FASHION BREAKFAST SET IN PURPLE

Due to its unusual shape, the very graceful and beautiful "Fashion" Sugar & Creamer has always been one of my favorite breakfast sets. This is the first one of these that we have ever owned in purple.

A few years back we did find a lone creamer at a flea market in Florida, but that was as close as we ever came to owning a set in purple. Any piece of "Fashion" in the purple color is actually very hard to find. In most patterns, Imperial did not make much purple, but when they did it was usually outstanding in color and iridescence. This set is no exception to that rule.

In addition to the purple color, these sets were also made in helios green, smoke, and of course, in the more common marigold. It is quite likely that they were also produced in clambroth and amber, since Imperial did make a lot of carnival glass in both of those colors.

While Northwood is considered as the King of the pastels and Fenton was the top producer of red carnival, Imperial was certainly the leading maker of amber, clambroth, and smoke. With the exception of marigold, these little breakfast sugar & creamer sets are all difficult to find. A set in helios green is extremely hard to locate. We believe that it would be well worth your time in searching for one of these sets in any color.



EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES By John & Lucile Britt

CHATELAINE - A FANTASTIC TUMBLER

For shear beauty in shape, design, color and iridescence, the "Chatelaine" Tumbler rates very high on any tumbler collectors list. Mr. Richard Owens, in his fine carnival glass tumbler book, rates this tumbler as one of the top ten tumblers in the field. I would probably not crowd it into my top ten favorite tumblers, but I believe I could find room for it in my top twenty.

"Chatelaine" is considered an Imperial tumbler. The outstanding deep purple color and super iridescence are characteristics for which Imperial is so well noted. The "Chatelaine" pattern has been reported only in the purple color. I have dreamed of finding one of these little gems in marigold, but so far my dream has never come true. Most tumbler collections contain one of these in purple, and one will come up for sale occasionally, Even so, this tumbler in perfect condition, will usually demand a price of about three hundred and fifty dollars.

"Chatelaine" tumblers are slightly taller than most of our carnival glass tumblers. They have a ground base which was done at the factory in order to make them set level on the table. The water pitcher in this pattern is equally beautiful and most desirable. Only seldom will one of these pitchers show up for sale.

This is #96 in our Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will cover the very rare "Cone & Tie" tumbler.
