The set of five Commemorative Souvenir Bells are now complete. These bells commenorate the original Glass companies that produced the major portion of the Carnival Glass. Northwood, Fenton, Millersburg, Imperial, and Dugan. Each different bell features a portrait of the glass company founder. The Circle Scroll is used as its' pattern and it also has the Fenton logo.

The 1985 souvenir bell, commemorating the Northwood Glass Co. has the portrait of its' fonder, Harry Northwood. This bell was made in Ruby Red Carnival and is now sold out.

The 1986 bell was made in Lime Green Opalescent with a beautiful Marigold iridescence, commenorating the Fenton Art Glass Co. and has a portrait of its founder, Frank L. Fenton.

The 1987 bell is Cobalt Blue, which is a rare color for the Millersburg Glass Co. The portrait on the bell is of John W. Fenton, its' founder.

The 1988 bell recognizes the <u>Imperial Glass Co.</u> and its' founder, <u>Edward Muhleman</u> and is a beautiful Marigold. The 1989 bell, the last of the <u>Series</u>, commemorates the <u>Dugan Glass Co.</u> The portrait is of <u>Thomas E. A. Dugan</u>, its' founder. The color of the bell is Fentons Teal Marigold.

PICTORIAL PATTERN PARADE By John & Lucile Britt




PHOTO #1 UNUSUAL AND RARE FUCHSIA BON BON IN BLUE

This pretty bon bon was found by Richard and Roberta Conley of Silver Spring, Maryland. It is not listed or shown in any of the books that we have seen or read. We wish to thank the Conley's for letting us photograph this piece and add it to our Pictorial Pattern Parade series.

After considerable study of different types of flowers in many books and catalogs and with the Conley's approval, we have decided to call this pattern "Fuchsia". It looks more like that species than any other type of flowers that we are familiar with.

This piece is photographed laying on it's side. The bowl part sets on a short stemmed or footed type base. The Fuchsia bon bon was made in the same shape as Fenton's Wreath of Roses bon bon. It is so near alike that one could actually pass it by as a Wreath of Roses bon bon unless you took a better look. The Wreath of Roses bon bon is shown in color in "Fenton Glass - the First Twenty-Five Years" by William Heacock. It is #268 and is on page 54 of that very fine book on Fenton glass.

While we did not realize it at the time that we first viewed the Conley bon bon we did have a photo of one of these Fuchsia bon bons in marigold. This photo




PHOTO #2 UNUSUAL AND RARE FUCHSIA BON BON IN MARIGOLD

was taken perhaps 8 to 10 years ago. It was owned by Sterling Butz, which at that time lived in Allentown, Pennsylvania. We recently tried to get in contact with Mr. Butz regarding this piece, but was unable to do so.

We are showing the marigold example in Photo #2. We are sure that you will agree thatit is the same pattern as the blue example. These are the only two pieces that we know about in this pattern. We suspect that there are a few more out there somewhere, however.

Most collectors who have seen this Fuchsia bon bon believe it to have been made by Fenton. Of course, we are not completely sure at the present time, as to the maker. We would like to find out more information on this pattern, if possible. If any of you in the Allentown, Pennsylvania area know where to contact Sterling Butz, we would appreciate hearing from you. He owns, or did own at one time, the marigold example that is shown in this article.

EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES By John & Lucile Britt



THE FIR CONES TUMBLER

Here is a beautiful Carnival Glass tumbler that is known as Fir Cones. It is one that really took to our liking. We first heard of this tumbler when Dick & Joan Bird of Australia sent us a colored photo of it. They had found it in Australia. We fell in love with the piece from the photo and thought to ourselves - - here is a tumbler that we would really like to own. About two years later we were able to purchase one of these that had been found in Argentina. In 1992 we were fortunate to purchase another one that was also found in that country.

In our experience of trying to research foreign made Carnival Glass, we have learned that just because a piece or pieces of Carnival Glass were found in a certain country, such as Australia or Argentina, did not necessarily mean that they were made in that country. After considerable reading and research, we found the Fir Cones pattern listed in "Carnival Glass Worldwide" by Marion Quintin-Baxendale. She shows the tumbler along with the water pitcher as #145 in her book. She reports that it was made by the Finland Riihimaki works. She reports that it was also thought to be a Kauklahti model.


The three tumblers that we know about in this pattern are all in the cobalt

blue color. We suspect that they were also made in marigold, but have not heard of one in that color. The iridescence and color was very nice on the two that we have seen.

The Fir Cones tumbler is considerably smaller than most American made tumblers. They stand only 3 3/8 inches high. The polished base is 2 inches in diameter and is perfectly smooth. The top opening is 2 3/8 inches wide. There are 12 panels placed around the tumbler with a one inch wide band containing fir cone and leaves. This band circles the outside center of the tumbler. The shape, panels and band used with the tumbler are very similar to that found on the Band of Roses tumbler. See the H.O.A.C.G.A. tumbler book for a photo of the Band of Roses tumbler. We consider the Fir Cones tumbler as rare, beautiful and very desirable.

This Fir Cones tumbler marks our 173rd entry into our Educational Tumbler Series. We hope that you have found it interesting and educational.

May 21-24, 1992: Keystone Convention, Brookville, Pennsylvania. This is always a fun Convention and Chairman Denny Keck from nearby Punxsutawney, as usual, did a super job organizing the event. This very cooperative Days Inn has a good restaurant and we had a superior banquet followed by the popular white elephant sale (we laughed until our sides ached). The Hospitality Room had many goodies and was open long and often. We took a cake to help celebrate our 45th Wedding Anniversary which fell during the Convention.

It wasn't all eating and visiting because there were two outstanding educational programs conducted by knowledgeable collectors. Gary Heckenberger presented "Colors in Carnival" and had the seldom seen pieces to illustrate the various colors. Don Hamlet brought some 30 rare, rare pieces for the "Rarities" program which Tom Burns narrarated. All we can say is, you should have been there. Both were well done and what a sight to see!

Tom Burns sold some good glass from the Oran Baker collection in the auction and it was well received. Proce examples were marigold Waterlily & Cattails spittoon \$2,250.00 (we thought a bargain), blue 1914 B.P.O.E. Parkersburg Elk Bell \$2,000.00, amethyst Millersburg Rosalind plate \$2,000.00, marigold squatty Tree Trunk funeral vase \$3,400.00, purple Loganberry whimsey vase \$2,200.00 and a card of 48 buttons at \$270.00.

We found the larger Buzz-Saw in clear too (at a different time and place from the small one). If anyone has any information on these, please contact us.

We also discussed the possibility of incorporating the Club for various reasons, and decided to proceed with investigating this to see what it will take.
