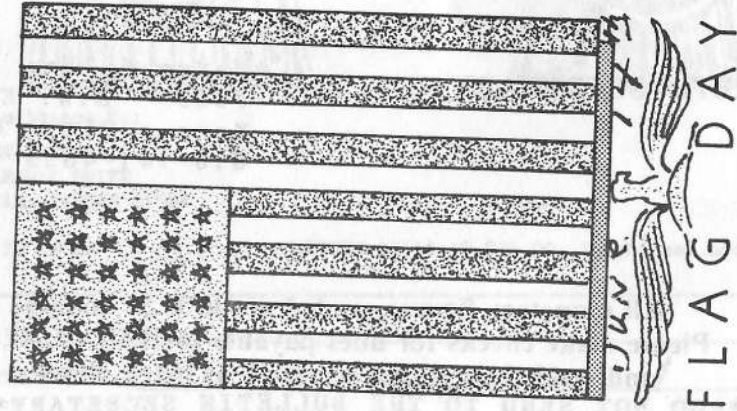

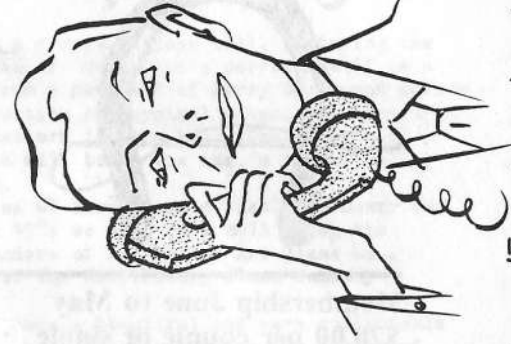

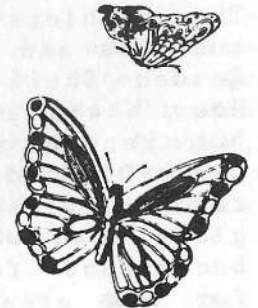

EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

JEWELED HART -- ANOTHER DUGAN TUMBLER

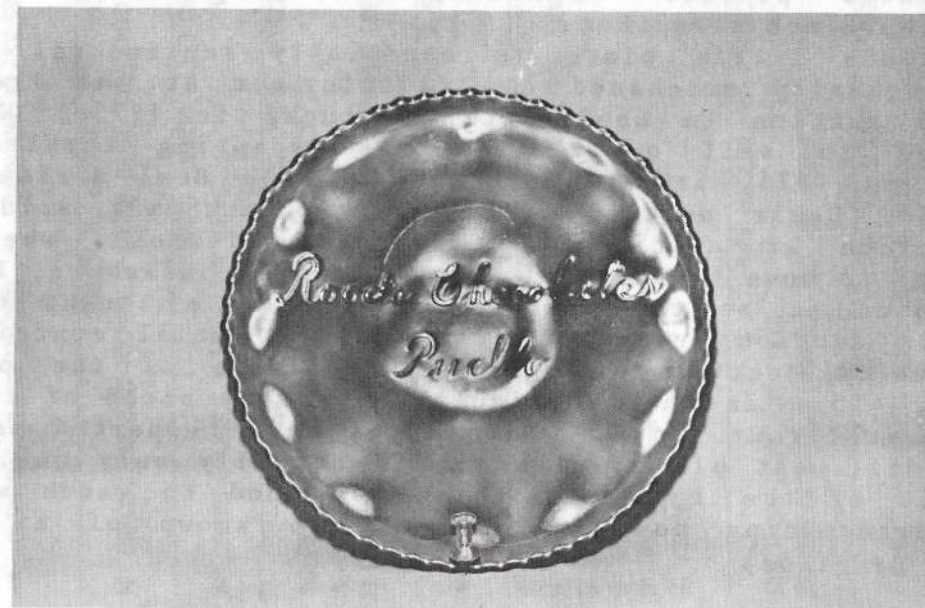
"Jeweled Heart" tumblers are shown above in white and marigold. The white tumbler is extremely rare. I purchased this one at the Collier auction in 1976. To the best of my knowledge, this is the only one that is known in white. We later were fortunate to find one in an amberish color, which is also a rare color in this pattern. "Jeweled Heart" tumblers are usually found only in marigold. While I would not call the marigold examples as rare, they are certainly not easy to find and probably should be classed as very scarce. I consider the "Jeweled Heart" water pitcher as rare and one of these only seldom comes up for sale. The tumblers are made very similar to the Beaded Shell tumblers and remind me a lot of the tumblers in that pattern. Beaded Shell is also a Dugan-Diamond pattern. "Jeweled Heart" was considered a Northwood pattern for many years, but recent research has proved it to have been made by Dugan-Diamond. Dugan actually produced many patterns in carnival glass and made a much larger quantity of old carnival glass than was originally thought. Dugan remained in the background for many years, but now is being recognized for his great achievement in the production of many fine patterns in carnival glass as well as other types of glass such as opalescent and custard glass.

This Dugan-Diamond "Jeweled Heart" tumbler article is #89 in this tumbler series. Next month we will feature a very rare carnival glass tumbler that is known as "Punty Band". "Punty Band" is a pattern that was made by the old Heisey Glass Company of Newark, Ohio.

NOTICE: A Cambridge Near-Cut "Inverted Feather" tankard pitcher and three tumblers have just been reported in amethyst. This comes from a very reliable source who has seen the pieces. More about this in a later issue.

ROOD'S CHOCOLATES -- A RARE SMALL PLATE

This little advertising plate is an amethyst, 6 3/8 inches wide, and very flat. It is only 7/8 inch high from the table top. The advertising on it reads "Rood's Chocolates" on the top line and "Pueblo" on the bottom line. This is most likely Pueblo, Colorado, but of course I am not sure about that at this time. It is iridised on both the top and underside surfaces. The bottom side has twelve panels and carries a "rayed star" design in the center of the base. I have always leaned to Fenton as being the maker of this piece, due to the fact that a number of Fenton pieces have this same under side or reverse pattern and rayed star design on the bottom center of the base. The "Little Flowers" sauce or berry dish, which was made by Fenton, has this exact pattern on its underside. Some of the well known and very knowledgable collectors think that this piece might have been made by Millersburg. Some collectors and writers lean towards Northwood as being the maker. I know of only three of these little "Rood's Chocolates" plates. No doubt, there are others out there, but I have not seen them.

This little plate is especially sentimental to us. We originally purchased this little gem at the Presznick museum auction in Louisville, Kentucky in 1973. When we decided to sell our collection (excepting tumblers and mugs) in 1975, it was purchased by the Neal Markham's at our St. Louis auction. Later the Markham's sold their collection at auction in Effingham, Illinois, when they decided to move to Florida. Mrs. Muson of Galesburg, Illinois, purchased it at the Markham auction. We bought it back at her auction several years ago. It still contains the "Presznick Auction" sticker on the base of the plate - number 435. In this particular case, one piece of carnival glass sold four times. This might be interpreted as being four different plates while it is actually only one. This is one of the important things we need to watch when we are determining how many pieces are known of a certain piece of glass.

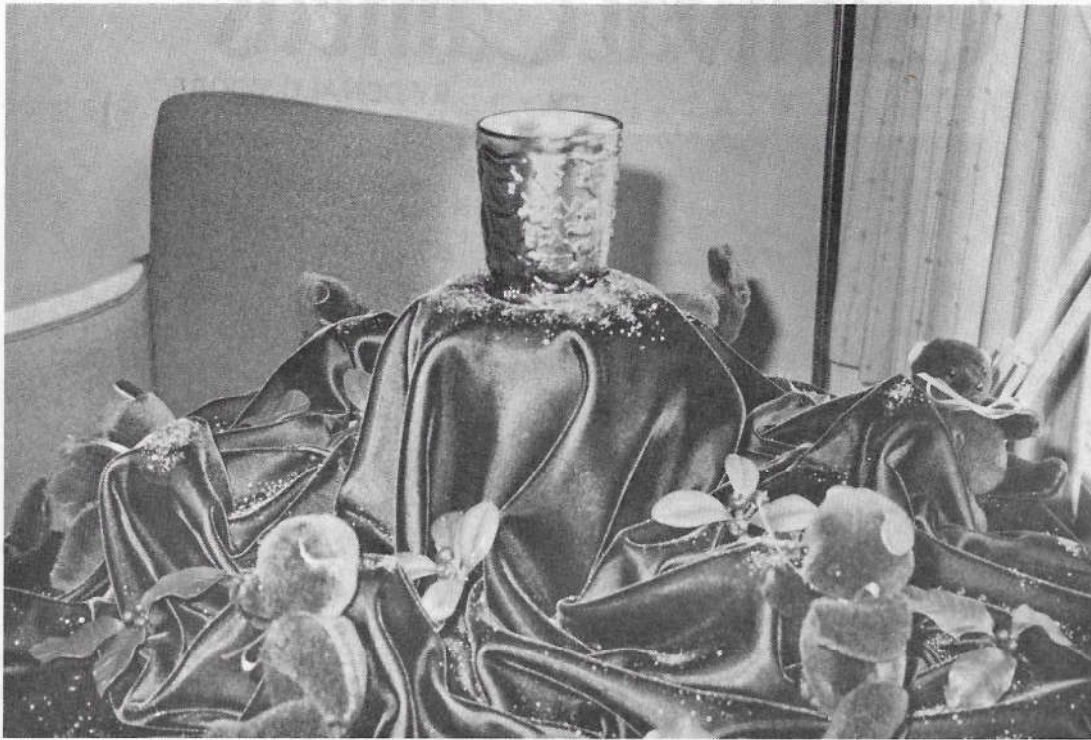
COAL BUCKET- While these novelty pieces have been sometimes attributed to the U.S. Glass Co., as far as I know there is no positive proof that this is true. While quite common in both clear and colored non-iridized pieces, these novelty buckets are rare in Carnival.

The piece shown here on the left is green while the one on the right is marigold. You will notice, that the one on the right was clearly designed as an ashtray with a cigarette holder on each end of the bucket. The pattering around the bases are very similar as is the 20 rays impressed on the underside of the bases abut except for that these pieces are very different. It is obvious that one company no doubt tried to copy the product of the other. The iridescence on the green bucket is flashed on while that on the marigold one is fired on. These often carry souvenir lettering as is true with this green bucket. It reads "Souvenir of Rochester, N.Y."

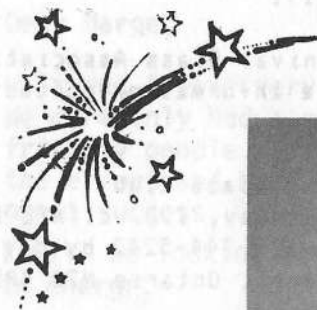

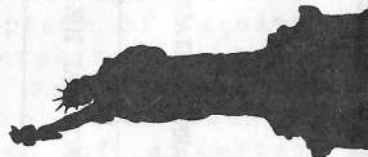

There is a collector of Carnival Glass who publishes a book on same, by the name of Bill Edwards. I have written to him, but to date have received no reply.

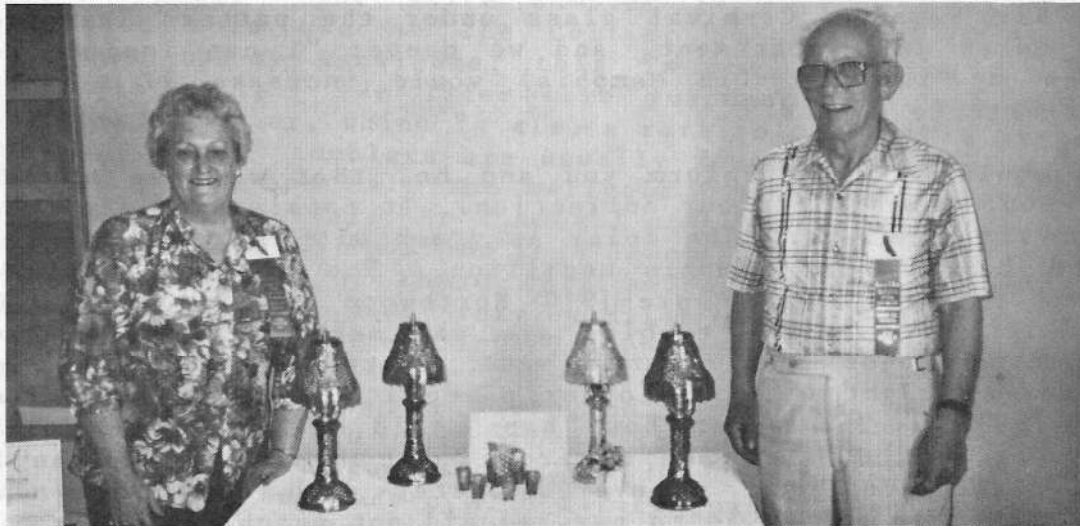
In his book on Carnival glass under the pattern "Memphis" he makes this statement, and we quote: "I can imagine how much my interest (in Memphis) would increase if a water set were to appear."

We would like to inform you and he, that we have a water set (of Memphis) in our collection. It consists of a pitcher and six tumblers. The color is green with flashed on gold, rim, handle, and Memphis medallion. The pitcher is marked with the very early pre-1910 Northwood marking, a double circle and N. The tumblers are not marked. We also have a large sugar and creamer set. These pieces are large but look right with the other pieces. They are also green and gold. The sugar bowl has a lid, and large finial, and is marked N in small circle with hyphen under the N. We also have seen a covered butter dish and large oval footed bowl, which sad to say, we did not purchase.

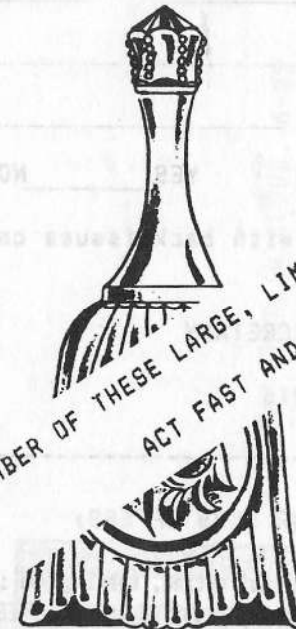
