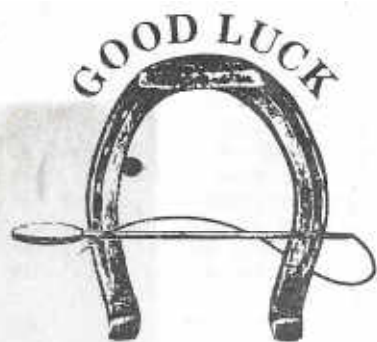

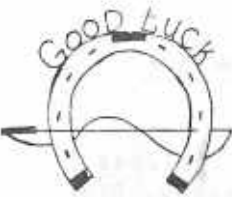

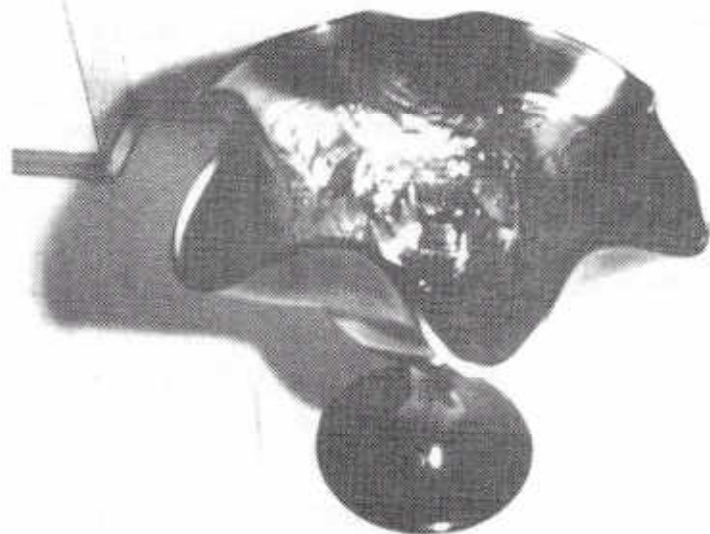

**** RARITIES & SELDOM SEEN ****

.....FENTON'S "PEACOCK & URN" COMPOTE IN RED.....

This compote has the most beautiful red color I have ever seen, it is RED-RED! Most of these have a silvery iridescence but this one does not. I have had several collectors tell me that this was the nicest red compote they had seen.

This piece is much sought after by collectors and the last one to sell publicly brought \$1000 at the 1984 ICGA Convention auction. This red compote is listed in Don Moore's "Carnival Glass Rarities" on page 6 in the honorable mention column. Less than a dozen of these compotes have surfaced and finding one is tough.

This piece stands 5 1/2" tall, is 6" across the top and has a base diameter of 3". Colors known in the compotes include marigold, green, blue, amethyst, white, aqua, lavender and red. Fenton also made bowls, plates and goblet shapes in the "Peacock & Urn" pattern but not all shapes were made in all colors.

I have been meaning for quite a while to take the time to tell you what a superb job you and your wife have done with the HOACGA Bulletin. We're sure many people do not realize all the time and work that goes into the making of a monthly Bulletin. We do and we certainly appreciate all of your efforts. FLUFFY PEACOCK - A Beautiful Fenton Pattern

For a number of years the "Fluffy Peacock" pattern was considered by many collectors and writers to be a Millersburg pattern. Mr. Frank M. Fenton, through old company literature, has helped us prove that the pattern is definitely a Fenton product.

This has always been one of my favorite water set patterns. The rather unique square shaped top of the bulbous water pitcher seems to set it off very nicely. You might have noticed that the enamelled "Zig Zag" water pitcher has the same shape as the "Fluffy Peacock". Our featured pattern has been called by many names including Peacock, Fluffy Bird, Fluffy Bird Peacock and Fluffy Peacock. We will use "Fluffy Peacock" as that is the name most often used by collectors and writers. Whatever name you choose, it is definitely a beautiful water set in any of the four colors we have seen.

"Fluffy Peacock" tumblers come in green, marigold, amethyst and blue. The marigold is my personal favorite because the pattern shows up so very nice and the bright, glossy color and iridescence give it a brilliant "show off" effect. However, they are beautiful and desirable in any color. You will find the dark tumblers will demand a higher price.

We believe that most serious tumbler collectors will want examples in all four colors. While they are not common, they are not considered as rare either. In my opinion, the blue and green are the hardest to find with the amethyst tumblers seen most often. We have heard rumors of white tumblers in this pattern but cannot verify this statement. I have never seen one in white and should it exist, it would be extremely rare.

"Fluffy Peacock" tumblers are of a standard size, standing just a little over four inches tall. Three of the peacock designs are placed uniformly around the tumbler. These rather unusual looking peacocks appear to be setting on a nest of feathers. The tumbler is of a three piece mold and the bottom of the base is perfectly smooth. You will find them distinctively different from other peacock pattern tumblers and they will add variety and charm to any collection.

This article on the "Fluffy Peacock" pattern represents Number 85 in this series. Next month we will cover a tumbler that is much more rare. It is known as "Harvest Flower" and was made by the old Dugan/Diamond Company of Indiana, PA.

We hope that you will be as excited about these souvenirs as we are and that you will get your orders in as soon as possible. 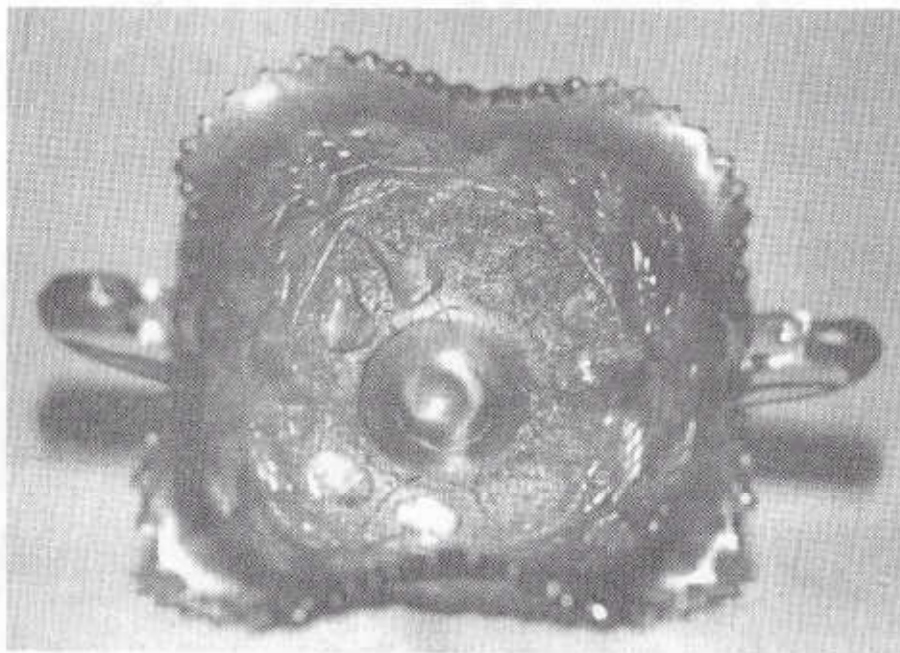

PICTORIAL PATTERN PARADE

FRUITS & FLOWERS BON-BON, WITH STIPPLED BACKGROUND

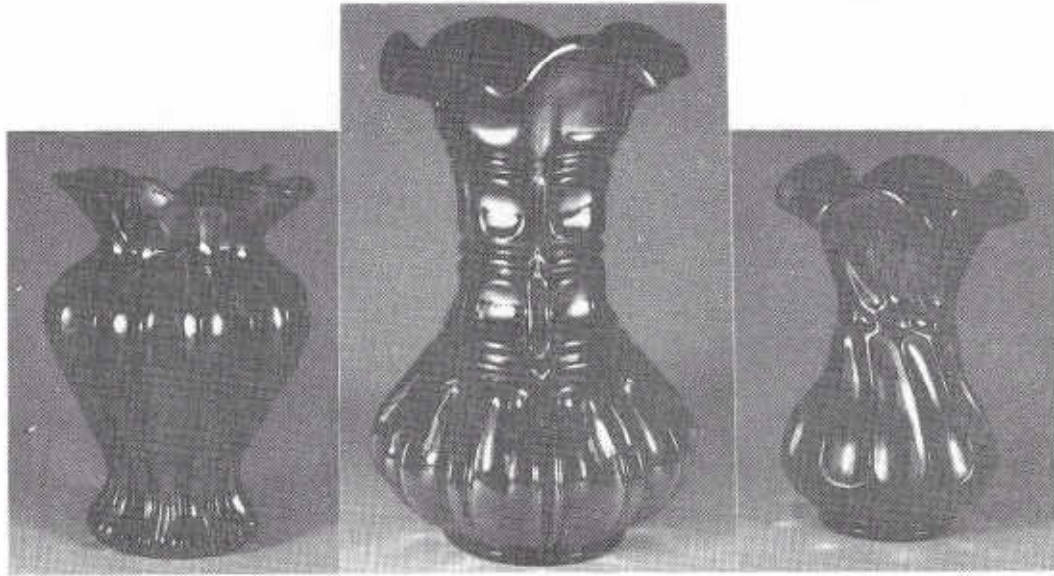
We hope that the above picture can clearly show the stippling on the background of this "Fruits & Flowers" bon-bon. Some collectors I have talked with did not realize that the stippled background existed on some of these. These bon-bons are usually entirely smooth on the surface behind the pattern. On this variant the stippling covers the inside of the bowl except for a space in the center the size of a silver dollar and an area about 3/4" wide along the outer edge of the bowl. The stippling actually covers all of the area that is directly behind the "Fruits & Flowers" pattern. We have examples of these stippled variants in marigold and cobalt blue. We are quite sure they also exist in other colors, but we have not seen any.

We also have one of these bon-bons in dark green that has still another variation. "Fruits & Flowers" bon-bons contain eight panels that are on the outside portion of the foot portion of the piece. These panels start at the top of the foot and extend completely down to the outer edge of the base. On this particular bon-bon, these eight panels extend out to about 1/2" from the outer edge and then each panel forms a rounded petal. Together these petals develop a design which looks much like an eight petaled flower. It is an interesting variation and you might want to check your "Fruits & Flowers" bon-bons to see if you have either of these variants in your collection.

** IMPERIAL VASES **

You've heard it said so often that when Imperial is good it is unsurpassed. The three purple vases shown here confirm that statement. These were also made in marigold and while less spectacular, they are even harder to find.

The THREE ROW VASE in the center is the rarest of this group. I can confirm only three in purple. One of these sold for \$700 at the HDACGA convention auction in April of 1984. Unfortunately Dr. Larson of Mason City, Iowa thought it was almost as pretty as I did. He is newer in Carnival and hasn't had the time, as yet, to get quite as crazy as some of the rest of us.

The COLONIAL LADY on the left is also very hard to find. The tops of these are often shaped in different ways. This vase takes its shape from the corseted waists of Victorian ladies. I don't recall one of these selling at auction in recent years but a purple one would no doubt go for around \$350. While not plentiful, the THUMBPRINT & OVALS on the right is the least rare of this group. Even so, they are seldom seen and a purple one should sell in the \$150-200 range.

** 1984 - A RARE YEAR **

As we begin a new year, one has to wonder what may turn up in carnival rarities. Every year brings out some rare and unknown items and doubtless this year will be no exception. It is still such a thrill to hear of a carnival rarity after all the many years our thousands of members have been collecting.

Not having a computer mind and also not hearing of every great piece of carnival being found in 1984, I'm sure some good ones turned up and we didn't hear about it or perhaps it has slipped out of mind temporarily, however the ones that come to mind at the moment include the Bob Gallos finding the Frolicking Bears tumbler - of course they have been found before but anyone will admit they are extremely rare - and the Gallos such nice people too.

Can't ever forget the thrill of seeing the amethyst Millersburg Hobnail cuspidor in the large unknown size that the Carlton Schleedes displayed at the ACGA convention. Joe Corrothers was happy to have found the marigold Blackberry cuspidor in Millersburg, Ohio during the Fall Festival. We found a white Butterfly & Berry water pitcher during the year so we felt lucky on that.

The footed Orange Tree water pitcher in lime green opalescent certainly deserves mention as one of the rarest in '84. The lucky finder of that beauty was Bob Strasburger. The ice green Dandelion water pitcher found by the Hemms at a Wisconsin county fair proves it sure pays to look everywhere. Many rare items changed owners during 1984. The Tumbler collection of Ward Russell was sold at auction and it contained some very rare items. It was a full auction year with prices holding up on nearly every occasion.

I fear I've missed something important but hope not. It seems reasonable to assume that by the end of 1985 another rare list can be made - now that is a nice thought to start out with. Our best wishes to everyone for a wonderful year.

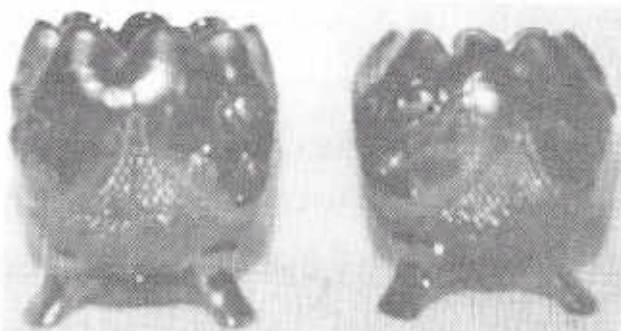
