THE FABULOUS MULTI FRUITS & FLOWERS



It is a little difficult for me to find enough adjectives to describe this exquisite and beautiful Millersburg tumbler. If they held beauty pageants among tumblers, I am sure this little jewel would win its share of awards. Among the tumblers in our collection, I choose the "Multi Fruits and Flowers" as my personal favorite. This does not mean that I would rate this tumbler ahead of the "Frolicking Bears" and the "Butterfly" tumblers. Certainly not, but I would rate it in the # 3 spot just behind them. And in all honesty, I personally think the "Multi Fruits and Flowers" is the most beautiful of the three.

I believe the nice people who own the two extremely rare tumblers above would agree with me on this point. But in all around tumbler rating, the great "Frolicking Bears" and "Butterfly" tumblers deserve to be rated #1 and #2 respectively. The point I would like to make here is, that the "Multi Fruits and Flowers" is certainly one of the most beautiful of all the carnival glass tumblers.

Besides being beautiful and most desirable, these tumblers are very rare. I have seen very few of them in any color. Perhaps the green tumbler would be the easiest to find, if indeed you can call any of them easy to find. Amethyst tumblers are extremely rare in this pattern. I know of only six in marigold, and they are all in a water set with the pitcher being the "Millersburg Cherries" pattern. I know of no other "Multi Fruits and Flowers" tumblers in marigold.

This tumbler will always demand a rather high price, as there is not enough of them around in all colors combined to supply the many collectors who would like to own one.

A good many of our carnival glass tumblers contain a certain type of fruit which form their basic design. A few examples are Northwood's "Peach", Imperial Grape", "Wreath Cherry", "Raspberry" and "Blackberry" Block. Here however we have a design that contains a good many kinds of fruit including a pear, and apple, berries, cherries, and grapes. It also contains some flowers which helps account for its name being called "Multi Fruits and Flowers".

The shape of the "Multi Fruits and Flowers" tumbler very much resembles that of the "Millersburg Cherries", and from a distance it would be hard to distinguish them from one another. At close range however you will have no trouble telling the difference, as the "Millersburg Cherries" design contains only the cherries. Both tumblers flare out at the top and bottom and neither have the ground base. The "Millersburg Cherries Variet" on the other hand, has straight up sides and contains a ground base. More on these Millersburg Cherries patterns in a later issue of this series.

The "multi Fruits and Flowers" pattern was also made in a punch set. The punch set is somewhat easier to find than the water set. The tulip shaped bowl or the one with the top turned in is the most rare of the punch sets. These punch sets come in marigold, green and amethyst. There is a great possibility of a blue set showing up, since several blue bases are known to exist. This pattern also is known in a little stemmed fruit cup or stemmed desert.

To find one of these little pieces has always been one of my greatest desires. A good picture of this piece as well as the Punch set and water set, can be found in Bill Edwards book on Millersburg Carnival Glass.

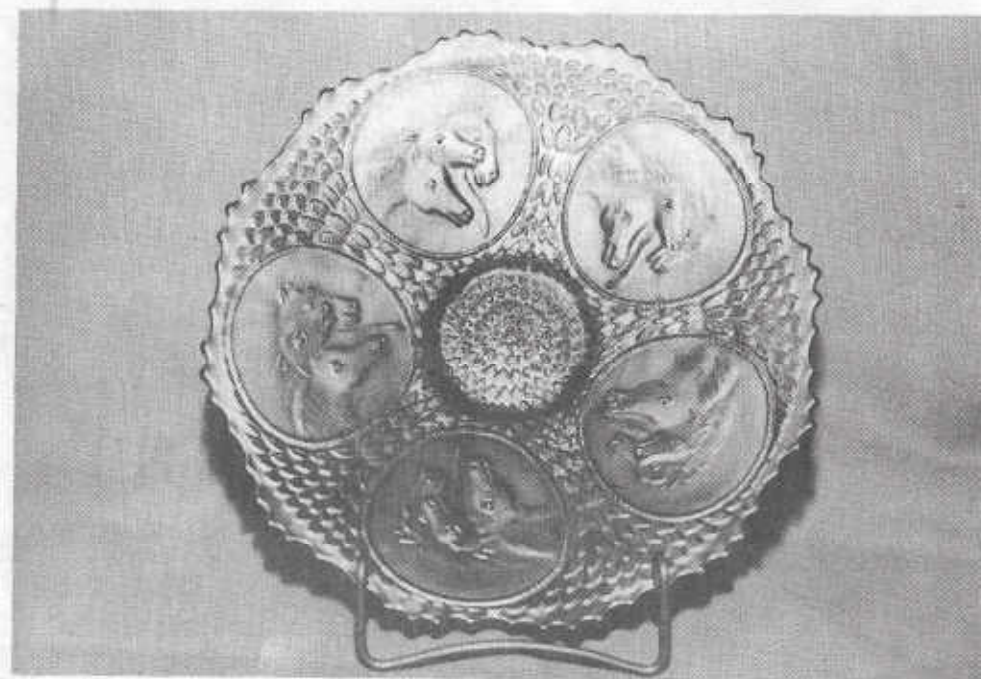

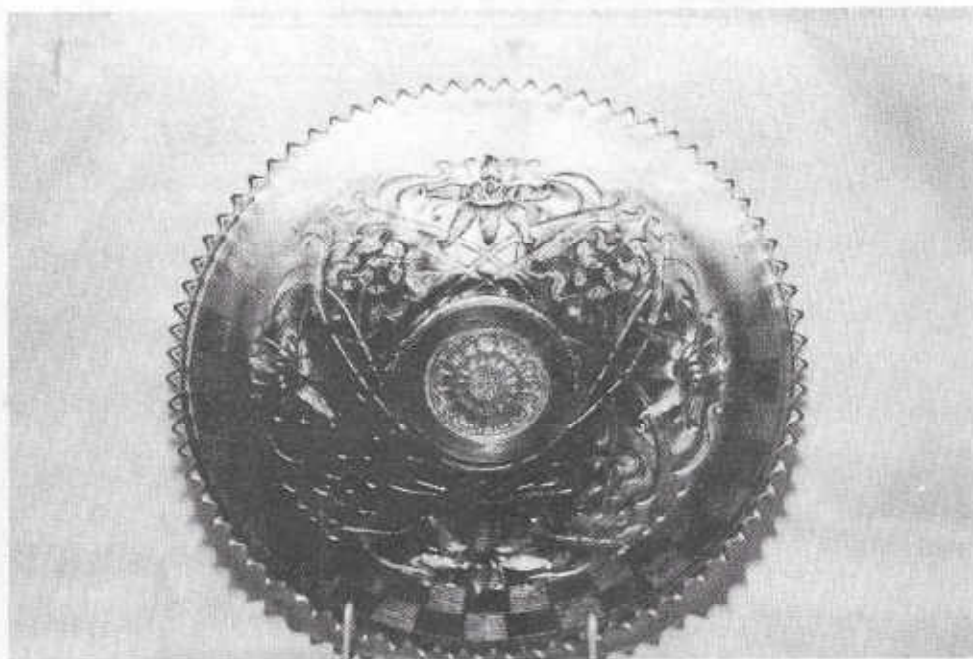
PICTORIAL PATTERN PARADE

HORSES HEADS PLATE IN COBALT BLUE



This 7½" to 8" plate was made by the Fenton Art Glass Company. You see quite a number of these in marigold, but I have seen only two plates in cobalt blue and have heard of very few others in this color. The "Leaf and Berry" pattern is on the reverse side. The "Horses Head" pattern is sometimes called "Horses Medallion". The famous original painting was done by John F. Herring, a British artist. I have seen a few of these old paintings around and they always remind me of the carnival glass pieces that I have seen. The original name of the painting was titled "Pharoah's Horses". This pattern also comes in the rather rare footed rose bowl and both footed and flat bowls.

These "Horses Heads Medallions" from damaged pieces are popular today in the making of jewelry and tie clasps. So if you have a damaged or cracked piece in this pattern, these horse head medallions do make very pretty tie clasps. The Chris Harnishes of Willow Springs, Pa. have made a lot of this type of jewelry from damaged carnival glass. This is a good way to enjoy even the broken pieces of our Carnival glass. We found the above blue plate on our way down to Florida last October.

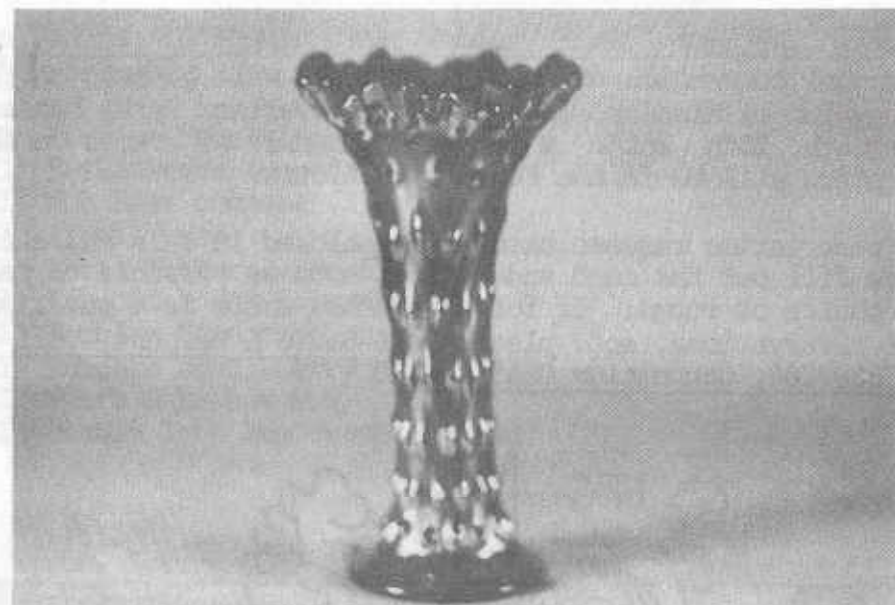


This large "Wishbone" chop plate is rather hard to find in any color. This one is in dark green. This is the only one I have ever seen in green, and have only heard of a very few in that color. It has the basketweave reverse pattern.

The "Wishbone" pattern was made by the Northwood Company and is highly collectable. It is sometimes called the "Melinda" pattern. This pattern is the only carnival glass pattern I know of that features the beautiful orchid flower. These orchids are surrounded by a sort of wishbone figure, hence its name "Wishbone".

The "Wishbone" pattern is also made in footed and flat bowls, a 9" footed plate, the very beautiful two piece epergne and the fantastic water set. This green chop plate pictured above was found by Osteen and Mary Lou Smith of Cornith, Miss. They had been trying to buy it for a number of years, but didn't realize that it was green until they bought it.

RED RUSTIC VASE - A piece of Carnival can be rare because of the pattern, the shape or the color. Very rarely a piece will be rare in more than one of these categories. A Peter Rabbit plate is rare because of the pattern and the shape. I have never heard of a white Peter Rabbit plate, but if such did exist, it would be rare on all three counts.

Certainly the Fenton Rustic vase shown here is not rare because of pattern or shape. It is rare however, because it is red - a strong cherry red. As far as I know it is the only one to turn up to date. I would expect others do exist. It is 8½ inches in height. Not many red vases in any pattern are known. I can think of Thin Rib, Wide Panel and Butterfly and Berry. Such have been reported in Pulled Loop and Plume Panels, but I have seen neither.
