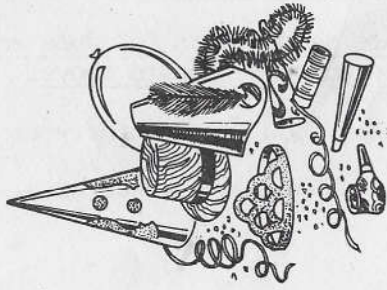

A PEEK INTO THE PAST - - IN CARNIVAL GLASS

This month we will take another Peek Into the Past and view an important and large sale of Carnival Glass in 1972. In January of that year Mr. & Mrs. Delayne Eigenberg of Fairbury, Nebraska, sent out lists of some 370 Carnival Glass items and sets (about 700 pieces) to some 800 collectors. They also offered a 5% discount if you picked the pieces up at their home.

We knew the Eigenberg's well, having seen them at several Carnival Glass auctions and at Mrs. Hartung's Carnival Glass get together and banquet held in Emporia, Kansas. We had also stopped and saw their collection on several occasions and knew they had some beautiful Carnival Glass.

On January 15th we drove up to Fairbury to purchase some of their glass. The piece we wanted the most was their Christmas compote, but the Jim Mogg's of Hamilton, Missouri were there earlier and had taken it back to Hamilton along with a number of other pieces. It sold for \$2,000.00. Delayne once told us that they drove to Oklahoma City, after a phone call, to pick up up for \$500.00. This, of course, was back in the 1960's.

Another piece that we can remember was a super beautiful Garden Path Variet chop plate. It was marked at \$1,000.00. I can well remember telling Lucile that they could never get that much for it. They did, however, and rather quickly. It went to Don Moore of California. Please remember, however, that back in 1972, some 21 years ago, that \$1,000.00 was a big price to pay for a plate. We did buy some gorgeous Rose Show, Poppy Show and Peacocks on the Fence plates, however, so we were very pleased.

Here is a sampling of some of the plates offered and prices asked: Blue Rose Show \$235.00; green Rose Show \$200.00; aqua Peacocks \$250.00; electric blue Peacocks \$160.00; purple Good Luck \$250.00; blue Poppy Show \$300.00; purple Greek Key \$175.00; green Nippon \$125.00. Believe it or not, we actually drove back up there the next day (only about 100 miles from us) to purchase some of the pieces that we thought we should have purchased the first day.

A few other items in this collection were a purple Farmyard \$2,000.00; purple Country Kitchen table set \$600.00; purple S-Repeat punch set \$800.00; purple Marilyn water set \$750.00; blue Milady water set \$500.00; purple Flute water set \$400.00 and a purple Grapevine Lattice water set for \$400.00.

To us, this experience was a very memorable and exciting event that happened to us in 1972. We were rather new collectors then and we later wished that we had purchased a few more pieces. We never look back or worry about what we should have bought, however, Carnival Glass has always been an enjoyment to us and it still is. Besides all the beautiful glass that we have seen and owned during the years and the thrill of finding and learning about it, we

This is #48 in our "Peek Into the Past" series. We hope that you have found it interesting. We would like to wish you all a very Happy and Healthy 1993!

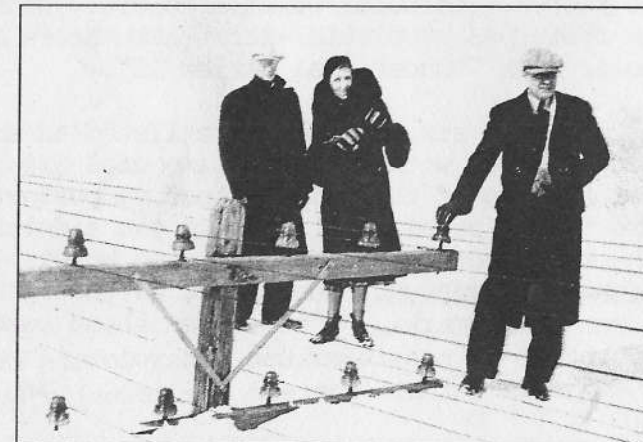

THE CHESTERFIELD TUMBLER IN FROSTY WHITE

The Chesterfield tumblers were made by the old Imperial Glass Company of Bellaire, Ohio. This tankard ice tea set is illustrated in an old Imperial catalog and the name Chesterfield was Imperial's original name for this pattern. We notice that the tankard type pitcher was made exactly the same as that which was used by Imperial for their Colonial Stretch pattern. The pitchers of both these patterns contain a lid. The tumblers are much different however. In the case of the Chesterfield pattern, the tumblers contain a handle and are dome footed. Colonial Stretch tumblers do not contain the handle nor the dome foot. (See Colonial Stretch tumblers in our article on page 29 of the tumbler book "Educational Series II".)

The Chesterfield pitcher and six tumblers were listed as an ice tea set. The tumblers are fine inches high with a top opening of 3 5/8 inches. There is an inch wide area at the top of the tumbler that is perfectly smooth. Below this smooth area are twelve panels that go down the side of the tumbler and continues out to the outer edge of the dome footed base. The base is 2 1/4 inches wide and slightly depressed. The center of the bottom contains the old IM-PE-RI-AL German Cross mark. We have seen these tumblers only in frosty white and marigold, but it is possible that other colors might exist. The tumblers, pitchers and sets in this pattern are actually quite hard to find.



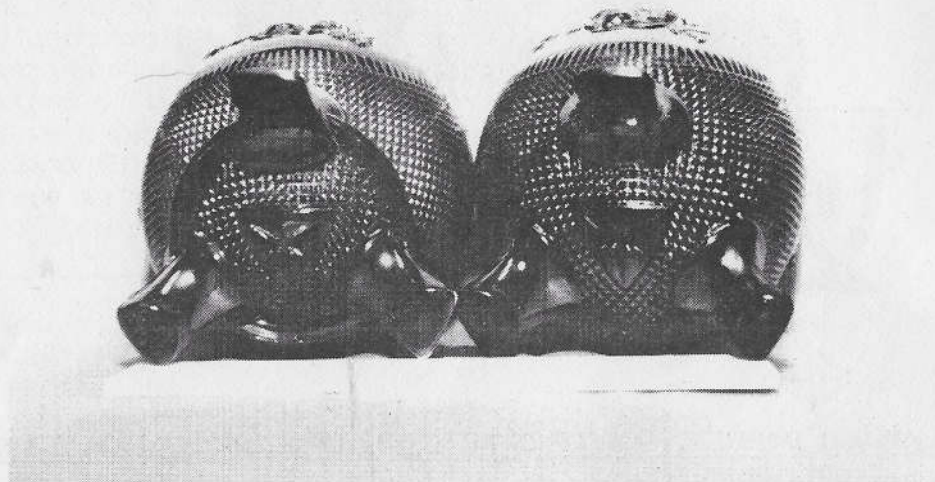
REPRINT FROM AN OLD IMPERIAL CATALOG SHOWING THE CHESTERFIELD ICE TEA SET

We are including a photostatic copy of the Chesterfield ice tea set that was taken from an old Imperial catalog. They list it as an eight piece ice tea set and packed one dozen sets in a barrel. Handled tumbler capacity, 10 ounces. Covered tankard jug, one half gallon size.

The Chesterfield tumbler marks our 180th entry into the Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will cover a rare Twins tumbler. Presznick calls this pattern "Horseshoe Curve".

FINE CUT AND ROSES AND VARIENT ROSE BOWLS

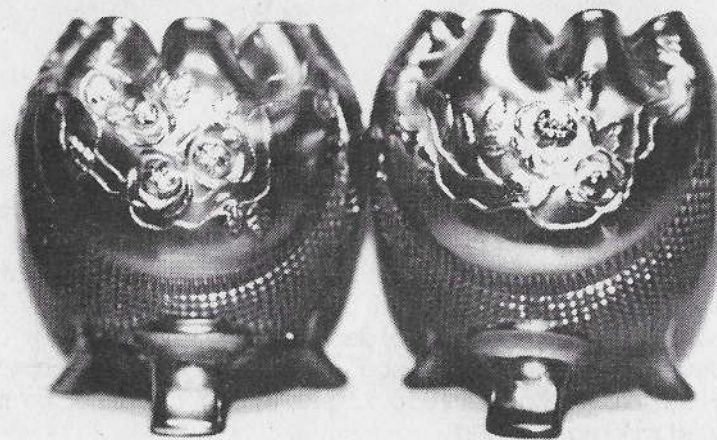
The purpose of this article is to show the differences between the regular Fine Cut and Roses rose bowl and the Varient in that pattern. We have taken a photo of the two rose bowls laying on their side in order for you to see the difference more easily. The regular rose bowl is shown on the left with the Varient on the right. Notice the collar which is joined to the three feet that is used on the rose bowl on the left. This collar extends out about 1/8 inch from the surface on the regular rose bowl. This pronounced collar is not used on the Varient which is shown on the right.

Here are a few facts regarding these two different rose bowls. The Varient (the one without the collar) is very seldom seen. We contacted Bob Stremming, who has worked with rose bowls for years and certainly has one of the largest rose bowl collections known, as to how many of the Varients that he has ever seen. He stated that he had seen only three in purple, one in lavender and one in green. He has never seen one in marigold. We believe that it is quite possible that one in marigold might show up some time, however.

Another point of interest is that the Varient has never shown up with the Northwood trademark. Our theory is that the Varient was probably made first and that they had problems of breakage in the making and then added the collar

for strength and to lessen breakage. This is only a guess on our part, but it does seem logical to us.

To the best of our knowledge, these Varients have never been mentioned in any of the Carnival Glass books. The Stremmings have discussed them in some of their fine presentations on rose bowls. They showed one of these Varients to me many years ago from one of their convention displays. This was the first one I had ever seen and it took us many years to find one. Actually it is a little hard to see the difference when they are standing on their feet. You really need to turn them on their side or top in order to get a good view of this distinct band.

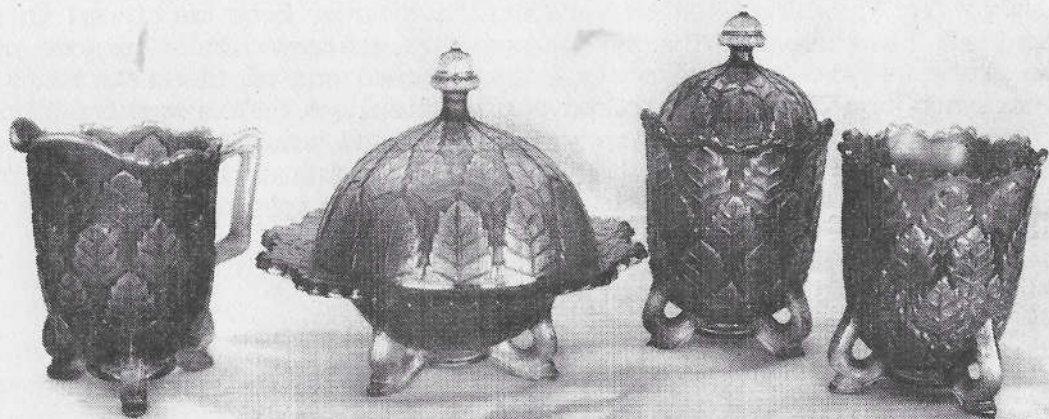


THE SAME TWO ROSE BOWLS IN STANDING POSITION

The above photo shows the same two rose bowls in a standing position. The Varient is on the right. Notice that it is a little hard to tell the difference in this position. The Varient has a smooth interior with no (N) trademark. The regular rose bowl sometimes has the smooth interior, usually with an (N), and can also be found with the Northwood's Fancy interior. This Fancy interior is most often seen in the pastel colors, but we also have found this Fancy interior used in a few of the vivid color examples.

This is #168 in our Pictorial Pattern Parade. Next month we will discuss a very unusual piece of Carnival - a rare Shriner piece in marigold.

LEAF TIERS TABLE SET IN MARIGOLD

This is a table set made by Fenton, found only in marigold and considered rare. It is another footed pattern with all four pieces resting on three twig-type feet. The unusual shape of the feet probably contributed to a lot of breakage as a very limited number seem to have survived. We have seen a wide variation in color, from a light golden marigold to a very dark almost reddish marigold. Usually the iridescence is good and the stippling on the leaves provides many surfaces to reflect light which combine to make the dark marigold pieces very striking indeed.

We got our first piece in 1980 and it wasn't until October, 1992 that we found the sugar bowl to complete our set. We don't recall ever seeing a good complete set sell at auction. In most patterns there are a few butter tops floating around and very few butter bases, but in this pattern the opposite seems to be true. We have seen several butter bases waiting for a top to surface. Why? The only guess we would make is that the "acorn" finial sits on a somewhat long slender neck which may have been a weak point and a lot of tops were lost. Pieces with perfect feet are rather hard to find. For some reason pieces in this pattern do not command very high prices.

This is the seventh in our series on Table Sets. Next month we will feature the more common and attractive Butterfly & Berry set.

November 28, 1992: Delphi, Indiana. Old Timers will remember Dicie Lucy. Dicie and her late husband George (George was a contractor) had an antique shop in Monticello, Indiana and set up at antique shows as "Lucy & I". She was an early member and supporter of the I.C.G.A. and occasionally contributed pieces for Mrs. Hartung to sketch and include in her pattern books. One such piece was the 1908 Shrine Toothpick that sold at this sale for \$550.00.

A local auctioneer sold the contents of their shop and part of their personal collection in a two day sale. He heavily advertised the sale to national antique papers, many Indiana newspapers and used a mailing list to send brochures all over the country. The brochure included furniture, china, pattern glass, Royal Bayreuth, primitives, a large collection of miniature lamps and Carnival Glass. The notation under the Carnival Glass heading read "Ranked as one of the outstanding collections of Carnival Glass in the country not in quantity but in quality, etc." The Carnival list included 136 items but did list the many souvenirs.

We questioned the auctioneer's glowing description of the collection and decided to get a first hand look. We had spent Thanksgiving in Indianapolis so it wasn't much out of the way to go to Delphi on our way home. We thought maybe this would be a hand picked group of exceptional glass from years of antique shows and collecting. Did we see that? Not in our opinion. We saw some unusual miniature pieces that brought top prices and a dozen or more other real nice pieces but no plates and only one or two pastel pieces. We also saw the usual chips, cracks, wrong stoppers, some repairs and more low end items than we expected.

The crowd was there. Apparently the extensive advertising paid off. We were surprised to see some individuals from quite a distance in attendance. It was interesting to talk to and listen to those examining the glass prior to the auction. Apparently we were not the only ones surprised.

There were several unusual and seldom seen pieces offered and they as a whole were nice. These included the Shrine Toothpick mentioned earlier, which stayed in Indiana, and the following partial list:

- \$550.00 Marigold Knife Rest
- \$600.00 Marigold Hobstar Pickle Castor
- \$1,150.00 Marigold Wild Rose Syrup Jug
- \$525.00 Marigold Napkin Ring
- \$850.00 Red Primrose and Fishnet Vase
- \$800.00 Amethyst Grape & Cable Candle Lamp with original Northwood paper label
- \$1,300.00 Amethyst Wild Rose Kerosene Lamp

Mrs. Lucy sat through the sale expressionless but we couldn't help but wonder what she thought when she saw how well some (not just Carnival) items sold and how poorly others were received. We left before the Carnival souvenirs sold but the local historical or souvenir items that we saw sell were not setting any records.
