EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

THE BARBELLA TUMBLER

The Barbella tumbler is not often seen and we consider them as rather rare. We have only had a chance to purchase two of these in the last 20 years. The examples that we have seen have been in the true vaseline color. The beautiful color used on this tumbler is like that found on the vaseline Northwood Bushel Basket. It is also the same color that is found on the vaseline Northwood Flute sherbert and the Northwood Flute salt or nut set pieces. By this, we mean that there is no marigold overlay such as that found on most Fenton and Millersburg vaseline pieces. The color on all these Northwood examples will really glow from top to bottom when placed under a black light.

Unlike the other Northwood pieces mentioned above, which contain the underlined (N) in a circle, the Barbella tumbler has the N-less circle on the inside bottom of the base. This same type of N-less circle is also found on the inside of the Grape & Gothic Arches tumblers. The Barbella tumbler is 3 7/8" high with a top opening of 2 3/4". It has a collar base and contains 14 panels on the interior of the tumbler. The iridescence is on the outside of the tumbler.

In photo #2 (next page), we show the Enameled Apple Blossom tumbler alongside the Barbella to illustrate how similar they are made to one another. The En-

ameled Spring Festival (Whitley #53) is also made with this same type of collar base and tumbler shape. Northwoods Grape & Gothic Arches tumblers are also made in this same shape and similar collar base.

The Barbella pattern was named by the late William Heacock. There is no doubt that he did more research on this pattern than anyone else. In issue #2 of the Glass Collector, spring 1982, he mentions this pattern on page 39. He shows a photograph of a table set in this pattern, which up until that time was unknown in the Barbella pattern. The table set pieces clearly matches the shape and finials of the Grape & Gothic Arches table set pieces. He notes that each piece of the set has the plain circle in the bottom.

We would like to give credit to William Heacock for much of the research that has been done on this pattern. We would also like to thank Jq Ann Mitchell, Jane Dinkins and Cecil Whitley for their help on this pattern. If anyone else has other information on this tumbler, we would be glad to hear from you.

This article on the Northwood Barbella tumbler, is #147 in this Carnival Glass tumbler series. Next month we will feature the Enameled Dotted Diamonds and Daisies tumbler.

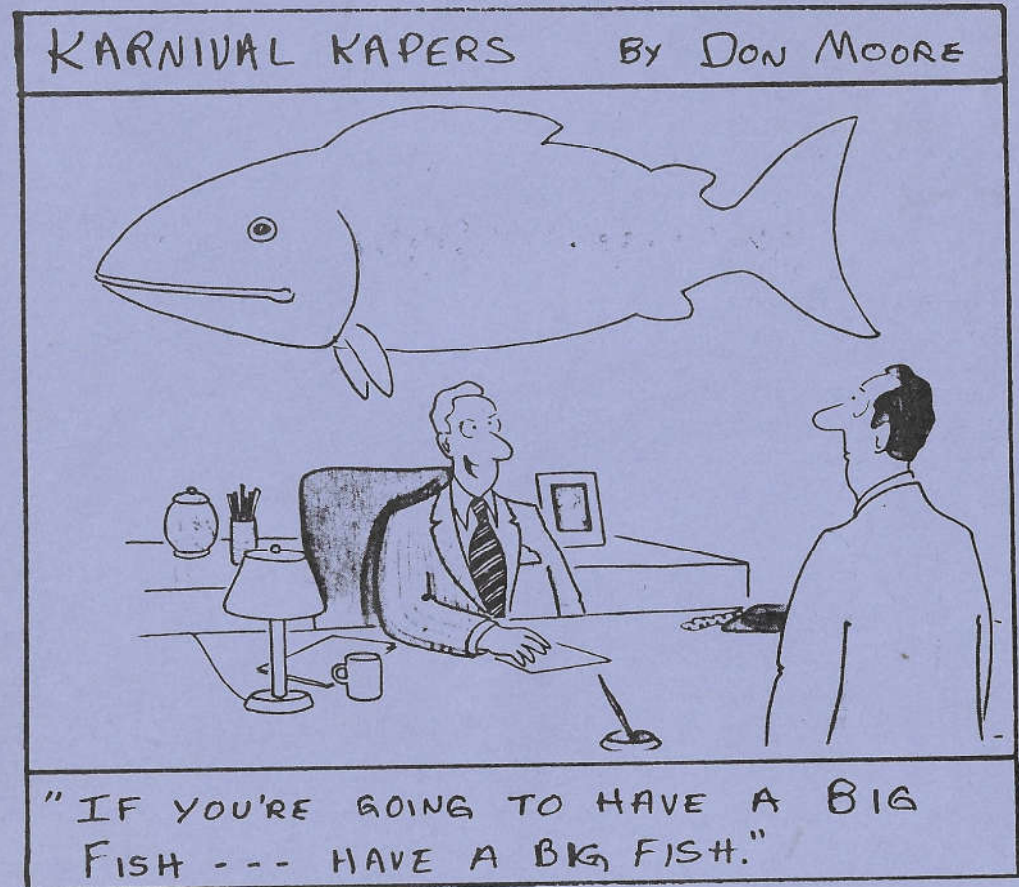

THE STIPPLED RAMBLER ROSE NUT BOWL

The Stippled Rambler Rose pattern is not often discussed and certainly is very seldom seen. We have seen this pattern only in the nut bowl shape as shown above. The four or five that we have seen were all in a good marigold color. Hartung lists the pattern in marigold and amethyst, however; while Edwards reports the colors in marigold and blue.

The bowl sets on three spade-like feet. The feet are more of a roll-type and quite different from the spatula feet that were used on Northwood and Fenton bowls of this footed type. The shape of the nut bowl is very similar in shape to the Vintage or Grape Delight nut bowls. The exception being that the Grape Delight nut bowls are on six feet instead of the three that were used on this piece. The bowl stands four inches high and has a 5 3/4 inch top opening. Notice that a scroll-type frame surrounds the featured single rose flower and leaves. All of the background inside the scroll frame is stippled, while the rest of the surface is plain or smooth.

The rose that was used on the regular Rambler Rose pattern is very similar to the one that we find on the Stippled Rambler Rose nut bowl. The leaves, however, on the Rambler Rose water set pattern are distinctly serrated like those found on true life rose leaves. In the case of the Stippled Rambler Rose, the

leaves are smooth. A rose bud is found on the Rambler Rose tumblers while none is used on the Stippled Rose pattern. Of course, the main difference between the two patterns is the stippling found on the background of the Stippled Rambler Rose.

We consider the Stippled Rambler Rose nut bowl as a fine addition to collections where rare and unusual pieces are desired. It also should fit in very well in rose bowl and nut bowl collections.

This is our 135th entry into our Pictorial Pattern Parade. Next month we will cover one of Westmorland's finest patterns - - the Fruit Salad punch set in peach opalescent.

The incentive to collecting as a hobby varies from one individual to another. Usually the reason is a subjective one, first involving the personality of the collector, then acted upon as the means, time, and ambition direct.

Intriguing to us may be trading cards, antique tools of the farm or kitchen, or perhaps the works of artists. Indeed, the number of objects that are considered by collectors to be beautiful, useful, or just interesting is almost beyond enumerating.

Carnival Glass buttons were designed to appeal to the appreciation of men and women who lived in the latter part of the Victorian era and the transition years before World War I. We view their prescribed social conduct as rather strait-laced, and we feel no wonder that for diversion they indulged themselves in fanciful buttons, luxurious textiles, and ornate jewelry.

The enjoyment of the buttons, at least, has come full circle, as the practice of seeking them out is practically world-wide at present.

When collecting Carnival Glass buttons, one option is to specialize. Specialization can go in any of several directions, such as:

1. Conventionals: One of the advantages of collecting conventionals is that the variety of designs seems almost endless. The category can include the buckles, stars (stars may have from five to at least twelve points), abstracts, lacy patterns, facets, many inlays, etc.. They also appear in the greatest number of different sizes. A smaller collection could be comprised of any of the above.
2. Pictures: These are less abundant, and the subjects may be human figures and heads, animals, birds, insects and spiders, scenics, dragons, and inanimate objects. Go for any or all!
3. Botanicals: The naturalistic depictions of flowers, fruit, nuts, vegetables, grains, and leaves are rather scarce. The non-realistic or stylized ones are a little more plentiful and often the iridization or hand-retouching is applied in a way to create special effects.
4. Designs with subjects related to patterns on other Carnival Glass: There are grapes, strawberries and other fruits, roses and other florals, deer, a very scarce lion, shells, a bird singing, acorns, stars, horseshoes, sailboats, basket weaves, swans, butterflies, windmills, and others.
5. Buttons with pastel iridescence: This is an effect that I haven't

seen on dark base glass Carnival bowls, etc., although surely it would be stunning. Perhaps for some reason it was difficult to use over a large surface of dark glass.

6. Buttons with metal or celluloid frames, which are found in many sizes.

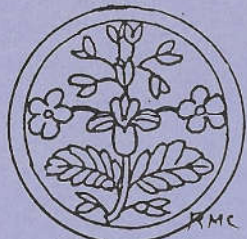
The upper surface design of a button is not all that is of interest. For practical use the reverse side must be considered to determine how it can be attached to a garment.

There is another interesting feature that sometimes appears on the back of a button, and this is the back mark. If it includes the word "Patent" or an abbreviation, it was made in the United States. Since patents are on file in government archives, it could be possible to establish the period of manufacture. However, most U. S. Carnival buttons were not marked.

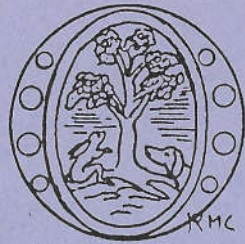
There are a few buttons with back marks that indicate English, French, or German origin. If it is "Registered" it is English, if "Depose" it is French. (Incidentally, the brass shank with four holes in its four sides usually is considered typically French, although some may have been made or used in Eastern Europe.) The word "Geschutzt" is a German protection against copying.

Simple back marks such as raised dots or stars have yet to be explained, but are interesting in that along with the others, they occasionally appear on our Carnival Glass buttons.

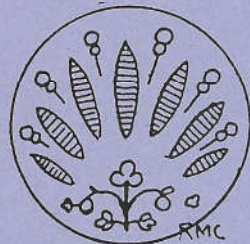

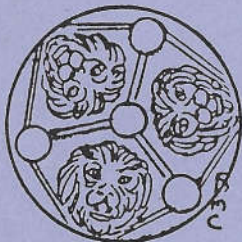

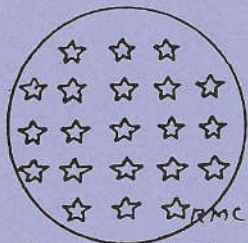

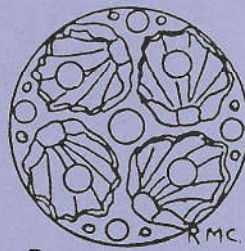
