Survivors include two sons and a daughter-in-law and sisters Delores Wilson and Bonnie Ferguson.



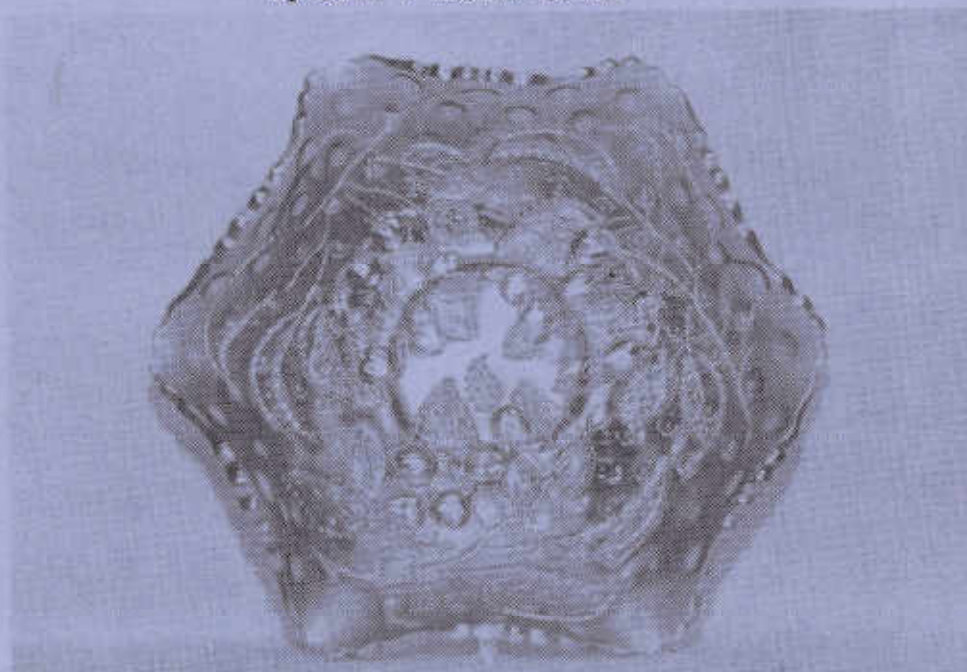


PHOTO #1 MILLERSBURG CHERRIES SHOWING THE FRONT VIEW OF THE BOWL

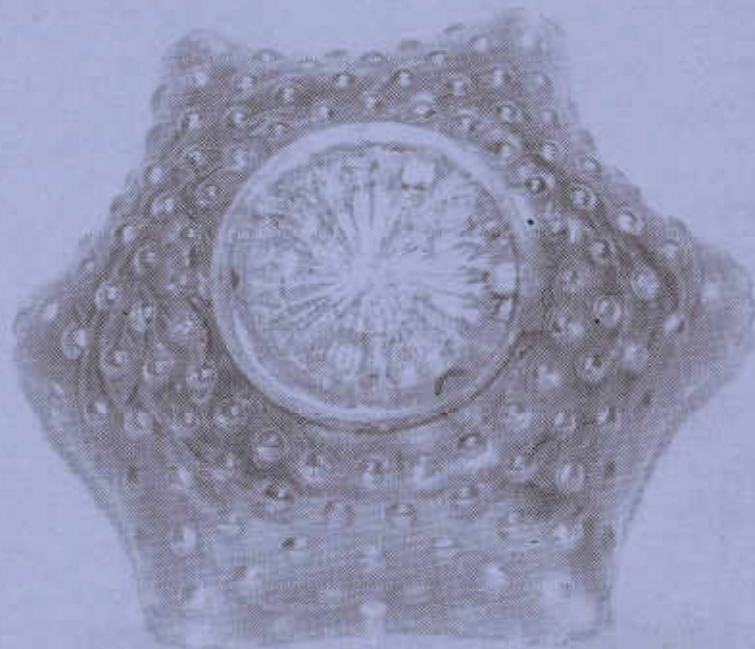


PHOTO #2 EXTERIOR OF THE CHERRIES BOWL SHOWING THE HOBNAIL PATTERN

MILLERSBURG CHERRIES WITH HOBNAIL EXTERIOR

Photo #1 shows the front side of this pretty Millersburg bowl. It contains three large clusters of cherries and leaves in very realistic forms. The bowl measures 10 inches from outermost point to point. This six ruffles shape was very popular with Millersburg and was used on quite a number of their bowl patterns. The color is very dark marigold with radiant iridescence that has been applied to both the interior and exterior of the bowl.

Photo #2 illustrates the Hobnail exterior. It contains five rows of hobnails that circle around the bowl. The collar base, or what glass makers call the marie, contains an unusual designed 24 point star. This same design is also found on the collar base of the Millersburg Vintage/Hobnail and Zig Zag bowls.

While the marigold example in this pattern is very rare, one in amethyst is even more hard to find. We know of only 5 in that color. We have not seen one in green, but it has been reported by Jack Wilson in his Millersburg research notes. Bill Edwards reports one in blue. A very rare 5 inch sauce has also been reported by both Wilson and Edwards.

The Millersburg Vintage bowls were also made with this same hobnail exterior. These can also be found in both the large and small 5 inch size. All of these are very desirable Millersburg pieces of Carnival Glass. More on the Millersburg Vintage/Hobnail pattern in a later issue.

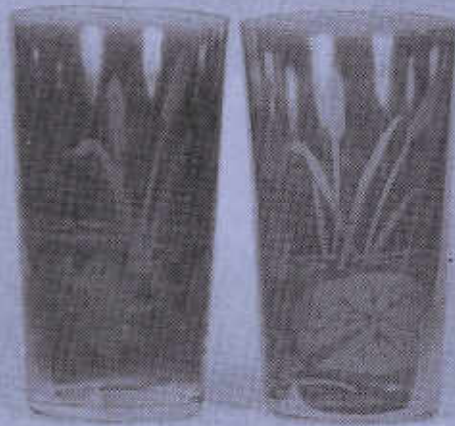
This has been entry #146 into the Pictorial Pattern Parade. We hope that you have found it interesting and educational.

LATE WATERLILY TUMBLERS

We first read about this tumbler in Richard Owens very fine book on Carnival Glass tumblers. Cecil Whitley also included it in her informative book "The World of Enamelled Carnival Glass Tumblers". If you collect enamelled or painted type tumblers, this book is a "must". We were very pleased to see that Bill Edwards had included this tumbler in his very popular revised second edition "The Standard Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass". He also described it extremely well and most accurate. Here is his description. For one of the later patterns in Carnival Glass, this is certainly a good one. The coloring is superior, the shape symmetrical, and the design of waterlilies and cattails very attractive.

The Late Waterlily tumblers can be found in marigold and cranberry. We have found them to be harder to locate in the cranberry color. It is a little taller than most tumblers, standing at 4 3/4 inches tall. Most collectors call this an ice tea tumbler. We have always liked this tumbler. It is not hard to find, modestly priced and certainly lives up to Ken & Aileen Oppenlander's slogan "Beauty on a Budget".

This marks our 158th entry into the Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will cover the Adams Ribs tumbler.

This Peek Into the Past article will cover Carnival Glass that was listed for sale from a single Antique Trader dated August 27, 1974. It is especially interesting to us because we purchased a very nice piece from this particular Trader and also sold a good many pieces from our ad that was placed in this issue.

THE BRASS DOLPHIN, LONG BEACH, NEW YORK: Purple Persian Medallion 11 1/2" bowl, beautiful \$95.00; purple Nesting Swan, extra fine \$180.00; amethyst Concord 9" flat plate, excellent color & iridescence \$300.00; ice green Peacock & Urn nearly 11" in diameter, chop plate, N marked, rare \$1,000.00. (Writers note: This is the same plate that George & Mavis Loescher now own. We are not sure whether they purchased it from this ad or whether they bought it later at a lower price. Anyway, it is a super and very rare chop plate. The Brass Dolphin was Jay O'Donnell's name for his work shop. Some of you older members will probably remember Jay, and his friend Joy Dumbaugh, coming to Carnival Glass auctions and conventions together, back in the early 1970's. Jay passed away a good many years ago. He was very knowledgable in Carnival Glass and sent many pieces of Carnival to Mrs. Hartung for use in her Carnival Glass books.

CAUDLE ANTIQUES, STATE ROAD, NORTH CAROLINA: Marigold Fisherman mug, rare \$125.00; blue Fisherman mug, hard to find \$75.00. (Writers note: We can well remember this ad. I called and bought the blue mug as we had never heard of one in that color. It became a part of our mug collection, which in our opinion, was one of the nicer and larger mug collections in the country. This blue Fisherman, the marigold Heron, the white Orange Tree, the large green Orange Tree shaving mug and the marigold Panelled Palm were the rarest of the mugs that we owned. Our favorites were the peach opalescent Fisherman, aqua opalescent Singing Birds, aqua opalescent Dandelion and the ice blue and ice green Knights Templar (Dandelion) mugs. We might add, that to the best of our knowledge, there are still only 3 blue Fisherman mugs that have ever been reported.

TOM BURNS, BATH, NEW YORK: Aqua opal Leaf & Beads rose bowl \$95.00; smokey Zipper Loop lamp \$180.00; aqua Orange Tree mug \$43.00; peach opal Caroline hand grip bowl \$34.00. (Writers note: Even though Tom is much younger than we are, I guess he has been buying and selling Carnival Glass for about as long as we have. The first time we ever met Tom was at the 1972 I.C.G.A. Convention that was held at Rochester, New York. He was really just a kid then and was running down the halls and through the rooms just about like a kid. Everybody liked him because he was so friendly and energetic and always on the go. Our relationship with him goes back a good many years. For a number of years when Bob Vining was President of I.C.G.A., he often asked me to supervise the convention auctions. I always would get Tom as one of my helpers



because he was a good runner and kept everybody laughing, and of course, he also knew the patterns well. It is quite possible that these convention auctions in the early years might of had something to do with his decision to become an auctioneer.)

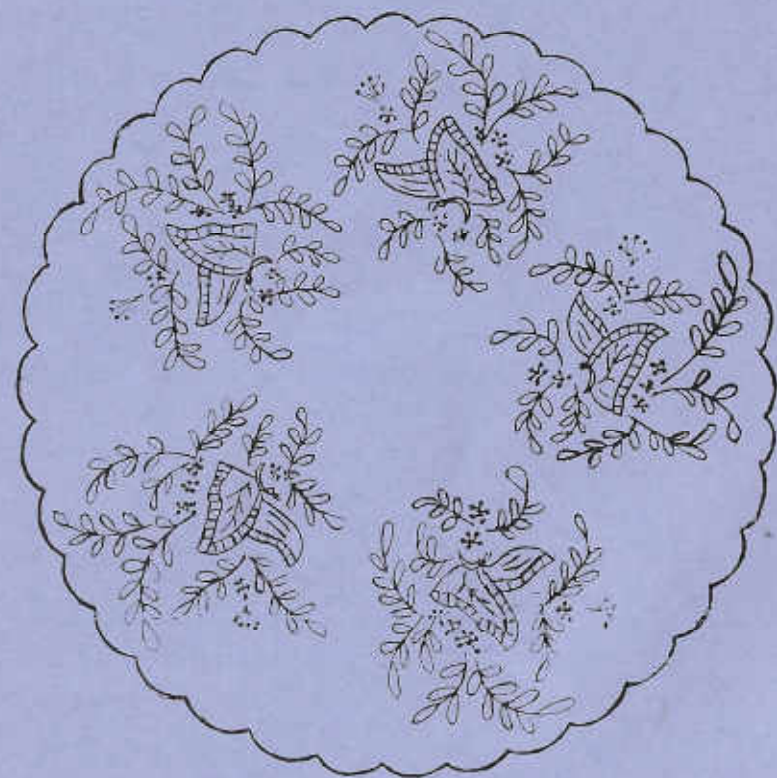


## AUSSIE NATIVE FLORA

Here we have an interesting section of the Australian Carnival Glass patterns. While this country is known for some of the most spectacular wild flowers and some of the greatest variety in the world today, it has puzzled me as to why the mold makers only concentrated on four species, namely only Wattle, Waratah, Christmas Bells, and Flannel Flowers.

It could be speculated that it was easy not to have too great a variety which would naturally keep costs down and the other observation being that the Crystal Glass Company was incorporated in the State of New South Wales, and hence chose those wild flowers predominately found locally. Whatever the reason, it has limited large differences that could have been, and this is such a pity as the compotes which I am dealing with in this article are some of the most outstanding ever made by any Carnival Glass manufacturer, with iridescence that is unequalled and on top of that, an excellent consistency in quality control particularly in the amethyst.

Not all compotes were made in all shapes and sizes, but generally they could be found in round, fluted and flat cake plate styles from 7" in diameter with a height of 5" through to the largest of 14" in diameter standing 10" high.

The large pencil drawing shown here is with five butterflies on some type of bush strongly suspected to be wattle. I have left the center blank on purpose as the following individual sketches were used singularly to be placed in that area to give variety and appeal to the purchaser.



SKETCH 1 - BUTTERFLY - When this figure was placed in the center of the large drawing, the compote was called Butterfly Bush and was found in both the small and large sizes and is relatively easy to find and leads one to believe that because of this it must have had great appeal to the consumer for the company to produce greater quantities of this as against others.

SKETCH 2 - WARATAH - This was the next most popular compote in the found and ruffled styles, although I believe I have the only one known in the amethyst cake plate style. I have noticed in all examples I have seen in the ruffled compote, the waratah has been flattened, while in the other shape this flower stands out clearly. My research on this strange occurrence has not come up with any feasible theories as yet.

SKETCH 3 - CHRISTMAS BELLS - As a lover of the Australian natives, this is one of my favorites, as I very much admire the delicate brightly colored red and yellow flowers popping up amongst our somewhat rugged scrub at Christmas. Just as Christmas is a bright spot in our somewhat torrid world today, a similar contrast can be seen in our bushland. The pattern is only found on the small compotes in all the shapes.

SKETCH 4 - FLANNEL FLOWERS - Individually, the flannel flowers, which incidentally derives its name from the close resemblance to the feel of the flannel fabric, and while pleasant to look at, is nothing startling and closely resembles most daisies. It is quite often seen in large clumps and the mass of



stark white is an outstanding contrast to a somewhat dull green of the surrounding bushland. This compote is the least interesting of the four already dealt with and is generally found in the large round and flat plate shapes. While none of these compotes are rare, the flannel flowers is probably the least found.

One may consider this to be a bit of trivia, but it is interesting to note that the background pattern of the five butterflies in the case of the waratah and Christmas Bells, the butterflies face from right to left, whereas in the case of the Butterfly Bush and Flannel Flowers, they face left to right. As with all significant Australian Carnival Glass, the above were made only in marigold and amethyst during the mid 1920's.
