


PHOTO #1 PERSIAN MEDALLION/GRAPE & CABLE SAUCE, INTERIOR PATTERN

### THE PERSIAN MEDALLION / GRAPE & CABLE SAUCE

Here is a little Fenton piece that is right down hard to find. Persian Medallion interior with the Grape and Cable exterior. We are sure that you have seen many of the large fruit or orange bowls in this pattern, but how many of these little sauces have you ever seen? It is about the same size as the Panther and Butterfly & Berry sauce dishes only much harder to find. We have never seen one in any color other than marigold, but we suspect that a few might have been madein blue. If so, we have never seen one in that color.

We purchased this piece in a western Kansas carnival glass auction held by Scott Brown at Greensburg, Kansas on October 4, 1990. We were surprised at the size of the crowd that was there for such a small place. The prices received were high and in many cases record highs.


Don & Connie Moore were there, stopping by on their way to the Air Capital convention at Wichita. The Grissom's were also in attendence. Being knowledgable collectors they too had spotted this little sauce dish. Even Richard Cinclair from way down in Texas was at the sale. We were really surprised to see him there. We suspect that we all thought that this was an ideal auction to pick up some bargains. How wrong we were. Even Swede and Vaunda Tilberg were there to pick up their share of the bargains. They too were very surprised at the prices and enthusiasm of the crowd.

We did win out on the little sauce dish, however and took it home with us at a higher price than we had expected. We wanted this piece for three reasons. It was a small piece that we both liked. Secondly, we had seen one of them at a convention back east many years ago that was not for sale. We had been looking for one ever since. Thirdly, we thought it would make a nice piece for us to photograph and describe in our Pictorial Pattern Parade series. So here it is for you to see and read about. It is certainly not an elaborate piece, but it is one that we like to show and tell about. We consider it as rare.

This is our 173rd entry into the Pictorial Pattern Parade. We hope that you have found it both interesting and educational.

# EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES By John & Lucile Britt



THE ENGLISH HOBNAIL TUMBLER

English Hobnail is a Westmorland pattern. The above example is in a good marigold with fine iridescence. It is 4 5/8" tall and 3 3/8" across the top. There is a 1" plain band around the top of the tumbler. A 34 point rays pattern is on the underside of the base.

This is one of Westmorland's very popular patterns that was introduced in the 1920's and was produced for many years. While it was made in a wide variety of pieces and in a number of different colors such as pink, amber, green, turquoise and cobalt, only a small amount was ever produced with iridescence. The above tumbler is actually the only iridescent tumbler that we have ever seen in this pattern. This one is from the very fine tumbler collection of Cecil & Floyd Whitley. We do have an iridized salt dip in this pattern and have seen a few of these around. Those that we have seen usually find their way into miniature collections. We also have the iridised salt & pepper shakers in this pattern. This is the only set that we have ever seen with iridescence. They are in a light amber color, actually more of a honey amber. We suspect that there are other pieces around in this pattern with iridescence, but we have not seen them.

This is a very fine tumbler that we are very glad to include in our carnival glass tumbler series. It is one that you might want to look for in your Carnival Glass hunting trips.

A LOOK AT TABLE SETS

### THE MAPLE LEAF TABLE SET

This old table set came in marigold, amethyst and blue. It was made in custard glass by Northwood, but one researcher reported seeing shards of this pattern at the Dugan dump site. This seems to be the best proof that Dugan made this set. In Encore Book I, Dorothy Taylor said this pattern was in the 1974 L. G. Wright catalog and was made in amethyst color from the original molds. At that time five pieces were made which included the butter, sugar and creamer and they were usually signed with the  $\underline{W}$  in a circle. So we have both the old and reproductions that are essentially the same except for the trademark.

All pieces have a Soda Gold background pattern with three large maple leaves as the focal point. The unusual feature of this pattern is that the three leaf stems form sort of small handles on the sugar and spooner. On the creamer two of these stems were flattened, although still prominent, to eliminate the handle effect and the third leaf stem was made larger and heavier to form a true "creamer" handle. On the butter and sugar lids the three leaf stems form a three-sided open finial. An area of ribbed effect appears both above and below the Soda Gold background. The lower ribs extend to the bottom edge which is a series of bubles or beads that form the surface the piece rests on. There are thirty of these beads or bubbles on the butter base and twenty-seven on the other three pieces. All pieces have a many-rayed star in the base.

The butter dish is noticeable primarily because of its unusual finial. The other three pieces are unique because of the "stem" handles and straight sides that end at the limited base. The Soda Gold background is stippled, and when

coupled with the reddish-bronze iridescence on the dark pieces, the effect is striking.

Prices seem to be reasonable, probably hurt by the reproductions. The iridescense varies greatly. It may take some looking to find closely matched pieces but they are available. Damage to the lower edge is also a problem. This set is one we like because it is different, attainable and pretty when decked out in beautiful iridescence.

This is the twelfth in our series on table sets.

### ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK & MARGE

MAY 15, 1993: Seeck Auctions sold the Greguire Collection at St. Louis, Missouri. We saw some pretty lamps, but having seldom seen lamps at an auction we have no idea whether the buyers or seller came out the winner.

It seems every auction has a trade-off. This one had glass that was clean with very good color and iridescence, but in our opinion this was offset by a chip here and there. Jim had no trouble moving the glass at what we thought were good prices, but the price on some of the key pieces reflected their condition. Some prices were:

MAY 17, 1993: This has little to do with an auction, but we just talked with John and Jeanette Rogers of North Carolina. Jeanette became ill at the Heart of America Carnival Glass Association Convention and spent nearly 3 weeks in the Overland Park Medical Center. John and Jeanette were proud and appreciative of the Kansas City area H.O.A.C.G.A. members that befriended them. John said, "The Carnival Family sticks together." He was talking about another side of our collecting hobby—the friendships that are developed. We have proven again there is more to our collecting hobby than the glass.

Jeanette, we are glad you are feeling better and hope to see you in the front row at an auction soon.

### DRAGON & LOTUS

The Fenton Art Glass Company and Mr. Fenton were known for the use of animals on their designs. Mr. Fenton seems to be the only one to use the dragon. Dragon & Lotus and Strawberry and Dragon. He probably chose these two, Dragon & Lotus, because of his appreciation for Chinese Art. This type of art was popular around the turn of the century. His son, Mr. Frank Fenton, told me his father had quite a library and read extensively about Chinese Art. His knowledge of the Chinese folklore is evident in this design. Mr. Fenton was given a red pencil and a blank bowl on which he drew the Dragon & Lotus. The primary design consists of four dragons, four lotus blossoms, and eight floating lotus. The lotus has been used in art for centuries. Beneath the main design a ribbon-like pattern forms a circle. In the base are four Daisylike flowers with twelve petals, two leaves enclosed in an elipse shape. In the very center of the base two straight lines intersect with concentric circles on the ends. There is feathering around the lines and circles.

There were two molds used. The spatula footed and collar base. There is a difference in the patterns. Both molds have no exterior pattern. All the pieces have a fluted edge no matter what the shape. It has three mold lines.

On the collar base dishes the floating lotus to the right has a root that circles the dragon. There are no hash marks at the top of the circle. The lotus blossoms stem circles itself. In the bottom the elipse shape overlaps the collar base. Also all of the dragons have only four toes.

On the spatula footed dishes the floating lotus to the left of the dragon has the root that circles the dragon. Could this denote the giver of life? The lotus blossoms are circled by the stem. All of these circles have hash marks (five) at the top of the circle. Some of the ribbon designs are more symetrical. The bottom design fits within the collar base. There are two dragons which have five toes on one foot. One on the left foot and the other the right foot. There is significance to the five toed dragon. It was reserved for use by the right hand man of royalty. The Chinese believed the dragon had magical powers to perform great deeds, give longevity and prosperity.

This pattern comes in numerous shapes and colors. There are twelve opalescent colors alone. The spatula footed comes in high ruffled, low ruffled, 3 in 1, ice cream, and a rare nutbowl shape. The collar base comes in ruffled, ice cream, 3 in 1, a 3 in 1 so low it qualifies as a plate, and the rare nutbowl shape. This has always been a popular and desirable pattern. Some build whole collections around this pattern.

It's difficult to find written information about Dragon & Lotus. Fenton's First Twenty-Five Years does list Dragon & Lotus being made in 1915, 1920 and 1925. Mr. Fenton said the opalescent colors were produced early on and I have
