We picked them up at a flea market, not knowing the pattern. We thought that they were so pretty. It sure would be great if we could complete this table set.

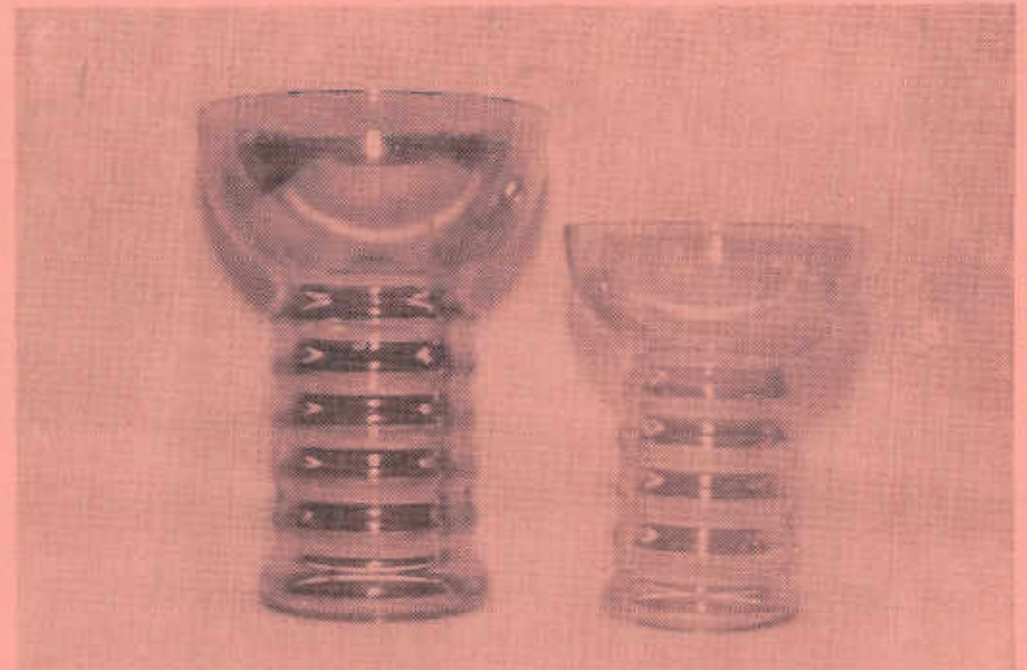

EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

THE ARAMIS TUMBLER BY DUNBAR

The Aramis tumblers were made by the Dunbar Flint Glass Corporation of Dunbar, West Virginia. This company was started in 1913 in a very small way. In the late 1920's and early 1930's they were very successful with a wide line of beverage sets. Aramis is one of those sets and it was the original company name for this pattern.

The Aramis tumblers were produced in both the water and juice size. The above photo illustrates the two different sizes very well. The juice size is 3 3/4 inches high with a top opening of 2 7/8 inches. The base is a little over 1 3/4 inches in diameter. The juice size tumblers are shown in the second photo on the nextpage, in cranberry, marigold and smokey blue. It is interesting to note that usually these sets, in which we have seen, came with mixed colored tumblers. In other words, the tumblers were not all six of the same color. Sometimes the shades were both dark and light tones of each of these colors, all in one set. We have seen some of these sets where the tumblers were all of the same color, however; but most of those that we have seen contained the various colors. The water pitchers in these sets can be found in both the bulbious and tankard types. We think that the tumblers in both sizes would certainly add color to any Carnival Glass tumbler collection.



THE ARAMIS JUICE SIZE TUMBLERS IN THREE COLORS

Hazel Marie Weatherman, in her fine book "Colored Glassware of the Depression Era 2" shows this pattern along with other patterns of beverage sets made by this company. We recommend this book highly to Carnival Glass collectors, as this book shows a good many patterns that can be found with iridescence.

This article on the Aramis tumblers is #177 in our Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will cover a very fine intaglio type tumbler that is called Buzz Star and File.

THE OLYMPIC COMPOTE

In this small compote we are privileged to describe for you one of the very attractive, but little known patterns from the old Millersburg Glass Company of Millersburg, Ohio. The Olympic pattern has been seen in only one shape - that of the stemmed compote. The pattern appears on the interior of the bowl part of the compote. The outer surface of the bowl carries eight smooth wide panels and the piece rests on an octagonal base. These eight panels follow down the outside of the bowl to the outer edge of the base. Unlike many compotes from other companies, this pattern is highly iridescent on both the interior and exterior.

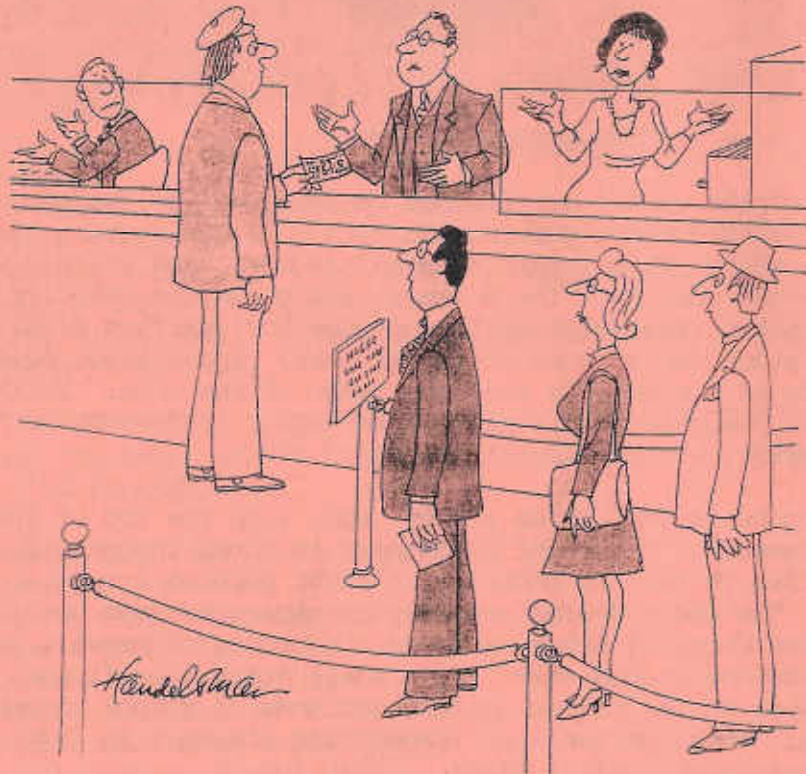
The Olympic compote is only three inches high, with the top of the bowl being $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter. The eight sided base is three inches wide. The pattern is distinctive in that it contains an eight pointed irregular shaped star in the center. The whole design actually incorporates some motifs not commonly found on other Carnival Glass patterns. A circle of heavily raised beads circle around the odd shaped star. Four small daisy like flowers are used at the top and appear to be holding up four garlands of rather unique shaped stippled leaves. These garlands of leaves swag somewhat to form a unique pattern in Millersburg Carnival Glass.

It is interesting to note that this compote is made in the same shape and

size as the Millersburg Leaf & Little Flowers compotes. Only the interior of the bowls are different. The outside of the bowl, stem and base of both patterns are exactly the same.

This little compote is extremely rare. Only two, one in amethyst and one in green, have ever been reported. One of these sold at the Don Doyle auction in June of 1990 for \$2,850.00. In regards to this pattern, Bill Edwards states the following in his popular Carnival Glass book. If ever the old adage "Great things come in small packages" could apply, certainly it would be to the Olympic compote.

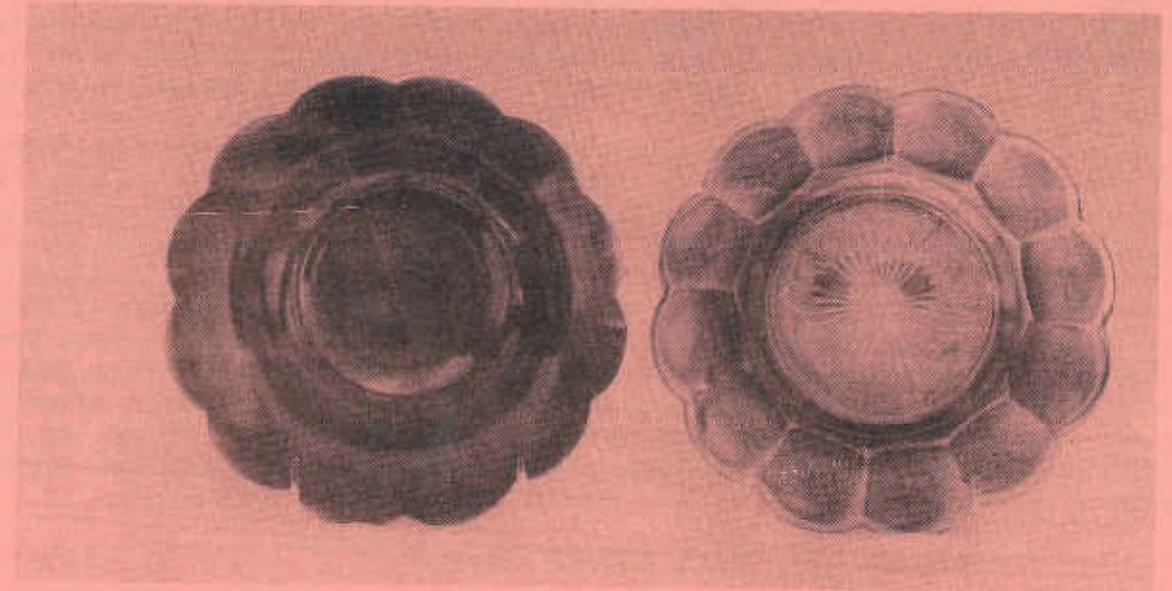

SPRINGTIME TABLE SET IN MARIGOLD



TWO DIFFERENT TYPE BASES USED FOR THE SPRINGTIME TABLE SET

Springtime table sets are a Northwood pattern and available in marigold, green and amethyst. This pattern is one of the prettiest and most sought after of all the table sets. We have put together well matched sets in green and marigold, but have found the amethyst pieces harder to find, particularly the sugar bowl. All colors are considered rare.

We have found most Springtime pieces have very good iridescence and top quality pieces are usually found. We have rarely seen a badly damaged Springtime set. This seems strange when compared to other patterns, most of which have their share of questionable sets. Could it be this pattern was so pretty it was reserved for use only when "company came"? If so, why didn't more survive?

Three Northwood pattern butter dishes share the same base design--or do they? It is generally accepted that the Peacock at the Fountain and Singing Birds have interchangeable butter bases. The "Birds go together". Most collectors believe the Springtime butter base is the same as the "Birds" on the top side but differs on the underside. The difference is the Birds have a base smooth on the underside, while the Springtime base has twelve panels covering the entire rim underside and a many rayed star in the collar of the base. If this is true, we have seen as many Springtime butters with the wrong base as those supposedly correct. We are picturing the underside of two butter bases to show the smooth "Birds" base and the paneled "Springtime" base.

Years ago we saw a beautiful green set in a West Coast collection and were determined to own it someday. Finally it was to be sold in a March, 1987 auction at Cleveland, Ohio, so our time had arrived--or so we thought. On our way over we decided what it was worth and what we were willing to pay. We examined each piece and waited. Before the set came up I moved to the side of the room--better to see who my competition was. The opening bid was \$750.00 and five hands went up and I didn't know any of the bidders. The next bid was \$1,000.00 and I headed for my seat. As I sat down I signalled my \$1,100.00 bid. \$1,200.00, \$1,300.00, \$1,400.00, \$1,500.00, \$1,600.00. At that point I said NO! We occasionally see the new owner and we both still laugh at the day a couple of "carnival nuts" didn't know when to quit. Now you have one reason the newer price guides list the Springtime table set pieces so high. This seemed to bring the green sets out of the woodwork, as shortly thereafter a set sold for \$1,100.00, another at \$900.00 and then \$775.00 plus a lot of individual pieces. As most collectors know there are many collecting stories, this is one of ours.

September 19, 1992: Mickey Reichel Auction, Scottsburg, Indiana. There was a Flea Market, an Antique Advertising Show, a Collectibles Show and the Ron Cox Antique Show all at the Fair Grounds in Indianapolis to provide a nice stopover for several of our Carnival Glass people on their way to Scottsburg. The antique show had a fair amount of Carnival Glass but we saw only one of our friends with a package when we were there Friday afternoon. Prices were a little strong, in our opinion, and there were few "can't live without" pieces offered.

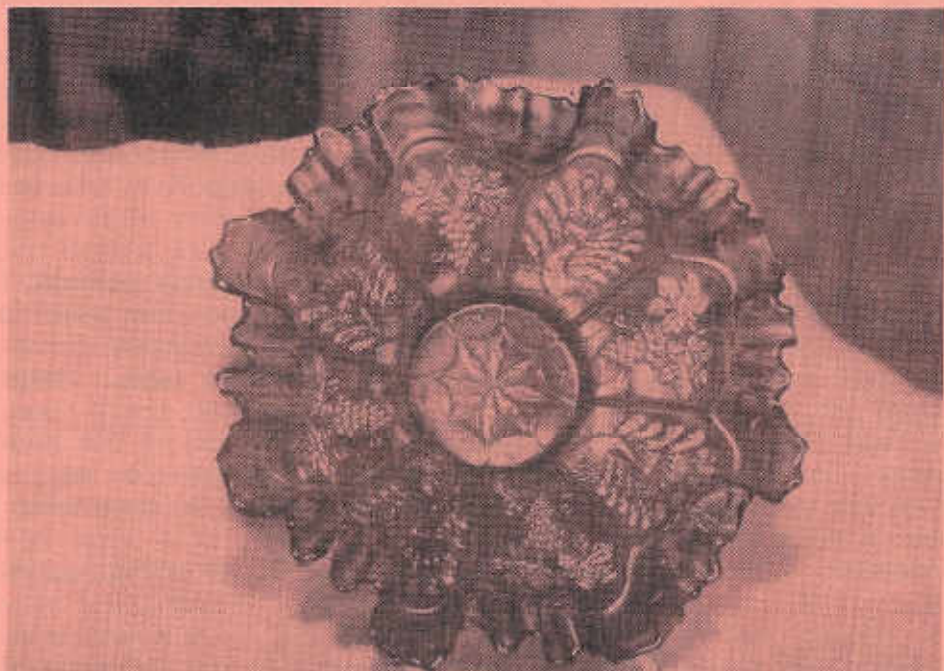
Marge stayed at our daughter Cindy's house in Indianapolis and I headed for Scottsburg early on Saturday morning. The starting time advertised was at 10:00 A.M. E.D.T. but Scottsburg isn't on daylight savings time so there was some confusion and a few local people were a little late. About 70 bid numbers were issued and the bidders filled the somewhat small room. We have always felt that a full house regardless of the size of the room made for a fun party---or a better auction than when the room is too big for the crowd. This, in our opinion, was the situation Saturday. We have seen Mickey Reiche operate in both situations and he was at his best this time in a very friendly atmosphere. This was another example when local advertising helped attract buyers.

There was glass for most everyone and prices for the midrange glass were good. A few examples are: White Peacock at the Fountain master berry bowl \$275.00, green Grape & Cable Old Rose Distillery plate \$350.00, marigold Fashion punch set \$300.00, amethyst Peacock & Urn 7 piece ice cream set \$850.00, amethyst Seacoast pin tray \$525.00 and a clambroth Seacoast pin tray at \$875.00. The Multi-Fruits and Flowers punch set with 3 cups topped the sale at \$1,900.00 on a mail bid followed by the aqua opal Peacocks on the Fence bowl at \$1,125.00 and the aqua opal Rose Show bowl at \$1,200.00.

AMETHYST COLLAR BASED PEACOCK & GRAPE BOWL WITH 3 IN 1 EDGE

This article will cover the various pieces made in the amethyst base color. The amethyst color will vary from very light to a dark (black amethyst) color.

As is typical of Carnival Glass made by Fenton, fewer pieces were made in amethyst than were made in marigold, blue or green. Usually the iridescence on the amethyst pieces is very good.

One piece with the candy ribbon edge has been reported, but we have not seen this shape. Since collar based plates were made in marigold and blue, it is feasible that plates were also made in amethyst, but to date, we have not seen or heard of any. The collar based plates are available, but are considered rare.

On the following page, we are providing the availability of pieces made in the amethyst color.

If anyone has any additional information regarding the amethyst color Peacock & Grape pieces, please contact us, so we can update our records.

My membership in H.O.A.C.G.A. has been long overdue however, now I have addressed the matter I can only gain from the information I receive through the Bulletins, educational series, videos, etc. Obviously, as you will appreciate, we in England do not have the full wealth of experience that you have in the country of origin, but we are prepared to learn as we do with each day that passes.

I think our main frustration, if one can call it that, is that as can be seen from the sales pages in the Bulletins. We do not have the availability of the glass in this country therefore there are no sales pages or auctions of the quality or quantity as shown. We just, as I am sure many of your fellow Americans do, trudge from fair to fair, shop to shop in hopes of finding something that is a little bit different.

One day I hope to visit the U.S.A. and meet some fellow collectors and enjoy hopefully the sight of such collections in which we could only dream. But who knows, maybe one will find during that visit, a little treasure to bring home to enjoy over and over again.

However, in the meantime one must continue and the search goes on.

I would be very interested to hear from any of the members over there who would be prepared to perhaps send glass for sale (well wrapped) to England, certainly those patterns, etc. which we find very hard to obtain, if they were ever here in the beginning.

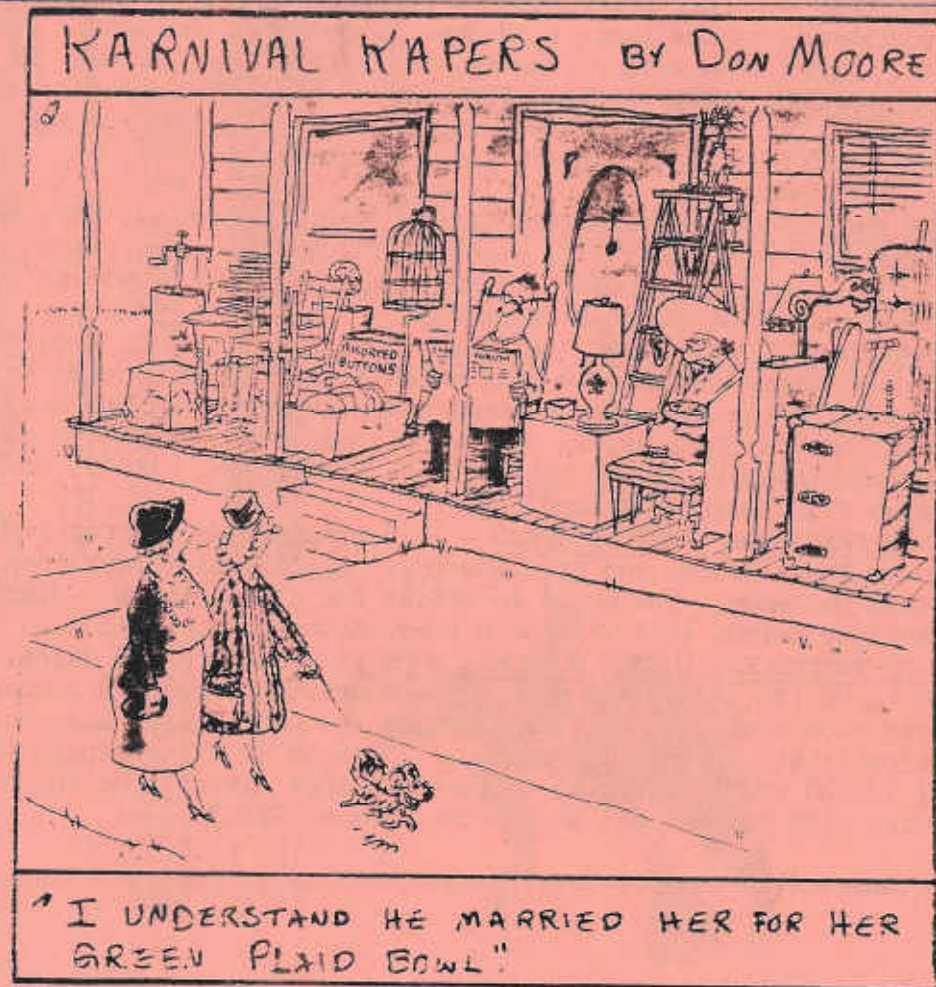
