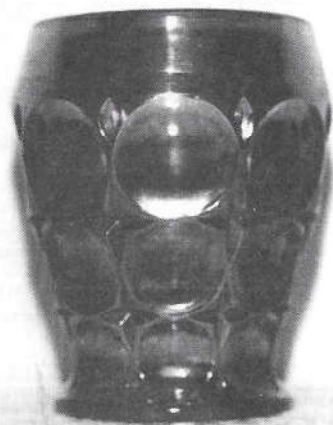

THE MOONPRINT TUMBLER

Moonprint is a well known pattern, easy to recognize and was made in many different pieces and shapes. Our first acquaintance with this pattern was found in Hartung book eight. It is shown on page 93 of that book. Mrs. Hartung did not know the maker of the pattern at that time. Through the years the pattern has been more publicized and we learned that the pattern was produced by the Sowerby Glass Company of England.

Don Moore featured such pieces as the butter dish, breakfast creamer, banana boat shape, two piece fruit bowl and vases, but never the water pitcher and tumbler. Ray Notley and William Heacock also wrote about this pattern. As the years passed by we were able to actually see pieces in this pattern, usually shown in displays at Carnival Glass conventions. But to our disappointment we could never find a tumbler in that pattern or any information about one.

Somewhat later, in one of the Carnival Glass Society Journals, published by Ray Notley of England, there was shown a good many pieces of this pattern including the tumbler, which was actually made in two styles. Ray Notley has probably done more on researching foreign Carnival Glass than anyone else and has printed a valuable source of information on Carnival Glass in general. Through his research, we now know that the Moonprint pattern was also made by

Brochwitz of Germany. He has promised more information on this in his future journals.

So now, after some fifteen years of searching for a Moonprint tumbler, it finally has become a reality for us in 1993. We are featuring it here in this article. The tumbler has three rows of moonprints that circle the tumbler. (There was also a tumbler produced with only two rows.) These three rows of moonprints or circles are larger in the top row and each row the circles gets smaller toward the base. There are eight of these circles in each row and they are pressed well into the outer surface of the tumbler.

The tumbler is 3 7/8 inches high with a top opening of 2 3/4 inches. It cups in slightly at the top and flares out a little at the base. The base is 2 1/2 inches in diameter and contains an eight point star on the underside. It is factory ground and polished along the outer edge of the base bottom. The color is a good rich marigold. In fact, no piece in this pattern has ever been reported in any color, other than marigold.

We are happy and thrilled to be able to feature this tumbler in this series. To the best of our knowledge, it is the only one known in the U.S.A.

The Moonprint tumbler marks our 188th entry into this series. Next month we will cover a very pretty and unusual enameled type tumbler that we have named "Rose of Paradise." It is a standard size green tumbler with bluish green iridescence containing a beautiful large pink rose with green leaves. It has attracted a lot of attention from all who have seen it. More on this tumbler next month.

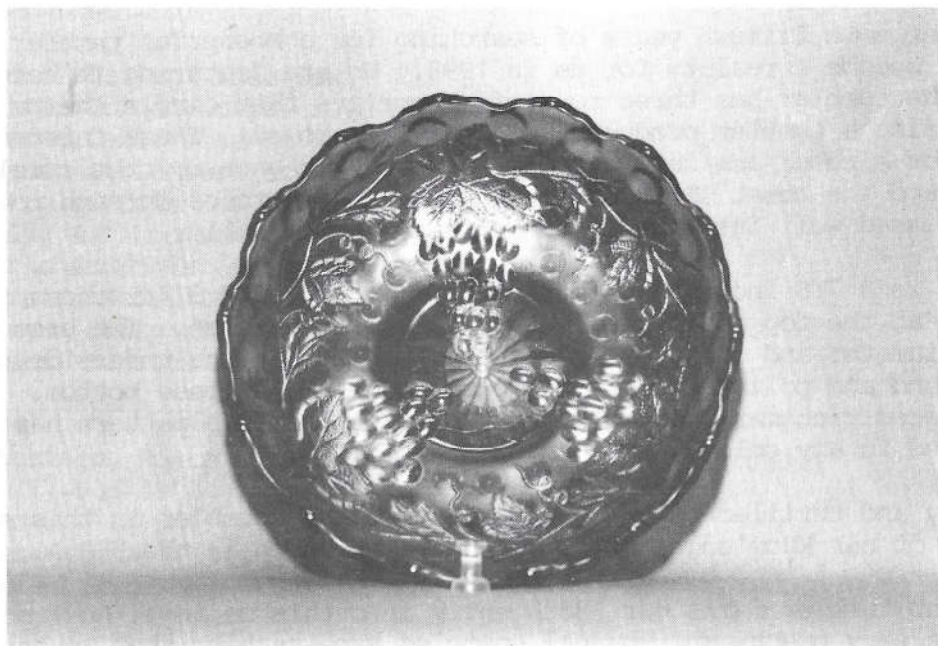


PHOTO #1 MILLERSBURG VINTAGE/HOBNAIL BACK SAUCE IN GREEN

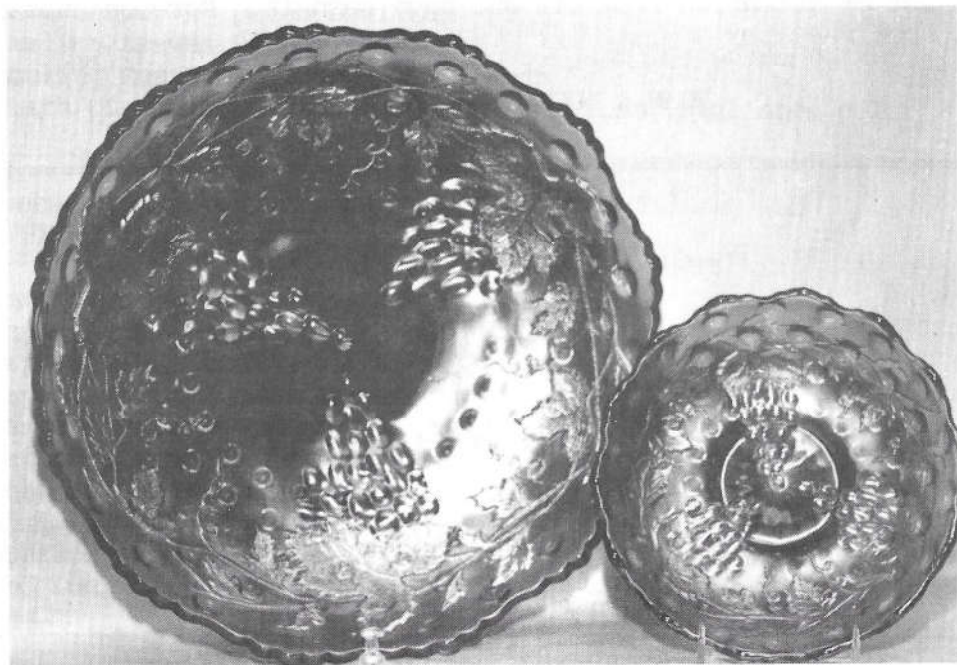

MILLERSBURG VINTAGE/HOBNAIL BACK SAUCE - - IN GREEN

Photo #1 shows the little Vintage/Hobnail sauce which is certainly a super piece of Millersburg Carnival Glass. The interior pattern contains the three rather long bunches of grapes that reach to the center of the bowl. A band of leaves, tendrils and vine circles the upper inside of the bowl. The back side contains the popular Millersburg Hobnail pattern. This little sauce is 5½ inches wide and contains an unusual rayed star type figure on the bottom of the marie or collar base.

We consider this sauce as a rarity, said to be the only one known in green. IN our Carnival Glass years, we have owned a few of the large green 9 3/4" bowls in this pattern, but this is the first sauce or berry bowl that we have seen in green.

Photo #2 illustrates the same little sauce in marigold, alongside the large master bowl in the same color and shape. These are also excellent pieces of Millersburg Carnival Glass. They are beautiful, most desirable and certainly rare.

This is #176 in our Pictorial Pattern Parade. Next month we will feature the Millersburg Mystery Peacock bowl.

OCTAGON TABLE SET IN MARIGOLD

This is one of Imperial's very ornate near-cut patterns. Table sets are listed in marigold and a rare green. Although we have never seen a complete amethyst set, we have seen enough individual pieces to believe it could also exist in amethyst. This is another pattern where the glass is relatively heavy. In the near-cut category these pieces stand out because of the almost always sharp and deep impressions and the many surfaces that reflect light.

Marigold pieces seem to be readily available and we had no trouble finding good well matched pieces. The finials are the flat squared off kind that seemed to be susceptible to edge flakes. Perfect butter dishes are the hardest of the pieces to locate. Prices of the marigold pieces are usually reasonable, but the bidding war breaks out when green or amethyst pieces sell at auction.

This is the fifteenth in our series on table sets.

JULY 29, 1993: International Carnival Glass Association auction at Indianapolis, Indiana. The I.C.G.A. Convention was held at the Embassy Suites Hotel--a very nice setting. To us, the Convention seemed a little more quiet and subdued than usual. This auction was a part of the convention with Jim Seck as guest auctioneer. We didn't think the auction had the usual zip and zing. Was there a let down after several good quality high-dollar auctions already in 1993?

It is tough to hold an auction in a long narrow room. The people in the back of the room were so far from the auctioneer they almost had to relay their bids to the front. We had three hours to view the glass, but some rather late arrivals didn't get to view it at all--the line moved at a snails pace.

Just when it seemed water sets were doing a turnaround we ran into 25 or so sets and pitchers in one auction. All were not super examples and they sold all the way up and down the scale. The tumblers were sold separately with the "choice and privilege" which worked to the advantage of the buyer when the group was not well matched or perfect or in a total of six. Other than the water sets, there was a wide variety of mostly middle group glass that sold at average prices.

A few of the seldom seen pieces at the auction were the green Inverted Strawberry pitcher at \$1,600.00, purple Perfection pitcher at \$3,500.00, marigold Strawberry Scroll pitcher (chip on strawberry) at \$1,200.00, blue Rose Tree ice cream shaped bowl at \$1,800.00 and a marigold Fenton Heart & Horseshoe bowl at \$1,500.00.

AUGUST 6, 1993: Springfield, Ohio. A four day auction well advertised in the national antique publications. Friday, August 6, was advertised as Carnival & pottery day with 375 lots of Carnival to sell at 9:30 A.M. The various ads were somewhat vague and limited, but highlighted was a "RARE" blue Grape Arbor pitcher (sold for \$14,000.00), a "Coca-Cola" ashtray (\$65.00), "old" marigold Pony plate (at \$150.00). In the middle of the ad was "30 pieces of Millersburg" including amethyst Courthouse bowl (\$475.00), "SUPER" amethyst Peacock at Urn beaded urn bowl, rare amethyst Peacock at Urn 6" ice cream bowl with beaded urn, marigold "Hobstar & Flowers" punch bowl set and green Roses & Fruits bon bon. The ad closed with "lots more including over 30 plates, aqua opalescent, etc."

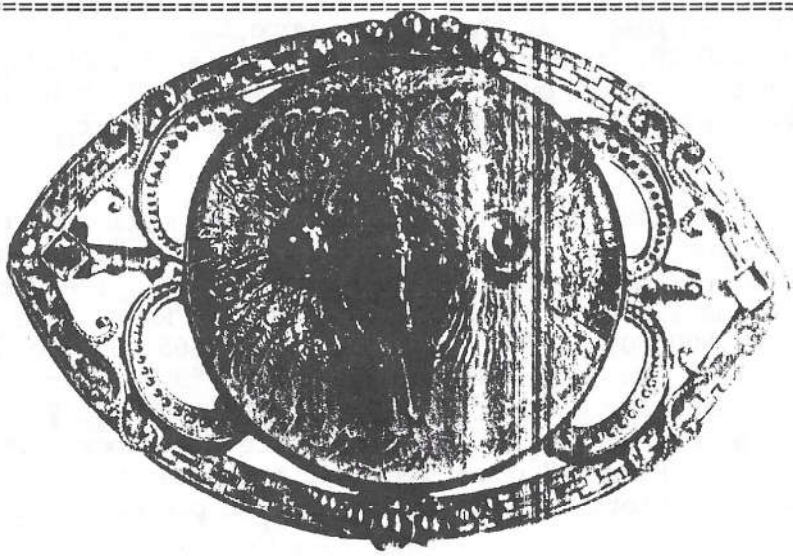
We thought this might be an interesting sale so up at an early 3:30 and off to Springfield--only 135 miles away but in a different time zone. When we drove up an hour and half prior to sale time we saw cars from Kansas, North Carolina, New York, West Virginia, Michigan and Illinois already there. Did someone know something we didn't or was it the somewhat off beat location or the auct-

ion team Carnival people don't usually see or the advertising? Anyway our Carnival people literally came out of the woodwork. A numbered list in sale order was provided at the door. Five and one half hours later they had sold the 376 pieces of Carnival and moved on to the pottery.

The high end of the glass sold very well while the middle of the road pieces were all over the lot--some high and some low. They did call most of the obvious damage and willingly took back and resold immediately the few pieces that were returned. The interesting part of the resale of the damaged pieces was they generally sold only for a fraction of the original price with a couple of exceptions like the blue opalescent "Daisy Wreath" bowl that brought \$450.00 both times.

It was an interesting sale in a fair grounds building that was not air conditioned. It was a good thing the weather was cool or it might have been a different story.

DIMPLES AND BRILLIANTS, AN UNDOCUMENTED OLD IRIDIZED HATPIN

The hatpin as an ornamental pin used for fastening a lady's hat to her head became an important lady's accessory in the early 20th century. The 1902 Sears Catalog advertised "hat pins" ranging in price from 50 cents to \$1.95. The expensive one was gold filled set with six large sapphires and forty-three brilliants (rhinestones). They went nicely with the stylish trimmed hats of the day. The heyday of Carnival glass production paralleled for a brief time during the declining years of the hatpin craze. By 1925, hatpins had all but vanished from the fashion scene. It is only logical that not only iridized glass with the volcano shank would be on the scene, but other innovative and creative minds would design a hatpin or hatpins to include rhinestones (brilliants as they were called) and incorporate other glass shapes not so far documented by button and or Carnival Glass historians. This undocumented hatpin is just that item. I've named it Dimples and Brilliants.

The convex side of the black glass is smooth while the concave side, the side we see, is filled with varying shapes and sizes of dimples. Since the discs were glued into a smooth metal alloy bezel setting, the edges of the glass were not ground and are rather rough. You don't see this when it is in its setting. The disc is one and five-sixteenth inch in diameter and is highly

iridized with blues, gold and much lavender inside each dimple. Ten small and ten larger faceted brilliants are individually mounted in metal alloy cups but with many prongs to hold the stones in place. Underneath the setting is a bridge extending from one side of the bezel setting to the other side, and in the center is the usual antique finding to receive the stem. Originally, the metal setting was silver washed. The entire piece is approximately one and eleven-sixteenth inch in diameter.

In the late 1920's, a small shop proprietor in the northeast retired and stored his remaining inventory in the basement of his home. There they remained until recently when the estate was resolved. The Dimples and Brilliants hatpin was part of the inventory. I found them in a foothill shop in northern California along with other non-iridized glass hatpins. The shop keeper said everything he purchased was very dirty and much was broken as they were wrapped only in brown paper that crumbled over the years while in that basement.

This hatpin also came in a shiny, gray metallic finish. It cannot be classified as gun metal or silver luster. One is shiny jet, and two were opalescent glass. I wish I had done my antiquing earlier as the shop keeper showed me the opalescent one he kept for his own collection but had already sold the other one.

Jerry Reynolds will include a photo of this hatpin in her soon to be published book, and Alphonse Tvaryanas will have a drawing of it in his next book. It is always exciting to find unusual glass, and who knows what other great things will emerge in the future.

SUN'S UP - - A HATPIN WORTH CROWING ABOUT

A wave of interest in iridized buttons and hatpins has invaded the Carnival Glass world. I've been collecting them before this interest took hold only because it is beautiful iridized glass, and in addition to collecting Carnival glass, I collect hatpins of all sorts.

The rare Sun's Up is a stunning piece of glass. It is rather large, measuring one and thirteen-sixteenth inch in diameter, has the volcano/cone shank for accepting the hatpin stem and is rather flat with the rooster significantly raised up. The artist who designed it was genuinely talented. It is a masterpiece. The design shows simplicity, combined with detail. One imagines the artist had the model rooster within reach while designing the hatpin feather by feather even including his spurs. He stands on top of the sun with rays radiating from it, his beak is open, giving his head a cocky look as he announces to the world the beginning of another day. To finish the piece, the edge has a tiny ribbed border that extends from one side of the sun to the other.

Rose Presznick attributed the Sun's Up to Northwood. I'm told she had seen a number of buttons/hatpins in a Northwood collection, and this could have been one reason why she attributed it to Northwood. Others say they came from

Czechoslovakia, the Bohemian region. Much pretty and inexpensive glass originated there. No one to date has been able to authenticate beyond a shadow of a doubt who made them and where. We are left to our own imaginings as we look at this beautiful glass.

I've been able to determine the Sun's Up was made in light amethyst and jet base glass. The light amethyst has iridescence that is superb. The comb and wattles are painted red. The iridized jet also has super iridescence and some have the background painted a matte black just like the smaller rooster aka Top of the Walk, which we are more familiar with. This painting gives a different effect showing off the sun and the sun's rays as well as the varying colors on the rooster's feathers. The comb and wattles are red. The black matte paint wears off easily.

Other variations were not iridized, but by themselves, are interesting and pretty. They include a gold painted rooster, red comb and wattles and gold painted sun, silver rooster with red comb and wattles and gold sun, and a plain shiny jet. The painted ones were fired and the paint ran during the process. The background was then painted matte black. This allowed the rooster to stand out and hide the processing imperfections.

Even though the Sun's Up is more scarce than Hen's Teeth, having any of the iridized hatpins could make a Carnival Glass collector cackle with glee, and having all the different variations, iridized or not, is enough to crow about. If anyone has any other variations, I'd love to hear about them.

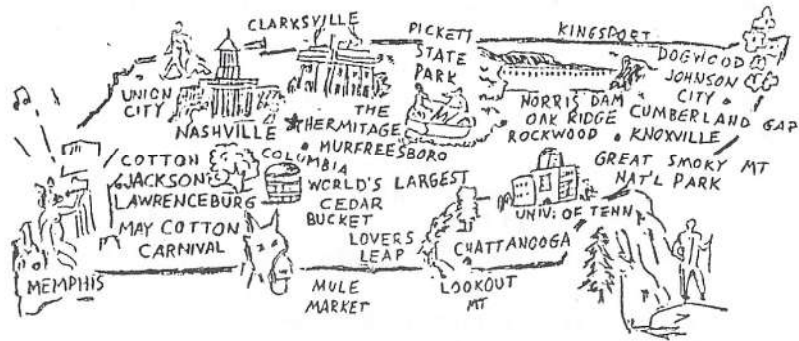

I recently found two Tennessee tumblers. On them is the outline of Tennessee with various cities and sites. Above the state are the words TENNESSEE, THE VOLUNTEER STATE. Being born and raised in Tennessee, I was excited to find them.

Along with the tumblers was a water pitcher. The pitcher also has the same scene and words as the tumblers. The pitcher also has the outline of North Carolina, various cities, sites and the words NORTH CAROLINA, THE TARHEEL STATE. It seems reasonable to assume that somewhere out there are tumblers with the North Carolina scene on them. I believe these were made by Jeanette. They are exactly like the other Jeanette water sets that everyone has seen.

Probably the most often seen pattern is Late Sunflower. Other patterns such as Royal Scroll, Blue Willow, Minuet, Pennsylvania Dutch & Castle in the Woods can be seen in Cecil Whitley's book on enameled Carnival Glass tumblers.

Other patterns which I have are Souvenir of Niagara Falls, Souvenir of Buffalo, New York, one with horizontal stripes, one with a daisy like flower surrounded by dots and one with various flowers & leaves suspended in mid air.

That makes a dozen different patterns that I have. And that's not taking into account that they came in different sizes. At least one of the patterns can be found in white or black enamel. How many more patterns might be out there?

You probably have to be a tumbler collector to be familiar with Jeanette, since they made late Carnival Glass. Many of you probably aren't interested in the late Carnival, but although many of these tumblers are easy to find, some of them are down right rare. If anyone has any information on more patterns by Jeanette or some literature that shows the different patterns, I would appreciate the help. Also, if anyone has a North Carolina tumbler or knows where one is, I'm interested in having one.
