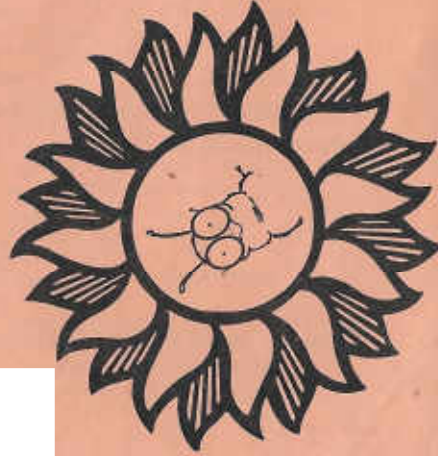

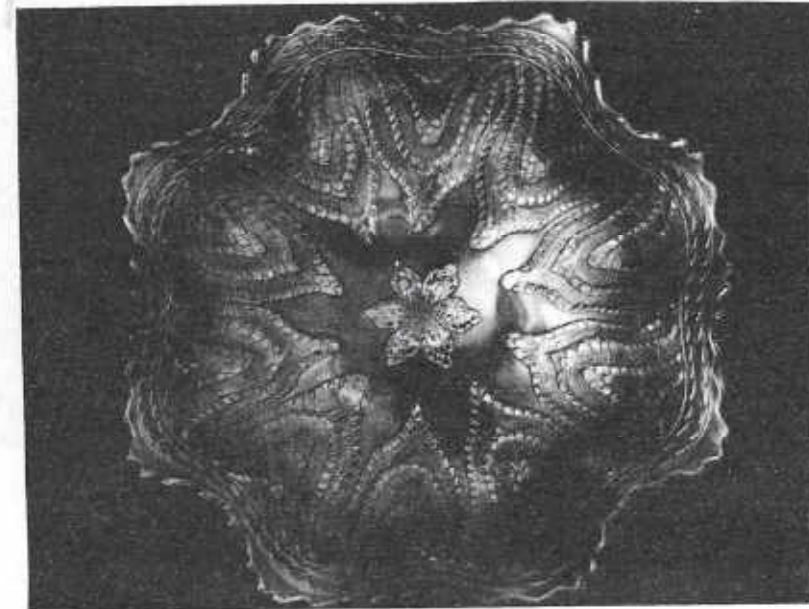

**DRAGON'S TONGUE**

Collectors of the many and varied wonderful patterns available in Carnival Glass are always excited when able to add one such as this to a collection. Dragon's Tongue is found on shades (as on lamps) of marigold over milk glass. However, the design of that pattern is not quite the same as the one displayed on this 11" footed bowl.

This bowl is one of Fenton's rare ones and has not been found in a plate shape, such as Stag & Holly Chop plates. Dragon's Tongue bowls have always been in short supply. None sold at auction during 1994 and only two sold in this manner during 1993. There must be some fantastic story surrounding the one which brought \$750. We can only speak about the gorgeous qualities of the one which sold for \$1,600. These were the only ones auctioned off in 1993. We have seen a lovely example in the ice cream shape bowl during 1995. It was for sale privately.

For whatever the reason, only a couple of Fenton's rarest bowl patterns have been found in plate form. There is a marigold and a blue example in Birds & Cherries, and, of course, very few plates in Peter Rabbit pattern.

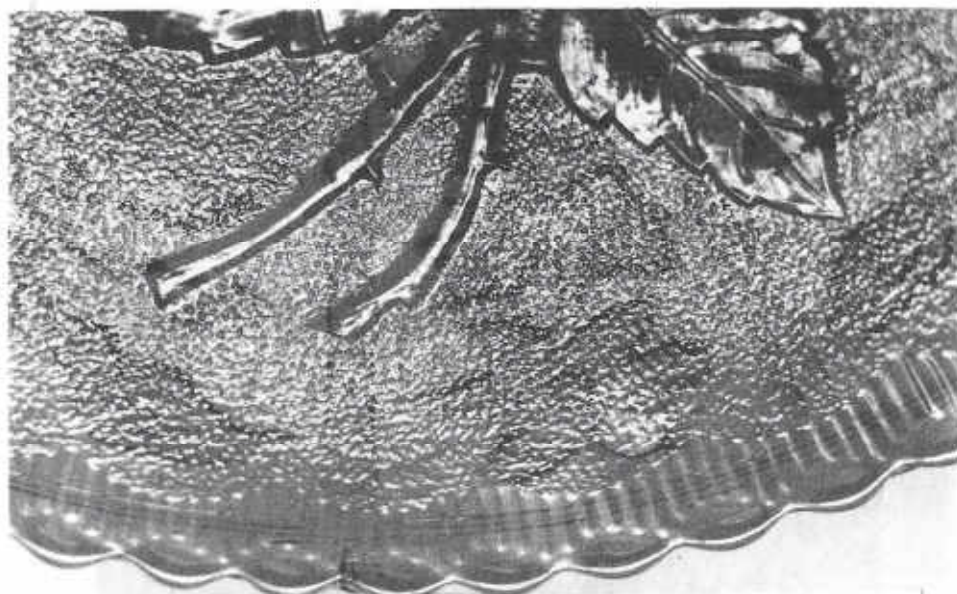
Little Daisies, Heart & Horseshoes, Dragon's Tongue, Ragged Robin, Wild Blackberry, Rose Tree are known only in the bowl shapes. A marigold and a blue plate have been reported in Goddess of Harvest pattern. We cannot verify that these are true flat plates.

We surely would enjoy reading articles on that subject. Perhaps their owners will decide to accommodate and better inform the rest of us. We're always eager to learn more about this fascinating pursuit.



## IMPERIAL'S OPEN ROSE PLATES

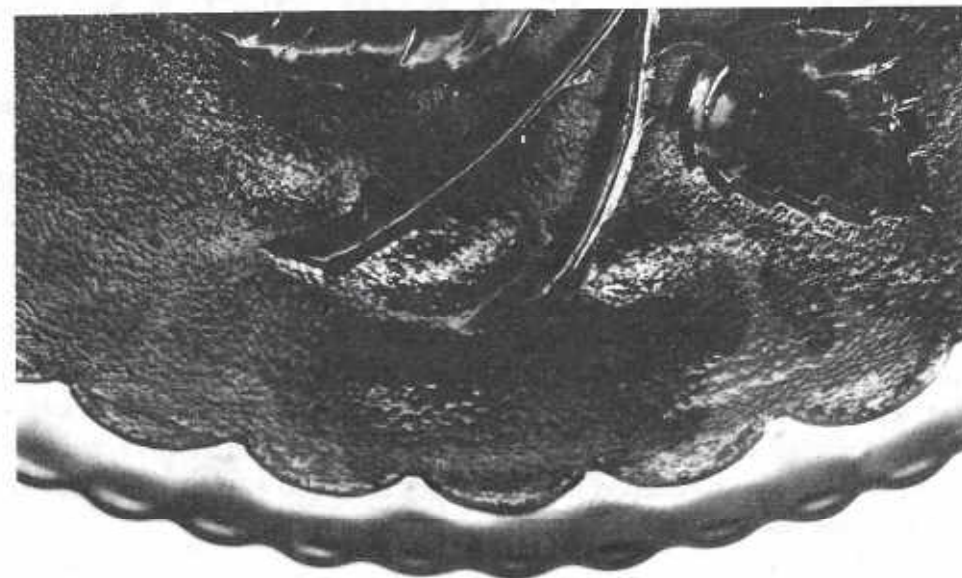


**Amber plate with radial lines and blunt stems.**

Let's take a closer look at Imperial's Open Rose plates. First, please note we said plates, plural, not one but two individuals plates. We have wondered for years why nothing is ever mentioned concerning the fact that there are two similar yet altogether different Imperial Open Rose plates.

The plates were made in amethyst, considered a rare color, a rich amber, a helios green and varying shades of marigold. Bill Edward's book states that it also was made in smoke. We have no knowledge of it ever being made in smoke, but it's possible. Some years ago at the St. Louis' Gypsy Caravan, an annual flea market and antique affair, we saw what we remember as a blue Open Rose plate. The price was in the \$400 range and poorly iridized. At that time we were not smart enough to appreciate that blue would be a rare find in an Open Rose plate and passed it by. We are still in the learning stage today.

The plates feature two very realistic open roses and four rose buds in various stages of opening. All have heavily stippled backgrounds ending in scallops and are found with two different edge treatments. One has undulating radial lines, the other has no lines. Both edge treatments can be found on the same color plates. In a recent conversation with glass historian Dr. James Measell, he reminded us that many moulds had a top edge section of the mould

that was changeable. Some plates could have been made with either edge treatment by changing this part of the mould. Other patterns such as Imperial's Grape plates and bowls and Imperial's Windmill bowls can be found with and without the radial lines.

Now let's look at the central design of the plates. The differences between the two moulds are very obvious when holding the two plates in your hands. I will not attempt to describe in detail the dissimilarities, but invite you to look at your plates and compare. The rose stems, blunt and pointed, varying thorn positions, leaf positions and sizes, and rose buds are all quite different. An amethyst plate sold recently at the American Carnival Glass convention for \$2,000. That is getting to be serious money. That plate was the radial line variety, with blunt stems.

Our observation is that all the plates we have seen with radial lines are the blunt stem type. It follows that we have only seen the pointed stems pattern on the plates without radial lines. To prove or disprove the theory that the two plates could be made either with or without the radial lines by changing the top portion of the mould, we would like to find a blunt stem without radial lines or the pointed stem variety with radial lines. This may be a "who cares" story, but one has to wonder why collectors get so excited about some mould variations and completely ignore others like this one. In this case, it could be monetarily advantageous to know if one type is scarcer than the other.



## ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK & MARGE

**June 24, 1995:** Reichel Auction, Boonville, Missouri. When we saw people from Florida, New York, Minnesota, North Carolina, Texas and points in between we knew there was some interesting glass in the auction. The sale featured many water sets, individual pitchers and tumblers. In many cases, the pitcher and tumblers were sold separately with choice of tumblers.

The prettiest pitcher had to be the \$1200 amethyst Dugan Lattice and Daisy tankard - it was super, but the lone tumbler that sold separately was the exact opposite. The top selling water set was the nice purple Oriental Poppy at \$3000. Some other prices - amethyst Checkerboard pitcher at \$3500, amethyst G & C tankard pitcher at \$875, purple Greek Key water at \$1400, amethyst Panelled Dandelion set at \$1000 and blue Starflower pitcher at \$1500. The super marigold 9" Good Luck plate brought \$1150.

Pieces we seldom see at an auction were the four (yellow amber, lavender purple, dark yellow green and purple - Mickey's description) Four Flower Variant 9" plates at \$375, 275, 350 and 250. Also, the Goofus 5½" pinched in whimsy Palm Beach bowl (very unusual iridescence) at \$225 and the marigold 5 3/4" square whimsy Palm Beach bowl at \$175.

There was a good crowd and this was a well conducted sale. In our opinion, prices varied greatly, but were above average. The hat pins seemed to be in the soft category. We were happy to get a few of the unusual pieces we went to Boonville to buy.

**July 5-8, 1995:** American Carnival Glass Association Convention, Fort Wayne, Indiana. The location, good auction and two informative educational seminars made this a very good convention. All this was topped off with entertainment at the banquet by the "Little Fiddlers". Marcus and Megan Mullins (11 and 8 years old) are nationally known entertainers having performed all over the country - a good show.

Lee Markley presented the basket seminar and when it comes to bushel baskets, he literally has them all, and then some. Bob and Betty Stremming presented the rosebowl seminar. They had 235 rosebowls in their display plus several more brought in by other members - a huge grouping and each piece labeled with a display card. Both sessions were well done and appreciated by those in attendance.

Burns Auction Service had an auction in conjunction with the convention and sold some

very desirable glass. There were too many pieces for a convention auction and the sale was too long, but prices held up well to the end.

**July 15, 1995:** Riverbend Auction, Alderson, West Virginia. We took a short vacation filled with variety and new experiences. We couldn't go through Millersburg country without stopping at the Sugarcreek bakery and a few area antique shops. While in the area, we stopped at Meitzler's Iris and Daylily Garden and purchased several new daylilies for our garden. How did we know about these daylilies? Because of carnival glass of course. Louis and Gertrude were in Fort Wayne attending the ACGA convention and we found out about their "other hobby".

From there we headed on south stopping at the Fenton Glass factory before reaching the West Virginia Hamilton's home. Vic had made motel reservations near Alderson, so we were all off to a new auction experience for us. The Riverbend Auction wasn't all positive or all negative. We liked the 95 pieces per hour pace, the computer checkout, having the pieces with absentee bids identified with small stickers (1 for single and 2 tags for multiple mail bids), and the presence of several familiar faces in the crowd.

We draw the line on the 10% buyers fee however. The glass was sold "as is". Couldn't have returned an item anyway as the glass was not handed out, but "stored" until settled for. Haven't seen so many \$2.50 bids since the last farm auction we attended. The location was an old warehouse type building with the expected poor acoustics and no air conditioning. It did have comfortable old theater seats. What else? Well, the building is along a railroad track and a train went through on piece 10, 26, 157 and 203. We left shortly after number 203 to avoid the heat. More trains? Probably.

There were a few very good pieces sold, but for the most part, the glass in this particular auction was not the high powered kind. The auction team was very efficient and did a good job in our opinion. Now if they would just eliminate the 10% buyers premium!

Many times we said we would get to Grace Rinehart's, but this time we made it. Thanks to Vic and Helen Hamilton we took an indirect route back to their home and stopped off for a lovely visit with Grace. On an extended weekend for us we visited two lovely homes filled with West Virginia hospitality.

## EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

### THE PLAIN AND FANCY TUMBLER

The Plain and Fancy pattern was made by the old A.H. Heisey Glass Company of Newark, Ohio. The featured tumbler is 4 inches tall and has a top opening of 2 3/4". The base is 2 1/4" in diameter and is plain on both sides. The tumbler contains twelve interior rather shallow panels. These panels are about 3/4 of an inch wide. The tumbler itself is plain with a 3/4" wide fancy engraved band that circles the tumbler near the top. This is probably how it got its name "Plain and Fancy".

The water pitcher, along with a tumbler, is shown in photo #2. The pitcher is 7 1/4" tall with a clear applied handle. The plain base is 4" in diameter. It is also 4" across the top. From the base the pitcher bulges out somewhat and then comes back in at the top. It also contains the shallow panels on the interior which are somewhat larger than those on the tumbler. Both the water pitcher and the tumblers are in rather light delicate marigold. The iridescence is very fine and we would class it as pastel due to the pretty pinks that show up in the iridescence. Neither the pitcher nor the tumbler contain the Heisey "D" in a Diamond trademark.



Heisey club members, researchers and authorities at the Heisey Museum all are strong believers that Heisey definitely did not make any carnival glass. They did however, sell glass, some of it signed with the "H" in a Diamond trademark, to other companies that performed the iridising and decorating. Some of the Heisey iridised pieces were also used as souvenirs, with the words SOUVENIR OF some city, fair, place etc. stenciled on to the piece. One such name that we have seen used quite often are the words "HALE BATH HOUSE - HOT SPRINGS, ARK." Most of the iridised Heisey pieces that we have seen, such as the Plain and Fancy water set did not contain any advertising, however.

Robert Smith of Massachusetts done most of the research on the Plain and Fancy pattern. He spent a lot of time at the Heisey shows in his area and was able to go through old Heisey catalogs and literature. His work has been a great help to us in writing this article.

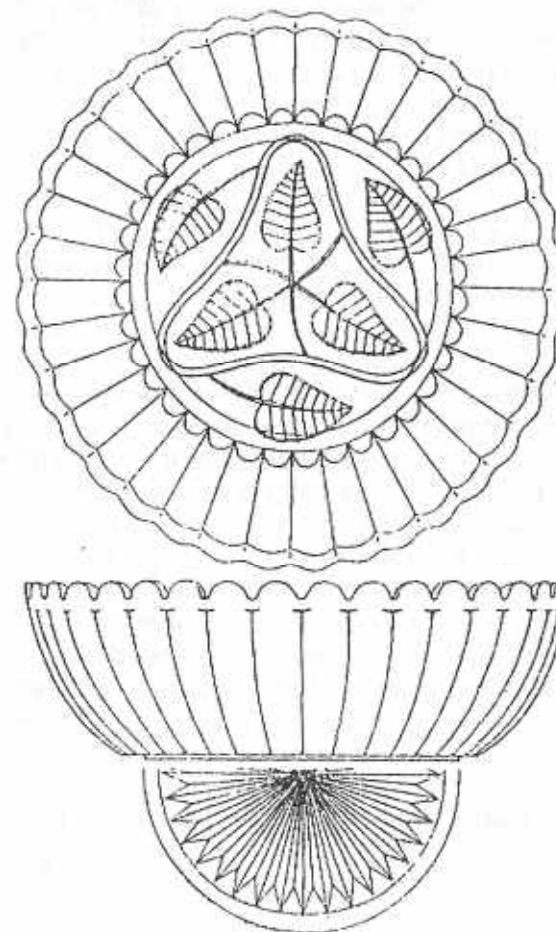

Here are six marigold bowls from my collection of 'waifs and strays':

1. "LEAFY TRIANGLE". At first glance, the exterior of this bowl appears to be another variant of Pillar Flute. Closer inspection shows difference not only in the top of the flutes and the scalloped rim but also in the bottom of the flutes which are sharply cut off parallel to the 1/16" deep collar base. But of course it is the leaves and triangle motif covering the centre of the bowl's interior which sets this apart from all others. The mould-work is excellent and the six leaves have delicately serrated edges. This otherwise symmetrical design is strangely marred by having the tip of one of the innermost leaves pointed in a different direction to the other two. There are 36 flutes around the bowl's exterior and under the base is a 36 petalled-rays motif. (Incidentally, the latter completely obliterates the interior motif when the bowl is held to the light). The color is rich but the iridescence is on the interior only. The bowl measures 6½" diameter and is 2" high. I can find no mould-marks. From the exterior pattern, I would guess it's Imperial, but this is the only shape and size I have seen in this design. Most collectors of my acquaintance have this piece.



Glen had added the caveat that she felt the piece was neither as easily found as this article implied, nor was it probably Imperial, but rather European. I agree wholeheartedly on both accounts, and stand by my earlier assertion that it's most likely an Eda Glass product.

It also is not clear to me if the name "Leafy Triangle" has some traceable provenance, or if Mr. May assigned the name himself. I would assume it is the latter case, and seems to me a wholly suitable and descriptive name for this pattern. All in favor of accepting the aforementioned name as the correct and proper name for this pattern (until somebody else writes a book), please signify so by saying aye!

Lest I forget, a big thanks to the Blairs for their help on this item.

I said in last month's response to Jeri Sue that I would know more about some of her European pieces in this month's column. I lied. Haven't been able to find out squat about any of them. Found a picture of the pointy pattern bowl, but there was no name given for it. If I am unable to make any headway by next month, I may just name them myself.

Well, I had to go and open my big mouth. I no sooner said what nice comments I'd been receiving on the column, when along comes a letter castigating me for my irreverent and flippant attitude towards Carnival Glass collecting. The lady who sent the letter did not request anonymity, but I am too much of a gentleman to reveal her name and let the world in on the fact that she is totally devoid of a sense of humor. Take a tranq, get a grip, and try to remember that this is a hobby and supposed to be fun.

Further to John D. Resnik's article in the July Bulletin, I was interested to see on page 17 the illustration of the "Jam Jar with Lid" which is also in our collection.

This Jar was included in the "Poor Man's Tiffany" exhibition held at Nottingham Castle Museum in August 1983 showing over 800 pieces of the Notley/Lerpiniere Carnival Glass collection and is described in the exhibition catalogue as "Blocked Diamond, Master Pattern Number 2251 and of unknown make". It has a cut-out in the lid for a spoon and was probably used for Honey, Marmalade or Conserves (Jam). Our Jar as well as the 3 or 4 I have seen in this country, are completely marigold and not as shown in your photograph with a clear knob and feet.

The Society's First Annual General Meeting was held at the Castle Museum during the opening weekend of the exhibition.

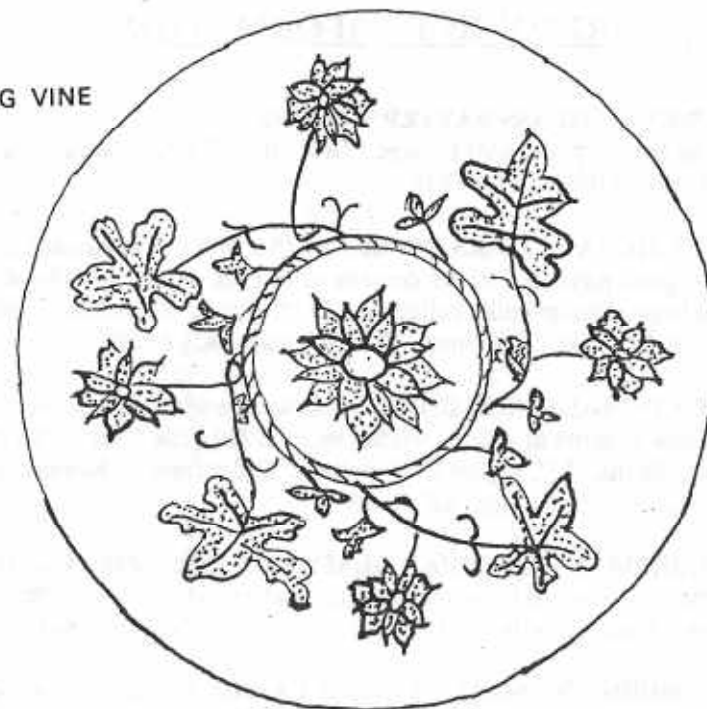


### FLOWERING VINE COMPOTE IN GREEN

We consider the Flowering Vine compote as extremely rare. We know of only this one example in the green color and have seen one in amethyst and heard of two others in that color. We presently know of no marigold examples. In 1982, when Jack Wilson wrote his Millersburg Research Notes, he had seen only one in green and one in amethyst. Mrs. Hartung listed the pattern in her tenth and final carnival glass book, so she had worked with carnival glass a long time before she actually knew that this pattern existed. The one she wrote about and sketched in book #10 belonged to Mrs. Lucille Lowe of Killbuck, Ohio, a town very close to Millersburg. Edwards does not show this pattern in his 1975 edition on Millersburg glass, but does list it in his later Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass. He also reports one in green and one in amethyst. From these reports you can see that there are only a few of the Flowering Vine compotes known to exist.

This pattern is found only in the tall compote. It is not only rare, but it is also beautiful and very desirable. This compote was made by the old Millersburg Glass Company of Millersburg, Ohio in the 1910 era. It is quite unusual in the carnival glass field to see a compote that is as tall as the Flowering Vine. It measures 9" high and 6½" across the top. The tall version of the Rosalind compote and the Ohio Star compotes do approach this

height, both of which were made by Millersburg. The featured Flowering Vine compote has nine panels that cover the exterior of the piece. The nine sided base is smooth on the underside. The interior pattern is one of grape like leaves and dahlia like flowers. It contains the popular radium finish. We are including a photostatic copy from Hartung book 10 showing the interior of this compote, which will probably give you a better view of this pattern.

This rare green Flowering Vine compote that is covered in this article sold at the Woody auction of the O.J. Olson and Harrington collections at St. Louis, Missouri in January of 1982. It sold to Don Doyle, one of the top Millersburg collectors, for \$1,300.00. When Don Doyle sold his collection at the Lincoln Land convention auction in 1990 at Milwaukee, Wisconsin the Flowering Vine compote sold for \$3,750.00. It was sold again in 1994 at the St. Peter, Missouri Britt auction, held by Jim Seeck, for \$9,000.00. It went back to its former owner, Don Doyle. He is building another great Millersburg collection. The Flowering Vine compote will certainly add a lot of beauty and charm to his collection. Marie McGee, author of the very fine Millersburg book, states that the Flowering Vine is certainly one of the most beautiful of the Millersburg compotes. The photo of the compote is courtesy of David and Joan Doty.

This is our 201'st entry into the Pictorial Pattern Parade. Next month we will feature a rare and beautiful blue rose bowl in the Northern Lights pattern.

## RED GOOD LUCK - 6 INCH PLATE - 1993 SOUVENIR

A photograph of the 1993 "GOOD LUCK" souvenir plate was included and in the July bulletin. This souvenir plate was made in 1993, but it did not sell as well as other Red pieces. Other souvenirs that have been made in Ruby Red have sold out. For some reason, these plates were not offered for sale in the bulletin at the time they were made, so members may not have been aware of these small 6 inch plates before.

This six (6) inch red plate has the Northwood "GOOD LUCK" pattern featured on the front side and the Imperial "OPEN ROSE" pattern on the back side. This plate was made from a mold which the Fenton Art Glass Company purchased after the Imperial Glass Co. Closed.

The Northwood "GOOD LUCK" pattern was never used on small plates, it was only used on the 9 inch plates and bowls. This pattern has always been popular with the carnival glass collectors.

This small plate is unique in that the "GOOD LUCK" pattern was never used on a six (6) inch plate and neither of the patterns were ever made in Ruby Red. It combines patterns used by two different makers of Carnival Glass, Imperial and Northwood and this souvenir plate was made by the Fenton Art Glass Co. This Ruby Red Plate will make an attractive addition to your collection.

The plate sells for \$37.50, plus \$2.50 each plate for shipping. Only 300 of these plates were made.

## FROM MY CORNER

By Bob Grissom

### THE HOBBY OF CARNIVAL GLASS COLLECTING

WHERE IS IT GOING? The future of the Carnival Glass collecting hobby depends wholly on those who are now involved in the hobby. The challenge, then, is will we accept the responsibility to provide the necessary leadership and guidance, in order that the Carnival Glass organizations will remain a viable educational and informational source for collectors, both the beginning and the advanced.

I believe that for Carnival Glass collecting to continue its growth, several aspects of the hobby must be addressed, they are:

1. **Membership:** The hobby requires a continuing supply of new collectors. In order to have this supply, all collectors must assume the responsibility of encouraging new members. Collectors must assume the roll of educator for the newer collector in every aspect of collecting - color, patterns, maker, shape, iridescence, price, etc.
2. **Organization:** The collector must be an active participant in the various clubs. It is the responsibility of the clubs to be a major source of information for all collectors through their monthly meetings, educational seminars at the conventions and with their periodic publications. The organizations should always strive to promote and educate members about all aspects of the glass. We must maintain a market for all of the glass regardless of the price, it cannot survive on rarities only.
3. **Marketing:** The collectors must require a high ethical standard to be maintained. The collector must always honestly represent his glass that is offered for sale/trade. If we allow reason for doubt about the ethics of members to enter into a hobby it will certainly effect the ability to market the glass. New collectors will be reluctant to enter the hobby. The auctioneers that offer the glass for sale must always represent the glass fairly and honestly, to both the seller and buyer.
4. **Damage:** In some way the hobby needs to establish a criteria for analyzing defects. We are becoming too critical of defects regardless of their location or size. If the collector continues to degrade the glass because of a small defect regardless of the other favorable aspects of the piece then we will be sending the wrong message to the newer and less experienced collector. In just a few more years, Carnival Glass will be celebrating 100 years, a few chips should be expected.

WHAT DOES THE FUTURE HOLD FOR CARNIVAL GLASS?  
THAT WILL DEPEND UPON THE EFFORTS OF THE PRESENT COLLECTOR,  
AND WHAT WE DO NOW TO SECURE THE FUTURE.

Dear Jackie,

Having read a letter in HOACGA from a Mr. Bob Smith, I feel I should offer a measured response. Would you please print this letter in the newsletter.

First let me say every research writer HATES having to write an accompanying price guide; they are always inaccurate from the moment we put a price on paper. But knowing it is a necessary part of writing, we try to do the best we can. When I first wrote a price guide, I used only tag prices and person-to-person sale prices, believing auction prices were mostly inflated and a poor value guide. I was soundly criticized for my prices being too LOW. When I did decide to use auction prices, I now find I am being judged for prices too HIGH (and often by the same people who were vocal about previous prices not being high enough). I try to understand this and take it in stride, knowing with a guide that has many thousands of prices, most collectors realize there will be some bad judgement calls and some misprints I have no control over. However, I do get upset at the buyer who bids wildly at an auction, driving up prices in an effort to impress friends and other collectors in the room and then goes to a mall dealer expecting prices not to reflect this wild bidding frenzy. Actually, the criticism of my price guide or any other flatters us; dealers are more driven by auction prices and the headlines of those wild auction sales much more often than they are by price guides. Just remember a few of the headlines in weekly antique newspapers that say "\$27,000 carnival vase tops sale" or "Carnival pitcher brings \$16,000". Could you expect dealers who are not experts in carnival glass to avoid marking their items accordingly? Of course not!

Just remember ALL price guides are usually written "after the fact". Except for rare items that seldom come up for sale, recently discovered items that haven't been priced before and a few unintentional misprints, guide prices are listings of prices **THE GLASS SOLD FOR SOMEWHERE**.

Finally, let me say anyone who wants can write a better price guide of his or her own if that person wishes to do so. In fact, I recommend it! It is the best way I can think of to learn tolerance with those who do. I remember the first carnival price guides from Marion Hartung and Sherman Hand; they had four color columns, no distinction of colors (all purple, green and blue came in a "dark" column) and very little detail of sizing or shape. I would LOVE to go back to that sort of price guide! It would make my last years so much easier. But with each year and each new collector, buyers have demanded more detail, more information and more accuracy. All of us who write and research try our best to keep up with these demands; but there is a LIMIT and I'm afraid we are reaching it. When petty complaints take all the fun out of the hobby, then there has to be a downside.

I write this letter with all good intentions and want to say to Mr. Smith (and any other critic): **PLEASE WRITE A PRICE GUIDE OF YOUR OWN. I WILL BE THE FIRST TO STAND UP AND APPLAUD YOUR EFFORTS FOR I'VE BEEN THERE FOR TWENTY FIVE YEARS AND KNOW THE PROBLEMS YOU WILL FACE.**
