAL

The Orange Tree loving cup is a beautiful piece of carnival glass. It is found in marigold, cobalt blue, amethyst, green, white and the one shown here in aqua opalescent. This is the only one that has been reported in this gorgeous color. It was found a few years back by Nancy Williams of Reading, Pennsylvania. Mr. & Mrs. Williams had it on display at several of the I.C.G.A. conventions. The opalescence is very fine, as well as the iridescence. It is truly an outstanding piece of carnival glass.

We are showing a picture of the piece for two reasons. First, it is extremely rare in aqua opalescent. Secondly, we are very proud that the loving cup will be our 1979 souvenir for H.O.A.C. G.A. It will be in the red color and will be made by the Fenton Art Glass Company. The Fenton Company also made the old pieces in this pattern. We are excited about our souvenir for next year.

The little carnival glass creamer shown here with the loving cup is the Estate pattern and is part of a breakfast sugar and creamer set. We took this picture at one of the I.C.G.A. conventions.
