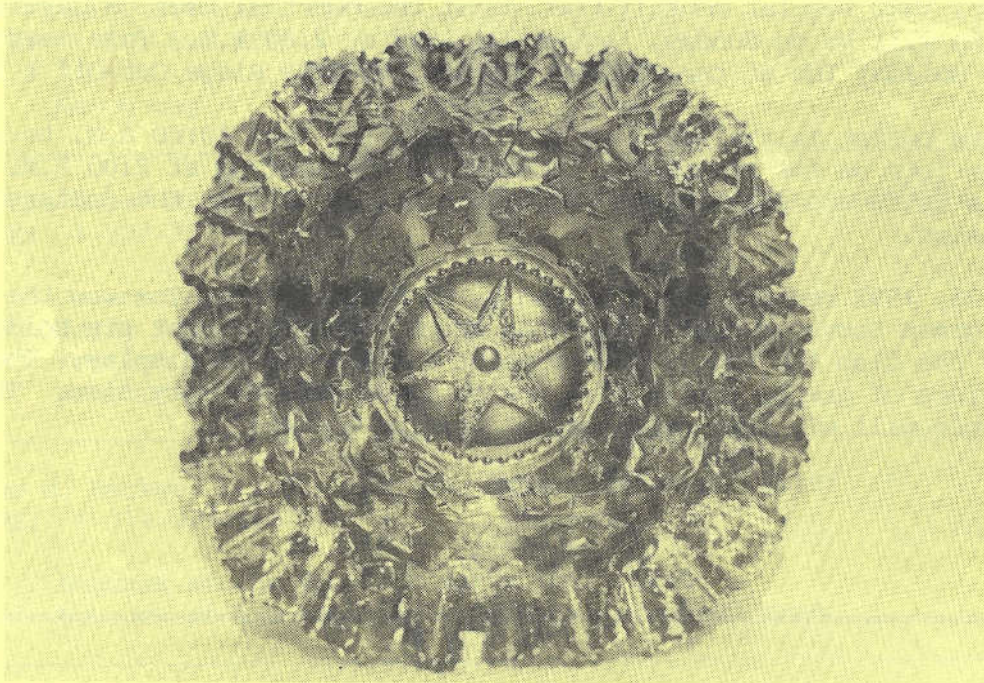

MANY STARS SQUARE BOWL - RARE

The above amethyst Many Stars bowl is the only square example of this pattern that we have ever seen. We suspect that there are a few others out there somewhere, but we have not seen or heard of them. Bowls in this pattern are usually found in the round ruffled, ice cream shape or those with the three in one edge. We have also seen one in the tri-cornered shape which is certainly very rare. Bowls are usually found in the green, amethyst, and marigold colors. Only a few examples are known to exist in blue. We have also seen a three in one edge Many Stars bowl in true vaseline. We consider them very rare in that color. All of the above bowls are great examples of Millersburg Carnival Glass.

Examples of these pieces come with either a five or a six pointed star that is found in the center of the bowl. We have seen more pieces with the six pointed star than we have of the five pointed examples. The Many Stars pattern was made only in the large bowl which usually ranges from 9 to 10 inches wide. It is possible that a rose bowl could exist since rose bowls are known in other Millersburg patterns such as Peacock & Urn, Fleur-De-Lis, Holly Sprig and Nesting Swan. A plate has been reported in this pattern, but we have never seen one and can not verify it at this time. If one does exist, it would be extremely rare. A geometric type pattern is often used on the reverse side of many Millersburg patterns. In the case of the Many Stars bowl, the Trefoil Fine Cut

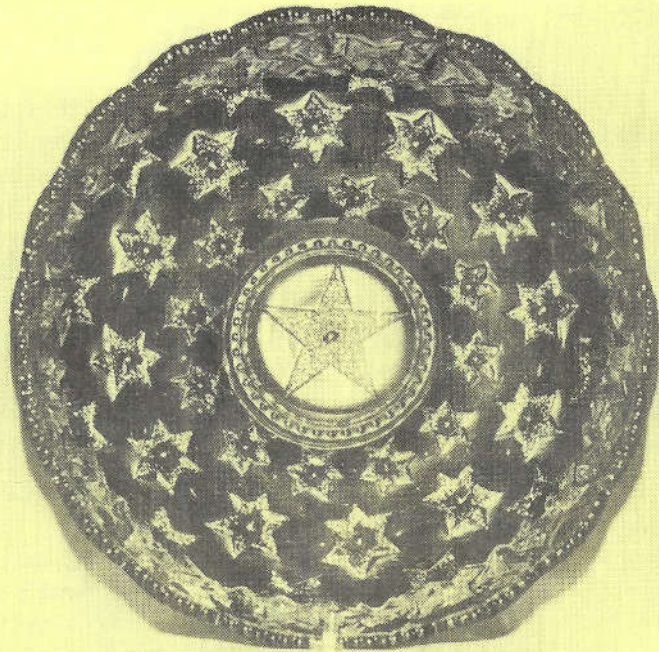
SIX RUFFLED MANY STARS BOWL IN THE RARE BLUE COLOR

pattern was used on the back side.

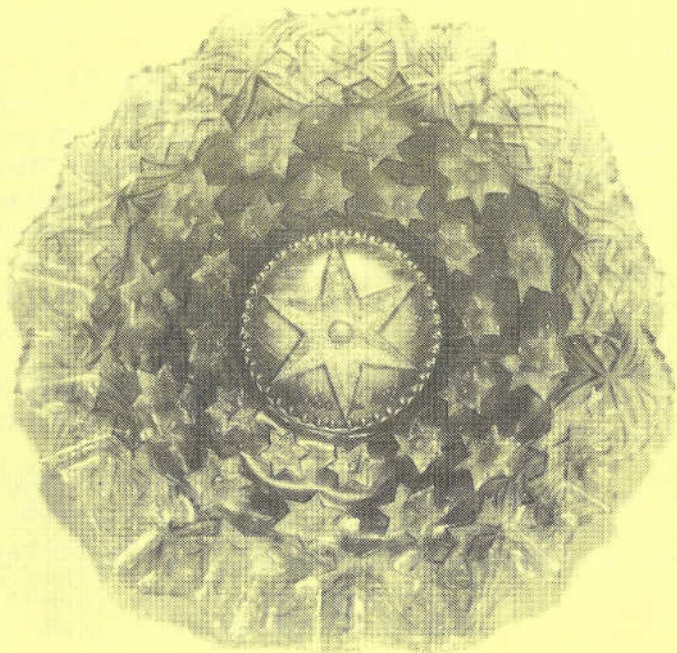
While writing about the Many Stars pattern, we need to mention the pretty Many Stars bowl with the advertising in the center. This one is generally known as the Bernheimer bowl. It is basically a Many Stars bowl with the lettering Bernheimer Brothers and a small star that replaces the large star that is usually found in the center of all Many Stars bowls. An interesting fact about this bowl is that all of those that have been reported were found in a blue base glass, a color that is rare in other Millersburg patterns. We suspect that the management of the Bernheimer Brothers Department Store decided that they wanted their souvenirs made in blue. This is only a guess on our part, but it seems logical. It is certain, however, that Millersburg made only a very small amount of Carnival Glass in the blue color.

On the next page we are showing two other examples of the Many Stars pattern. One an amethyst ice cream shaped bowl with a five point star and a marigold three in one edge bowl with a six point star in the center.

This is probably one of the more exciting tumblers that we have come across in our some twenty three years of collecting Carnival Glass. It certainly is not as valuable as a Morning Glory, Multi-Fruits & Flowers, Frolicking Bears, Big Butterfly and others in that class, but it is very pretty, unusual, extremely rare and a pattern that we did not expect to find in Carnival Glass. It is similar to the Heisey Sawtooth Band tumblers, which are shown on page 147 of the Educational Series #2 book on tumblers. It is unfortunate that this Block Band tumbler was not discovered sooner in order to be included in Cecil Whitley's fine book "The World of Enamelled Glass Tumblers".

We happen to be familiar with the Block Band pattern, as we have ruby stain tumblers and wines in this pattern, but to find one in marigold Carnival Glass was indeed an unexpected thrill.

The tumbler is of standard table size measuring slightly under 4 inches high. The top opening is $2 \frac{3}{4}$ inches across with a base diameter of $2 \frac{1}{4}$ inches. The base contains a 24 point star figure on the bottom. Decoration consists of a $1 \frac{1}{4}$ inch band of high relief that circles the tumbler at the bottom. The band is made up of small geometric faceted figures in diamonds and square blocks. The upper part of the tumbler is plain which lends itself readily to etching or enameling. In this case, we find a pretty blue painted flower with

a long stem and four green leaves. This design appears on both sides of the tumbler. The color is marigold with very fine iridescence. This is the first one of these tumblers ever reported in Carnival Glass, but we are sure that there are a few others out there somewhere to be discovered.

The Block Band pattern was originally made in crystal by the George Duncan Sons and Company of Washington, Pennsylvania. An old undated catalog, in which this pattern appears, probably antedates 1885. It was made in many different pieces including the table set in both crystal and ruby stain. In 1891, the George Duncan and Sons Company, then located at Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, was a part of a group of companies that formed the United States Glass Company. This particular factory was known as Factory D. We believe that this iridised example was made and iridised by the U. S. Glass Company most likely around 1915. A lot of interesting history on this company can be found in "U.S. From A to Z" by William Heacock and Fred Bickenheuser. We recommend this book highly as it contains many U.S. Glass Company patterns that were made in Carnival Glass.



PHOTO #2: BLOCK BAND TUMBLERS IN RUBY STAIN AND CARNIVAL GLASS

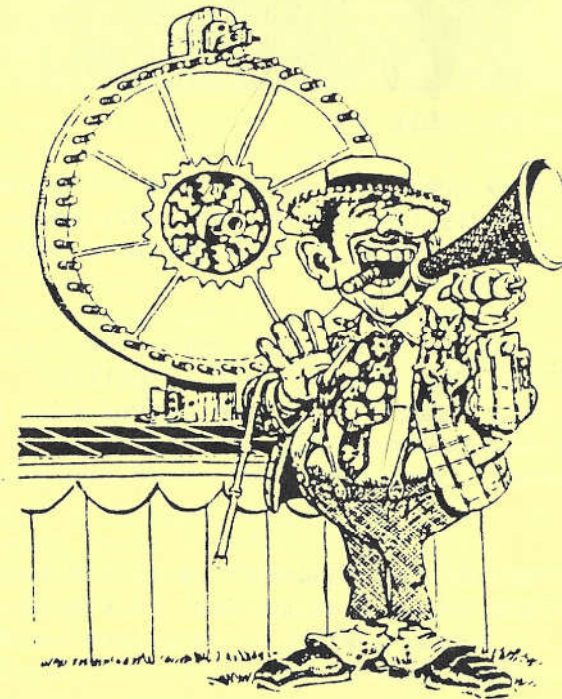
Photo #2 shows the Block Band tumblers in both ruby stain and Carnival Glass. This pattern is illustrated and described in Kamm book 3 on page 132. It shows a number of the different pieces that were made. The Kamm books are a big help in finding different patterns in old pressed glass. Some of these old

pressed glass patterns were carried over into the Carnival Glass period.

This Block Band tumbler was found in the St. Louis area by Karen Skinner of East Alton, Illinois. We want to thank her for letting us purchase this rare and unusual tumbler to photograph and include it in our series on Carnival Glass tumblers.

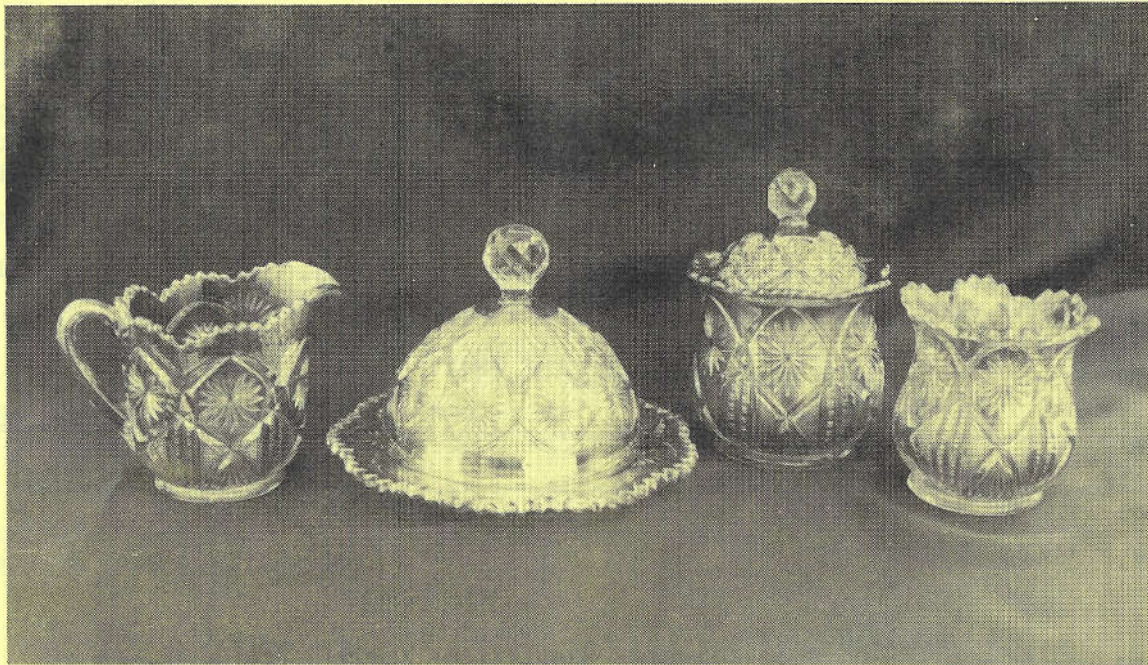

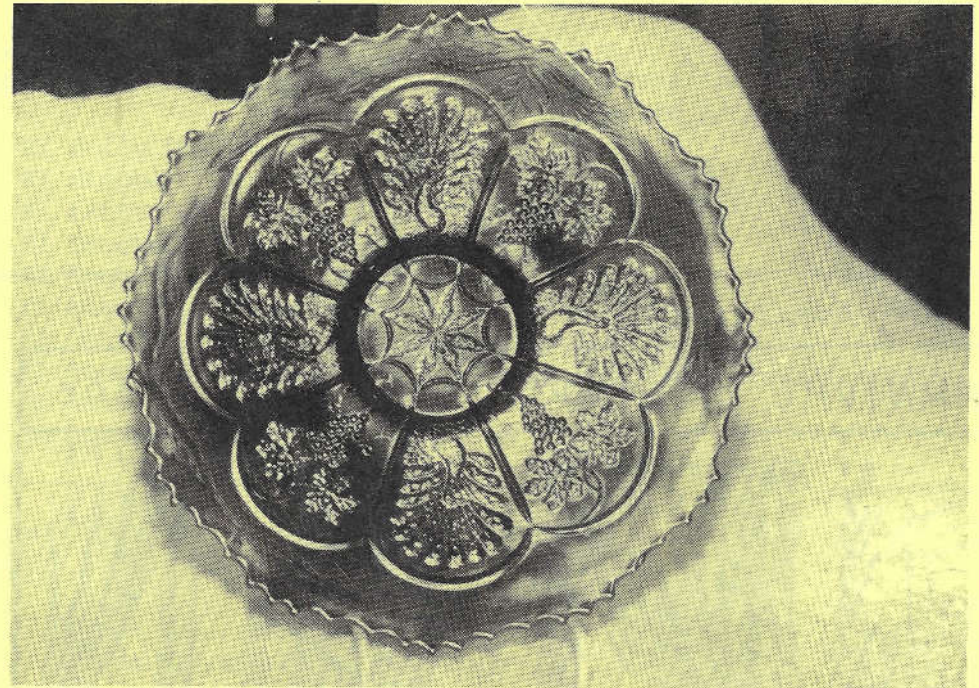
THE COUNTRY KITCHEN TABLE SET

This near-cut pattern is usually seen as the exterior pattern on Millersburg bowls. It was however, used as the primary pattern on this very artistic and desirable table set. Complete sets can be found in both marigold and amethyst and are considered quite scarce.

Here again we have pieces with a distinctive shape. We think the spooner is a real cutie and would have been a natural for shaping into a spittoon. The sugar follows the same lines and is very attractive. The butter base has no feet or collar base and is ground on the bottom. All four pieces have a rayed star in the base. The pattern and shape complement each other and make a very attractive set in either color.

The finish or iridescence runs from terrible to Millersburg at its best. We have seen both marigold and amethyst pieces as flat or dull as can be imagined. Amethyst pieces usually have a gold iridescence with an occasional electric blue one that will rival the best Imperial finish.

We have had opportunities to complete our amethyst set or purchase complete sets that were less than perfect, but so far we have found desirable pieces at reasonable prices and are content to wait and look until we find the particular piece we want -- for us that is half the fun of collection Carnival Glass.



Peacock & Grape is a pattern produced by the Fenton Art Glass Company. Two of the most popular and widely used patterns in Carnival Glass, the peacock and the grape; are brought together to form this pattern. The inside pattern consists of eight arched panels. Each panel contains an alternating peacock and a bunch of grapes with two leaves. An eight petal-type flower design is in the bottom.

Two different molds were used in the production of this pattern. One mold utilized the collar base with an exterior pattern which is the familiar Fenton Bearded Berry. The other mold utilized the spatula footed base, with an exterior that is plain (smooth).

The collar based pieces came in bowls and plates. The bowls are found with 8 ruffles, 3 in 1 edge, candy ribbon edge and round edges. The spatula footed pieces come in plates and bowls. The bowls are found with 8 ruffles or round edges.

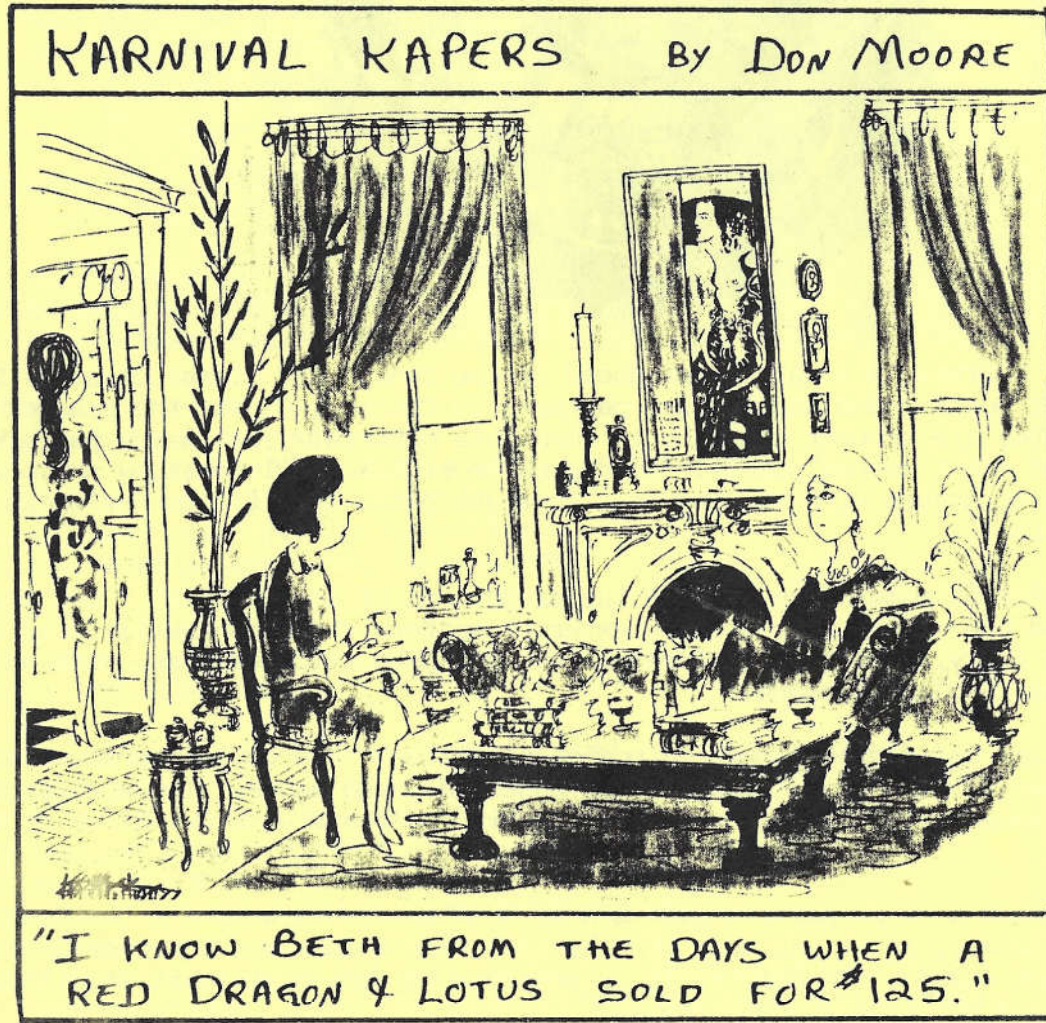
The Peacock & Grape pattern pieces must have sold very well for the Fenton Art Glass Company, as it was made in many different colors and in several of the different shapes. We believe it is possible to obtain at least 75 different pieces and not have any duplicates.

In future articles we will present the various shapes, colors and edges found

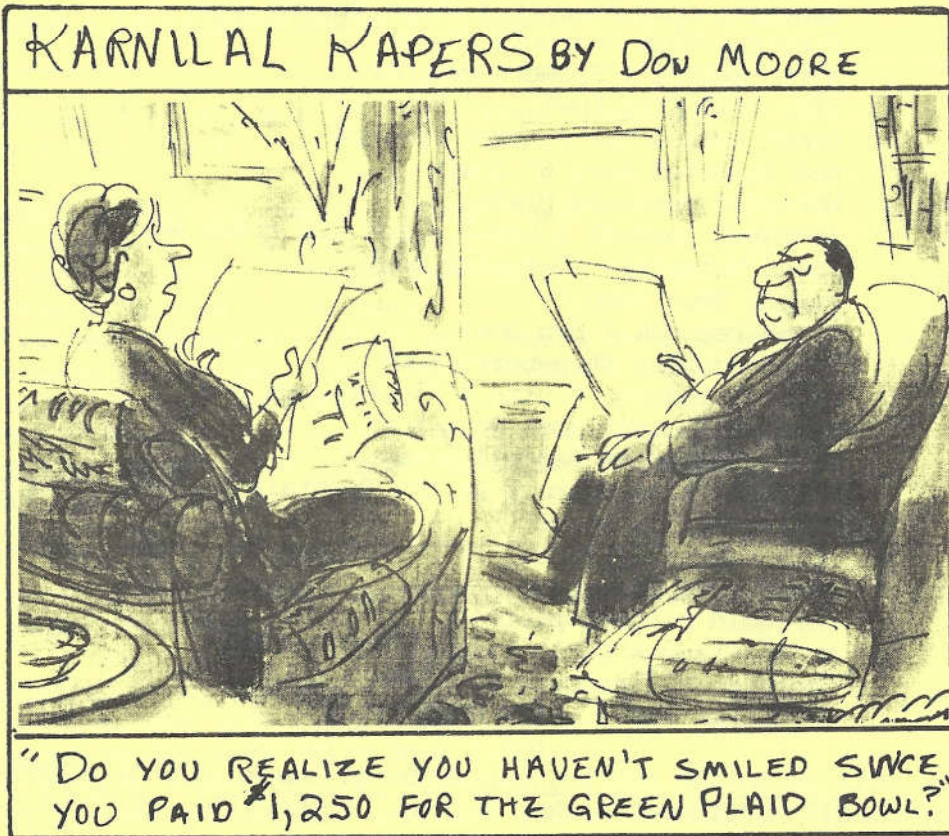

June 26-27, 1992: Seeck Auctions sold the Gretha and Lee Wagaman collection at Springfield, Illinois. What a nice story! A pair of senior citizens found their dream home and were using the Carnival Glass they had collected over the years to buy it.

540 pieces is a lot of glass and included were far too many low end items and out of favor bowls for one auction. Take out the some 125 items that sold for \$20.00 or less and it was a fairly normal auction. A Farmyard bowl sold for \$2,100.00, a blue Panther master berry bowl at \$400.00, an emerald green Rose Show bowl at \$3,000.00, a honey amber Cosmos & Cane rose bowl at \$900.00, an amethyst Rose Show plate at \$2,200.00, an amethyst Ohio Star vase at \$1,000.00 an amethyst Amaryllis miniature footed plate at \$600.00, a dark marigold Fishermans Mug at \$400.00, white Embroidered Mums bon bon at \$900.00, an aqua Embroidered Mums bowl at \$1,600.00, a marigold Hearts & Flowers plate at \$1,000.00 and a marigold Millersburg Roses and Fruits two handled bon bon at \$1,000.00 are examples of some of the higher end prices.

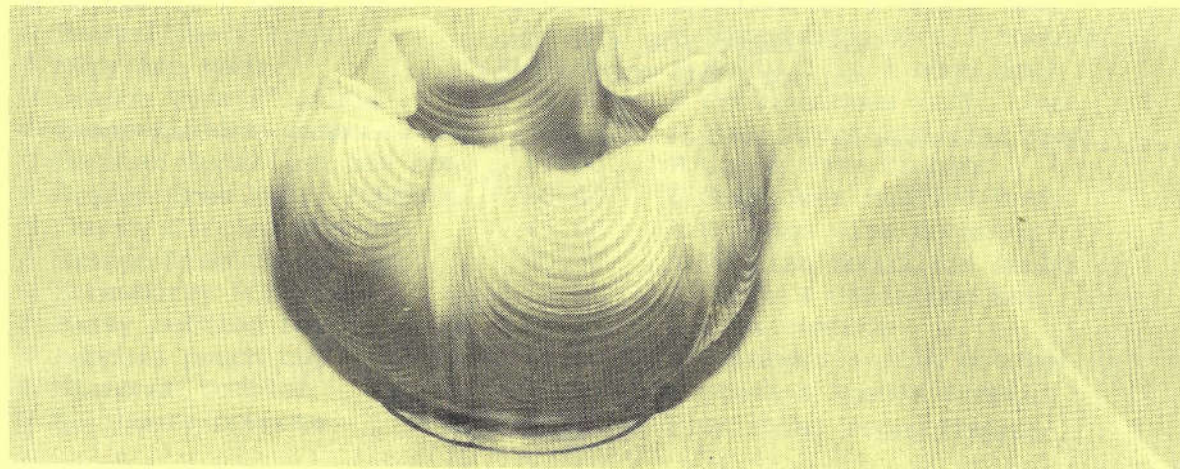
