MORE ON THE FENTON NUT CUPS

COMPLETE SET OF FENTON NUT CUPS IN WISTERIA

We recently wrote an article featuring the Fenton nut cups. We pointed out that we had seen only two of the small sized cups in the Wisteria color and had never seen any of the large master sized examples in that color.

Only recently we received a nice letter from Jerri Sue Lucas of Federal Way, Washington. She stated that they had found a complete set in the Wisteria color at a local antique mall this past June. She also stated that they were fairly new collectors and that our articles and books were very helpful to them.

Photo #1 illustrates their complete set - the master and six small pieces in the Wisteria color. The master (large size) is 3 3/4 inches high and 5 5/8 inches across the top. The base is 3 5/8 inches in diameter. The upper part that flares out contains a narrow band that appears to be much like Laurel Leaves in appearance. The small cups do not contain this band. Photo #2 illustrates the master cup laying on its side. Notice the band of leaves around the top.

We wish to thank Jerri Lucas for writing and sending along the photos. This little Wisteria nut set is one that we have never seen. Wouldn't this make a fine set for the Fenton museum?

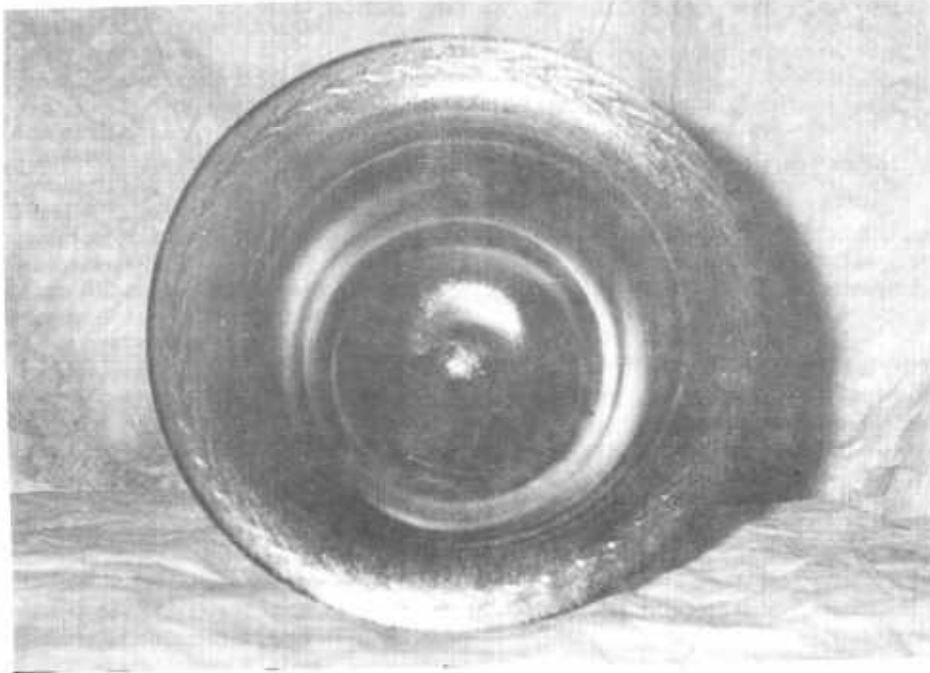

EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

WAFFLE BLOCK AND WAFFLE BLOCK VARIANT TUMBLERS

In this article we are featuring the Waffle Block Variant tumbler. It is shown on the right in the above photo. We covered the regular Waffle Block tumbler, illustrated on the left, back in March of 1978. It was #4 in our Carnival Glass Tumbler Series. We did not mention the Waffle Block Variant in that article, because we had not seen or heard of the Variant at that time. We feel that the Variant should be included in our tumbler series.

Actually the main difference in the two tumblers is that one has a collar base and the other has a flat base. The sides on the Variant appear to be more straight up. The Waffle Block Variant comes down to a flat base and does not contain the rather deep groove and collar that is found on the regular Waffle Block tumbler. By not using the collar base, the Variant is a little shorter. It is 4 1/8 inches high while the taller Waffle Block is 4 3/8 inches tall. Both have a base diameter of 2 1/4 inches. The distance across the top is 3 1/16 inches for the regular tumbler and 2 7/8 inches for the Variant. The underside of the base on both tumblers contains an 18 point star type figure. The colors found on the Waffle Block tumblers are dark marigold and clambroth. We have seen the Variant only in clambroth, but we suspect that they were also made in marigold. We consider the Waffle Block Variant tumblers as very hard to find. These tumblers were made by the old Imperial Glass Company of Bell-air, Ohio.

PICTORIAL PATTERN PARADE

BLACKBERRY AND RAYS COMPOTE

This is a very pretty Northwood pattern compote that is only seldom seen. We could not find this pattern listed in any of the old Carnival Glass books. This pattern is different than the regular Northwood Blackberry compote which carries the Basketweave exterior pattern and the Northwood trademark on the interior. It is also different from the Blackberry pattern that is used on the inside of the Daisy & Plume three-footed compotes and rose bowls. The Northwood Blackberry and Rays pattern has been found only in the compote shape.

The Blackberry and Rays compote carries the famous underlined "N" in a circle on the bottom of its base instead of the interior of the bowl. The interior features a background of 40 rays spaced evenly around the inner surface of the compote. On top of this large group of rays is a band, 1½ inches wide, that features berrys, leaves and flowers. This rays and blackberry combination forms a very pretty interior. The exterior is plain and contains no pattern. The compote measures 4½ inches high and has 6 ruffles. The bowl part of the compote is 6 inches wide. The bottom of the base is 3 inches in diameter and is plain. It is made and shaped similar to Northwoods Blossomtime compote.

Colors known in these compotes are purple, green and marigold. We have seen

four in purple, two in green and only one in marigold. A purple example sold for \$325.00 at the John & Lucile Britt auction in March, 1994. The one in marigold sold for \$500.00. This marigold example is the only one that has ever been reported in that color. Even though they are very pretty in any color, wouldn't it be great to find one in one of Northwood's pastel colors?

We might mention that a purple Blackberry and Rays compote is shown in color on page 86 of the "Carnival Glass 1995 Appointment Calendar Book" which was arranged by David and Joan Doty. Many other colored photos of beautiful Carnival Glass are shown in that very fine book. The Blackberry and Rays compote is also shown in color in the Compote Section of the H.O.A.C.G.A. Pattern Glass Notebook.

This article is #191 in our Pictorial Pattern Parade Series. The compote is a part of the writers collection. The photo was provided through the courtesy of David Doty.

In this issue of the "Peek Into the Past", we will feature the second Sam Roebuck auction. A large portion of the Roebuck collection was sold by John Woody in a 1980 auction. This auction contains some of their favorite pieces that they did not wish to sell in their first auction. You will notice a lot of rare pieces in this list. The auction also contained R. S. Prussia, French Cameo, Royal Bayreuth and Art Glass. We will cover only the Carnival Glass pieces at this time. The auction was held at the Holiday Inn West, I-270 at St. Charles Rock Road, St. Louis, Missouri. John Woody was the auctioneer. Dates were September 3 and 4, 1982. Prices received are as follows:

A LOOK AT TABLE SETS

PEACOCK AT THE FOUNTAIN TABLE SET

This is a Northwood pattern and apparently their second most popular pattern after Grape & Cable. The table set was made in marigold, amethyst, blue, rare green, rare white and rare ice blue.

The marks we have seen are somewhat puzzling. All our butter dishes have the N in a single circle. Most of our sugars, creamers and spooners have the N in a double circle mark. The exception is the green sugar which has the N in a single circle. We have seen an ice blue set with the familiar N in a single circle trademark on all four pieces. Obviously they used different molds, but do the pieces represent different periods of production? If so, we have sets that were "marriages" rather than sets that have always been together. Probably most sets of any kind we purchase now have been put together as it would be a wonder if many complete sets have survived all these years intact.

All four pieces rest on collar bases. The butter top, sugar and spooner were made from four piece molds but the pattern was repeated only twice. The creamer is almost identical except one fountain is omitted for the handle attachment. Each pattern section has three main segments--a well designed peacock standing on a wall with a sprig of some shrub as a filler, something that looks like a palm tree of sorts and a fountain that is maybe a little out of propor-

tion. The sugar, creamer and spooner have a prominent row of beads circling the pieces both above and below the pattern. The beads are the widest part of the pieces and took their share of bruises. The lids both have a row of beads on the finial and another lower down. It is an interesting pattern and was very popular.

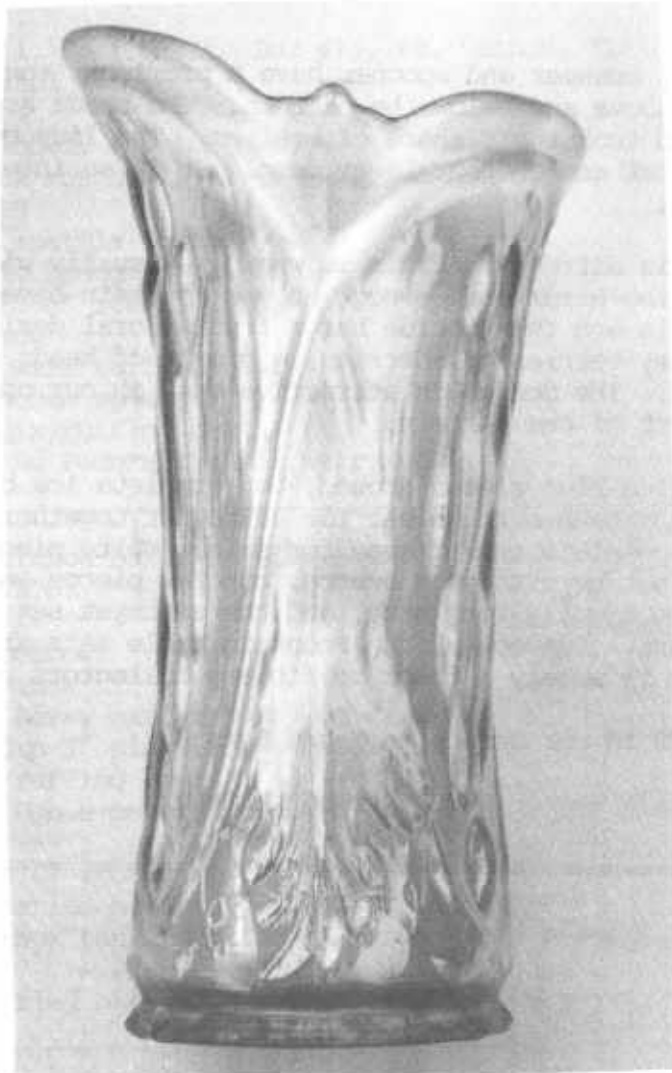
The butter base is different. This is where we usually claim the "Birds go together." Singing Birds and Peacock at the Fountain have the same bases. The underside is plain and the topside has a fruit-floral design with a couple of different flowers, berries or cherries, a couple of heads of wheat and a few leaves and stems. The design is attractive but, in our opinion, has little relation to the rest of the pattern.

There are a few ice blue pieces around, but complete ice blue sets are very scarce. Green has been a tough set for us to put together, and we do not remember seeing a complete one offered for sale. White pieces are seen occasionally. Blue may not be listed as scarce, but few pieces seem to be available. Marigold sets are usually very nice, and the amethyst set is the old standby and looks the part. Peacock at the Fountain table sets are eagerly sought after, and there is surely a color to fit any collectors preference.

PALM BEACH VASE (WHIMSEY)

U. S. Glass Company made some of the most spectacular white examples in all of Carnival Glass. Their application of heavy pastel tones of iridescence can scarcely be surpassed.

The Palm Beach table set in white is, in our opinion, one of the most handsome of all table sets. It can be found in honey amber and marigold. Some shapes are found in amethyst.

The water set in this pattern is quite distinctive with a pitcher which is

shorter than most others, having a twig-like handle.

The rosebowl shape is found with silver or gold applied to the upper rim and contains a Gooseberry interior, as well as design under the collar base. Another rosebowl exists without the painted trim and no interior pattern.

A marigold tri-cornered whimsey from a tumbler is known, along with a much sought after 6½" marigold plate. This is a spin-off from the small berry bowl.

The four whimsey shapes which come from the table spooner are: a four sides-pinned in rosebowl type piece, a 5" tall, 5½" wide marigold vase with a slightly flared top edge, a white spooner having an unaltered base flaring out at the top one inch of the piece; lastly, the 7" swung vase pictured here.

These whimseys exchange hands privately, therefore it is difficult to determine their current status. Mention is made in one written source where a vase (as pictured) sold in 1989 for \$250.00. If any one of these shapes were to appear at auction, competition would surely be keen. There is also a banana-shaped version of a bowl with goofus decoration known to exist.

We feel fortunate to own this particular vase. Perhaps some of you readers can add to the list of whimseys in the Palm Beach pattern. We would enjoy reading an article from anyone who can contribute more information.

ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK & MARGE

SEPTEMBER 9, 1994: An estate auction in Springfield, Ohio, that was billed as a lifetime collection of thousands of items. The ad said 500 pieces of old Carnival Glass with no details given. We called the local auctioneer selling the glass and they knew little more. With all that glass there just had to be something for us and everyone else. It was 140 miles and an hour time difference so we made motel reservations nearby--had to be fresh for what turned out to be a long day.

We didn't expect the best so arrived early for the preview. There it was--500 or so pieces of Carnival--no numbers--no list--no pattern identify and many signs saying "don't pick up the glass." All this in a country fair grounds building with poor acoustics and set up for two auction rings in the same room. On the good side--the auction team was kind and helpful and called the damage they saw, the chairs had cushioned seats and the restrooms were above average.

We soon found out we were to ask the helpers to hand us the glass for examination--but who were the helpers--with a couple of exceptions they all looked alike to us. We zeroed in on two that had auction company names on their clothing and we were able to see the pieces we were interested in. Since this was an old time collection it had its share of pieces bought way back when some damage was acceptable. No problem however, because if you found uncalled damage, the piece was readily returnable. The Carnival Glass, which included 90 or so vases and many bowls, was intermixed with art glass, cut glass, pressed glass, pottery, costume jewelry, figurines, pictures and more all day long.

The auction team had little trouble moving the Carnival Glass at what we thought were reasonable prices. Think of finger bowls with rose petals floating in them--well the auctioneer must have--he sold our rose bowls as "finger bowls."

SEPTEMBER 17, 1994: A Burns auction at the Harley Hotel in Columbus, Ohio. They sold the collection of Danny and Mildred Replogle with the addition of a group of Cambridge Carnival. Not a lot of high end glass, but it was a good well conducted auction of desirable glass.

We have come to expect a piece or two of unusual glass at a Burns auction. This time we saw a lovely Czech 3 lily blown swirl epergne with hanging baskets in marigold with green trim--a real beauty that brought \$700.00. A red Peacock Lamp that had the original peacock finial brought \$650.00--with the original finial we felt it was a real buy. Also there was a neat Palm Beach bulbous spittoon shaped vase in white at \$725.00. We also expect Tom to "buff" the heck out of a few pieces during the auction. A couple that really glistened were the \$1,700.00 electric blue Leaf Chain 9 inch plate and the purple Dugan Dogwood Sprays domed tri-cornered bowl.

QUESTION AND ANSWER COLUMN: The present system of sending in a question and/or a photo does not enlighten the membership as the responses are not published. Questions could be sent to an expert on the topic or to a general authority. That person could then submit the question and their response to the Bulletin Secretary for publication. Someone could compile a list of those willing to answer questions with their address. I have several questions which I'm eager to submit.

COLLECTING EXPERIENCES: Everyone must have at least one interesting tale surrounding the acquisition of a favorite piece. Younger collectors would undoubtedly be interested in reading about the availability of Carnival Glass in the 1950's and 60's at the local level, regionally, and outside the U.S. I also think articles on the present availability of our favorite glass in England & Australia would be interesting. How about a brief article on the beginning of the H.O.A.C.G.A. Club? Also, has anyone found any good pieces at a thrift store, garage sale, or any other out-of-the ordinary location lately?

GREAT FINDS: These stories are always inspiring and serve to renew our optimism. They could include great flea market, auction, or antique shop deals. Has anyone spent twenty or more years looking for a piece only to find it in an unexpected manner? By the way, I met a lady a few months ago who had just purchased a perfect Brooklyn Bridge bowl for \$20.00 in a small town auction in south Louisiana.

PERSONAL FAVORITES: These short stories could be about pieces which are common or rare, inexpensive or expensive. Perhaps it is a family piece, the first that you owned. Do you collect only one pattern or pieces from one manufacturer? If so, the rest of us would enjoy the story. By the way, does anyone else have a collection of iridized flower frogs?

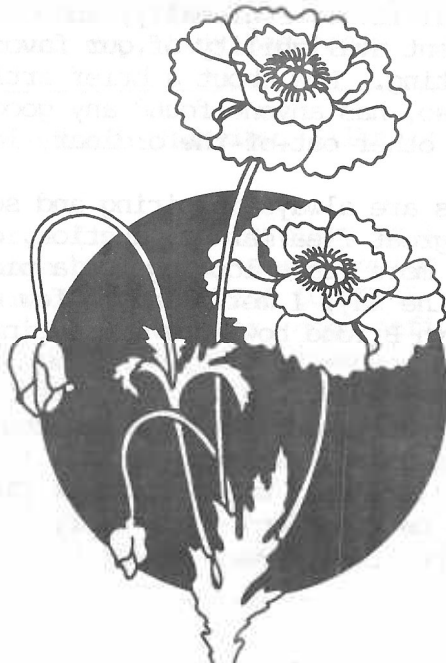
