THE ENAMELED FLORAL SPRAY TUMBLERS

Here is a very pretty enameled type tumbler that is on clear glass with excellent iridescence. The colors used in the floral spray design are flowers with two shades of pink, leaves in two shades of green and the stems are brownish gold in color. The workmanship on these pieces is excellent and it no doubt took a lot of time, patience and effort to paint the pretty floral spray pitcher and tumblers. There is a narrow gold band around the top of the tumblers.

The tumblers are of the standard table size standing 3 7/8 inches high. The exterior is smooth, but the interior contains eight rather wide panels about one inch wide.

The photo on the next page illustrates the water pitcher which contains the same floral spray, only in a much larger size. The applied handle is reeded or threaded instead of being plain. The top is ruffled containing six ruffles. The pitcher measures 9½ inches high, the base is 4¼ inches in diameter and contains a pontil mark in the center.

At the present time, we have been unable to find the maker of this pattern. We showed these pieces to Dr. James Measell, author of the Dugan-Diamond book. He was very impressed with the pattern and workmanship, but was unable to identify the manufacturer. So at the present time we will call it maker unknown.



ENAMELED FLORAL SPRAY TUMBLER ALONGSIDE THE WATER PITCHER

We consider the Floral Spray pattern as rare. We know of only one pitcher and four tumblers. Even though the pattern is on clear base glass, the iridescence is excellent, and the enamling is outstanding.

The Floral Spray tumbler and water pitcher marks our 193rd entry into our Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will present an update on the Wide Panell-ed Thistle tumbler, sometimes called Grand Thistle.

THE FENTONIA TABLE SET

This four piece table set is listed as having been made in marigold, blue and amethyst, all of which are rare. In our opinion, this pattern is unmistakably Fenton. It has the same shape as the Butterfly and Berry table set, same ball feet and finials, and the pattern is what was used as filler or background on other Fenton patterns. The more we looked at this set, the more it "grew on us". It is a very attractive set in a "different" pattern. Judging from the scarcity of the set, it must not have been one of Fenton's more popular patterns

Most marigold pieces have good color and iridescence. We believe the blue pieces are more scarce than marigold and they occasionally have uneven iridescence as well as some problems with the so called "burn" or "acid" spots. Rare or not we have not encountered high prices for this set. Although we have not seen one, an amethyst set does exist and someday we hope to have one in our collection.

This is the twentieth in our series on Table Sets.

PURPLE OCTAGON SALT & PEPPER SHAKERS

Putting this little set of purple Octagon salt and pepper shakers together was probably one of our favorite Carnival Glass achievements. We purchased them over the years one at a time. Before we were able to put this little set together, we had seen only one other set in purple and heard of one other single, none of which we were able to buy. We also saw a single marigold example at one of the Joe and Rose Presznick auctions back in the early 1970's. This is the extent of the pieces that we know about today. There are probably a few other pieces out there somewhere, but we have never seen or heard about them. We consider these little salt and peppers as very rare. They are also very pretty and most desirable.

When we write about anything in Imperials popular Octagon pattern, we always like to mention our collection of different colored Octagon wines. In photo #2 on the next page, we show a nice selection. Top row left to right. #1 Purple wine, rare, #2 dark Marigold cordial, very hard to locate and the only color we have seen in the Octagon cordial. #3 Cobalt blue wine, very rare color. Bottom row left to right. #1 dark Marigold wine, common color, but highly sought after to complete out wine sets. #2 Aqua Teal, very rare. We purchased this one in 1975 and have seen and sold only one since then. #3 Frosty White wine, only one we have ever seen or heard of in that color. #4 Helios Green, you would think that this color would be common, but you try to find an Octagon wine in Helios green. Imperial Grape in Helios Green yes, they are common, but

not in the Octagon pattern.

While discussing the Octagon wines, we would also like to mention the beautiful and rare purple Octagon wine sets. We had one of these dark purple sets back in the early 1970's. We had purchased it from Betty Klutz of Oklahoma City. In 1975 we had planned to move to Florida and decided on an auction in St. Louis. We hated to sell the Octagon wine set, as it was one of our favorites, but finally decided to sell everything but mugs and tumblers.

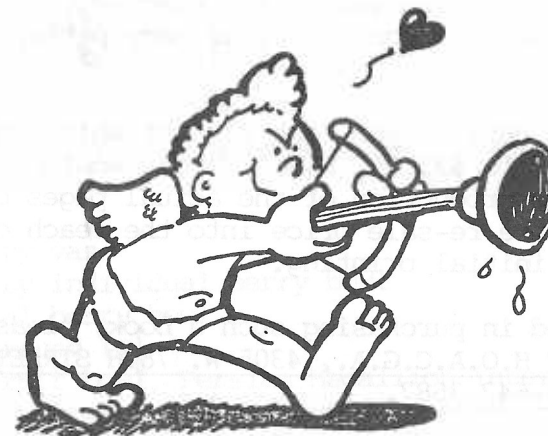
The Bob Grissom's came to look at our glass before our auction and the purple Octagon wine set was one of their favorites. They purchased it at our 1975 auction and it sold for \$775.00. Keep in mind that this was back in 1975 when ice blue and ice green were selling for very little. For instance, our beautiful ice green Poppy Show plate in mint condition sold for \$275.00. WE might add that we were very happy with that price, because that was what they were selling for at that time. Our highest price piece in our 1975 auction was a super purple Christmas Compote that sold for \$2,900.00. Next highest piece was our beautiful aqua opal Peacock at the Fountain fruit bowl for \$2,700.00. It went to Cooley Miller's daughter. Sometime later to the Cooley Miller's and later still to Ken Osbon of Oregon. It is now a part of the Karen and Doug Engle collection in Oregon. We rather suspect that it will stay there. We would like to make a trip out to Oregon sometime and take another look at that beautiful piece.

Regarding the rare and beautiful Octagon wine set, we still stop by Bob Grissom's occasionally to take another peek at it. We never get tired of looking at Carnival Glass.

The featured purple Octagon salt and pepper shakers marks our 190th entry into our Pictorial Pattern Parade. We hope that you have found it interesting and educational.

As a result of our quest for Butler Brothers Catalogs last fall, we now have an accumulation of some 300 pages illustrating Carnival Glass patterns and their original selling prices.

There are 39 issues of Butler Brothers, 2 issues of John M. Smyth Co., 1 issue of Baltimore Bargain House, and 1 issue of Charles Broadway Rouss, Inc. These were all wholesale distributors. The years involved within these catalogs extend from 1905-1931 with no duplication of issue dates.

Not every issue illustrates the same assortment of glass and certainly not every pattern we know in Carnival is represented. They DO represent verification of manufacture AND the continuity of many patterns over many years of sale.

Before printing this publication, the size of which is: 11" X 14" with a price range of \$20.00 to \$22.00, H.O.A.C.G.A. would like an idea of the desirability of such re-production of the actual pages of these historical old catalogs. To bring the re-sale price into the reach of collectors, 1,000 books will need to be the initial printing.

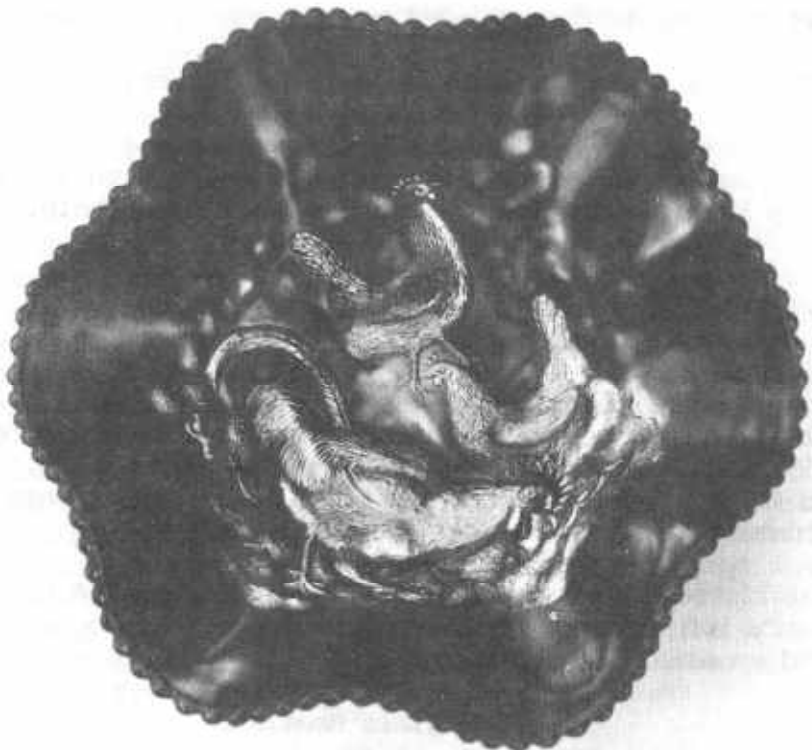

FENTON MOULD # 1545

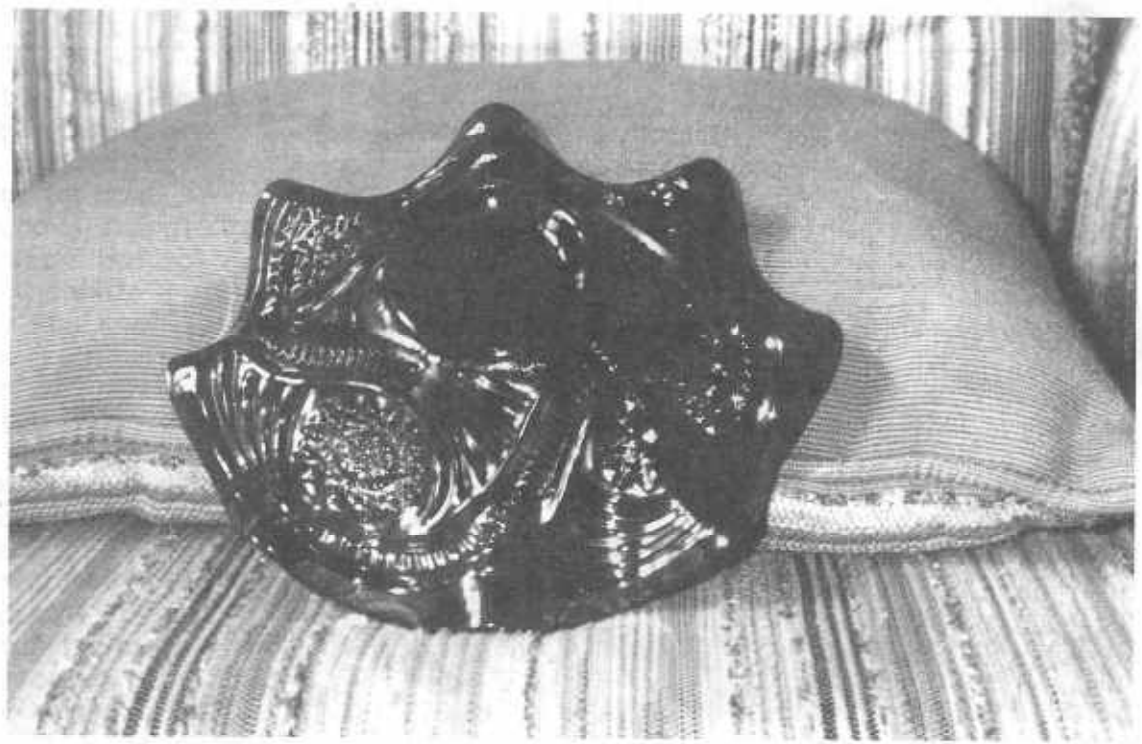

When we arrived last July to pick up this mould, huge circus tents had been erected in the Factory parking lot. MANY treasures could be found among the "tent sale" offerings, which Frank explained occurs about every couple of years. It is quite an experience. You owe it to yourselves to go there sometime! #1545 is a two part mould. When clamped together, the retaining ring with scalloped edge is placed on top of the mould.

GREEN DRAGON AND LOTUS

The green color in Fenton glass is sometimes harder to find especially in some patterns. However, the different shape bowls in the collar based Dragon and Lotus are not as difficult to find as the different shaped spatula footed bowl. Maybe because the spatula footed are not as abundant.

Dr. Chris Reynolds was well known for collecting Dragon and Lotus. He collected for many years and some of the different green shaped bowls were still missing. That should indicate the difficulty in finding some shapes.

The green base colors include a dark emerald green, a light green, and a blue-green (not aqua). The lime green is more scarce than the lime green opal. The emerald green collar base with the green iridescence is my favorite. It has a dull matt finish. Diane Fry has told us when the iridescence and the base color are the same, it really enhances the glass. How true! Some green pieces don't look green. They range from beautiful green to butterscotch iridescence. Usually they're iridized on both sides. Some have a shiny finish and the green shows thru and the dark green almost seems opaque.

As of this date there are no known green plates in Dragon and Lotus. Wouldn't that be a find!
