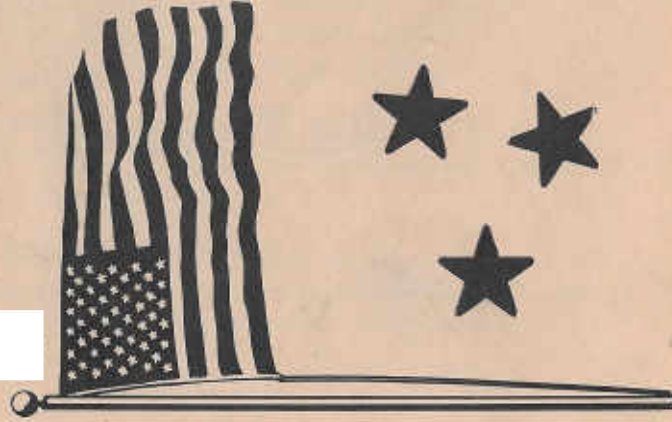

## FROSTED BLOCK

This pattern is called Beaded Block by Depression Glass Collectors and before Carnival Glass came into fashion, this was also a pressed glass pattern (the name of which we do not know.

Although Edwards lists bowls, creamers, sugars, compotes, plates, milk pitchers, pickle dishes and rosebowl as shapes found in the pattern, rosebowl in two sizes, an occasional compote, and a VERY occasional 9" plate are what we have observed in Carnival Glass over the years.

Colors in rosebowl seem confined to a lovely clambroth and usually strong marigold. On the inside rim of the collar base, "Made in USA" sometimes appears. These pieces will usually command up to 25% more in price.

As for the plate shape, which is rather rare, logic dictates that only when the shape of the rosebowl could not be maintained, the result was a plate. We believe this accounts for their scarce to rare status.

Because the pattern, then, appears only on the exterior, these plates do not command the notice nor price which more noted patterns bring. Not much has been written about them either.

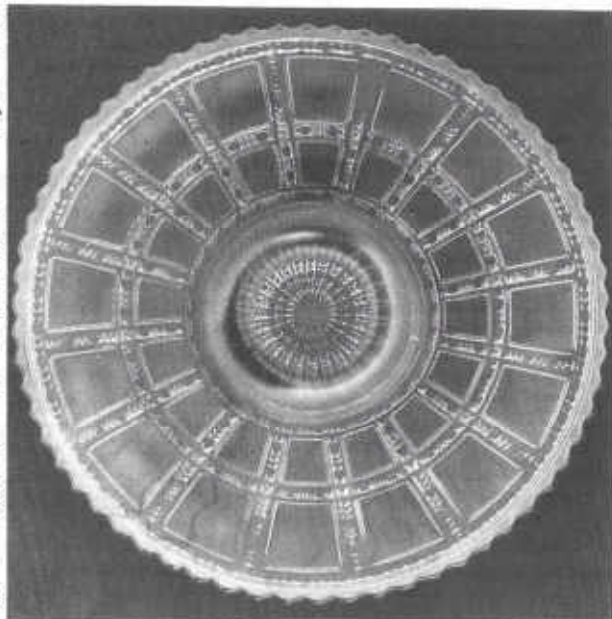
In the Plate Section of the HOACGA Educational Inserts, only "white" and clambroth are listed. We believe that the marigold plates are not easily found. We have never seen a white example. In fact, the few we have seen in collections over the years have all been clambroth color.

The Mordini Price Guides list NO sales during 1994 in the Frosted Block pattern. During 1993, only a clambroth rosebowl is listed as having sold for \$50

This is a pattern being overlooked, perhaps because of its simplistic design. Why should EVERYTHING demand complication?

This elegant pattern lends variety to any collection and can still be obtained for very reasonable prices. A shift away from some of the more expensive glass CAN be a welcome advantage!

Perhaps a second look will convince you to search for a choice piece in this beautiful Imperial Classic! It is not a pattern which has been reproduced, so far as we know.

## PICTORIAL PATTERN PARADE

### FANTAIL CHOP PLATE IN MARIGOLD

We feature here the rare and beautiful Fantail chop plate. The reverse pattern is Butterfly and Berry. You see footed bowls in this pattern fairly often in both marigold and blue, but this is the only marigold Fantail chop plate that we have ever seen. We consider it as a very desirable piece of old Fenton carnival glass.

The first Fantail chop plate that we ever seen was in a pretty blue color and was owned by Marion Hartung. When we saw this example in her home we were very impressed with it and hoped that we would some day find a Fantail chop plate. Hartung's very rare plate was later sold at her estate auction in October of 1983 for \$1000.00 and went to Don Moore of California. The second one of these plates that is known in blue was quite badly damaged, but is still sold for \$750.00 when offered at auction in March of 1989.



The featured marigold Fantail chop plate was actually brought to our home and was offered to us for sale. Needless to say we purchased it at a rather high price. We enjoyed this piece for some time and later was very proud to feature it in our March 1994 auction. It sold at auction for \$5500.00 and now is a part of the Dale Matheny plate collection of Belmont, California.

In photo #2 we show the Fantail pattern in a very pretty shallow ruffled bowl in blue. While not as rare as the chop plate, it is certainly a beautiful piece of carnival glass that would add charm to any collection.

This article on the Fantail chop plate is #200 in the Pictorial Pattern Parade. Next month we will feature the Millersburg Flowering Vine compote.

## Q & A

This month's column comes to you from California, so I am without my reference sources & my computer. Hope the printer can decipher my hen scratching & hope you all will bear with me if I have to side step some questions until I'm able to get at my research materials.

The following item was sent in with last month's column, but in my ignorance of printing practices, I sent in a facsimile of the photo which could not be printed, so we pulled the article until I could forward the original picture.

Bev Schneider of Loveland, Co sent in the photograph shown below.

Q. We have been unable to identify to bowl shown in the enclosed photo. What is it?

A. I don't know. I would venture a guess that this piece is rather thick & somewhat heavy for it's size. I'm almost positive that it is not of American manufacture; possibly Australian or more likely, EDA Glass of Finland. If that is not the case, then this item would fall into the "Late Carnival" era circa 1935. I'll do more in depth research & try to have more information next month.

ADDENDUM: So far I have been unable to come up with any additional information on this piece, but I have this gut feeling I've seen this pattern in print recently. Perhaps I'll get some help from the membership.

Some late May arrivals from Bev Schneider of Loveland, Co.

Q. In Bill Edwards 4th Edition on Carnival Glass he refers to the Lightning Flower pattern as very rare. It is unclear to me whether he means all pieces in the pattern or the pictured nappy one. We have a 7 1/4" bowl with a plain interior except for the (N) mark. It measures 2" from the table to the highest point of the ruffle. There are 6 ruffles. The base is a sunflower much like that in the (N) Sunflower bowl. The color goes from a pinkish marigold to almost clear at the edge.

A. Welcome to the club. Much of the time, I have no idea what Bill is talking about either. However, I would guess he was referring specifically to the nappy. This is not to say that your bowl is not quite rare, but the facts of life are that darned few people have much interest in exterior only patterned pieces, regardless of their rarity. I hesitate to put a value on your bowl, not having seen it, but I think it's safe to surmise it would be somewhere this side of \$100.

Q. Can you give me a description of Renniger Blue?

A. Boy, you sure know how to make a guy squirm. Let me preface my comments by saying that I am in a very small minority on this issue, & that when I have an item of this color, I do call it Renniger Blue; both for clarity, & quite frankly, because they sell for more money.

A little background: The name came from a group of Pennsylvania collectors who found the first pieces of this color at the famous Renniger's Flea Market that takes place in Lancaster County, PA.

Renniger pieces when held so that any available light plays on the surface of the iridescence, look pretty much like any Northwood blue pieces. However, when held so that any available lights shines through the glass from the backside, these pieces take on a slight greenish or teal like hue. All "Renniger Blue" pieces that I have seen have had a fairly heavy marigold overlay. It is my opinion (& it's just that, an opinion) that the green or teal hue results from the light passing through the gold iridescence causing a mixing (to the eye) of the two colors, resulting in "Renniger Blue".

It is a foregone conclusion that all those people owning Renniger pieces, & having paid a premium for them, are going to belittle & ridicule my opinion. And, come to think of it, they are exactly correct, (I just bought a collection with several Renniger pieces in it) I take back everything I just wrote.

Annette Parker of Victoria, BC Canada writes: (Love to hear from our Canadian friends, Ayh?)

Q. Please describe the shape of a hair receiver so that I might recognize one. In which carnival patterns are hair receivers found?

A. In all deference to Marion Hartung, I doubt that there are any real Carnival Glass hair receivers. In porcelain items, a hair receiver is a two piece article much like a powder box, only with a hole in the center of the top piece. During Victorian times, a lady would clean her comb, place the hair in the receiver through the hole in the top, & later remove the top to retrieve the hair which was then used to make crafts. The only Carnival Glass hair receiver I can think of is Persian Medallion. It looks exactly like a Persian Medallion Rose Bowl, except the hole in the top is square on the hair receiver & round on the rose bowl. It's available in marigold, blue, & white.

Q. Is the iridescence obvious on pieces of Pearl carnival and/or iridized custard? What colors are evident in the iridescence on these pieces? Was Northwood the only manufacturer who iridized custard glass?

A. First, Pearl carnival & iridized custard are one in the same. Two names for one horse, so to speak. The iridescence on these items is typically of the pastel variety; delicate, but obvious. It most often is multi-colored with the strongest hues belonging to the family of golds. A good rule of thumb for these items, as well as all of the carnival world is: "If you have to ask if it's iridized; it ain't." Northwood was far & away the largest producer of this type of ware, but examples from Fenton & Dugan are known.

A distinction needs to be made between these items & marigold on Custard/Moonstone. These latter named items have a very heavy marigold overlay ranging in color from a light butterscotch to a dark pumpkin. Also, where the Pearl items are generally not highly sought after & subsequently are reasonably priced, the marigold on Custard/Moonstone items are fiercely coveted & command astronomical prices into the five digit range.

Q. Several shades of the same color such as lime green, olive green, & green are often described. Were these color variations deliberately formulated or were they inadvertent variations in the chemical mix? Does a series of shades & tints exist between the colors listed above (or Sapphire blue, Renniger blue & blue) or were they distinct & separate colors?

A. Darned good question. This is one of my favorite topics, & I just love to get on my soapbox about it.

You can take this to the bank: NO Carnival glass manufacturer set out to make seventeen shades of blue. Period. End of discussion. Glass manufacture is like medicine, an inexact science. Not only were there color variations from one manufacturer to another, but also within one factory from one batch to another, & if the mixing was not performed sufficiently well, from one pour to another within the same batch. Having said that, I must also note that most rarities are either items that did not originally sell to well, or were mistakes. The facts of life are that there are a multitude of color variations in all basic colors (some for real, & some only in the minds of those naming them), & the real question is; how much do I care, & how much of a premium am I willing to pay for these variations?

An anonymous inquiry from California (now why do you suppose they didn't want their name on this?)

Q. We are long time members of HOACGA, but because of the distance, can only rarely attend the yearly convention. Our question is this: Why is it that we regularly pay our dues, but the only time we receive anything from HOACGA, other than the bulletin, is when we attend the convention? Our last roster is 1990.

A. I'm afraid I'll have to pass this along to an elected official. I'm just a writer/flunky. Besides, they know who I am.

Received a nice letter, a plethora of questions, & about a hundred dollars worth of pictures from Jeri Sue Lucas of Federal Way, Wa. Personal to Jeri Sue: It's no bother, that's what I'm here for.

Q. How can you tell the difference between Vaseline & lime green? Someone told me Vaseline was a yellow-green & lime is a green-yellow. I'm still confused.

A. That explanation would confuse me too. Vaseline is generally a lot more yellow looking than lime green, but since color is a very personal perception, I'll try to simplify this: In most cases Vaseline will flourese under a black light, & lime green won't.

Q. We have a Wide Rib vase --- Northwood. The base glass is crayola - sky blue. Can you translate that to a carnival color? Is it aqua, teal, ice blue or none of the above?

A. Since they took my crayolas away (I keep eating them), I'll attempt a little long distance clairvoyance here. Is your vase signed Northwood? I didn't think so. The closest thing to "wide rib" in Northwood would be Thin Rib, but I think what you have is most probably a Westmoreland Corinth vase in blue opal or blue opaque. For an absolute verification, send picture.

Q. What is "Electric Iridescence"?

A. See June column.

Q. What crayola color would match up to Emerald green?

A. See above; re, crayolas. Emerald green is a pure green devoid of deviating colors. Having written that, I have no idea what it means. Emerald Green is the color of an Emerald (I told you we don't just make-up this stuff).

Before I get on to the rest of Jeri Sue's questions, which will revolve around pictures she sent, I would like to make a request. Pictures are certainly a big help when trying to identify an item, pattern, color, etc; but the short coming of most pictures is that they are devoid of any reference point. That is, if you do not include some measurements, I have no idea whether I'm looking at a 4" bowl or a 12" bowl. The more information you can send me, the better (& easier) I can answer your question.

Q. Is this the same pattern as the vase called "Fleur de Lis" in the Edwards book? It looks similar, but he only lists a vase, & this is a really large, really heavy bowl. If it is "Fleur de Lis", then who made it? In the text of Edwards he says it is Czech, but in the front he says it is a Jenkins product. If it isn't the same as the vase, then can you tell us what it is? Is it old, new, etc.?





- A. I checked this out with "Mr. Vases", George Thomas of Belmont, Ca to confirm my own opinion, & it is our consensus that the "Fleur de Lis" vase is indeed a Czeck product, probably from Jain, the same maker as the Hand & Fish vases. I would have to make some comparison measurements of the vase & your bowl to be absolutely certain, but in all likelihood, the two pieces come from the same mold. Your bowl is probably the original shape as it came from the mold, & the vase shape was swung up from it. As to age, most of the European Carnival Glass falls into the late carnival era of the mid 1930's.



- Q. We know this candy dish is Heisy; it has an (H) in the lid, but we would love a name to attach to the rest of it.
- A. How about Fred? However, if you insist on Heisy's name; it's "Icecycle". Some years ago I had a butter dish in this pattern that matched your covered candy.

I have to pass on question #7 because I can't make out the pattern name. I know it's something Daisy. Please write again & let me know what the something is.

- Q. Can you I.D. this for us?



- A. No. It's English, probably Sowerby's; but I have no idea what the pattern name is. When I get back to my reference books I'll see if I can find it.
- Q. Same question. Old or new? Does it have a name?



- A. I was mistaken previously; this one is Fred. This is certainly European, & probably from the late carnival period, but I haven't a clue as to what the pattern name might be. P.S. How big is it? Looks like a spoon sticking out the back. Is there a cut-out for the spoon? Perhaps a mayonaise or a sugar?

Q. Can you tell us what this pitcher is called & who made it? It has drapes on the inside. My mother thought Northwood, but I'm betting on Fenton!



A. Sorry Mom, Jeri Sue wins this round. The pattern is "Magnolia" or "Magnolia and Drape", depending on your choice of author. The maker is Fenton, which is always a good guess when talking about Enamel Decorated Carnival, as they made the lions' share of it.

Q. Do you know who made this little milk pitcher & is it old or new? It weighs a ton!



A. It's one of the "swirl" patterns, but I don't know which one. Excessive weight is usually a pretty good indicator that a piece might be new, but in this case, the color & finish do not look new (at least from the photo). My best guess is that it's of foreign manufacture, again probably European, and again, probably from the late carnival era.

I have received a lot of positive feedback on the Q&A column, & want to thank everyone who took the time to write in & say nice things. Haven't heard any unfavorable comments as of yet (talk about waiting for the other shoe to drop!) & I would just as soon keep it that way!

## FROM MY CORNER

### THE HOBBY OF CARNIVAL GLASS COLLECTING

WHERE IS IT NOW: By the late 70's, with the information of the early clubs (ICGA, ACGA, HOACGA) the Carnival Glass collecting hobby had established its basic foundation. The publication of the Hartung and Preznick pattern reference books provided a resource for identifying the various patterns, shapes, and makers of Carnival Glass. This enabled the collectors to speak a common language. The Woody Auctions had established a marketplace, which helped establish a price the collector was willing to pay. With this foundation the hobby began to grow.

Members of the early organizations realized the need and advantages of forming area and regional clubs. Through their efforts, additional organizations were formed. All clubs were effective in the expansion of the hobby by attracting new collectors. The interest in Carnival Glass now extends to Australia, England, Canada, and Argentina, where members from these countries have also formed area clubs. The growth of these organizations has helped to give Carnival Glass worldwide attention and opens the marketplace for further expansion. Another positive influence has been the Carnival Glass Auctions, which provide an opportunity for the exchange of the glass. Tom Burns, Jim Seeck, Mickey Reichel, and Gary Cooper, along with John Woody, are among the knowledgeable auctioneers who contribute greatly to the expansion of the market.

An additional contribution that has added to the growth of Carnival Glass collecting is the availability of reference materials. Many collectors have added to the collectors' knowledge of Carnival Glass by writing articles for club newsletters, presenting educational programs at club meetings, room displays, and presentation of educational programs at conventions. Two members have made major contributions to the collectors knowledge. One of those was Don Moore, who wrote several books and many informative articles for club newsletters. Another source of educational and reference material has been supplied by John and Lucile Britt. This information is a tremendous benefit to all collectors. HOACGA has published two educational books of newsletter articles which were written by the Britts. They have contributed educational articles to all publications distributed by the various clubs. Some of the more recent publications by other collectors that have added to our knowledge are:

## EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

### ENAMELED BUTTONS AND BRAIDS TUMBLER

This pretty Enameled Button and Braids tumbler is of standard size measuring 3 7/8 inches high and three inches across the top. The base is slightly more than 2 inches in diameter and has a smooth or plain underside. The outer 1/4 inch edge of the bottom of the base has been factory ground and polished. The Buttons and braids pattern is used on the interior of the tumbler. The pattern consists of two rows of 15 buttons that circle the interior near the top. Below these two rows of buttons are two rather large braids that pretty much cover the rest of the inside.

The exterior of the tumbler is smooth and contains an unusual enameled single flower that is used on only one side. The flower is in a pretty blue and white color. The two leaves are in several shades of green. The floral enameling is superb and the iridescence is quite nice.

The Buttons and Braids tumbler is shown in color in "Fenton Glass, The First Twenty-Five Years" by William Heacock on page 31. Those tumblers are in blue opalescent glass which is not carnival, but it does show the pattern quite well.

This unusual red carnival glass tumbler marks our 210th entry into the Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will feature a marigold Heisey tumbler that is known as "Plain and Fancy".

For the 1993 souvenir HOACGA made a 6 inch plate with the Northwood "GOOD LUCK" pattern on the frontside. Several of these plates are still available. The plate was made by the Fenton Glass Company in Ruby Red. The backside pattern is the Rose panels from the Imperial Open Rose pattern.

The "GOOD LUCK" pattern was never used on small plates. The pattern appeared only on regular 9 inch plates and bowls. The "GOOD LUCK" pattern has always been popular with the collector. This pattern was never made in red, because Northwood did not make any Red Carnival Glass.

This small plate is unique in that the pattern was never made in a 6 inch size. It combines patterns used by two different companies that originally made Carnival Glass, Imperial and Northwood. The plate with the "GOOD LUCK" pattern in Red will make an attractive addition to your collection.

- \* A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

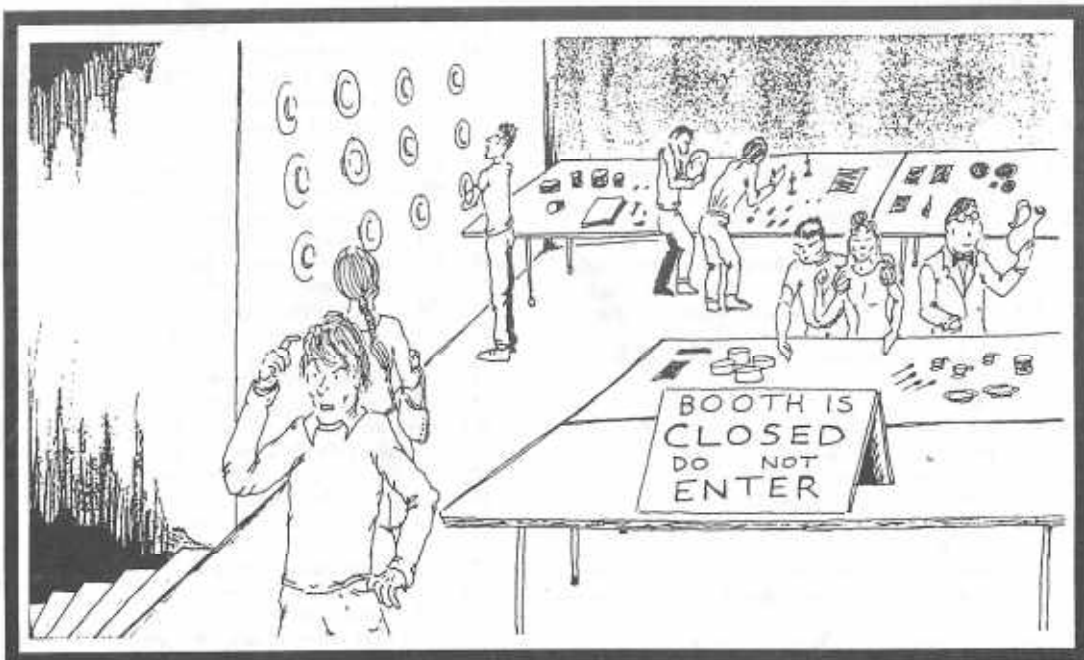
