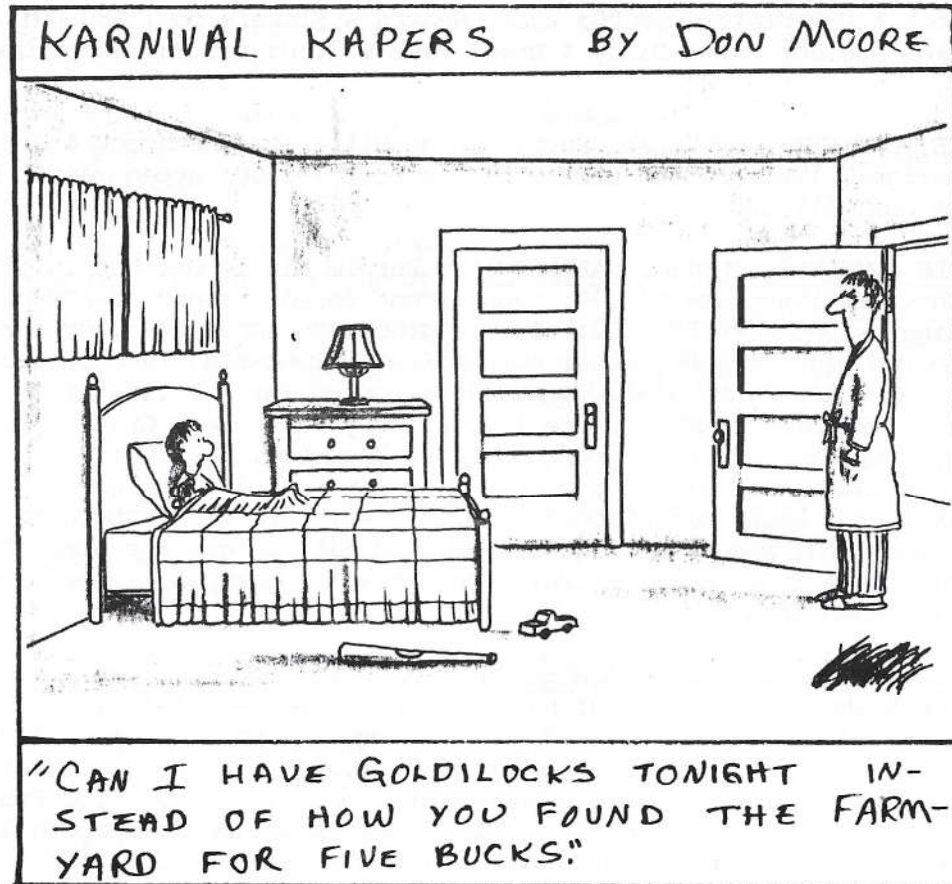
PHOTO #1: DAISY & SCROLL DECANTER & SMALL WINE OR SHOT GLASSES

Photo #1 shows the Daisy & Scroll decanter along with two of the little wine or shot glasses. These pieces are in dark marigold with very nice iridescence. The decanter is 10 3/4" high, not including the stopper. The base is 3" in diameter. The above photo was sent to us by Dick Jamieson of St. Ives, Australia, who owns this rare set. It was found in Australia, but was not made in that country.

Photo #2 on the next page, shows a close up of the little wine or shot glass. This cute little piece is in the collection of the writers. We just recently purchased this one, which came out of Argentina. It is 2 5/8" tall and 1 7/8" across the top. The base is square and is 1 3/4" wide. While the scroll type design is used twice on the decanter, this small piece has a four part mold, with the design on each of the four sides.

We have searched in vain for some clue as to where this set was made. We have a feeling that it could have been produced in Czechoslovakia or Finland, but at the present time, we can only accurately state "maker is unknown".

We are giving the credit of naming this pattern to Dick Jamieson of Australia. We believe that his choice of a name "Daisy & Scroll" fits the pattern very well.



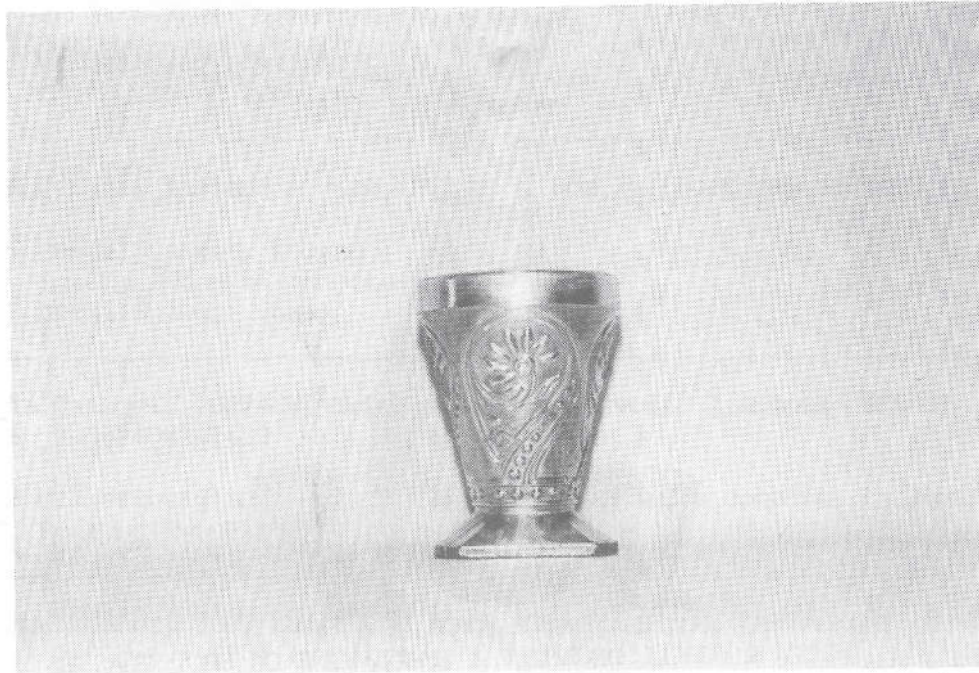
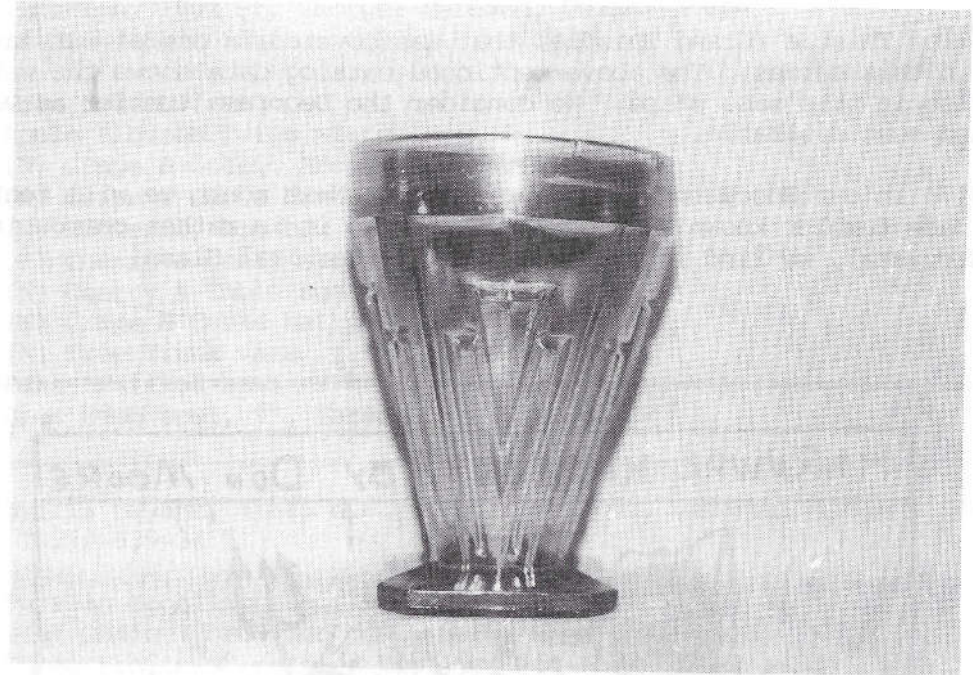


PHOTO #2: CLOSE UP OF THE LITTLE DAISY & SCROLL WINE OR SHOT GLASS

THE DECORAMA TUMBLER

The Decorama pattern was named by the late William Heacock in volume #2 of his Collecting Glass magazine. A beautiful color photo of the tumbler is shown on page 46 of that volume in ruby stain. He describes the tumbler and gave it the name "Decorama" on page 64 and 65 of that same volume. On pages 83 through 95, you will find old catalog material showing glass patterns made by Josef Inwald A.G. Prague, Czechoslovakia. This pattern, in both the tumbler and water pitcher can be found in this old catalog material, circulation 1925-1935.

Another tumbler that we wrote about in our tumbler series that we named Intaglio Stars, is also shown in that old catalog. As you might remember, I stated that the Intaglio Stars pattern was possibly made in Czechoslovakia. We have definite proof of that now.

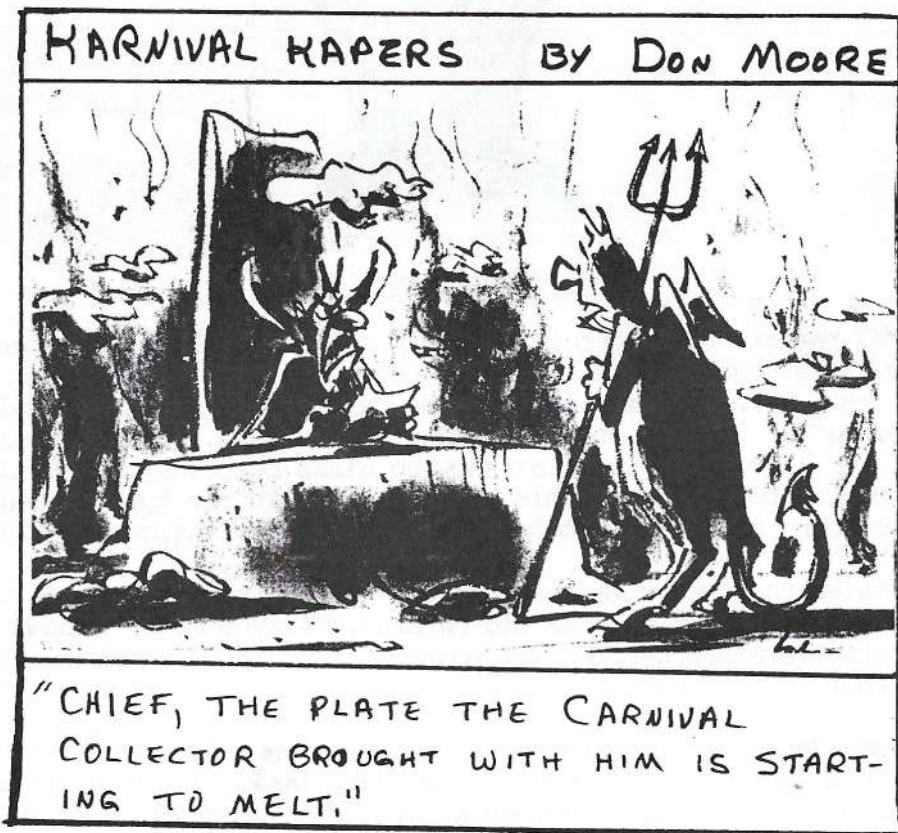
This Decorama Carnival Glass tumbler, that is shown above, is the first one of these that has ever been reported in Carnival Glass. It is in an amberish marigold color with very nice iridescence. The tumbler stands $4\frac{1}{2}$ " high with a top opening of $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". The square base is $2\frac{3}{8}$ " wide. The featured motif of this pattern is very similar to the Keystone design.

Notice that the shape of the Decorama tumbler is very much like that of the

Wide Panelled Thistle (Grand Thistle) that was covered in one of our earlier articles in this series. The above mentioned catalog data shows the water pitcher also in this same shape. We consider the Decorama tumbler as very rare, unusual and most desirable.

This is #174 in our Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will feature an American made tumbler known as Block Band. While it is rather common in ruby stain and crystal, we find it extremely rare in Carnival Glass.

THE FILE TABLE SET

File is probably the most unique of all the table sets. It is an Imperial pattern and only known in marigold. In our opinion it is different in three ways: 1. The bases. The butter dish has no collar or distinct base and is usually ground. The sugar, creamer and spooner all have dome footed bases. 2. The lines or contours. All the pieces are tapered in their vertical dimensions. 3. Pattern. Nothing comes close to the very different pattern in table sets.

While not considered rare, we believe it is quite scarce. In 20 plus years we do not recall seeing a complete set sell. Thanks to friends we were able to put our set together piece by piece. The spooner is the piece most often offered for sale, while the butter dish is by far the hardest to find. We know of several collectors looking for butter bases only. Of all the File pieces we have seen, the quality has been above average. We have been surprised at the high percentage of undamaged pieces.

How does it fit in a table set display? It stands out! If you don't believe

it, just give it the "neighbor test". Ask your neighbor which set caught his eye. If it isn't the first set mentioned, it will be the second one. The iridescence is usually good and very uniform, while the many facets in the pattern reflect light well to compliment the unique shape and make this set most appealing. While not the most expensive set we own, it is near the top in desirability.

The above is our opinion and based on our experiences. If anyone has contrary of additional information, please let us know so we can update the material.

May 30, 1992: Seeck Auction, St. Louis, Missouri. A three consignment auction with some good glass and some otherwise. Jim moved the sale right along but there were a few too many pieces for out weary bones to take in one day. The ice blue Grape & Cable punch bowl set was easily the highlight of the auction at \$10,500.00. There was a lot of mid-range glass and we thought some of it sold very well, but there had to be some very happy buyers, too.

We always enjoy traveling to St. Louis for an auction and the visiting with friends, but we were not expecting to see Joe Kambitch using a motorized scooter after a lengthy stay in the hospital, or to learn of Wes Strain's accident.

June 12-13, 1992: Burns Auction, Richfield (Cleveland), Ohio. About 75 bidders participated, including one from as far away as Colorado. We heard four consignors put this sale together. There was some very good glass and most pieces had good color and iridescence. We thought prices in general were a little soft, particularly the Millersburg pieces. About 20 percent of the glass went to mail bidders. One collector in attendance bought nine plates and three or four dealers were very active buyers.

Some price examples were red large ruffled Vintage bowl at \$4,000.00, red ruffled Chrysanthemum bowl at \$5,500.00, and a large ruffled amethyst Millersburg Peacock & Urn compote at \$1,750.00. In our opinion the sleeper of the sale was probably the aqua opalescent Beaded Cable footed rose bowl that had a base and feet that were not the usual aqua but a very different opaque blue that brought \$1,600.00. Also, a good blue God and Home water set at \$3,500.00, and a six piece ice blue Raspberry water set sold for \$3,200.00. We brought home the blue Millersburg Hobnail three piece table set and are now hoping someone can find us a blue Hobnail spooner to complete the set.

While we were at Richfield, someone bought a very nice aqua opalescent Rose Show bowl for \$12.50 at a local auction near home. Some luck!

June 17, 1992: Richmond, Indiana. A local auction with two good pieces of Carnival and hundreds of items of "stuff", some good and some otherwise. We used the opportunity to stop at a large mall in nearby Centerville. Quite a bit of Carnival scattered about the mall and a lot of it we have seen there many times before. Could it be the price vs. quality is out of line? For example, the white Peacock at the Fountain water set at about \$3,000.00 and the blue Ten Mums water set at about the same price seem to be permanent residents.

CHUCK & MARGE KREMER

Tom's auction schedule for June 12 and 13, 1992 made the second one for Richfield in five weeks. Yet it brought in a good sized crowd as usual. We went by Sugar Creek and Millersburg on the way. There are three new antique shops on the main street in Millersburg, so we checked them out. One had some pretty Carnival too.

The room was open for viewing before 4:00 P.M. and it all did look so nice. Nothing very ordinary in the whole lot. Tom sold one hundred pieces on Friday night. Having read H.O.A.C.G.A.'s "Educational Series #1" of John Britt's articles, as a reference several times, it was not until it was read cover to cover did I read about the "Lightening Flower" pattern and its comparison to the Daisy Dear, Single Flower and Caroline patterns on page 14. John's reference to this pattern is as follows:

"Another pattern that is similar to these three patterns is a Northwood pattern known as "Lightening Flower". It is shown in Presznick Book 3 p plate 125. This pattern has much more workmanship than the above Dugan Patterns. It is very rare and is used on the outside of a small nappy with a pansy pattern on the inside. It would seem that this piece was made to compete with the Imperial Pansy nappy."

Immediately bells and lights started going off in my mind. I had seen this pattern most definitely in an antique shop about 125 miles away and about one year ago. At this time my research efforts to identify this pattern proved fruitless. It was so similar to the Imperial Pansy nappy except for the outer pattern that I hesitated to buy it. After "discovering" this pattern in John's book, we immediately called him to inquire about this pattern's availability. John remembered having seen one in a Carnival Glass collection in California several years ago but has not seen any since. The base was marked with an (N). Not wasting any time, I immediately set out on my journey. There was no guarantee that after about one year the nappy would still be there, but I had to go anyway! 125 miles later I pulled up to the antique shop - "GOING OUT OF BUSINESS". After entering the shop it all came back to me and I went right to where the piece had been sitting just about one year ago. Unbelievably it was still there. Obviously no one else had "discovered" this virtually unknown Northwood pattern either. In another couple of days the shop would have been out of business!

The Lightening Flower/Pansy nappy is approximately the same size as the Imperial Pansy nappy. The color is marigold. There is a tree bark handle, with the Pansy pattern on the interior. The exterior holds the "Lightening Flower" pattern. The base has raised rays and a raised button center. There is no (N) found on the base or anywhere else on this piece.

To date this is only the second one reported in the nappy shape. Rose Presznick's book lists this pattern in a 9" plate and a 5½" compote in various colors but we are not able to verify their existence.

If anyone has this pattern in any shape or color, or has any further information to share, we want to hear from you. Please write or call.

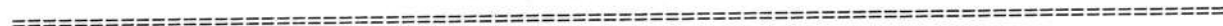

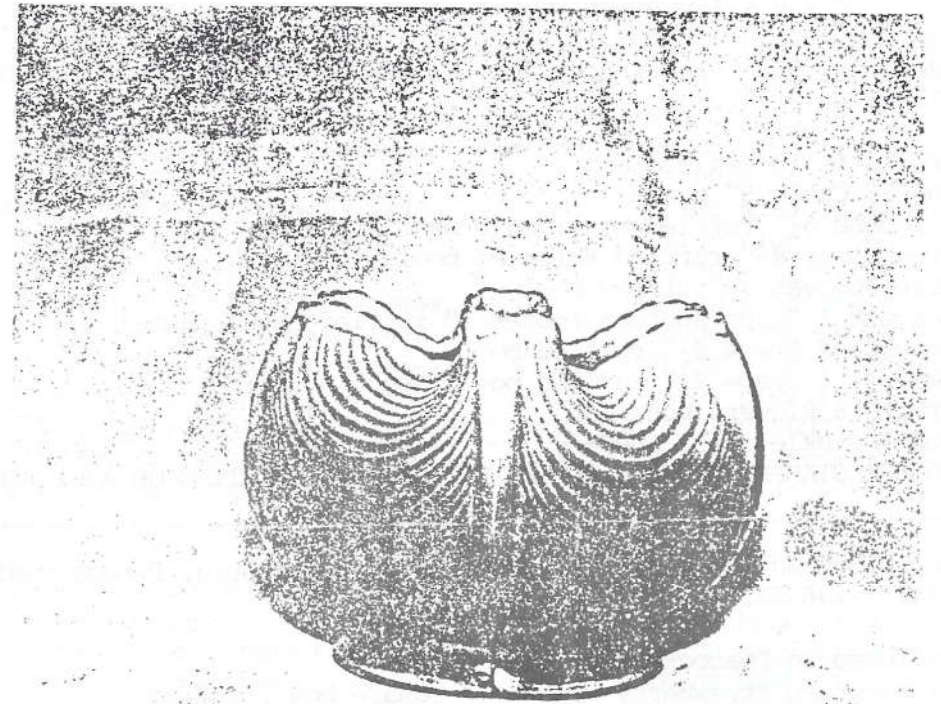




Enclosed is a photo of a tumbler which we found some time ago and have been unable to identify. We were hoping that someone could help us. We have 6 of these tumblers.
