EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

THE SWORD AND CIRCLE TUMBLER

The Sword & Circle is a very rare tumbler. The one shown above is the only example that we have ever seen. Mrs. Hartung sketched and described this tumbler in Hartung book seven on page 112. Richard Owens also shows it in his tumbler book. It is #168 in that fine book on carnival glass tumblers. Whether this is the same tumbler that is shown by Mrs. Hartung, we are not sure. Anyway, consider it as a very hard tumbler to find.

We purchased the above tumbler, along with a good many others, from the Arnold Preheim collection in 1976. We can well remember how thrilled we were to get this tumbler, as we had never seen one before. The Preheim's, we might add, furnished about thirty percent of the tumblers that were used in Owens tumbler book. The Sword & Circle, that is shown above, is one of those tumblers that was used in Owens book. A few years ago we sold this tumbler to the Whitley's of Houston, Texas.

Our featured tumbler is of an amberish marigold color. We consider it more amber than marigold. It stands 4 3/8" high with a top opening of 3". The swords or spears rise from the base to separate the slightly concave circles, two per panel. There are nine panels. On the bottom of the base is an unusual pattern with rather sharply raised ridges in groups of threes, there being nine of these groupings around the circle in a diameter of 2". They rather

resemble wagon wheel spokes with nine spokes radiating out from the center. We have not been able to pin point the producer of this tumbler, so will have to state that the maker is unknown.

Sword & Circle is our 139th entry into this Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will feature a special edition in this Series, of what was until just recently an unheard of small Rising Sun juice tumbler in very dark marigold with super iridescence.

AN IMPORTANT CAMBRIDGE GLASS DISCOVERY

LARGE INVERTED THISTLE COMPOTE IN GREEN

Not many people associate Cambridge with the production of Carnival Glass. Mrs. Kamm even states in volume 7 of her pattern series, that "Cambridge never made Carnival Glass." The fact is, however, they got into the act in a major way even though their principal line was always fine crystal and non-iridized tableware.

The Cambridge Glass Co. sprang from a conglomerate of some nineteen glass factories in 1898 which was called the National Glass Co. A few years later and after a new factory was built in Cambridge, Ohio, they took on the Cambridge name by which we have known them for so many years. In 1906 they adopted the "NEAR CUT" trade mark. Most, but not all, of their Carnival production carried this logo. For several years prior to 1906, they had used a "C" in a triangle. The Company was in continuous operation until 1959 when they ceased operations and their molds were sold to the Imperial Glass Co. Mr. Harold Bennett now maintains the Cambridge Glass Museum where crystal and rare pieces of Carnival are on display.

After this brief history let's now inform all those affected by the illness commonly known as "Carnivalitis" of the rare discovery.

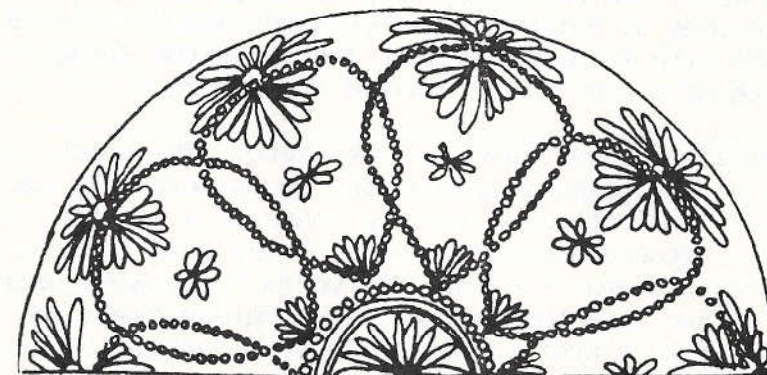
After consulting Don Moore on the subject, I may now mention my find which is an INVERTED THISTLE 7½" large compote in green, signed "NEAR CUT" (Cambridge Glass Co.) inside the compote. It is 10" across the top and the base of the pedestal is 4½". Underneath the base we have the thistle pattern. This intaglio pattern is a superb piece of glass with good color and iridescence. ALL INVERTED THISTLE is rare, but I was doubly pleased when informed by Don Moore that I have the second known large INVERTED THISTLE compote in green. Proof that there are still a few pieces of rare glass in Quebec.

CARNIVAL GLASS BY HEISEY

It is our understanding, with information given us by authorities on the subject, that Heisey did not make any carnival glass. Heisey people claim that the Heisey signed pieces, that have iridescence, were made by Heisey and iridised by someone else. We certainly respect their knowledge on this subject. We do own a few pieces of Heisey signed carnival glass, however, and have seen a number of others with iridescence that contained the Heisey trademark. This trademark consists of a capital "D" inside a diamond.

Our featured pieces are shown above in the photo. The punch cup, or perhaps a custard, that is on the left, is plain with no pattern. It is in marigold with super iridescence. The bottom of the cup contains a 24 point rayed star design. It has been factory ground around the edge of the base in order for it to set level. On the outside, near the top, the words "Hale Bath House - Hot Springs, Ark." have been etched into the surface. The Heisey trademark is on the inside of the bottom. This is a pretty little piece of carnival glass and we are sure it is quite rare.

On the right, in the above photo, is the Heisey Flute toothpick. It is in marigold with super iridescence. It contains eight panels and a 16 point star is pressed into the underside of the base. It is very similar to the regular Flute toothpick, that we all know, except the regular Flute has six larger panels and

is scalloped at the top. The Heisey Flute is smooth at the top, as the photo indicates. We think a lot of this little piece and it fits in well in our miniature collection. We might add, that we have seen a number of these little Heisey Flute toothpicks in clear crystal, but this is the only one we have ever seen in carnival glass. Other Heisey pieces, that we have seen with iridescence, are Heisey individual set (Hartung book 6 - page 91), Heisey Flute punch cup (Hartung book 10 - page 72) and Heisey's Panelled pattern candlestick (Hartung book 8 - page 37), and the Sawtooth Band tumbler. (See H.O.A.C.G.A. tumbler article for October, 1985).

This is #127 in the original carnival glass Pictorial Pattern Parade Series. Next month we will feature a rare Millersburg piece -- the tall Rosiland jelly compote.
