THE FLORAL ACCENT CUP AND SAUCER

This little marigold cup and saucer is a cute little piece of Carnival Glass and due to its small size, we are calling it a demitasse cup and saucer. Demitasse is a small cup that is used for after dinner black coffee. We have seen many of these small demitasse cups and saucers, usually made of china such as R. S. Germany or R. S. Prussia. While this Carnival Glass example is a little smaller than the popular "Kittens" cup and saucer, we are quite sure that this one is not a part of a child's set.

The saucer is 3 3/4 inches wide and is slightly over 3/4 of an inch high. The cup is 2 1/8 inches high with a top opening of 2 3/8 inches. The base is 1½ inches in diameter. The floral design is attractive and the hand painting is very well done. The flowers used in the decorating appears to be that of the Babys Breath.

We have seen only two of these little Floral Accent cup and saucers. The first one was sold at the I.C.G.A. Convention auction at La Crosse, Wisconsin. It was purchased by an ardent miniature collector for \$145.00. We purchased our set at the Canadian auction several years ago and it fits in very well in our miniature collection.

We suspect that these were made in Czechoslovakia or some other country in that area, but of course that is only a guess on our part. This tiny set would make a nice addition to any Carnival Glass collection, but should be especially interesting to the miniature collectors.

This article on the little miniature Floral Accent demitasse cup and saucer is #142 in our Pictorial Pattern Parade series. We hope that you have found it interesting.

NORTHWOOD PEACOCK AT THE FOUNTAIN TUMBLERS

Peacock at the Fountain was certainly one of Northwood's most popular patterns. It was probably exceeded only by their famous Grape & Cable. It is an impressive well-done pattern with an intriguing design. The pattern was made in many different pieces including the water set, table set, berry set, punch set, compote and a large footed orange bowl. Peacock at the Fountain pieces are also found in a wide range of colors including the pastels. The fruit bowl, compote and punch sets are known to exist in aqua opalescent, even though they are extremely rare in that color. Unfortunately for the tumbler collector, no tumbler or water pitcher has ever been reported in aqua opalescent.

The Peacock at the Fountain tumblers are graceful, beautiful and easily found, especially in purple, cobalt blue and marigold. Green, white and ice blue tumblers are much more difficult to obtain. The electric blue example is fantastic and that color is in big demand by collectors today. We have never seen a Peacock at the Fountain tumbler in ice green. A number of unusual colored tumblers have been reported however, including smoke, lavender and amber. We once purchased 5 tumblers in this pattern, all at one place, that actually had an amberish with amethyst tint base color, but the iridescence had a super reddish amber glow. In other words, when setting on the table, they appeared to be a shade of red. More people commented on those tumblers for beauty than any tumblers that we ever owned.

The Peacock at the Fountain tumblers and water pitchers were also made by the Dugan Glass Company. Richard Owens, author of the book "Carnival Glass Tumblers", calls this one "Peacock at the Fountain, Varient". Some collectors refer to it as "Dugan's Peacock at the Fountain". It was no doubt a copy of the Northwood version. It is noticeably different. It is shown in the above photo in the very rare amber color. The big majority of these Dugan Peacock tumblers were made in cobalt blue.

Here is how to tell the difference between these two tumblers. First of all, most Northwood Peacock tumblers are signed, but not all, so you can't take for granted that all unsigned tumblers are Dugan. Secondly, the Dugan examples look and are a little smaller. They look squarish in shape and are narrower at both the top and bottom. The Northwood version tends to flare out slightly towards the top. The overall design on the Dugan tumbler is not raised in relief nearly as much as those made by Northwood. Differences appear in the Peacock wing, tail feathers and headdress. Major differences are found in the tree design and fountain area. These features are much more pronounced on the Northwood examples. We have noticed that with the Dugan tumbler, where the three top knots extend up above the head of the peacock, that the figures at the top look much like tulip blossoms. These same three figures are just ovals

that resemble small plums on all the Northwood Peacock tumblers that we have seen. Another point of difference and quite interesting, is that the top row of beading of the fountain on the Dugan tumblers have six beads while the Northwood tumblers have eight of the beads on the top row. Both companies used twenty four background panels, but they are much more pronounced on the Northwood examples. These differences should help even the beginning collector to tell the difference between these two variations.

In my study of the Peacock at the Fountain tumblers, we have discovered another varient tumbler which is somewhat different from the above two examples. This one is not signed, but does contain a large circle in the inside bottom of the base. We believe this to be a plunger mark. Instead of the 24 panels used on the first two tumblers, this one has 21 panels in the background. Also, instead of the six and eight beads found on the top row of the fountain, which were used on the previous described tumblers, this varient has seven beads. We have seen a number of these tumblers around, but in much less quantity than the former two examples.

This is #154 in our Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will feature the Satin Jewels tumbler. This pattern was named by Richard Owens and is shown and described in his very fine tumbler book.

MAIL BIDDERS IN GLASS AUCTIONS - - THE SECOND CLASS CITIZENS

Most glass auctions I have attended here in the Midwest start out by welcoming the participants and usually follow by an announcement that write-in bids will be entered as if you were present and bidding. The advance sale flyers have similar statements that would have you believe that you are a welcome and equal bidder in the sale. But it's all down hill from there.

Throughout the day remarks are woven into the sale degrading the lowly writein bidder. The people attending the sale are reminded repeatedly that they
are the chosen ones. Why? Because of the great expense and effort on their
part to attend the sale. That's baloney. They are there for many reasons:
because they enjoy the thrill of the sale, they want to see what they are
buying, visit with their many friends, some are bargain hunters. Does anyone
think mail bidders are somehow different? We would all like to attend each
auction for all the same reasons. But for various reasons such as work, distance, health or just can't afford to, we cannot attend all auctions.

Millions of dollars are spent each year in coin auctions by mail bidders. Why? Because it is a perfectly respectable way to add to ones collection. Any typically coin auctions state that "a floor bidder must bid higher than the highest mail bid to be awarded any lot." Why should glass collectors be treated any differently? The floor bidders have all the advantages of seeing what they are buying. We have all seen glass go to a lower bid from the floor because the auctioneer finds it's easier than mailing it. On the other hand he has no trouble at all with the mail bids that are so high that he can't even get a bid from the floor.

The Mil bidders benefit to the seller and the auctioneer should be obvious. Instead of a room of say 100 maybe bidders (as some are just lookers and listeners), the seller's glass is now offered to several hundred serious collectors all over the world. The buyer is notified by collect call and pays for shipping, so what is the problem? Why does this attitude exist? Come on guys, give us a break. We love your auctions and love our glass collecting hobby, but please, when you look down on us from the auction platform and cry about the pesky mail bidder, please realize you are talking to the guy who might have wanted to bid by mail in your next sale, BUT YOU TALKED HIM OUT OF IT.
