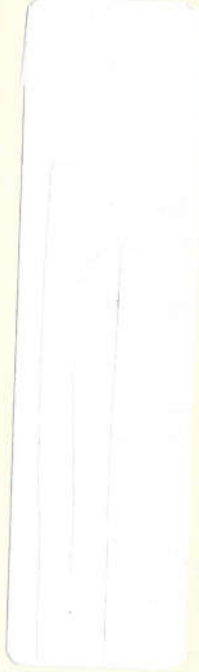

THE STUDS TUMBLER

The Studs tumbler was made considerably later than most of the tumblers that we have covered in this series. It is however, a cute little tumbler and we think it should be in every tumbler collection. It is listed as #210 in Richard Owens' popular Carnival Glass tumbler book. Mrs. Marion Hartung sketches the pitcher of this pattern in her book #8 on page 96. Bill Edwards shows this tumbler in color on page 196 of his Standard Encyclopedia of Carnival Glas, revised 2nd edition.

This tumbler is part of a juice set which also includes a small pitcher and a tray. It is a pedestal footed type tumbler that is 3 7/8" high. It has a top and base diameter of 2 1/4". There are twelve rows of studs that go around the tumbler. This studs type design covers almost the entire tumbler. The only color reported is marigold which appears to be more of a honey amberish type color with light iridescence.

This pattern is known as Holiday by the depression glass collectors. The maker is the Jeanette Glass Company of Jeanette, Pennsylvania.

This is our 164th entry into this series. Next month we will cover the very beautiful and rare Graceful tumbler.

ZIPPER STITCH CORDIALS

Photo #1 is a close up of the Zipper Stitch cordials. These pretty little pieces are quite tiny, measuring only 3 3/4 inches high with a top opening of 1 1/2 inches. The base is 1 3/4 inches in diameter and contains a 12 pointed star pressed into the underside. There are six panels that go around the cordial, each panel carrying the Zipper Stitch pattern. The stem has six plain panels that extend out onto the base.

Photo #2 shows the complete set of six cordials, decanter and tray. The same Zipper Stitch design, in a much larger version, is used on both the decanter and tray. It comes in a good rich marigold and is believed to have been made in Czechoslovakia.

This is a very attractive and rare set. The small size and streamlined effect adds to its beauty and desirability. The example that is shown is the only complete set that we have seen. A few single cordials are known to exist.

This article, on the rare Zipper Stitch cordials and cordial set, is our 152nd entry into this series. We hope that you have found it interesting.

August 17, 1991: Had two choices, but didn't take either of them. The Louis Waldsmith estate sale at Vandalia, Ohio had some neat items like the Indiana Amish made surrey with the fringe on top that had only been hitched once. A lot of glass advertised such as the Acorn Burr (no color given) domed candy dish, double handled candy dish, cream & sugar set. A novel way to advertise a "table set" to say the least. The 500 pieces of Imperial only rated six lines in the ad and sounded like newer glass to us.

The second choice was an all Carnival Glass auction at Linwood, Michigan. A very nice colored brochure detailed some good glass that included an ice blue Peacock at the Fountain punch set with four good cups that brought \$6,000.00. Friends told us the sale was somewhat different than the Carnival auctions we normally attend. For example, it was held in a long pole barn (rain kept the temperature down) that was hard to reach because the "one street" town was having a "Pickle Days" parade prior to sale time. Also as the glass was sold it was put in the "Bull Pen" until check out time. The auctioneer did give the city and state that the successful mail bid came from--sounds like a good idea to us.

August 24, 1991: Three local sales to check out. It was up at six, which is an awful early hour for a couple of retirees, to get to the first sale in Ohio. The ad said "Carnival" which turned out to be a green Chrysanthemum footed bowl that was cracked from one side to the other.

The second sale advertised "lots of Carnival" and it was nearby so worth a look. "Lots" was a play on words as there was less than 10 pieces, the best of which was a marigold Hattie bowl.

The third sale was back in Indiana and the hour difference in time allowed us to get there before the sale started. All to see the "15 pieces of Carnival" which we had a hard time finding half that many.

We came to one conclusion--know your auctioneer and how he advertises before devoting much effort to the search. Two of the auctioneers must have been schooled in "Modern Math" as they sure couldn't count. Or maybe they do not recognize Carnival Glass when they see it. On the way home we stopped at a mall and saw more ordinary Carnival. Ninety nine miles and no purchases but we did see over a thousand marbles to be sold at one of the auctions. They made a nice display.

For us August was a slow auction month but we are looking forward to the busy September and October schedule.

I would like to thank Mr. Frank Fenton for responding to my article on radioactive vaseline and verifying that it is truly radioactive.

I was fortunate enough to get to talk to Frank and Tom at the Fenton Factory while I was attending the A.C.G.A. Convention. There is probably no one that knows more about glass than them. Frank said that he doesn't believe that Radium was ever an ingredient of vaseline glass. Although his article was dealing with new vaseline, I now believe that Uranium is the radioactive element that makes old Carnival vaseline glass glow also.

It is possible that the Gamma-Scan did pick up gamma rays from a Radium atom because Uranium can decay down to Thorium, Radium, Radon (which comes from Radium) and several other elements on its way to becoming lead.

After talking to Frank and a little research, I no longer believe Radium was put into this cheap (at the time) glass because it is very rare. It's like blue Millersburg or red Carnival Glass and Uranium is like marigold Stippled Rays. Of course, it is also possible and probable that the Gamma-Scan computer needed to be calibrated.

I do still believe that there is a wide variance in the amount of Uranium in old Carnival vaseline. The color of old vaseline varies widely from piece to piece which is related to the amount of Uranium. The Atomic Energy Commission wasn't organized until after World War II, so there was no governing in the use of Uranium. In fact, Uranium was only discovered to give off radiation in 1896 by Henri Becquerel. No one knew about the effects for a long time. There was no knowledge of depleted Uranium. Naturally occurring Uranium really doesn't need to be depleted anyway. That is just to get the fissionable Uranium 235 out which is less than 1% anyway. You have to enrich Uranium 238 with Uranium 235 to use it in nuclear plants to get a sustained chain reaction.

The piece I had checked would have wound up buried in the radioactive waste site in South Carolina if I had taken it into the radiologically controlled area at the plant. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission set up these guidelines for nuclear plants and it doesn't apply to other industries. If nothing else, it shows how ultra conservative nuclear power plants are.

It was ten times higher than the N.R.C. limit, but it was still low compared to many other things. Like Frank said, you will get more radiation from the sun. You will also get more from jet travel, medical uses, smoking, lantern mantels, dental porcelain, bricks, fertilizers, wallboard, soil, rocks to name a few. Believe it or not, you will also get more from the person you're standing next to. The average adult human body contains enough Potassium 40, Carbon 14, Uranium and Thorium daughters to give a radiation dose comparable to about one chest X-ray every year.

Even with the varying amounts of Uranium, some fissionable material, higher than N.R.C. limits, a possible Radium atom here and there, old Carnival Vaseline is not dangerous.

Thanks again to Frank and Tom for taking time from their busy schedules to talk with me.

CARNIVAL CONVENTION AUCTION HOSTED BY THE WOODY TEAM

Woody Auction Company recently hosted a truly magnificent Carnival Glass auction in conjunction with the annual Convention of the Heart of America Carnival Glass Association (H.O.A.C.G.A.). The more than 400 piece collection, which belonged to Mr. and Mrs. Delton Kemp, sold April 27, 1991, at the Holiday Inn of Lenexa, Kansas.

The Kemps, thoroughly famous in the H.O.A.C.G.A. and modestly famous in the midwest, had collected Carnival Glass "since collecting became a term" before the 1970's. When the Kemps announced their intention to sell with John and LaVeta Woody as sale managers; and at the Convention to boot, the dye was cast; the auction was a grand success before it started!

Eyes opened wide when Woody brought down \$6,500.00 for an extremely rare Rose Show plate in marigold over milk glass and widened even further when a rare Goddess of Harvest 8" bowl in amethyst earned \$6,750.00.

With many, many \$600.00 to \$900.00 items between, some exceptional show-stoppers were a Millersburg Bellflower compote in green, taken for \$2,300.00 Rose Show bowl in ice blue for \$1,600.00; Christmas compote in marigold for \$2,100.00; Holly 8" bowl in red for \$1,125.00; and a Fenton ruffled Good Luck bowl in marigold for \$1,100.00.

Magnificent in marigold, a Rose Show Variet plate shot bidding to \$1,750.00 a Rustic funeral vase in amethyst brought \$1,050.00, B.P.O.E. Elk Bell, Atlantic City, 1911 sold at \$1,400.00, a Princess lamp in purple was taken at \$1,700.00 and top bids of \$1,050.00 each purchased 6" red vases, one in the Wild Rose pattern, the other pattern uncertain.
