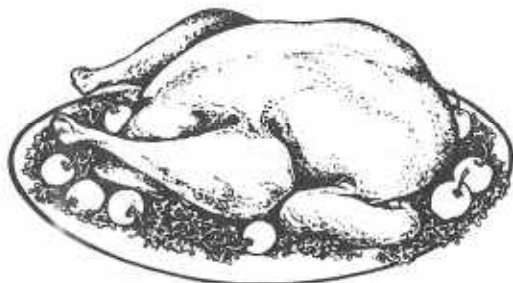

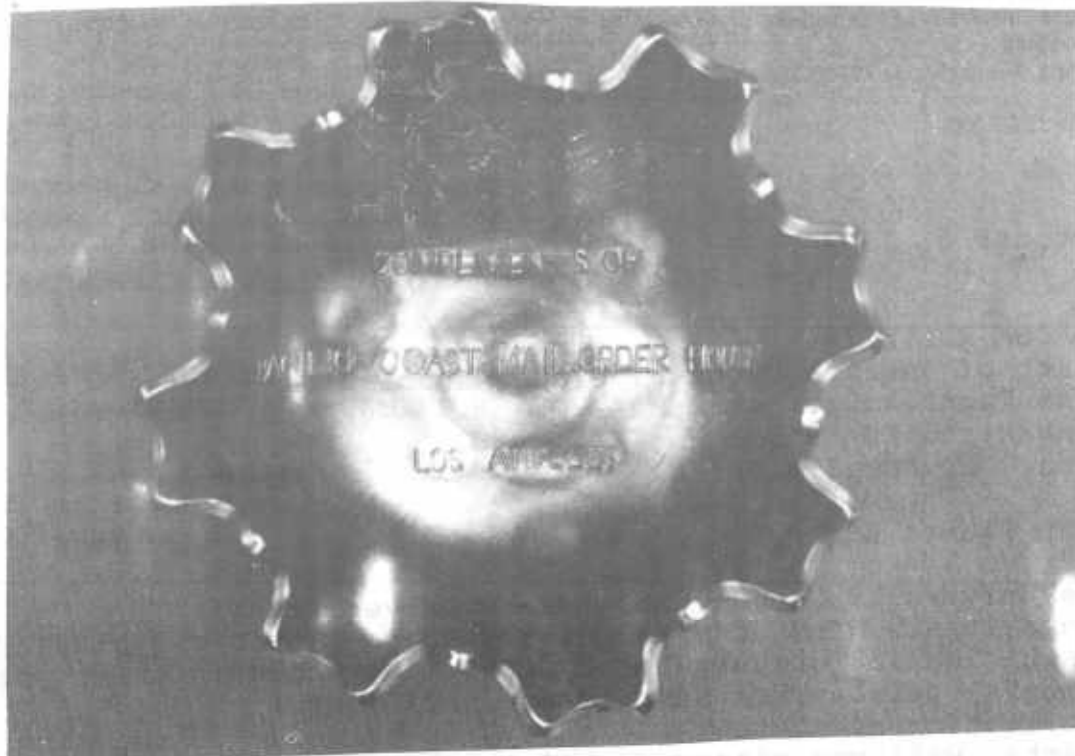

COMPLIMENTS OF PACIFIC COAST MAIL ORDER HOUSE, LOS ANGELES

This advertising bowl with the Fenton Grape & Cable exterior was created for J. C. Floyd as a promotional item in his mail order business on South Los Angeles St., Los Angeles, California in the year 1912. This was the first enterprise to offer Asian Imports nationwide on a mail order basis. (This information is included in John Resnik's Encyclopedia on Lettered Pieces.)

At the time John published his book in 1989, his own marigold example was the only perfect one known. He also mentioned the marigold, as-is example which still resides in the Fenton Museum. A blue bowl, in as-is condition also existed in 1989.

In September, 1992, a beautifully perfect blue bowl was purchased by a southern California collector from an antique appraiser who had purchased it directly from a deceased owners property settlement.

In October, 1992, we received a call from a different dealer, in the north of San Diego County, saying she had this big bowl with lettering inside and would we be interested in such a piece?

We were on the way within twenty minutes to purchase this perfect marigold bowl pictured here.

About a year later, Fred Roque discovered another marigold bowl at an antique show in the Los Angeles area. It is the one Tom Burns purchased for \$3,800.00 and placed in one of his recent sales.

These are the ONLY examples of this very rare pattern known to exist at this writing.

Fred Roque was fortunate enough to speak with relatives of the original owner of that marigold bowl he purchased. According to his information, these pieces were given on payment of account. The likely range for mail order business at that time in history could extend perhaps to Nevada and Arizona. Maybe more of these rare bowls exist and will surface as those owners in their eighties pass on and estates are distributed.

We hope this clarification of facts surrounding this unusual piece of "Carnival Glass with writing on" will help satisfy some misconceptions surrounding it. The history of any piece is every bit as important as owning it, particularly when that piece is so rare as this one. We wonder just how many of each color were manufactured? NOTE: The first marigold bowl sold at the auction of Bill Carroll in September, 1983 for \$1,400.00. Many of you will remember him as a TRUE COLLECTOR! He bought anything iridized!

THE GRAPE AND CABLE BREAKFAST SET

This is not a table set by our four piece definition. So why include this in our table set series? We have been asked "why can't I find the other matching pieces or the lid for the sugar?" The answer is you can't and won't so we thought it might help to show this set. This set is what Carnival collectors call a "Breakfast Set." Why--we are not sure. To the best of our knowledge only a half dozen of the regular iridized four piece table set patterns also had a two piece breakfast set.

We have pictured the amethyst Grape & Cable breakfast set. Like the four piece set shown in the July, 1994 H.O.A.C.G.A. Bulletin, this is a Northwood product and was produced in marigold, amethyst and green. Amethyst is the color most often seen.

When we compare these pieces with their counterparts in the four piece set, we see first it is unmistakably Grape & Cable, but without the Thumbprints. While it cannot be determined from our picture, the sugar has no inner ridge or rim for a cover or lid to rest on--the breakfast sugar has no lid. Also this sugar has two handles. Both the creamer and sugar are smaller than the regular set pieces. For example, the breakfast creamer is about 3" tall while the regular creamer is 4½" tall. Both creamers are about the same diameter.

While not plentiful these sets are available with a little searching and at very reasonable prices when compared to their big brothers. These are useful pieces and their size makes them fit our modern tables.

HORSES OF A DIFFERENT COLOR

My first encounter with Carnival Glass, other than an amethyst "rhubarb stained" (N) Strawberry bowl given to my mother by her mother, came in the late 70's while attending college.

I was furnishing my first apartment and friends at school recommended I "hit the garage sales" for bargains on kitchen supplies (dishes, flatware, small appliances). At one such garage sale the lady running the sale had posted an ANTIQUES IN BACK sign on her money table. The sign intrigued me; she saw me eyeing the sign and asked if I would like to go out back and look at the antiques. "Sure", I said (although not really interested).

Well, in the back yard was a card table with a few "old things" she said had belonged to her mother that she wanted to sell off. Scanning the table my eyes immediately went to a deep blue ruffled bowl of some sort; what attracted me to the bowl was the "shiny" color of the glass and particularly the little "circles" each containing the profiles of three horse heads. I was also impressed by the detail of each medallion. You could even see the hairs in each horse's mane. The lady then commented that "this was a good piece according to a friend of her's who knew antiques". "How much?", I asked; \$50.00 was the reply. I thought "that's a lot of money for just a 'piece of glass'" (Wish I still had that attitude!)

Anyway I left without the bowl, but I couldn't stop thinking about it. I decided to call on a local antique shop here in Wichita. Describing the piece to the dealer, she told me, "that's a scarce piece of Carnival Glass, \$50.00 was a very reasonable price; you should have bought it, I'll bet it's gone now".

Needless to say I felt like I "blew it". I decided to hurry back to the garage sale to see if the bowl was still there. Luckily it was, and from that point on began my "addiction" to Carnival Glass.

I still have that bowl fifteen years later; and the Fenton Horse Medallion pattern is still my favorite; with my "stable of horses" approaching forty (each one a different shape and/or color). Pieces have come and gone from my Carnival Glass collection over the years but I have not for some reason been able to part with my "horses of different colors".

JUST ONE GAL'S OPINION

It's hard for me to fathom why, after nearly thirty years of collecting Carnival Glass, I still hear from collectors, "There's little demand for Imperial because of the reproductions."

I heard this statement as recently as last week (October 20th) and it came from a very enlightened collector.

In 1967, when we began collecting, that reticence was understandable if not logical. Carnival Glass collecting was still relatively new back then. There wasn't a lot of printed information on it, and collectors had to fly by the seat of their pants, as it were. So wariness when venturing into the unknown and spending hard earned cash for a product many dealers disdained was the norm.

It wasn't so much that the re-issues couldn't be identified since Imperial had voluntarily placed a hall-mark on all of their new items to avoid any confusion. Rather, it was the fear that "all these reproductions" would kill the interest and the market for the old. Old Carnival Glass could turn out to be a "high risk" investment.

It seems ludicrous now, in light of the prices that have gone through the roof. Still, those high values seem to apply, only, to the products of Northwood, Dugan, Millersburg and Fenton and occasionally, U. S. Glass or Westmoreland.

And there, my friends, is the kicker! No company has made more "reproductions" than the Fenton Art Glass Company. They have used their own moulds, Cambridge moulds, Northwood moulds, McKee moulds, and moulds from many other companies in producing Carnival Glass since 1970, and it continues today. Fenton's new products are hall-marked, also, but the proliferation of this new generation of iridescent glass hasn't hurt the value of the old Fenton Carnival Glass. Why, then, is Imperial Glass still the poor mouse in the family?

Imperial is no longer in business. If there is any confusion about Imperial collectibles, it belongs to the generation of collectors who seek out the re-issues bearing the IG trademark. Those items are currently being reproduced by Summit Art Glass in colors different from those that Imperial made..but they still carry the IG.

I fail to understand the thinking of Carnival Glass collectors who shy away from some of the most beautiful pieces of glass ever made during the Carnival Glass heyday. Few would argue that Imperial's PURPLE is unrivaled. Often the MARIGOLD, (or rubigold) has superior depth of color and outstanding multi-colored iridescence.

The color that seems to be least appreciated is Imperial's contribution to the PASTELS. That color is CLAMBROTH.

For many years there was confusion as to exactly what Clambroth was. Some called it "Clear" Carnival...and valued it low because that's where it was in the price guides. Others called it Pastel Marigold. Still others just decided they wouldn't touch it because they didn't know what it was.

Imperial's CLAMBROTH, so named by Mrs. Hartung, is on clear glass with a pale gingerale coloring and multi-colored pastel iridescence. On every piece I've seen or owned, the iridescence was pink, green, blue and yellow, all blended together like the colors in a bubble.

Few people seem to recognize that there are some genuine rarities in this color. For example: I have owned the Imperial Grape water pitcher and could find no tumblers. I know they exist because, soon after I sold my pitcher, an entire set went up at auction. That was more than ten years ago, folks. I haven't seen or heard of another one since.

I have owned the Luster Rose water set in Clambroth. That time I was lucky. I had the pitcher already when I found 6 perfect tumblers at Brimfield. That, also, was more than ten years ago. I've just recently found another pitcher.

The Imperial Flute water set is known, but not often seen. The rarest set I've seen (and owned) was the Tiger Lily. And it was gorgeous! (That set went from me to the late Bill Carroll. I'd be interested in knowing where it went from there.) To this day, I've not seen or heard of another set or even parts thereof.

Other isolated items that have passed through my hands include the little Windmill sauce dish. That suggests there should have been a berry set out there somewhere.

Because the most frequently found items in Clambroth are Depression Era pieces, like the Optic and Buttons, or the Wide Panel bowls, plates and sherbets. Perhaps collectors have not expected to find the earlier shapes and patterns in this lovely pastel. It may be safe to assume that this was one of the last colors produced by Imperial in the waning days of the market for iridescent glass, therefore, not much of it was produced.

According to Carl Burns, that was the case with Northwood pastels. It would be reasonable to assume that Imperial entered the pastel market at about the same time in order to compete.

There are far more examples of Northwood pastels on the market than there are Imperial products. While Northwood was sending out Ice Green and Ice Blue, Imperial was offering what we call Clambroth and Smoke. I suspect the rare

Teal color may have been made during this time, also.

Perhaps this is an example of not enough to go around. When there is not a substantial quantity of a collectible available, there isn't enough to create a demand.

Whatever the case, I feel it is about time that Imperial Glass Company Carnival Glass got the recognition it deserves and is given a rightful place in the best collections.

Punty Band is a popular Heisey pattern that is most often found in custard, ruby stain and clear crystal. To find a Punty Band tumbler in Carnival Glass is a rare find, however. Punty Band was made by the old A. E. Heisey Company of Newark, Ohio. In old advertising material, Heisey referred to their glass as "Glassware of Distinction." Even today collectors regard it as top quality glass.

Our featured Carnival Glass tumbler is on clear base glass with marigold iridescence and very nice enameling work that presents a pretty floral spray containing three different species of flowers in three different colors. The front side of the tumbler also contains the name "Marie". It is illustrated in Photo #1. Photo #2 on the next page shows the opposite side of the tumbler which is shown alongside a more common ruby stained Punty Band tumbler. It is most likely that these crystal tumblers were purchased from the Heisey factory and iridized and decorated by some other glass company or individual who did that type of decorating work. Some of them were probably sold as souvenirs. We suspect that there are other tumblers in this pattern out there somewhere with different names used on them.

In the October, 1985 H.O.A.C.G.A. Bulletin we illustrated and described another Heisey tumbler that was made very similar to the Punty Band. It is

shown in Heisey books as Sawtooth Band. It is illustrated and described in the H.O.A.C.G.A. Educational Series Book #2. The Sawtooth Band tumbler contains a plain band, while our featured Punty Band tumbler carries a band that contains 24 small ovals that have been pressed into the band. On both of these Heisey pattern tumblers the band features a sawtooth type edge.

The Punty Band tumbler is of standard size measuring 3 7/8 inches high. A 24 point star type figure is pressed into the underside of the base. The outer edge of the underside has been factory ground to make it sit level on the table.

The featured Punty Band tumbler was found by Robert Smith of Boston. We thank him for sending it to us so that we could get photos made of this very interesting tumbler.

PENNY MATCH BOX HOLDER

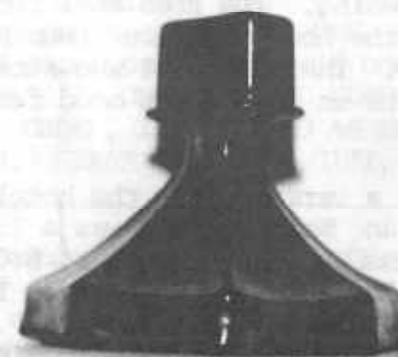
This little piece of Carnival Glass was made for a specific purpose, which was to hold the once very popular penny boxes of matches. At the top of the piece is a rectangular bar that was used to slip a partially opened penny box of matches down over it. The above photo illustrates the piece with a box of matches in place. The photo on the next page shows the match box holder without the match box. The rectangular bar at the top is 1 5/8 inches long and 5/8's of an inch wide. The piece without the match box is 3 1/8 inches tall and 3 3/4 inches wide at the widest point.

The pattern that is used below the rectangular bar is Wide Panels. It contains six of these slightly concave panels that increase in width as they extend downward. At the base and below the panels is an octagon shaped band that is one inch wide. The body of the piece is hollow. The few examples that we have seen were in deep purple base glass with excellent iridescence.

The color and iridescence favors Imperial as the maker, but we have no informative material that designates the Imperial Glass Corporation as producing this little piece, so we can only say at this time that the maker is unknown.

We consider this Penny Match Box Holder as very rare. We have seen only

four examples during our many years of collecting Carnival Glass. One sold at private sale in 1994 for \$1,000.00. It is certainly a pretty and interesting little piece of Carnival Glass and should enhance any Carnival Glass collection.

- * A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and enjoy visiting with other members.

It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

A set of five Commerative Souvenir Bells were made from 1985 to 1989. These bells commerate the Glass companies that produced the major portion of the Carnival Glass, Northwood, Fenton, Millersburg, Imperial and Dugan. Each different bell features a portrait of the glass company founder. The Circle Scroll is used as its pattern.

The 1985 souvenir bell commerating the Northwood Glass Company has the portrait of its founder, Harry Northwood. This bell made in Ruby Red carnival is now sold out.

The 1986 bell made in Lime green Opalescent with a beautiful Marigold iridescence, commerates The Fenton Art Glass Company and has a portrait of its founder Frank L. Fenton.

The 1987 bell is Cobalt Blue, which is a rare color for the Millersburg Glass Company, The portrait on the bell is of John W. Fenton, its founder.

The 1988 bell recognizes the Imperial Glass Company and its founder, Edward Muhleman, and is a beautiful Marigold.

The 1989 bell, the last of the series, commerates the Dugan Glass Company. The portrait is of Thomas E.A. Dugan, its founder. The color of the bell is Teal Marigold.
