BLUE GOOD LUCK BOWL - By Northwood

Upon first observation one would think this beautiful blue "Stippled" Good Luck Pie Crust Edge Bowl was your everyday fairly plentiful piece of carnival glass, right? - Wrong!

The pie crust portion of this piece, which is approximately one inch wide and all around the bowl IS NOT IRIDIZED! It is just plain blue colored glass, which make this bowl very rare. I have never seen another one like it and I doubt if there is. I believe it is one of a kind.

EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

SAWTOOTH BAND - BY HEISEY

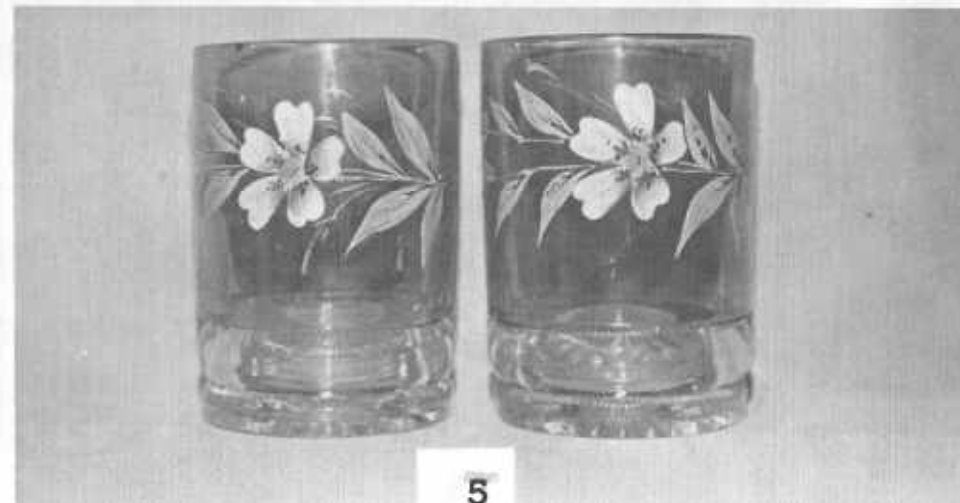
This "Sawtooth Band" Pattern Tumbler is shown in Heisey Books, but is not listed by any of the carnival glass authors.

I know of only five of these tumblers in carnival glass. Four of them are decorated as shown in the accompanying photo. The other one is plain with no decoration whatsoever. All are in marigold. The floral enameling is very pretty, containing white flowers with yellow centers and green leaves. In my opinion, it is one of the finest and most rare of the enameled type carnival glass tumblers.

This is the first tumbler in our series that was made by the Heisey Company. Even though a few iridised pieces do exist, Heisey was certainly not known for their carnival glass production. It is my understanding that Heisey made the pieces and sold the blanks to a company that specialized in decoration work. We own a number of these "iridised" pieces. Most, but not all, are marked with the Heisey "H in a diamond" trademark.

I consider this "Sawtooth Band" Carnival Glass Tumbler as rare, desirable, and certainly a very fine addition to any carnival glass collection. It is especially a star prize for those of you who collect tumblers.

This marks our 93rd edition in this series. Next month we will feature one of the finest of Carnival Glass Tumblers — Circle Scroll.



PICTORIAL PATTERN PARADE

MINIATURE INTAGLIO

This cute little "Miniature Intaglio" Almond or Nut Cup is sketched and described in Hartung Book 10 - Page 100. She wrote she had seen only a very few of these and believed them to be rare.

I find this to be very accurate, as one of these little miniatures very seldom comes up for sale. I have seen them more often with gold paint applied instead of the marigold iridescence. This little piece has been seen advertised as an Almond Cup and was made by the U. S. Glass Company.

It is quite small, standing from 2" to 2 1/2" tall. They measure from 2 1/2" to 3 1/4" across the top. The base is only 1 3/4" in diameter. The shape of the top varies somewhat from round to square. They sometimes contain the words "Souvenir of" and the name of some city such as Cleveland, Ohio, stenciled on the top of the base. Some examples do not contain the souvenir advertising, however.

The iridised examples that we have seen were all in nice marigold with good iridescence. The pattern is also known as "Wild Rose Wreath" and a very good picture of it appears in Presznick Book 4 - Plate 204. While this piece would add charm to any collection, it would make a super addition for the miniature collector.

NEW ENGLAND CONVENTION AND BRIMFIELD FLEA MARKET

Dear Marge,

I though you might like to hear what occurred in the New England states recently and have a report on the new England Carnival Glass Association auction prices which I have attached.

Travelling through the New England states nas always been a pleasure for me, but this was especially so this past month of September when I was fortunate enough to attend my first New England Carnival Glass Convention and the Brimfield, Mass. flea market all in the same trip. I had met some of the New England Club members when they had visited in California and Oregon for our Carnival conventions, but had never dreamed I'd meet them again. Necessity took me to the east coast, and I planned the trip to coincide with both aforementioned activities.

My mother, Lee Kasper, joined me in my quest for Carnival Glass. I dragged her to every antique store, garage sale and flea market that I read about in the newspapers and phone book. She, in turn, found out of the way places I wasn't sure we could find our way back from. Needless to say, we found some very interesting and unusual glass. Most of all, we met some rantastic Carnival Glass Collectors.

It was raining when we arrived at the new England Carnival Glass Convention, but this did not dampen anyones spirit as the members of the New England Club are the warmest and friendiest group of people you would ever want to meet. My mother and I were made to reel most welcome by Marian and Howard Robinson, who in turn introduced us to everyone else. The glass on display and for sale was outstanding. Some of the displays that come to mind are "My Blue Heaven" by Denise and Bill Ament with their ice blue water set and ice blue N's basket; the "Flora and rauna" display by Elain Malchman; and "On The Green" by Betty Palmer (a very charming lady) with a miniature golf course and a green buzz Saw cruet in the middle. They had red hat shapes and red Grape and Cable bowls, most every color in Corn Vases and Hat Pin Holders, and a lot of N's baskets that I volunteered to carry out to my car. I would like to thank the Canadian people who donated it to the raffle, it is terrific.

The auction was great fun and I suddenly found myself the owner of a blue opalescent Beaded Cable Rose Bowl. My wife, Judy, had called me from California when she got the brochure, and strongly suggested that I bid on the rose bowl! As usual, I left the auction with some very pretty glass and very empty pockets. It's a good thing I already had my return plane ticket.

The Brimfield flea market was beyond my wildest expectations, I have never seen so many people with so much on display for sale! I also saw so much Carnival Glass that it was almost too much to comprehend. I'm sure I missed a lot of glass since I could not spend the entire week at the flea market. The first day I was there it rained the entire day, but since I was limited in time, the rain did not even slow me down and I was able to find a few treasures in my search.

While in Connecticut I was lucky enough to be invited to the home of Sol and Eva Backer to see their collection and in particular their vaseline N's basket. The Backer's are a very gracious couple and have a beautiful collection of Carnival Glass in which resides an aqua Grape and Cable plate, a very rare Millersburg Peacock Variant, a marigold Checkerboard goblet, a beautiful Brooklyn Bridge bowl in marigold, an ice blue hat, a Persian Medallion ice cream set and Orange Tree punch set in white and an ice green Rose Show bowl. I spent a very enjoyable evening with the Backers and thank them very much for their hospitality.
