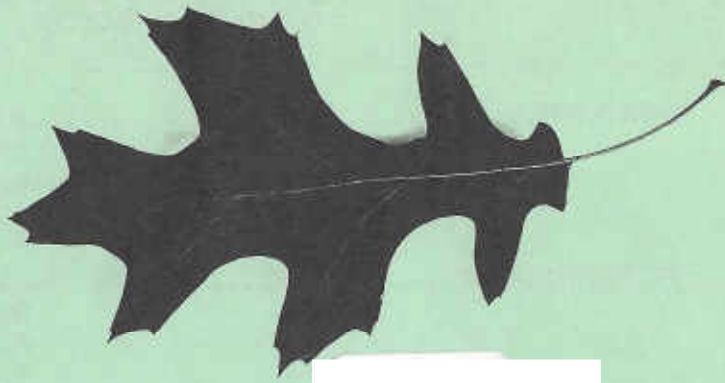

BULLS EYE AND DIAMONDS MUG

The Bulls Eye and Diamonds mug that is shown above is the only example that we have ever seen in this pattern. We suspect that it is foreign made, probably European, but what a beauty. It is in good dark marigold.

The mug is $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches tall with a top opening of $2\frac{3}{4}$ inches. The base is $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches in diameter. The underside of the base contains a 16 point star figure. The background design features the wide panels. The main motif is a band of diamonds with bulls eye centers that circles the mug just below the center of the piece. Nine half diamonds or triangles containing many tiny diamond points fit up into the featured band of diamonds.

This very fine mug is one that you might want to look for in your travels. We can assure you that it is rare. We suspect that this pattern was made in other pieces such as tumblers, wines, pitchers and decanters.

THE MIRROR AND CROSSBARS TUMBLER

We purchased this tumbler, along with a good many others, back in 1978 when Herbert and Gretchen Ripley decided to sell their tumbler collection. They called this tumbler Mirror and Crossbars. We have always used that name for this pattern because it fits the pattern so very well.

The tumbler is of the lemonade type standing $5\frac{1}{4}$ inches tall with a 3 inch top opening. There is a one inch wide plain band around the top. Three of the mirror designs are evenly spaced around the tumbler near the top. The rest of the tumbler is covered with many fine lines that cross one another. Hence the name Mirror and Crossbars. The bottom of the base is plain. The color is a very pretty marigold.

The Mirror and Crossbars tumbler was made very similar to the Muscadine and Beaded Spears tumblers in shape and size. These were all made of a rather thin glass, certainly not heavy. We suspect that it was made in Czechoslovakia. A number of this type of tumblers were picked up in India and brought back to Australia. From Australia, some of this type of tumblers found their way to the United States. This is how we got the pretty Muscadine tumbler. The Mirror and Crossbars tumbler is now a part of the Whitley collection. It is the only one that we have ever seen. We would think that there are others out there somewhere, especially in Australia. We consider this tumbler as rare, desirable and is one that you might want to look for on your hunting trips.

An afterthought on this distinct type of tumblers that have often been found in India. We know for sure that a number of this type of Carnival Glass tumblers found in Australia, such as Vineyard Harvest, Beaded Panels & Grapes, Mirrored Peacocks and the ones that we have mentioned in this article, were brought into Australia from India. Has anyone in Australia, or from any country for that matter, ever checked to see if they made glass in India? Is it possible that these thin glass type tumblers, that we call Czechoslovakian, were perhaps made in India? This is just a thought that maybe some of our Carnival Glass members that visit in India might try to check this out. We would appreciate any information on this subject.

This unusual and pretty Mirror and Crossbars tumbler marks our 200th entry into the Educational Tumbler Series. We hope that you have found it interesting.

A PEEK INTO THE PAST - - IN CARNIVAL GLASS

It is interesting to note that back in the early 1970's that dealers and collector-dealers sent out lists of their Carnival Glass for sale. We got a lot of them at that time. For this months Peek Into the Past in Carnival Glass we are featuring one of these lists. This one came from Annette and Sol Zwirn of Tustin, California. It was dated February 1, 1974. The list contained 284 pieces. We have picked out some of the most interesting pieces from that list and have itemized them below. The Zwirns were certainly one of the largest Carnival Glass dealers at that time. They also ran large ads in the Antique Trader. We have listed the pieces in different categories such as plates, bowls, etc. We hope that you will find the prices interesting.

A LOOK AT TABLE SETS

CHERRY AND CABLE TABLE SET

This Northwood product is also sometimes called Cherry Cable and Thumbprints. It was made only in Marigold and is considered a scarce set. This is a "squared off" massive looking set that usually has a good rich marigold color.

In some respects this is a strange looking set. The butter base looks to be identical to the Peach butter base. It has a 12 scallop edge, 12 panels on the underside, a many rayed star in the base and plain upper side. Put the butter top alone on the table and it resembles a king's crown. The nine thumbprints that circle the top just below the finial are the most prominent or eye catching part. A three part mold with three groups of cherries (four cherries to a group) hanging or attached to the cable that circles the middle of the top. There are nine panels and each group of cherries covers two panels leaving a blank panel between groups.

The other three pieces are from four piece molds with eight thumbprints that circle the lower portion and there are only two groups of cherries (six cherries each) that occupy two panels each. The sugar and the spooner are both handled pieces. The sugar lid has eight thumbprints. All four pieces are usually marked with the N in a circle trademark.

We only have three pieces of this four piece set, but since we have the key pieces we decided to picture this set without the creamer. Hopefully sometime we will be able to buy the creamer to complete our set.

We bought our butter out of a car trunk at a St. Louis auction in 1983. It had an incorrect base at the time. At home we had a Flute butter with the base we needed. A Switch gave us both sets with correct bases. Five years later we got the sugar on a mail bid at an auction in the East. We waited three more years before we found the spooner in a room at an auction. Three pieces in eight years--now after three more years we must be about ready to find the creamer. Although this is considered a scarce set, prices are usually quite reasonable.

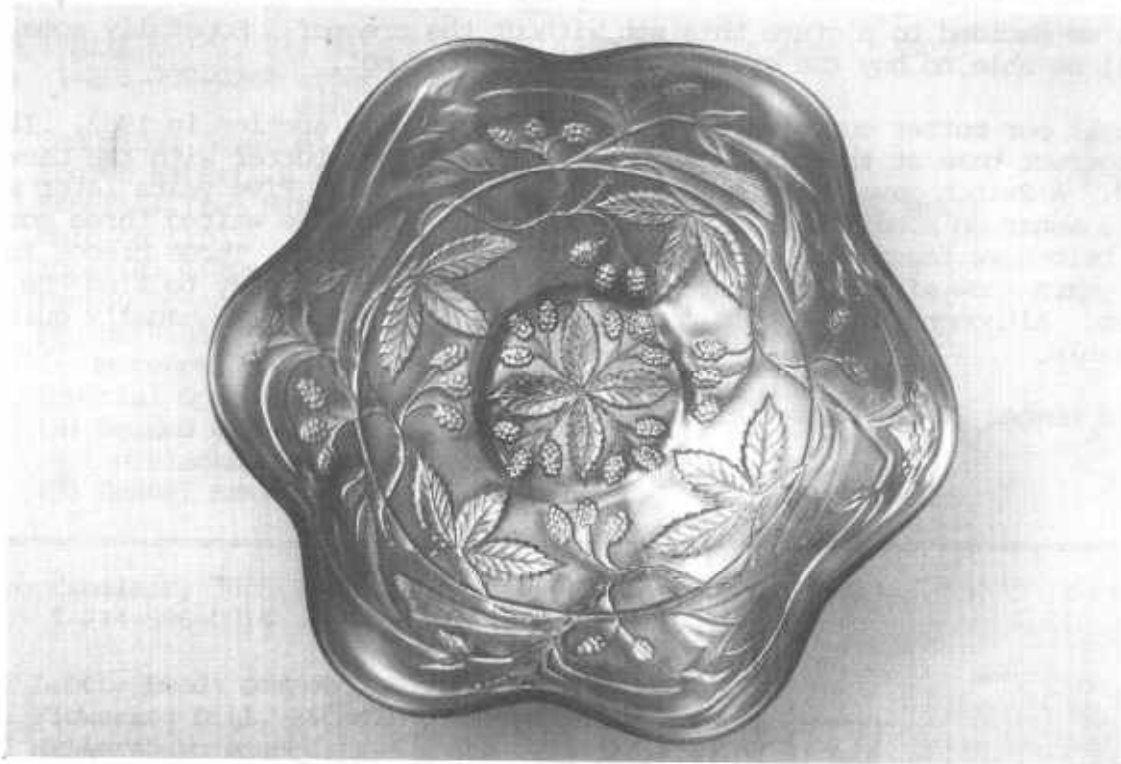

WILD BLACKBERRY

When considering the ten rarest bowls from Fenton, this engaging pattern comes to mind immediately, although this one has never instigated the response which we observe whenever a Dragon's Tongue, Peter Rabbit, or Rose Tree appears in our midst.

There really is no rationale for this, because the pattern appears on no other shape and certainly is great design, with nice balance and the ones we have seen have all been with strong color and iridescence. The mould work is quite good!

Except for the fact that SOME collectors seem not to credit a bowl with six ruffles, we can think of no reason that this extremely rare but reasonably priced piece should have remained in the "less than \$200.00 category in ANY color!"

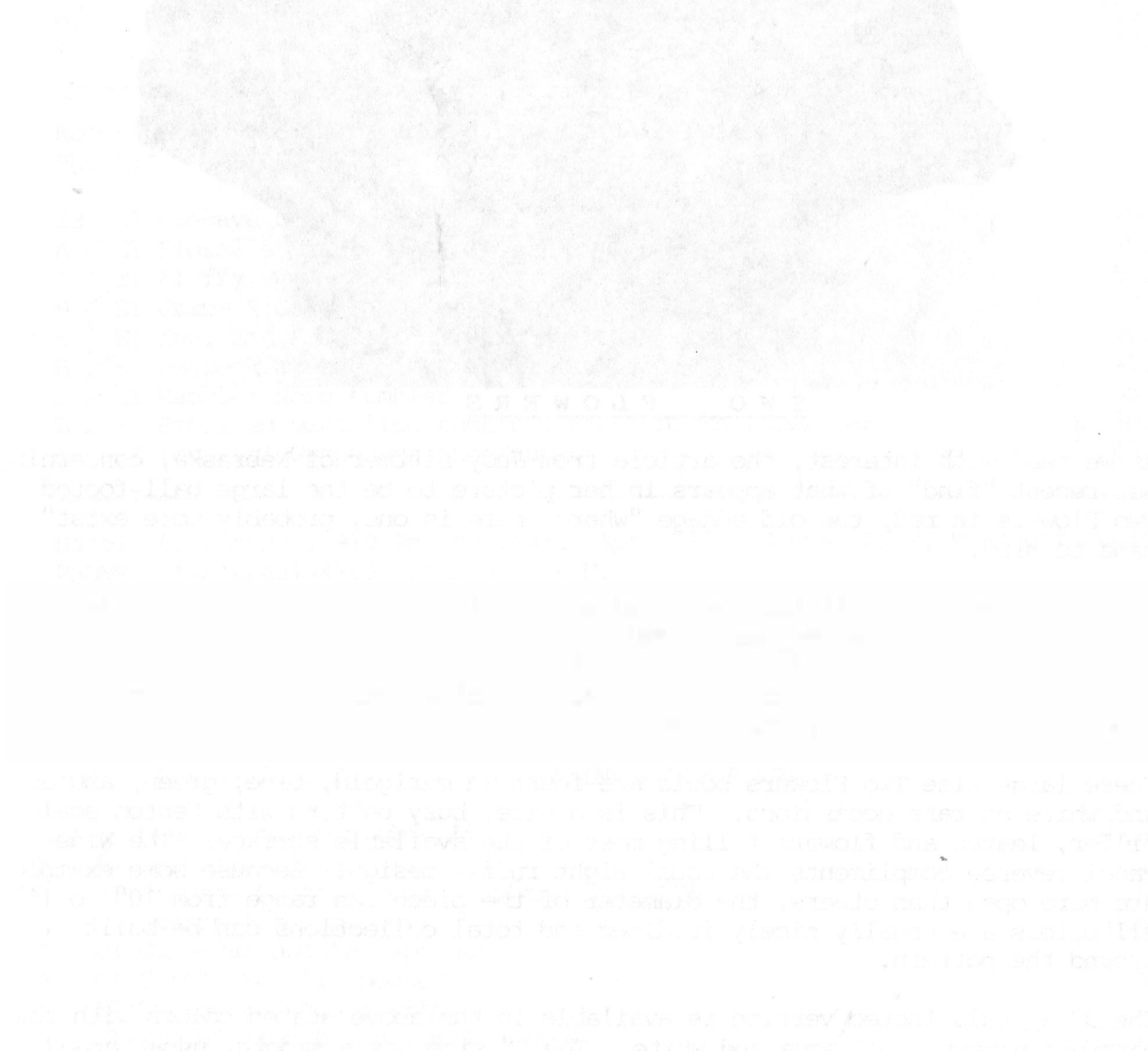
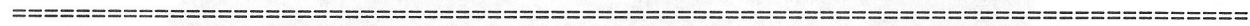
Perhaps there are a few more marigold examples than green, blue or amethyst. However, just ONE green bowl with the VERY occasional H. MADAY advertising in the base brought \$500.00 at auction in 1993. No non-advertising examples came to auction.

ONLY one marigold bowl sold in 1992 for a mere \$85.00!! We bought ours that

year for \$70.00 and watched another beauty sell privately also, for \$65.00! Now, here's one for the record. In 1991, the ONLY Wild Blackberry bowl sold on record for \$62.00!

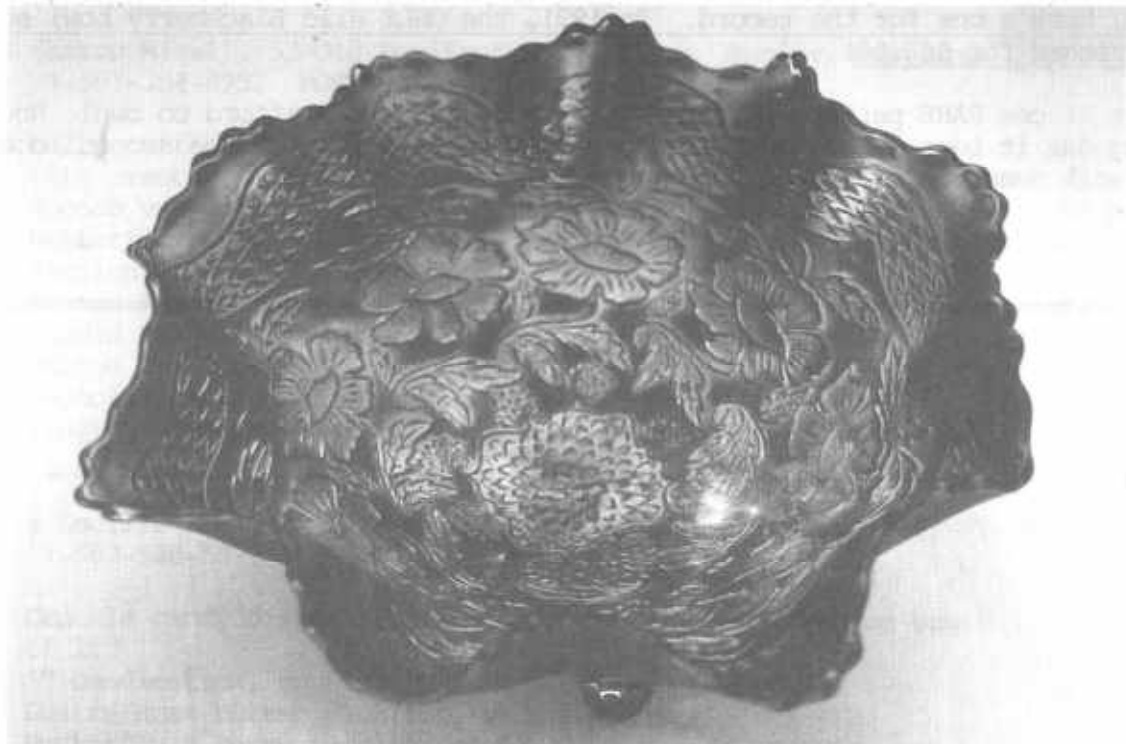
This is one RARE pattern which ANYONE who collects CAN afford to own! How long has it been since YOU passed one by without giving it the second look it so well deserves?

TWO FLOWERS

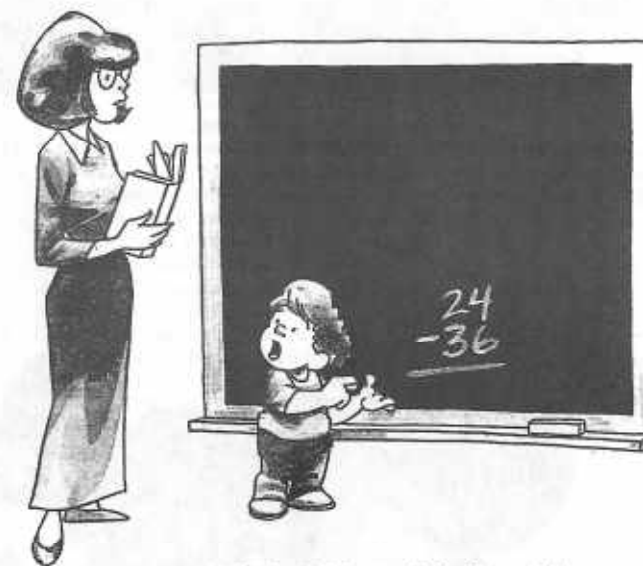
As we read with interest, the article from Judy Dittmer of Nebraska, concerning her recent "find" of what appears in her picture to be the large ball-footed Two Flowers in red, the old adage "where there is one, probably more exist" came to mind.

Even as recent as April this year, we were still under the assumption that only two of these bowls in red were known.

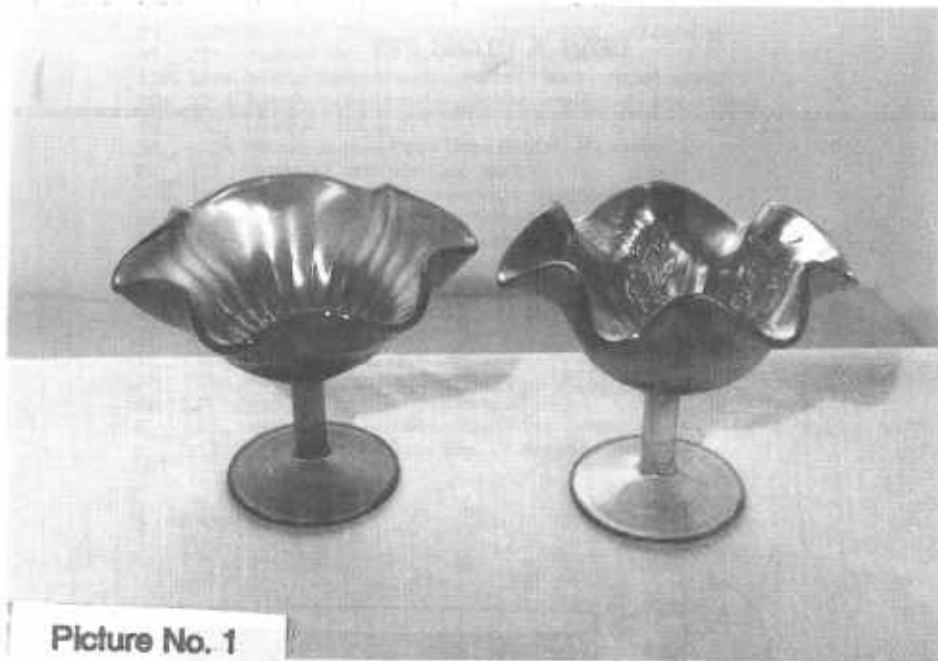
Ours came from the Don Moore collection. The other resides in the fine collection of Robert and Betty Stremming.

These large size Two Flowers bowls are found in marigold, blue, green, and aqua and white on rare occasions. This is a nice, busy pattern with Fenton scale filler, leaves and flowers filling most of the available surface. The Wide Panel reverse compliments the usual eight ruffle design. Because some examples are more open than others, the diameter of the piece can range from 10" to 11". All colors are usually nicely iridized and total collections can be built around the pattern.

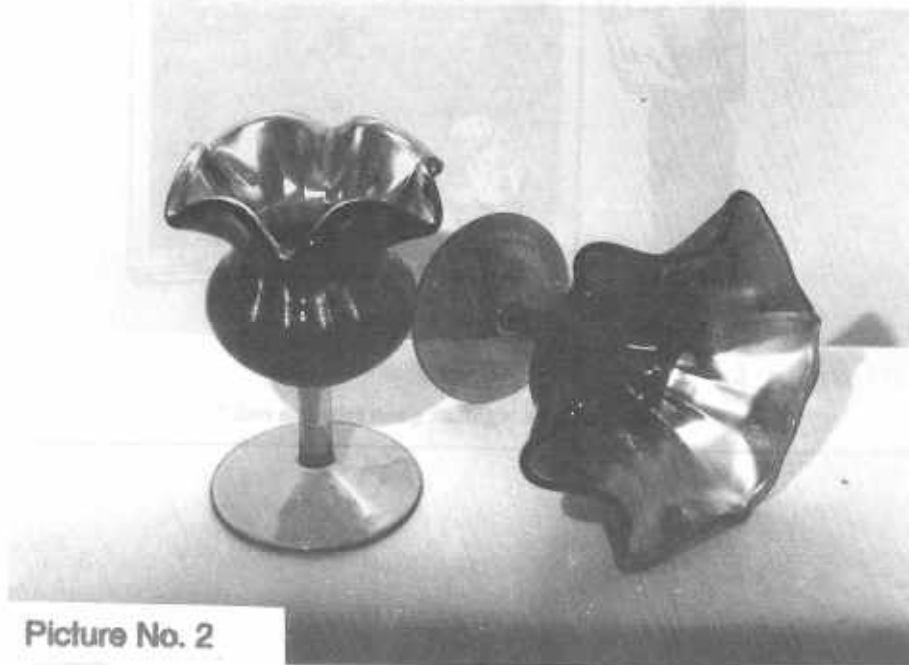
The 9" spatula footed version is available in the above stated colors with the possible exception of aqua and white. The 9" size has a smooth, unpatterned reverse.

Two compotes that were missed in the H.O.A.C.G.A. Compote Sections are what I am going to call in this article the "Fenton's Rib" compotes. This compote pattern comes in two sizes. First, in picture number one, I show two small green compotes obviously made from the same basic compote mold. Only the secondary or plunger mold was different. The compote on the right most of us refer to as a Holly compote. The book "Fenton Glass, The First Twenty-Five Years" has a better descriptive name of "Rib and Holly Sprig". This mold was obviously a very good seller as today they are abundant in a large variety of colors. It follows that if the right compote is "Rib and Holly Sprig, the one on the left without the Holly should or could be called "Rib". I feel that this "Rib" plunger mold was a forerunner to the better selling "Rib and Holly Sprig". Both have 28 ribs, stand a little over 4" tall and have a 2 3/8" diameter foot and are made from a two part mold. Having only found this one green compote in this size after some seventeen years of collecting suggests that this was not a good seller.

The second picture shows a larger version "Rib" compote on the right. This compote although very similar has only 20 ribs, a larger 3 1/4" diameter foot and stands about 5 1/2" tall. This compote mold was squeezed in to form what some people refer to as the "Small Rib" rose bowl, shown on the left in amber. This is shown as #76 in the H.O.A.C.G.A. Rose Bowl Section. This color was not listed.

This is confusing as on the same page two other rose bowls precede it with the same name. (No. 74 & 75) They are made from a different mold with a bulbous stem, and have 37 ribs. I believe they are from the Mid-Spring 1909 Golden Sunset assortment shown in the Butler Brothers catalogs. A Fenton assortment. The same compote is shown in the Compote Section as #105 and attributed to Dugan. This compote was pulled into a variety of shapes, including a pedestal cake plate.

The "Small Rib" rose bowl has previously been attributed to Fenton and that is presumably correct. It is not my intention to rename this Fenton rib pattern but only to call attention to the fact that they do exist. Does anyone know if this pattern has another name other than "Small Rib"? Will the real "Small Rib" please stand up? And who decided these compotes are really rose bowls? Maybe this is one of those situations that depend on if you are selling or buying. When the Club solicits pictures for the H.O.A.C.G.A. Notebook, it is to everyone's advantage that we all try to respond. Sometimes we miss out on the simple patterns, and they fall through the cracks.
