We can well remember of purchasing a beautiful ice green Daisy & Drape vase in a Topeka, Kansas antique show from a Colorado antique dealer for \$75.00. On another occasion at a Hutchinson, Kansas antique show, from a Missouri dealer, we bought an ice blue example of this piece for \$125.00. We actually didn't know then just how rare these pieces were. We just thought that they were very beautiful and purchased them. We can assure you that seeing these pieces at antique shows didn't happen often, however. We have seen only a few of these vases in pastel green or pastel blue in our Carnival Glass years. We have seen many in aqua opal, however. While somewhat common in this super color, they are still beautiful and very desirable. We can't think of anyone who wouldn't like one of these for their collection.

THE FLEUR-DE-LIS VASE

Here is a very pretty and desirable vase in rich dark marigold. The marigold color is as dark as we have ever seen. It was made in rather heavy glass and has excellent iridescence. The vase is 8½ inches tall with a top opening of 2½ inches. The 2½ inch base is eight sided and is formed by eight panels that go from the bottom of the vase up to the Fleur-De-Lis figures. There are four of these designs, each placed in an oblong circle type panel. At the top of the base are four 3 point fan like figures, one between and above each of the Fleur-De-Lis motifs. A deeply impressed whirling star figure appears on the bottom of the base.

We now know that there are at least two sizes in this vase as we recently saw one that measured 10½ inches high. Mrs. Hartung also reports that the one shown in her book #6 was 10½ inches tall. Deep marigold is the only color that we have seen. We also own a large chop plate in this pattern and pitchers and tumblers are shown in the literature, but we have not seen any of them.

Our featured Fleur-De-Lis vase was made in Czechoslovakia. In William Heacock's Collecting Glass books, volume #2, he features 15 pages taken from an old catalog that describes many Czechoslovakian patterns made by Josef Inwald A.G., Prague, Czechoslovakia, circa 1925-1935. The Fleur-De-Lis pattern is

shown in some of these pages in many different shapes and forms. A number of other Carnival Glass patterns that we have seen are also shown in these old catalog listings.

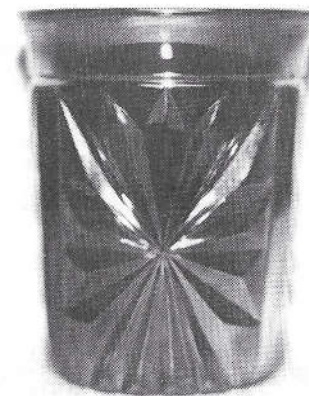
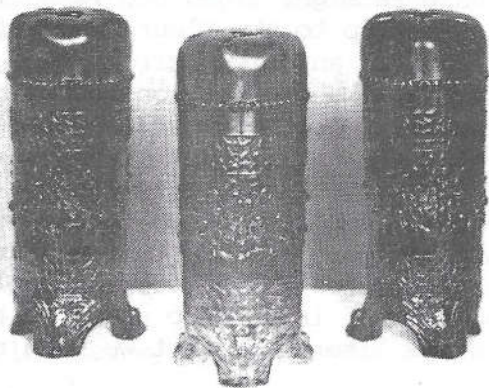

THE FLASHING STARS TUMBLER

The Flashing Stars tumbler that is featured here, is the only example that we have seen in this pattern. This is a pretty blue tumbler with very fine iridescence. We suspect that this pattern was also made in marigold, but we have not seen any in that color. It stands 3 3/4 inches tall with a top opening of 3 inches. The plain band at the top is 3/4's of an inch wide. The tumbler is flared out somewhat at the top. The bottom of the base has been factory ground and polished and contains an eight pointed star in the center. The outside of the tumbler contains three wide panels, each containing a large 16 point star like figure.

We found this pattern in old RIIHIMAEN LASI OY (RIIHIMAKI) material from Finland. This data was sent to us by Raymond Notley of England, who has done a lot of Carnival Glass research in both foreign and American made Carnival Glass. In addition to the Flashing Stars, other more popular Carnival Glass tumblers shown in this material are Western Thistle, Drapery Variet, Grand Thistle, Sunburst and Tiger Lily Variet. The Tiger Lily Variet is a copy of the Tiger Lily pattern that was made by Imperial in the U.S.A.

This rare Flashing Stars tumbler is from the collection of Cecil Whitley of Houston, Texas. She has without a doubt the largest known collection of Car-

nival Glass tumblers in the country and has written a book on enameled Carnival Glass tumblers called "The World of Enameled Carnival Glass Tumblers."

This marks our 183rd entry into our Educational Tumbler Series. We hope that you have found it interesting.

THE WREATHED CHERRY TABLE SET

This Dugan-Diamond pattern is found in marigold, amethyst and white. All are considered scarce, but we have seen fewer white pieces than the others and most of the white ones had red painted cherries. This is a dainty little set with a lot of eye appeal.

The butter base pattern has little relation to the Wreathed Cherry pattern of the butter top. The top side of the base is usually marked with a D in a diamond and is plain except for a scroll like design outlinging the outer edge of the nine fluted scallops. This butter base is deeper than most and has a underside pattern of nine roughly one inch by two inch plain loops or medallions edged by tiny beads and separated by a stippled area. On our marigold set these beads show through when viewed from the top and, in our opinion, add charm to this piece. The underside of the butter base is usually iridized except for the collar base which contains a many rayed star. The other three pieces of the set also rest on collar bases but without the rayed star, and we have never seen them marked.

A word of caution. This is one of the sets where the sugar without a lid could be mistaken for the spooner. The sugar bottom has no inside rim for the lid to rest on because the lid has a rim and fits over the top. The spooner top is not smooth like the sugar top.

We found a lovely amethyst butter at an antique show in 1982, and it wasn't until 1990 that we found the other pieces that matched. It was worth looking

and waiting as we have a very nice set as a result and we didn't have to take damaged pieces either. Next to white, marigold is considered the toughest to find, but we bought a nice marigold set at an auction in 1987 at what we considered a reasonable price. A white set---well maybe sometime.
