

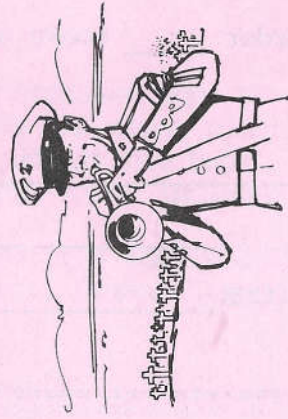

THE FRUIT SALAD PUNCH SET IN PEACH OPAL

The peach opalescent Fruit Salad punch set is certainly one of Westmorland's finest entries into the Carnival Glass field. The first time Lucile and I ever saw a photo of this beautiful set in color was on the cover of Sherman Hand's book #2, "Colors in Carnival Glass". It is also shown in color on the inside of that very fine book. Sherman Hand, along with Rose Presznick, used the name "Multifruits" for this pattern, so you might find that name used occasionally. Hartung, however; calls it Fruit Salad and that is the name that is most often used for this pattern today. Bill Edwards also shows this fine punch set in peach opalescent in his revised 2nd edition book "The Standard Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass". He, like Hartung, refers to the pattern as "Fruit Salad". Whether you like to call this pattern Fruit Salad or perhaps Multifruits, it is certainly a beautiful, desirable and rare set. In addition to our featured peach opalescent color, Westmorland also made this punch set in amethyst and marigold.

The first peach opal Fruit Salad punch set we were actually able to see was owned by Don & Connie Moore of Alameda, California. To us, it was one of the brightest stars in their beautiful collection of Carnival Glass. Don must have liked it very well too, as he used it on the cover of his very educational book "The Complete Guide to Carnival Glass Rarities".

It is possible that new or beginning collectors might get the Fruit Salad pattern punch set mixed up with the Many Fruits set, which was made by Dugan. Just remember that the Fruit Salad is the only punch set that contains the Pineapple. Even the punch cups contain the pineapple, along with the grapes and cherries, as does the top. The base to the set contains only the grapes however. In fact, there are three distinct bunches of grapes on the base. Keep in mind that this pattern contains the pineapple and you will have no trouble distinguishing it from Dugan's Many Fruits and Millersburg's Multi-fruits & Flowers punch sets.

This is number 136 in our Pictorial Pattern Parade Series. Next month we will cover the Western Thistle vase. The Western Thistle is an unusual and pretty vase in a very rare pattern.

THE DOTTED DIAMONDS AND DAISIES TUMBLER

This pattern is one of the enameled or painted-type of Carnival Glass tumblers. From time to time, we have included an enameled-type tumbler pattern in this Series. We think we should include some of these due to the big interest that is now shown in painted water sets, pitchers, and tumblers.

The first tumblers in this pattern we ever saw were at one of the Carnival Glass conventions in the mid 1970's. They were for sale in the room of Bob & Kitty Vining. As we remember, they had two of them. We thought they were very pretty and were different from other tumblers we had seen in this type, so we purchased them. We spent considerable time in researching this pattern. They were not included in the very popular Owens' Carnival Glass tumbler book that came out in 1973. We could not find the pattern in the Hartung, Presznick or Sherman Hand books which were the Carnival Glass books available at that time. Since we had been writing our Carnival Glass tumbler series for some two years at that time, and could not find the name for this pattern anywhere, we included it along with five other enameled tumblers in our November, 1979 tumbler article.

In that 1979 article, we named this tumbler "Dotted Diamonds and Daisies". We are very proud of the name that we have given this tumbler, because it actually fits the pattern very well. As you can see from the photo, the pattern is made

up of a series of dotted diamonds and daisies.

Out featured tumbler is of standard size. There are many narrow ribs on the interior that follow through the base. Four daisies with seven white petals are distributed evenly around the tumbler. Three small long shaped leaves are placed between each daisy. There are four diamonds, each consisting of 25 white dots, placed below the daisies. In our travels we have found this pretty tumbler to be rather hard to find. To the best of our knowledge it was made only in marigold.

Cecil Whitley of Houston, Texas came out with an enameled Carnival Glass tumbler book in 1985. The Dotted Diamonds and Daisies tumbler is featured in that book along with many other enameled type Carnival Glass tumblers. It is called "The World of Enameled Carnival Glass Tumblers." The book is in color. We recommend that fine book very highly and it would make a fine addition to anyone's Carnival Glass library.

This is number 148 in our Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will cover the "Plums & Cherries" tumbler, a pattern that was made by Northwood. This pattern is occasionally found in pressed glass, but only two or three pieces have ever been discovered in Carnival Glass. One of the pieces is the blue Carnival Glass tumbler that we will discuss. Another piece in this pattern is a blue spooner that will be sold at the Harold and Virginia Ludeman auction at the I.C.G.A. Convention at Cedar Rapids, Iowa in July. We consider the Plums & Cherries as a very rare pattern.

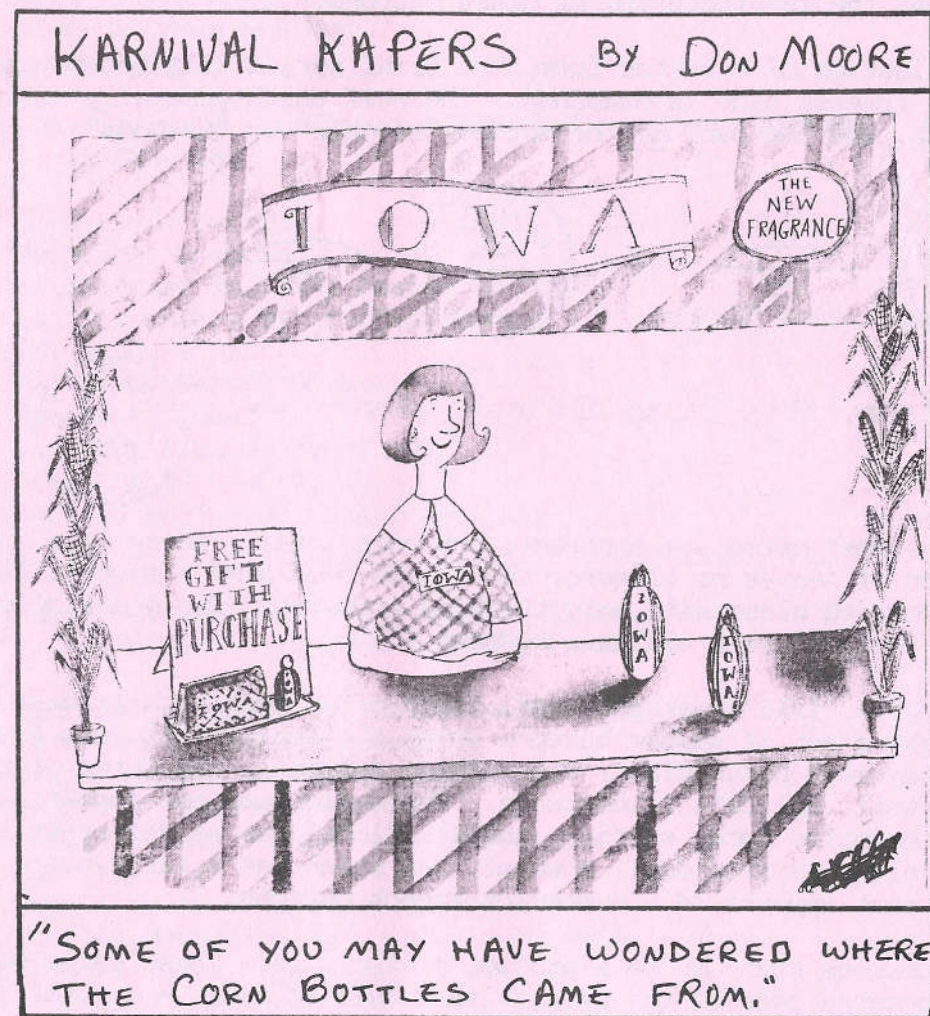

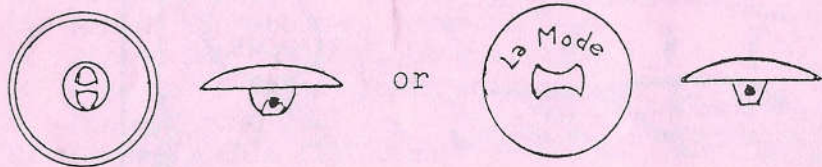
MODERN IRIDESCENT LUSTER BUTTONS

Modern is the term used for buttons made after 1918.

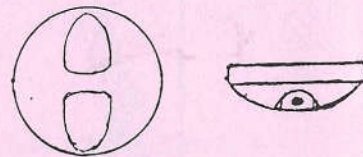
It is not impossible for a darkly beautiful, conventional design modern iridescent luster button to remain unidentified for a time among a group of old Carnival Glass buttons. Not that it is a reproduction, for it is not, but rather it is an example of the fine workmanship of the West German artisans of the 1950's.

With the West German economy in shambles after World War II, the United States helped to establish small, so-called cottage industries to provide temporary work for the population. One industry requiring a minimum of the very scarce machinery was the manufacturing of glass buttons.

The identification of a button from that brief period will become apparent as soon as the reverse side is examined. The self shank generally will look like one of these, and the back may be marked "Le Chic" or "La Mode":



or comparison, this is an old self shank: →



The patterns most often are abstract, but occasionally there is a stylized representation of leaves or flowers, and I have seen also a simple, flat, bird design on colored glass with only the bird iridized. The glass colors vary from black to clear with all hues between.

An early modern, 1919 to around 1940, isn't often seen with iridescent luster. I once bought a set of sample buttons which the dealer felt were from that period. They were black glass, one inch in diameter, and three of the eight had a very soft, delicate iridescence. The design was one geometric flower covering the entire upper surface, and its "look" was as different from old buttons as night is from day. However, the shank was a carry-over, the metal "four-way" that appears on a number of French buttons.

There are buttons that can be a product of two ages! These large buttons have a glass truncated cone on the back, with a hole to receive a metal ring shank. The same glass top can be used as a hat pin head. The buttons (and hat pin

heads) now are called "cone shanks". As reported by the National Button Society, the tops were made early in the 1900's, but in many cases the metal ring shanks were not applied until after 1918.

An eastern United States factory is credited with the production of many of the cone shanks that we see. This information is from the testimony of the owner of the company, as stated in a copyrighted article in The National Button Bulletin for February, 1988, Vol. 47, No. 1.

There also is a type of cone shank button with the back mark in German, "Geschutzt", mentioned in Article III. I recently consulted a former German national who told me that the English translation is our word, "patented".

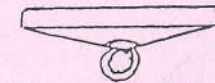

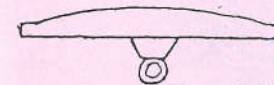
Hamann shank

Four way shank

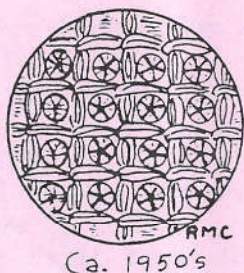
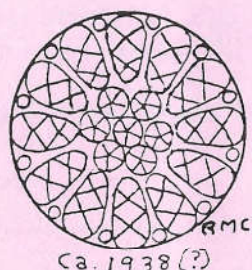
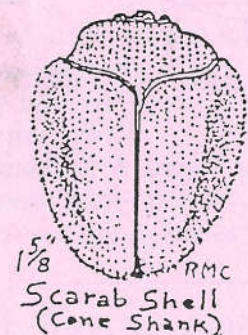
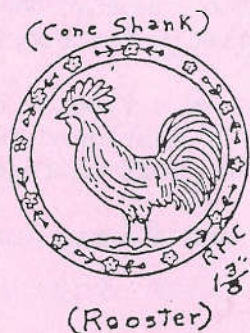

FOUR "CONE SHANK" CARNIVAL GLASS BUTTONS, AND FIVE "MODERN" CARNIVAL GLASS BUTTONS:



Much has been written about the rise in the prices of Carnival over the past several years. We sometimes fail to point out that these dramatic increases have been confined, by and large, to certain select colors, patterns, and shapes. The pastels, Rose Show, Poppy Show, Peacock pieces, red and plates have been the pieces which have soared in price. We must remember, however, that water pitchers, most Grape & Cable and pieces in purple, peach opal and marigold have not fared so well. In fact, the reverse has been true in many instances.

I thought it might be interesting to go back a few years and compare those prices with current auction prices. John & Lucile Britt held their first auction in 1975. Everyone knows John & Lucile. They have been our close friends for 20 years. They also had a super auction in 1989. A number of pieces in our collection came from one or the other of these auctions.

I have compared these 1975 Britt auction prices with those realized at various auctions in 1989. If the item did not sell in 1989, I have gone to 1988 prices. Where several of the same pieces were sold during the year, I have used the price nearest the average:

These 1975 prices total \$7,950.00 compared with \$5,685.00 for the same items sold at auctions in 1989. This represents a 28% reduction in price over a 15 year period. So not all Carnival categories have had the fantastic increases in value that we refer to so often.

But let's look at the other side of the coin. Had you been smart enough, or in all likelihood lucky enough; to buy a selection of other pieces at this same 1975 Britt auction, here is how you would have made out:

These pieces listed here sold for \$3,925.00 in 1975. In 1989 (1988 in two cases) they sold for \$18,975.00. This is a shocking increase in value of 383%. I'm sure John & Lucile wish they had held on to some of these pieces. I remember quite well, however, how high we thought those prices were in 1975.

I hope these comparisons illustrate quite clearly that all Carnival prices have not gone straight up. Some in fact have declined. It is indeed, a two-way street. And it seems to me the lesson we should learn from this is simply to diversify our buying to be assured of an increase in value. Couple this with the joy of collecting and we truly have the best of both worlds.

Our March meeting was held at the home of Bill & Barbara Hobbs on the 18th. Only 10 persons were in attendance including one of our newer members, Irene Carbone. The lack of people left those of us that did make it with an abundance of good food including Barb's lasagne. Sickness and last minute business problems seemed to take its toll of the regulars. It was unfortunate that so many missed the meal but, worse yet, they missed the business meeting and what I always enjoy, an opportunity to view the Hobbs collection.

The business meeting started with a review of the Jamboree which turned out to have more favorable comments than unfavorable ones to be said about it--little or no time was spent on the good points, however the unfavorable remarks were discussed lightly with the thought being that everyone should think things over and be prepared to discuss them at our next meeting. The following areas of concern, not unfamiliar after other jamborees, and some of the comments were as follows:

ADMISSION CHARGE: Should we request a small donation for admission? (On the order of \$1.00 per person). People attending the show did not want to sign a guest register. One thought put forth was that the fee would cover a door prize (not to be confused with our raffle) to attendees. Need not be present at drawing to win; members admitted free.

OLD VS. NEW CARNIVAL GLASS: AGAIN--Since it appears that this problem arises at every jamboree (We DO advertise as OLD Carnival Glass show) it has been suggested that sellers be required to tag new Carnival Glass as such if it is offered for sale. A possible interpretation of "NEW" could be that which is not listed in price lists such as Edwards or Hartung or Presznick handbooks.

TABLE RENTAL CONTRACTS: Tables were assigned in past without benefit of contract. Contract could be used to insure compliance with requirements to label "new" glass. Breach of contract could result in denial of rental tables at later events. Also covered would be hours of manning tables to insure adherence to show hours.

BANQUET MEAL: "London Broil" is different apparently based on local customs. Some unfavorable remarks on that selection. Other selections will be available in the future.

DATE OF 1991 JAMBOREE: 1991 will be the 10th Annual Jamboree. We will hold to some relative schedule. Coordination with Texas Club and Tom Burns Auction has been completed to avoid possible conflict. Dates are February 7, 8, 9, 1991

OFFICIAL CLUB ROOM: The Club will retain one room for conduct of business, coffee, whatever during the Jamboree. This will reduce imposition on members rooms, also, room is not to be haven for overnight guests.

PROGRAMS: We are now looking for "Volunteers" and or ideas for our 10th Anniversary Jamboree. Your ideas/suggestions are welcome--please let someone on our committees or Club officer know. Let's make the 10th an unforgettable affair!

Many of the items outlined above were left unfinished because of lack of persons at meeting--we hope to have more people present at the next meeting to put forth their opinions and thoughts. If you can't be present then write.

Now about our next meeting. It is going to be held on April 22, 1990, since the 3rd Sunday turns out to be Easter. It is a no cost, no effort (except to be there) deal!

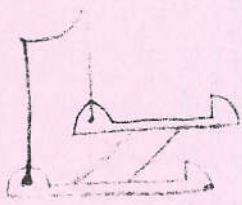
