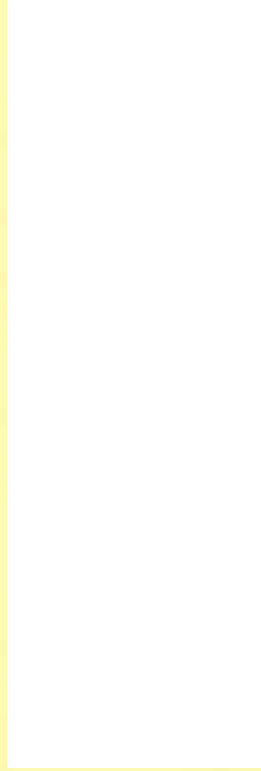

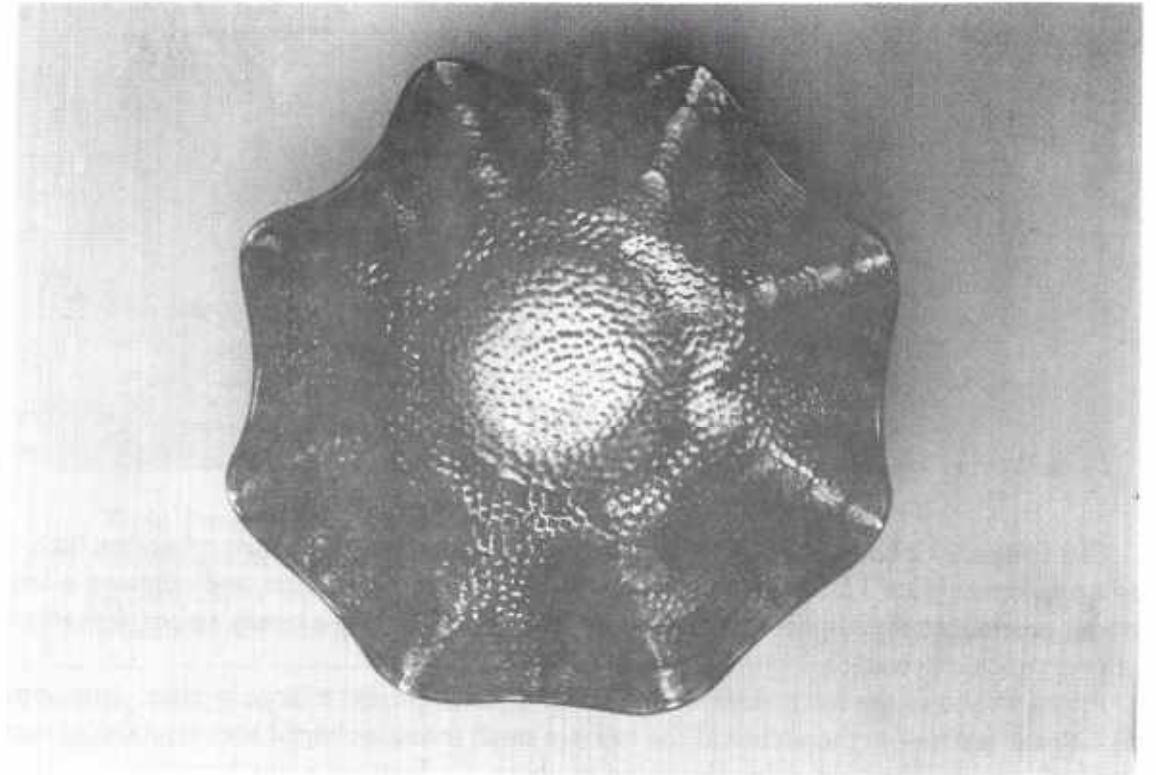

COBBLESTONES

The name for this pattern is quite appropriate, for the overall texture is tiny-pebble-like design all over the surface. While this is a very simplistic prime pattern made by Imperial, it usually has spectacular iridescence. The ARCS pattern used on the reverse lends character to this piece, because every other row of arcs is stippled.

Despite the usual reasonable price when one of these bowls is found, they really are not all that plentiful. Reported in green, blue, amethyst, amber, and marigold, we have not seen a blue one.

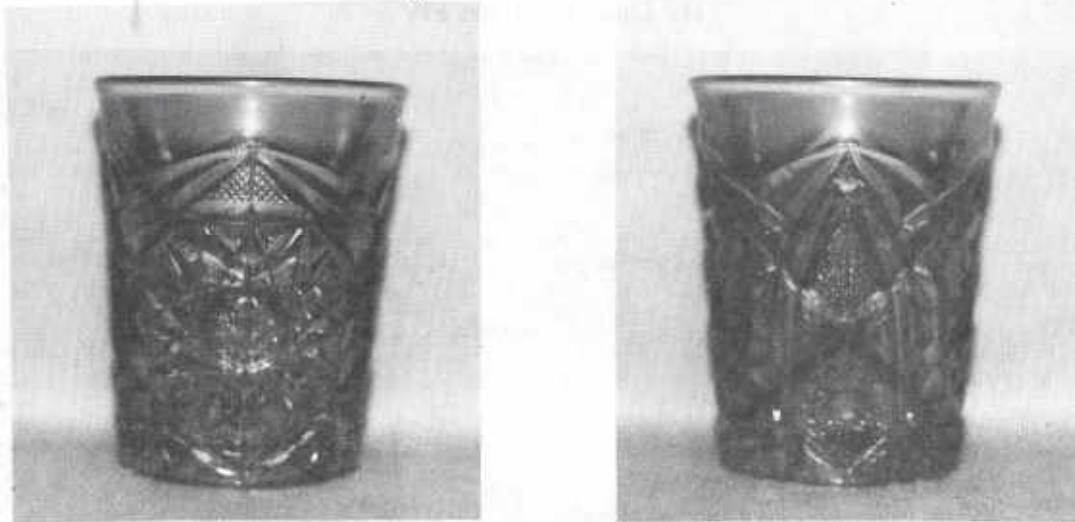
There is one amethyst "plate", not flat, but almost. The edge does turn up ever so slightly here and there around the outside edge.

Handled bon-bons with the shiny, radium-like finish, so like Imperial are mentioned in some early discussions of this pattern. A honeycomb exterior accompanies. We have never seen this shape, but certainly would enjoy the opportunity.

The nine inch bowls make a nice addition and pleasant compliment to some of our otherwise "busy" patterns.

EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

HOBSTAR AND ARCHES TUMBLER

Our featured Hobstar and Arches tumbler is of standard size measuring 4 inches high. It has a top opening of 3 inches. The base is 2 3/8 inches in diameter and contains a large hobstar or sunburst type figure on the bottom. The color is sort of a honey amberish marigold with very nice iridescence.

Photo #1 shows the front side of the tumbler which contains a large hobstar. Just above this hobstar and below the arches at the top is a small triangle shaped area containing many diamond points. The back side, illustrated in photo #2, features a much smaller hobstar at the bottom. Arches are used on both sides of the hobstar. Just below where the arches join near the top of the tumbler is a pointed figure containing more of the tiny diamond points. At the very top of the tumbler is a smooth area.

The Hobstar and Arches tumbler pattern is quite similar to the pattern used on the McKee Martec tumbler. The Martec tumbler contains the McKee PRESCUT trademark, however, while the Hobstar and Arches contains no trademark. The Martec tumbler does not contain the figures containing the tiny diamond points. Both tumblers feature a large and small hobstar and both use the arches in their pattern. The rare Martec tumbler is illustrated in the HOACGA tumbler book on page 105.

We consider the Hobstar and Arches tumbler as rare, pretty and very desirable. While we are quite sure that there are at least a few others out there, this is the only one that we have ever seen. This tumbler is a part of the Whitley collection.

ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK & MARGE

April 1, 1995: Seeck Auction at St. Louis, Missouri, (St. Peters Holiday Inn). We read the brochure and were unimpressed. Why did we go? There was one item we wanted, and when we got there it turned out to be something we did not want to take home. A lost weekend? Not really - there is always a pleasant enjoyable atmosphere at a Seeck auction and a time to enjoy friendships. The good food at a restaurant down the road, where we had dinner with friends, and the peanut butter parfait at the DQ didn't hurt either.

When we saw the larger crowd than we expected, and those that had driven hundreds of miles or flown in from as far as California we knew Jim and Vern had a winner. The top item probably was the red Chrysanthemum ruffled bowl at \$4,250. Two items we looked at very carefully were the 23½" Rustic funeral vase (\$1,500) and the purple Wishbone and Spades chop plate at \$1,200. They were not the highest priced items in the sale, but they were very nice. We thought the sale might be a dealers paradise, but if it was, we surely have a large number of dealers as most everyone participated in the bidding and prices were about normal for the most part.

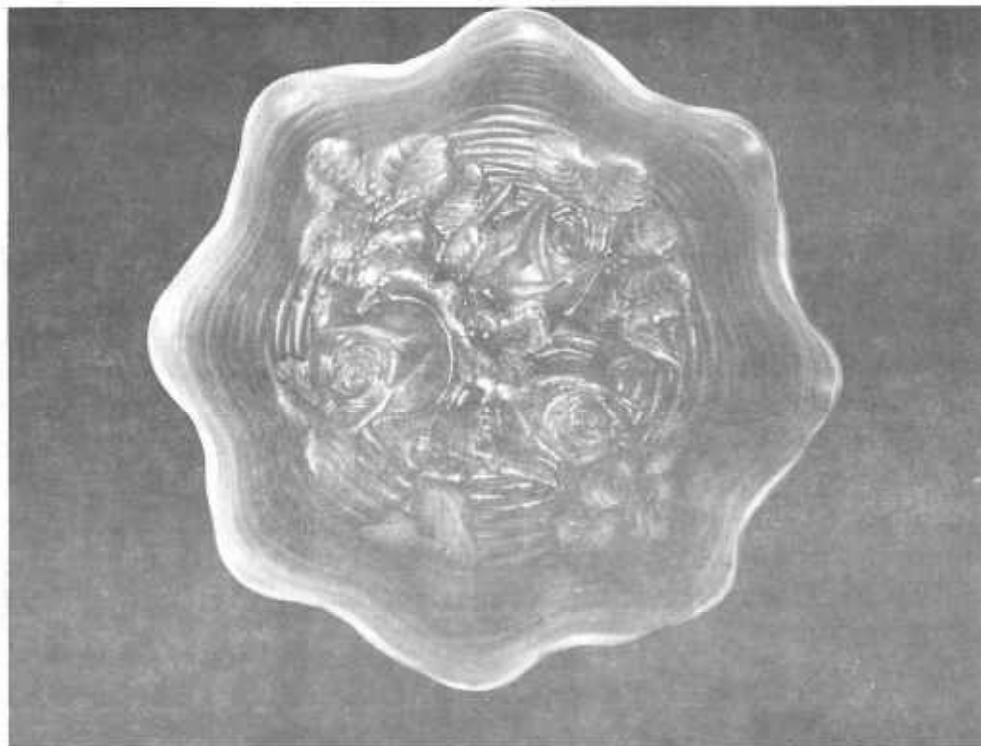
April 7 & 8, 1995: Burns Auction Service had a "real one" at Strongsville, Ohio, (Cleveland). More than 80 plates were included and for the most part they were super examples and sold for good prices and then some in our opinion. We left before the end of the sale, but at that point the gross had already exceeded \$200,000.

As usual there were a few pieces that did not live up to their advance billing, but who could complain about a \$5,200 purple Garden Path chop plate, a \$3,700 amethyst Lotus and Grape 9" plate, the \$4,200 purple Tree Trunk Elephant's Foot Vase, the \$2,800 green Stippled Strawberry 9" plate or the \$3,500 marigold Hobnail water pitcher.

Probably the most unusual aspect of the sale was that one buyer took about 75% of all the Millersburg pieces sold. On second thought, maybe it was that Tom stopped half was through the Friday night session when the sellers and auction team provided pizzas for all.

PEEK INTO THE PAST IN CARNIVAL GLASS

ROSE SHOW BOWL - MARIGOLD OVER CUSTARD

What a difference the years make. This beautiful and rare Rose Show bowl sold for \$14,000.00 at the Rambo auction in St. Louis, Missouri on March 25, 1995. The exact same bowl sold for \$250.00 back in February 6 & 7, 1976 at the Mary Elizabeth Collier auction. The auction was held in the same city, St. Louis, Missouri and by the same auctioneer, John Woody.

Back in the early auction years, John Woody would always group the rarities in a list at the front of the brochure. In 1976, this fantastic bowl did not make that rare group. It was sold along with the other Rose Show bowls. At that auction the other Rose Show bowls sold for as follows: aqua opal \$135.00, green \$270.00, blue \$100.00, ice blue \$175.00 and amethyst \$100.00.

Lucile and I were at that auction. I can't remember of much interest shown toward it. I didn't hear any comment or ooh's and ah's over it at that time. Of course, nobody really knew how rare it really was back then. We certainly compliment Ivy Rambo for purchasing this piece in 1976. We also salute Floyd and Cecil Whitley as the new and proud owners of this fine example of carnival glass. Cecil said it sure looked beautiful in their cabinet. She seemed very delighted about the purchase.

We actually went to the Collier auction especially to buy the Frolicking Bears tumbler. I planned on taking it home for \$1,500.00 as no tumbler had ever sold for anywhere near that price. I was wrong, however. I wanted it so bad that I took it to \$3,500 before giving up. As things turned out it would have been a good buy at that price. It later sold privately for in the ball park price of \$10,000.00. The Frolicking Bears water pitcher sold for \$6,000.00. There was a lot of interest in these two pieces. The brochure carried almost a full size page in color of them.

The two Morning Glory tankards also caused a lot of excitement. They were illustrated on the front cover of the brochure in color. The amethyst one sold for \$7,000.00 with the marigold example bringing \$4,900.00. Some of the other pieces that received a lot of attention and prices received for them were the green Millersburg Pipe Humidor \$2,700.00, same in marigold \$2,250.00, marigold Peoples vase \$4,500.00, purple Christmas compote \$3,000.00, same in marigold \$2,200.00, square purple Farmyard bowl \$2,000.00 and a marigold Peter Rabbit plate brought \$900.00.

These are some of the highlights of the 1976 Collier auction. The pretty Rose Show bowls and plates didn't get much attention back then. But now it is 1995 and an entirely different year.

DUGAN'S MANY RIBS VASE?

This little vase although seldom seen has been named several times. The most recent name bestowed on this vase is in a story by Ardonna Bucher in the March Pump. Ardonna and Carl Burns have attributed this vase to the Northwood Glass Company and called it a variation to the Jack in the Pulpit. She mentions two references. Marion Hartung's book six page 25 and Edward's page 115 (4th edition). Both references show Northwood's Jack in the Pulpit vases and both indicate that the vases shown are signed with the Northwood (N) and range from about 7" to over 8" tall. I have to wonder if Ardonna's marigold vase has the (N). My blue vase pictured here is not signed.

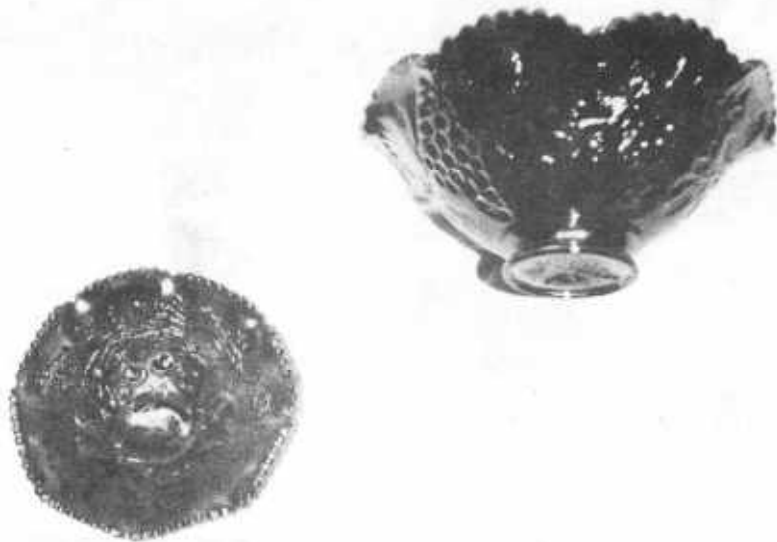
This vase is not show in any of the recent books on Carnival glass. However, it is pictured in "The Collector's Guide to Carnival Glass", by Marian Klamkin on page 118, published in 1976. It was referred to then as a "flared and footed vase in Ribbed pattern". It's not shown in any other book in our library although Bill Edwards shows a hat shape on



page 66 that he calls Many Ribs and states that "this pattern can also be found in small vases." Could this be the vase he refers to?

The vase shown is a cobalt blue with a bronze iridescent treatment. The measurements match Ardonna's marigold vase. The height is 5¼" pulled out to 5½" on top with a 2 7/8" diameter foot. The underside of the foot has a 29 point raised star rather than the usual recessed star and is smooth on top. The rib count is 24 and start above the smooth base top and terminate about a ½" from the top ruffle. Whereas the Jack in the Pulpit vase appears to have the ribs on top of the foot. Another conspicuous difference between this vase and the Northwood Jack in the Pulpit is the wide shoulder above the smooth foot.

We had best look at this vase a little closer before we make our final "educated guess" as to name and maker. The vase is similar in size and shape to a Fenton vase (No. 400) that Sherman Hand's 1978 book called the Bud Vase Whimsey vase. The Bud Vase Whimsey vases were made in the 1920's and can be found in most of the colors that Carl Burns named in Ardonna's article. Lorraine and I collect Bud Vase Whimseys. We have never seen them in a dark green, aqua or amethyst, but sure would like to buy them if they exist. The vase featured in this article was given to us by Mike and Lucy Hood because they also mistook it for a Bud Vase Whimsey. Picture No. 2 shows the similarity between the two vases. Enough said... Thanks to Mike and Lucy, and thanks to Ardonna and Carl. We all love to talk glass. And we all learn from these discussions, we hope.



I am sending pictures of a bowl I have had for many years. Exterior has vintage Intaglio Hartung book 8 page 81. Interior is Fruit & Flowers. It is 11 inches at widest point between ruffles & 5 inches deep. It is amethyst has circle in interior with possibly an N in it not to clear due to iridised heavily.

I cannot find this in books with exterior pattern on this size could it be a punch bowl top. Would like to find out something about price & etc..

NORTHWOOD'S "GOOD LUCK" --- IT'S THE BERRIES!!

Recently I had a fellow collector over to my house and we were reviewing some of my Carnival glass. We were sitting at the dining room table facing the cabinet full of glass and looking at the Good Luck bowls. I said to Marv, do you recognize the green Good Luck bowl? I purchased it from you about five years ago. I bought it at our Eugene, Oregon convention in your room.

As we were surveying the bowls, Marv said, I believe that green Good Luck bowl is a Good Luck Variet! Astonished, I brought it out from the cabinet. We compared it to my other five bowls, and sure enough, it wasn't as full of the design as on the others. It had fewer berries!

Well, neither Marv nor I had seen the difference at the time I purchased it from him, and here he discovers it while visiting me five years later. This brought us a good laugh.

I did some investigation and read in Carl Burn's book "The Collector's Guide to Northwood's Carnival Glass" that there was only one Variet Good Luck bowl known to exist and that was a marigold pie crust edge bowl, but it had fewer flowers, berries, leaves, and sheaves of wheat in the design, and had a basketweave exterior.

My bowl, however, had all of the flowers, leaves, etcetera, but what it didn't have was all of the berries you usually see. These are the single, double, and triple sets of berries stemming out from the flowers (refer to pictures).

As you can see, my green bowl has three less triple pods, six less double pods, and eleven less single berry pods. In all, there are 32 less berries in my bowl than the standard Good Luck bowl as pictured.

Investigating even more, I went through every book, publication, and auction brochures I could get my hands on, to see if I could find any other pictures of Good Luck pieces with less berries on them like my green bowl. I found two plates in several hundred photos of the Good Lucks. The one plate was marigold with the basketweave exterior found on page 104-#373 of the book "Harry Northwood, The Wheeling Years, 1901-1925" by Heacock, Measell, and Wiggins. The other plate was green from an auction brochure of Woody's dated September 4, 1988, exterior unknown.

So what have we? Is this another step from the original marigold Variet bowl to the final draft? Did we decide to add more berries, yet, to get enough detail to satisfy Mr. Northwood for the final Good Luck version as we see on most of our pieces? If so, how many were made before the final transition and the final draft?

Everyone ----- Check your Good Luck pieces. If you find that you have one of these "variants" please call, write, or FAX me your findings. Let me know if you have a bowl or plate, what color it is, and what the exterior pattern is.

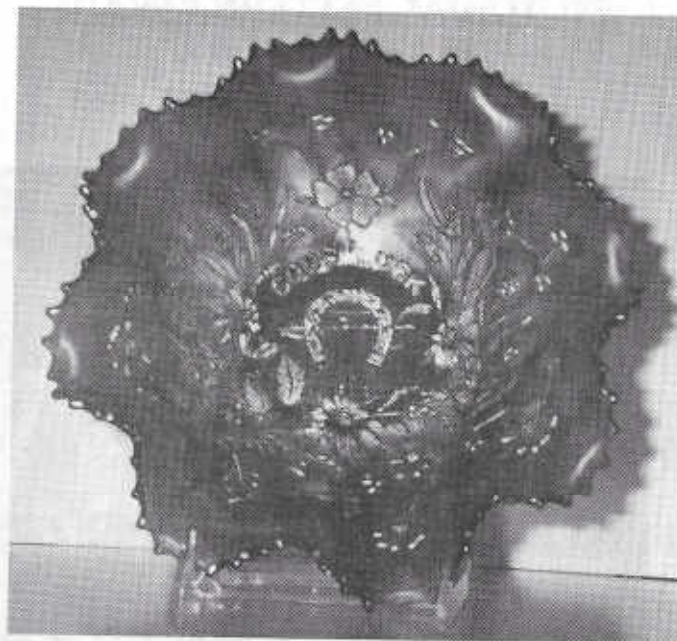

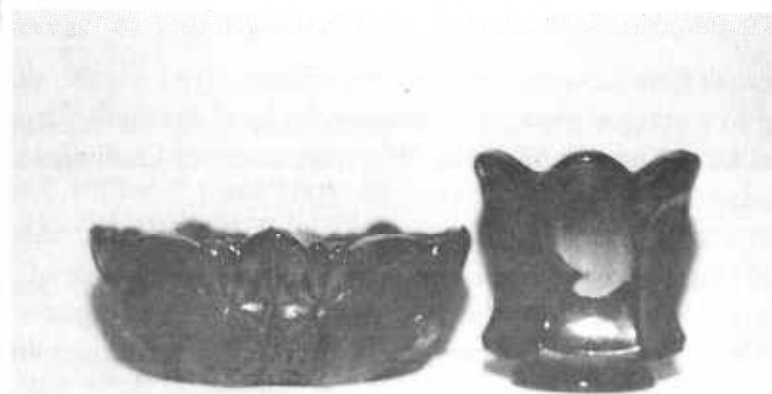
PICTORIAL PATTERN PARADE

PURITAN PATTERN SMALL PLATE

Illustrated above is a little marigold 6 inch plate in the Puritan pattern. Puritan is a McKee and it is their original factory name for that pattern McKee's PRES CUT trademark is found on the inside center of the plate. We are well acquainted with the Puritan pattern as we have a beautiful ruby stain tumbler in the pattern. It also contains the PRES CUT trademark which is found on the interior bottom of the tumbler. We were very surprised to find a plate in this pattern, however, as we had never seen one before in carnival glass.



In this photo, we show another piece of carnival glass in the Puritan pattern that we have in our collection. It is also signed with the PRES CUT trademark. This piece is unusual in that it is in a beautiful cobalt blue. We have never seen a McKee pattern piece of carnival glass in blue before. It measures 1½ inches high and 4 inches across the top. It would appear to be a sauce dish to us, but in old McKee literature it is listed as a round nappy. This little piece was presented to us at an I.C.G.A. convention a few years back by Smokey Cloud in appreciation for some of our article work that we have presented to the club. So it is more than a pretty piece of carnival glass to us, it also has a lot of sentimental value. Shown along with this piece is a blue Imperial Flute toothpick.

While McKee was a very large producer of pattern glass they made very little iridised carnival glass. The McKee pattern most often found with iridescence is Heart Band. Other McKee patterns in which we have seen in carnival glass are Aztec, Martec, Majestic, Rainbow, Sunbeam, Hickman and O'Hara. We suspect that there are other McKee patterns with iridescence that we have not seen.

This article on the Puritan small plate marks our 198th edition into the Pictorial Pattern Parade. Next month we will cover a rare rose bowl in the Imperial Three in One pattern. Photo of the Puritan plate is courtesy of Dave and Joan Doty.

JUST A DIRTY OLD PIECE OF GLASS

Having just returned from Lenexa, I weighed my options. Do I want to sit in the car for a 6 hour round trip to a antique show, or check out the local auction? Tired of driving I decided on the local sale. The sale bill listed "30 pieces assorted Carnival, blue, red, gold. Carnival to sell Sunday 1:00 P.M."

It was Friday afternoon when I got the chance to preview the glass. Most of the glass was in the \$20-\$100 range, and had sold in this area within the last couple of years. Then I spotted a large green I.C.S. bowl across the table. It had enough dirt and grime on it to block out almost all the iridescence. With two days to go and several hundred people handling and clanging the glass, could it survive?

Sunday morning brings 7 or 8 carnival buyers talking about the (silvery) Purple Three Fruits Medallion bowl being the best piece on the sale. Finally after a 4 hour wait the Auctioneer started on the carnival glass. The filthy green bowl was third to sell with the auctioneer calling it a Green Star of David (which of course it was not). I was totally surprised to get the piece for next to nothing. A passing antique dealer made the comment "Green glass doesn't sell very well around here". I just agreed. On the way out the door another dealer asked me what I had bought. My reply was "just a dirty old piece of glass".

After spending some time cleaning the piece up there wasn't just 1 star, but 37 Radium Stars shining on my Many Stars I.C.S. bowl

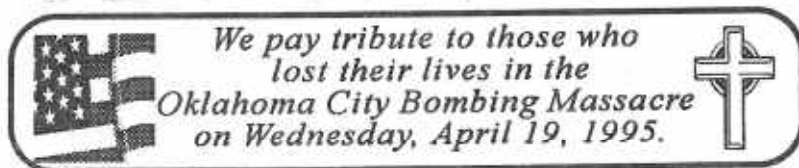

A few weeks ago I read an article which I thought was in HOACGA magazine on the "Leaf & Bead" Rose bowl. In trying to find this article again this weekend, I covered all the issues of 1994 and still could not find it. It covered the interior patterns and all the colors that the "Leaf & Beads" Rose bowl was manufactured in. In searching through past issues I came upon an article from past August on the "Four Pillars" vase in cobalt blue, by Harold Fortney. It is a little late to reply to that article, however, one of the first vases that I ever purchased was the cobalt blue "Four Pillars" from "Stratford" in Ontario.

The feet are perfect (which is a feat in itself, as most times the protrusions of the feet always seem to have a chip or two), and the iridescence is perfectly super. I also have the sapphire blue.

There is so much to learn about carnival glass. Something new every day. I often wonder whether every fact on patterns, shapes and colors, will ever be discussed in one encyclopedia.

Now, back to the "Leaf & Beads" Rose bowl!

Several years ago, a close carnival friend of mine in England had two "Leaf & Beads" Rose bowls for sale. She said "which one would you like?" - * The Convention offers members an opportunity to meet new collectors, renew old friendships and enjoy discussing carnival glass with other knowledgeable collectors.
- * A banquet is held with a Carnival Collector as out Speaker.
- * A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

* **Membership Dues** - \$25.00 per year - U.S. & Canada. \$40.00 per year for Foreign. The Membership Year is from the date of joining to one year later. Dues are set by the Board of Directors to support the publication of the monthly bulletin, typing, printing and mailing.

1995 CONVENTION SUMMARY

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 26, 1995 marked the beginning of registration for the 1995 HOACGA convention. It was a rainy day in Lenexa, KS but there was plenty of activity going on at the Holiday Inn. Several people had already moved in and more were coming. Over 125 rooms were used and 101 members preregistered.

THURSDAY, APRIL 27, 1995 In the morning was more registration and in the afternoon, Dick and Jennie Hostetler of Yukon, Oklahoma, presented a program on Millersburg glass. They brought a hundred pieces of all colors, patterns and shapes and about 180 people attended. Dick says his glass isn't carnival glass, or Millersburg glass - it's "family glass". Many of the pieces were handed down in his family. Thursday evening at 7 P.M., Joan and Dave Doty of Chicago, IL gave a program on swung vases featuring 35 ripple vases of varying sizes and colors and 25 other swung vases. Dave gave a demo of vase swinging with the "snap" used in the process (which was provided by Dean & Diane Fry). The room was full and everyone enjoyed both presentations. As usual, Thursday evening was pie and coffee night on the party deck and everyone enjoyed socializing.

FRIDAY, APRIL 28, 1995 saw more registration and a 10 A.M. presentation in the President's Room by John Mikkonen of Shakopee, MN, an expert on the Holly pattern. He displayed 60 pieces including bowls, plates, compotes and a few rose bowls. It was standing room only and we saw blue, marigold, white, amethyst, green, red, and aqua opal but George Loescher reminded John that he has the only peach opal. Everyone agreed that it was a very good presentation. A luncheon in the banquet room at 12:30 Friday was held to honor Carl and Ferne Schroeder of Kendall Wisconsin with the John & Lucile Britt award for excellence in carnival glass. One hundred and twenty members and friends attended. Testimonials (on the light side) were offered by Jim Seeck, Richard Cinclair, Tom Mordini and George Loescher. Ferne was presented with roses and John & Lucile Britt presented the beautiful hand painted vase to Carl and Ferne. Afterward the annual business meeting was held in the President's Room. Friday afternoon saw room display judging. There were over 50 excellent displays and Jackie Fortney headed the committee on judging. A separate article discusses the prizes. Friday evening was another hospitality night on the party deck and the auction glass was available for viewing. At 9:30 P.M., a midnight auction was held and some people bought and sold glass. We thank auctioneers Jim Seeck, Mickey Reichel, and Jason Woody for helping assisted by Bob Grissom, Todd Kuwitzsky and Richard Cinclair.

SATURDAY, APRIL 29, 1995 brought the John Woody auction of 411 pieces of glass. Over 140 bidding numbers were issued and the banquet hall was totally filled for a lively auction. Saturday evening, the banquet took place. The Holiday Inn served a very nice dinner to 200, after which the room display awards were issued. They are sapphire blue hobnail cuspidors matching the table favor mugs for 1995. Also, John and Lucile Britt received a \$200.00 U.S. Savings Bond, the award for the October, 1994 through March, 1995, membership contest. They referred twenty-two new members to HOACGA. Also a drawing of those preregistering (101 members) was conducted and Marnen and Betty Robertson of Camarillo, CA won a fenton Burmese iridized swan vase.
