I would like to apologize for this mistake and to thank the Stanek's for bringing this to my attention. This way I can also correct my records.



### MEMBERSHIP DUES

The H.O.A.C.G.A. membership dues are being changed from \$20.00 to \$10.00 for the remainder of the 1986-87 membership year only (June 1, 1986 - May 31, 1987), effective January 1, 1987. The \$10.00 membership will not include any monthly Bulletins prior to January 1, 1987.

The practice is to send all back issues of the monthly Bulletin, if available; to those new and renewal members. It is very difficult to have enough copies of each months' Bulletin on hand in order to send to those new and renewing members, especially after several months have passed.

I personally want to thank the Shuperts and Donald Moore for making this tape possible.







# PACIFICA - - A RARE U. S. GLASS TUMBLER

In 1982, two of these rare "Pacifica" tumblers were found by Wesley and Betty Strain of Ferguson, Missouri. This pattern is unlisted in any of the carnival glass books. The pattern was found however, in William Heacock's fine Victorian Colored Glass book #5 "U.S. Glass From A to Z" on page 162. This material was taken from old U.S. Glass catalogs, so we know it is definately a U.S. Glass pattern. The pattern is listed only as U.S. Glass No. 6425. Starting in 1982, we searched all of the pattern glass books that we could find in order to locate the name for this pattern, but we were not able to find it anywhere. Since "Pattern No. 6425" did not make a very good name for this tumbler, we took the liberty of calling it "Pacifica".




(This second photo shows the opposite side of the tumbler) The "Pacifica" tumblers are in light marigold and are extremely rare. The two pictures in this article show both sides of the tumbler. In September of 1982, we covered this pattern in the H.O.A.C.G.A. "Pictorial Pattern Parade" as a rare find. Since that time, to the best of our knowledge, no others have ever been reported. The two known tumblers in this pattern are in the Whitley and Perry collections.

This very rare U. S. Glass pattern is the 107th tumbler that we have covered in this series. Next month we will describe two Fenton Orange Tree patterns - - one known as "Orange Tree Orchard" and the other as "Orange Tree Varient". We are going to feature both of these tumblers at the same time in order to show them to you side by side and describe the differences between the two patterns.




### NORTHWOOD'S FLUTE SHERBERTS

The "N's Flute" sherberts make an interesting and very pretty collection because they come in such a variety of colors. Our favorites are shown above in blue opaque, vaseline and olive green. The blue opaque color, shown on the left, looks somewhat like blue milk glass with super iridescence. I have seen only a very few of these sherberts in that color. The vaseline example is in the center. Like the vaseline Northwood bushel basket, it is very rare In fact, even though I know others do exist, this is the only vaseline "Northwood's Flute" sherbert that we have ever seen. On the right is the one in olive green or sometimes called russet color. This color is rather hard to locate. You see the sherbert in marigold quite often. Other colors found in this piece are green, celeste blue and amethyst. We also have one in celeste blue that is decorated with gold trim. It is quite possible that other colors exist in these sherberts including dark purple, pastel green and cobalt blue, but we have not seen any of them in those colors.

These little sherberts are  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " tall with a top opening of almost 4". The base has a diameter of 2 3/4". The inside is perfectly smooth with an underlined "N" in the center. The trademark on this piece does not contain the circle around the "N". The outside of the sherbert contains nine panels that extend from about  $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the top on down the stem and out to the outside edge of the base. Northwood also made a much smaller piece in this pattern that is called a salt dip or nut cup. They too are very cute little pieces and make super additions to any miniature collection.

# THE DIAMOND POINT ROSE BOWL


This very unusual rosebowl was one of the highlights of the 1986 A.C.G.A. Convention auction last summer. It is the only one of these that has ever been reported, to the best of my knowledge. For sure it is the only one that we have ever seen. It is quite similar in making to that of the Diamond Poin basket, which is also very rare.

This rosebowl is  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " tall with a top opening of only  $2\frac{1}{4}$ ". The base is 2 3/4" wide and contains a 32 point rayed star on the underside. It has seven rows of diamonds that circle the bowl. Each of these diamonds contain nine tiny diamond points. The color is marigold with fine iridescence. At the present time we are unable to identify the maker. Perhaps some day we will find the answer as to what company made this piece and where. We can be sure however, that it is indeed rare and that it would make a fine addition to any rosebowl collection.

It sold for \$500.00 at the A.C.G.A. Convention auction last summer. Unfortunately, this very fine rosebowl was not found early enough to be included in the H.O.A.C.G.A. Notebook fillers on Rosebowls, but it was a part of the I.C.G.A. Convention's beautiful rosebowl display last summer.

# PEACOCK TAIL AND DAISY

This rare Westmoreland pattern is shown only in Mrs. Presznick's Book 111, plate 155. The one shown is the first marigold bowl to turn up and only the third that is known in any color. It sold privately in August 1986 for \$800.00. An amethyst bowl is in the Fenton Museum and the Loeschers' in Beloit, Wisconsin own the third piece which is on super rare iridized blue milk glass.

The Westmoreland Co. owned this old mold when they went out of business two or three years ago. I have no information as to who now owns this mold. This Peacock Tail & Daisy pattern plunger was one of five different patterns that were used with the same bottom portion of the mold. Gary Levy worked at Westmoreland for a short time prior to their demise and told me of finding these five pattern plungers. The other four were Daisy Wreath, Scales, Carolina Dogwood and Smooth Rays. It would be interesting to know who bought these molds when they were sold. A number of the Westmoreland molds went to Summit Art Glass, Viking & Peletier but I have no specific information as to these five plungers.

# (Peacock Tail & Daisy continued)


Before going out of business, Westmoreland reproduced a very few pieces of the Peacock Tail & Daisy for the Levay Glass Co. They were in pastel amethyst opal. Some were iridized and a few were not. Only 25 plates, 27 "double crimped" bowls and 19 "double crimped" baskets were iridized. At the same time a few pieces were also made in the same color and shape in the Daisy Wreath pattern. A few red Carnival bowls with six ruffles were made at the same time in both the Peacock Tail & Daisy as well as the Carolina Dogwood. Levay called these "Ruby Mother of Pearl". All of the pieces carry the Westmoreland logo.

To complete the picture it must be pointed out that in 1977 Fenton had a new mold made for the Carolina Dogwood bowl and offered it in both red and purple in a six ruffle bowl. These pieces have a somewhat different edge than those from the old Westmoreland mold and, of course, they carry the Fenton logo.

# Green LOTUS AND GRAPE plate - Fenton

Here is a plate that nearly always brings top dollar. In the photo is this piece in green. We also have one in blue. The blue is priced at \$500.00 and the green pictured is \$600.00, probably worth more now.

It is strange that on most pieces the bowls are low in price but extra high in plates. This green plate, as mentioned above, is \$600.00. The bowl is about \$60.00.

This comes in colors of marigold, amethyst, blue, green, white and red. Shapes are low bowls, bon bons, and rare plates. I have seen the plates in green and blue only. This bowl is rare and is a very beautiful piece. This piece is fluted on the outside edge and is very flat, as is also the bowl. Although the only bowls I have seen are ruffled and fluted.

We had a small turn-out for our November meeting, but what a beautiful day for those who did get out and attend!



Now that winter is here, why not start palnning a spring vacation to Camp Hill, Pennsylvania.


May 13, 14, and 15, 1987 the Keystone Carnival Glass Club will host our 4th Annual Convention at the Penn Harris Inn and Convention Center.

Saturday night welcomed seventy-six happy people toasting our sixth Birthday celebration. Colorful centerpieces and baloons set the festive mood.


Rounding out the program, an inspiring candle lighting ceremony honoring past presidents and charter members. Tom Burns was emcee.

Over 400 pieces with several rarities...such as the unlettered Courthouse, a blue Waterlily & Cattails tumbler, and a marigold custard Rose Show plate. It was worth the trip just to see them.

Auction was November 7 and 8 and as we often do, we went a day earlier for extra visiting, which we enjoyed very much; feeling it our last Ohio trip until next year. We met the Radcliffs and Heeleys at the Amith restaurant called "The Barn" at or near Wooster, Ohio. We almost like that part as well as the auction...however we can do both and don't have to choose. We met several relatives and loads of Carnival friends at early preview time. The Carnival truly was exceptional. As predicted, a large crowd was there. Well over 100 bidding numbers given out.

We feel prices held up wonderful considering so many auctions in 1986. Carnival seems to stay highly collectible year after year. Rooms at the motel too had beautiful Carnival for sale. No doubt many items were sold privately.

A surprise to have the Waterlily tumbler sell for the highest at \$2,700.00. It appears to be the only blue one known. Did hear one was in a museum somewhere but would never be for sale. This little rarity went to Mass. The Rose Show plate sold for \$2,500.00 and went to Minnesota. The Courthouse sold for \$1,100.00. Didn't notice who got it. So many good prices all along. The Hollyhock lamp at \$2,000.00. We didn't stay for the entire sale as it appeared a storm was approaching, so we left at number 346. Sure enough, we had rains almost all the way and dark quite awhile before getting home. We did hear sale grossed about \$90,000.00 so feel the owners and Tom Burns should be pleased.

We were saddened to hear that Carlton Schleede of New York was seriously ill. Dick and Phyllis Ott passed a card around for everyone to sign. We hope it cheered them up to know we all were remembering them with lots of best wishes. Carlton was President of A.C.G.A. some years back and he and his wife are one of the nicest Carnival couples. Just to hear of any Carnival friends having problems always grieves us. A card to the Schleedes from their friends would help the shut in days easier to endure. 


