## THE IMPERIAL PROCLAMATIONS

Shown in the photo here, is an example of the Crabclaw bowl in a true Ice Cream shape. It measures 9 5/8" in diameter, and stands 2 3/4" deep at the edge. When viewed "head on", it is slightly actogonal in shape. The color is a true Clambroth and the quality of the iridescence is beyond belief, rich with pink, brilliant yellow and Peacock blue highlights. When seen firsthand, it is a most impressive piece of Carnival Glass. To date, I can document 2 colors for these Ice Cream shaped Crabclaw bowls: marigold and clambroth. I would not be surprised to learn of others, as the usual ruffed versions are known in purple, smoke and green, as well.

The existence of this Ice Cream shaped Crabclaw bowl was first reported to me just as the Imperial book went to press, too late to include it in the text. I received reports of 4 or 5 others over the course of the ensuing 3 months. Then, in March, I found the example shown here in a local antique shop. It was priced at \$30, so needless to say it quickly found a new home.

Imperial produced very few Ice Cream shaped bowls and I would classify all of them as quite scarce. In addition to the Crabclaw, Fashion bowls may also be found in this shape. They have been documented in marigold, clambroth, and smoke. Here again, I would not be

surprised if purple or green examples also exist. Other Imperial Ice Cream shaped bowls that come to mind are three footed ones in the Open Rose, or Lustre Rose, pattern. This is commonly called the Centerpiece bowl, and has been reported in marigold, clambroth, helios, smoke and amber. It is quite scarce, in any color. Three footed Ice Cream shaped bowls are also known in the Floral & Optic Pattern, but I can recall no others. If anyone has an Ice Cream shaped bowl in any other Imperial pattern, I would appreciate hearing from you.


Incidentally, while we're on the subject of the Crabclaw pattern, take a close look at the ruffled bowl called "Blaze" on page 34 of Bill Edward's 5th Edition of The Standard Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass. It is a ruffled Crabclaw bowl!!

## IMPERIAL PATTERN, COLOR & SHAPE UPDATES

IMPERIAL'S GRAPE - The Handled Basket is now confirmed in purple. The Stemmed Compote is confirmed in aqua. Small, 4-5" ruffled bowls have surfaced in smoke and the 9" Flat Plate is now know to exist in true clambroth. A single example of the punch bowl, missing the base, has now been confirmed in smoke. Who's got the base and cups?

IMPERIAL'S GRAPE VARIANT - Three more of these curious bowls have surfaced, all in marigold. One of them was a big surprise, as it contains the normal Imperial's Grape pattern on the interior surface, yet it is the true variant, as it also has the single Grape Leaf molded on the exterior of the collar base!

STAR & FILE - Last month, I promised an exciting find from our friends "Down Under", and here it is. Shown in the photo below are three examples of the elusive Star & File Tall Sundae! It seems that 6 of these have been sitting quietly in the collection of John & Margaret McGrath of Quakers Hill, Australia for several years!



They are 5" tall and measure 3 3/4" across the top, exactly the correct measurements that are given in the old factory catalog reprint on page 24 of my Imperial book. The McGraths were not aware that these had never surfaced here in the U.S., or at least had never been documented. Perhaps this is why. Maybe the bulk of them were shipped overseas. John and Margaret informed me that they purchased these at an auction. The auctioneer claimed that he had obtained these in a shipment of antiques from England. Interesting! My thanks to John & Margaret for sharing this with us and for sending the photo.

#### MORE "NOT IMPERIAL"

BEADED PANELS "POWDER JAR" - This is another late Carnival Era pattern made by the Hazel Atlas Glass Co., circa 1927-1935. Like the Diamond Point Columns "Powder Jar" mentioned in last month's article, it was originally advertised as an "Ice Box Size Covered Butter".

BLOSSOM & BAND BERRY SET - While it is now certain that the Car Vase in this design is a product of The Diamond Glass Co., the Berry set bearing this name is not! It is another late Carnival pattern produced by The Hazel Atlas Glass Co. It appears in company with the Diamond Points Columns Berry Set in the April 1929 Butler Brothers Catalog.

DAISY & BUTTON HAT - This is definitely a product of The U.S. Glass Co. Molds for this pattern were used at several of their member factories, including The Central Glass Works of Wheeling, West Virginia. The mis-attribution to Imperial likely stems from the new Carnival examples that Imperial made in the 1960's and 70's. Remember, Imperial purchased the molds of the Central Glass Works in 1940!

That's it for this time. Next time, we'll feature one of Imperial's Candlestick patterns. in a previously un-reported color. 'Til then... Happy Hunting!

Restoring an old house is not a project for the faint of heart. Have exterior painting going on, and have difficulty in repairing the dry rot as fast as the painter can find it. Fortunately, he takes the weekends off, so it gives me a chance to catch up! Shouldn't complain though, I've wanted to do this all my life, and with any luck, may live to see it completed.

Had friends up recently from Florida and took a few days off to take them out and about to the local tourist traps. If you ever pass through this way, you really should visit the Biltmore Estate in Ashville, NC. It's the largest private home ever built in the United States: they measure it in acres instead of square feet! It's open daily year round and is well worth the price of admission.

On to business.

Q: Could you identify the vase in the enclosed picture? It's 15½" tall and the top is 8½" across. The base is textured like the Dugan Twigs vase, and the trunk is ribbed like a Fenton Fine Rib vase. Color is marigold. I have a pair of them. Also would appreciate a value.

A: Your vases are not Carnival Glass, but rather Art Glass. I'm certain there is a pontil mark somewhere on them (probably the bottom), and they are either mold blown or free formed, not pressed. In Larry Freemans' book, "Iridescent Glass" (long out of print), he goes into great detail explaining the different methods of iridising glass. Mr. Freeman states that glass of quality such as Tiffany and Steuben was processed by an "in the batch" iridescence, while cheaper types of glass, such as Carnival Glass, were iridised by a "spray on" technique. I'm sure Mr. Freeman would be mortified to know that this cheaper glass has, in many cases, exceeded his glass of quality in the area of value. Your vases are called jack-in-the-pulpit trumpet vases in art glass circles, and are of the Tiffany/Steuben/Loetz type. A lot of contemporary glassware has utilized the applied vine design which is employed on your vases, and without actually being able to touch your pieces, I'd be hard pressed to know for a certainty the age of these items. Assuming them to be contemporary, I'd estimate the value of the pair at \$300 - \$400; however, if they are old, the value could run up into the thousands. I plan to be at the New England Convention in the Fall, so bring them, and I'll give you a more succinct appraisal.

Robin Dodd of Moncks Corner, SC sent in a couple of questions.

- Q: Can you tell me what color my Good Luck bowl is and what it's value might be? It has one point missing.
- A: The color is teal, which is really a sapphire blue base glass with heavy marigold overlay, and a perfect one would fetch from \$1000 \$1800. With a point gone, I' think yours would bring from 25% to 50% of that.
- Q: Can you tell me what kind of bowl this is?
- A: Your picture wasn't going to mean much in a black and white reproduction, but your bowl is an Imperial Jewels piece and technically would fit into the stretch glass field of the early thirties. You failed to give me a base color or a size, so an exact evaluation is not possible. Still, generally speaking, all these items tend to fall into the under \$100 range.

Heard from old friend Rudy Kovacs of Pembroke Pines, Florida. Rudy recently came up with a Millersburg Hanging Cherries 10" ice cream bowl that he describes as clambroth and has a half radium, half satin finish.

- Q: I can find no record of another bowl in this color ever changing hands. Would you consider this piece a whimsey, one of a kind, or a workers hangover?
- A: The reason you have been unable to obtain any information on your bowl is probably because it would be listed as marigold, not clambroth. Auction brochures seldom make any distinction between the various shades that marigold comes in, and if there really is a color called clambroth, (and you can find a lot of people who would dispute it) it was only made by Imperial. The half satin, half radium thing is not really unusual on Millersburg pieces. Hanging Cherries ice cream bowls are particularly prone to be radium in the center, and become satin as you approach the outer edge. Totally radium ones are extremely hard to come by.

Norma Wagner of Spirit Lake, Iowa sent in the following "gotcha" question.

- Q: Recently purchased a white six sided vase with hounds tooth hobnail exterior pattern. What I find unusual about the vase is the embossed mark on the bottom; "Hoosier Glass" and a number. Have you ever seen this mark on any other piece of glass?
- A: No, and apparently neither has any one in Indiana (that is the Hoosier State, isn't it?), because I've talked to all of them in the past few days! My new glass research material stops at the mid 1980's, and there's no mention of this Company anywhere in my data base. Lee Markley though this might be one of several glass manufacturers in the Elwood, Indiana area, but also felt perhaps they were now defunct. The trail of referrals led me to several nice people I'd never met before, but alas, no "for sure" information on Hoosier Glass. I'm fairly certain this item had to have been produced in last twenty, and probably, last ten years. Any value judgement, on my part, would be an entirely uneducated guess, so I'll dodge the issue by saying it's probably in the same ballpark as other contemporary glass.

Had several calls wanting to know what the heck my carfare reference last month was all about. I was alluding to what I thought was a famous vamp from Pearl Bailey's rendition of "The Lady Is a Tramp". Guess I got to cute for my own good, or there aren't many blues fans in Carnival Glass.

Just received my bulletin, & apparently I've stepped on Mike Carwiles' toes. If something I said, or how I said it, has offended Mike's sensibilities, I regret it and duly apologize. What I don't regret is stating <u>MY</u> opinion as to the value of Bill Edwards books as research tools.


Mr. Carwile differs with me on that, as is his right. I feel that differences of opinion, such as this, on any topic, are a part of the spice of life. I have no axe to grind with Mr. Edwards or Mr. Carwile, and I'd like to make it perfectly clear that nothing said in this column is ever personal. As to Mike's question on Acorn plates: In an attempt at humor, I may have been a bit flip in my response, but you will note I said; "I don't think so". Very little in Carnival Glass, or life for that matter, can be stated in absolutes, so I try to utilize words like "known", "opinion" or euphemisms thereof.

I really do research most of the answers I give, or apply a little common sense; to wit, with the question of Acorn plates: 1) One has not sold at auction dating back to 1982. 2) In twenty something years, I've viewed more than a hundred thousand pieces of glass and have never seen one. 3) The Ed & Marge Garner collection, of some years ago, didn't have one, and Ed specialized in the Acorn pattern. 4) Most importantly, since the subject article has appeared, no one has said; "Hey, I've got one of those". Given all this, I'm afraid I'll have to stick by my opinion, until someone hands me an Acorn plate.

To avoid future problems of this nature, and to put this one to rest, let me state my credo on the subject of glass: People are more important than glass, and they haven't made the piece yet that I would knowingly make an enemy over. It's only a hobby, and I try not to take any of it too seriously. End of subject.

## **EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES**

# **EMBROIDERED PANELS TUMBLERS**

The regular Embroidered Panels tumbler is illustrated on the right. A variation of this pattern is shown on the tumbler on the left. The regular Embroidered Panels tumbler is 4½" tall and 2 3/4" across the top. The base is 2 1/8" in diameter. The underside of the vase is slightly depressed and is plain. There are six pretty embroidered type panels spaced evenly around the tumbler. These are alternated with six smooth panels which gives the tumbler a pleasing effect. Near the top of the tumbler is a 3/4" wide band that is made up of many tiny squares. In this band are six evenly spaced circles. These are placed just above the embroidered panels. A palin 5/8" wide area is found at the top of the tumbler and a smaller smooth area appears at the bottom.

The tumbler on the left with the variations is somewhat different in shape and pattern make up. Notice that it flares out at both the top and bottom instead of the straight up sides that is used on the regular tumbler. Also note that this example has a band at both the top and bottom of the tumbler instead of the single band that is used on the regular Embroidered Panels tumbler. The panels are slightly narrower on the varient and the design inside the

panels is more dainty. This variation tumbler is also slightly taller, but the designs used are essentially the same on both tumblers.

The Embroidered Panels tumblers are a part of a group of carnival glass tumblers that came to the United states via Australia. They were not made in Australia, but are brought into that country from India. Some of the other tumblers that are more well known in this group are Beaded Spears, Muscadine, Mirror and Crossbars, Vineyard Harvest, Beaded Panels and Grapes, Mirrowed Peacocks and Banded Moon and Stars. We have written articles on all of these patterns, but there are still some other patterns that have showed up in Australia that have not been featured as yet. We have always thought that this group of tumblers were made in Czechoslovakia, but this has not been proven as yet. More research needs to be made on this group of tumblers. Cecil Whitley, author and collector from Houston, Texas, has one of these tumblers that came from Australia that she calls Australian Daisy. We will try to cover that tumbler in the next issue of the HOACGA bulletin.

The Embroidered Panels tumblers that are featured in this article belong to Bob Smith of Boston, Massachusettes. He sent them to us to photograph and view. He had them marked as "Embroidered Panels" and states that they were very rare. We think that this name fits the pattern very well.

# ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK

May 10, 1996: Woody Auction at St. Louis, Missouri. There was a wide variety of glass and a wide variance in quality. The top-end pieces were generally good and the "Heavy Hitters" were there to pick them off. A few examples were electric blue Poppy Show plate (\$3,000), ice blue G & C Hatpin Holder on a mail bid of \$2,100, purple Garden Path chop plate (\$5,000), Regal Iris Gone with the Wind lamp in caramel color at \$8,100, and blue Diamond Points basket on a \$2,000 mail bid.

I saw some good buys such as a good marigold Inverted Strawberry powder jar (\$90), a marigold Fisherman's mug (\$130), a super pretty purple Diamond Lace pitcher and two tumblers at \$300, and a great purple stippled G & C powder jar at \$325.

In my opinion, there was too much damage and epoxy to call this an overall great auction. A few misidentified items were bargains to a dealer or two.

May 23-26, 1996: Keystone Convention at Brookville, PA. Move this convention into the "BIG" category -- 110 rooms had carnival people and their glass. There were many new faces in the crowd and they seeme to be enjoying the relaxed atmosphere. I believe a lot of glass in all categories changed hands. There were some nice displays that included some interesting pieces. One serious collector had an AO Peacock at the Fountain punch set and another had the first Northwood sapphire blue Peacock on the Fence plate I had seen.

Burns Auction Service sold glass from the Jerry Rissmiller collection in the auction in conjunction with the convention. The auction went smoothly with good glass that sold very well. A few pieces that caught my eye included the emerald green Imperial Grape wine (\$280), aqua-teal Three Fruits plate (\$3500), purple Butterfly & Tulip large footed square bowl (\$2000), super electric blue Good Luck plate (\$4500), the first amber Orange Tree ruffled bowl sold in years at \$190, amber signed Homestead Nu Art chop plate (\$2800), green Homestead chop plate at \$2700, the smoke signed Homestead chop plate (\$1800), smoke 8 3/4" odd-sized Imperial Heavy Grape plate (\$425), aqua eight sided Bushel Basket (\$2500) and the emerald green G & C hatpin holder at \$400.

Researcher Claudia Minick had some interesting Dugan memorabilia on display. Included was glass shards from the site diggings, newspaper articles, old ledgers, employee time records and several old Dugan production items.

June 1, 1996: I traveled to Boonville, Missouri, where Mickey Reichel sold glass from the Floyd and Theresa Wright collection. My goal was to buy the white Orange Tree butter. It far exceeded my expectation -- and the price was more than right too. Now the challenge is to find the other three pieces of the set.

A few things were different at this auction. This was the first time I had seen the new look at the auction center -- Mickey had new and more comfortable chairs. Also he had dropped the 5 percent handling charge on mail bids, and it apparently made a whale of a difference. Mickey said he had stacks of mail bids and they surely contributed to the outcome of the sale. I believe about 40 items went to the mail bidders.

Mickey and the owners considered the sale a success, but I left thinking it was a little soft in spots. There were no multi-thousand dollar items, but many nice and desireable pieces. More dealers should have been there.

June 7-8, 1996: Again, Burns Auction Service brought a top notch auction to the Lincoln Land Convention at Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Bill and Betty Mason had arrived at the time when they thought it was in their best interest to disperse their collection. They had bought top quality pieces and it was a pleasure for me to view the glass, bid on a few items and in general be a part of a very good sale.

Bill and I had locked horns over a green Springtime table set several years ago and Bill won. This time Bill won again -- at \$3,500 he little more than doubled his money and had the last laugh again. I didn't buy the set, but it went to a good home. To me the top rarity was the blue master Grape & Cable punch set that topped the sale at \$11,000. I am sure Bill and Betty were dissappointed in a few prices, but in between were some pleasant surprises. There must have been 40 or more four digit prices.

The Midway Motor Lodge is a nice location for a sale and the auction team had everything in order. The Friday night session might have struggled a time or two, but the Saturday session rolled right along. It was a well conducted sale. This is another example where good quality and desirable glass was easy to sell and was well received.

# PICTORIAL PATTERN PARADE

#### POINSETTIA & LATTICE BOWL IN AQUA OPALESCENT

Beginning with the early years of our collecting carnival glass, the "Poinsettia and Lattice" has been one of our favorite patterns. So we were indeed thrilled and happy to find this rare and beautiful aqua opal example at the Florida carnival glass convention at Lakeland, Florida in 1986. This was our first opportunity to buy one in aqua opal, so it didn't take long to decide to purchase it. The dealer told us that he had just found this piece in the state of Georgia. This was only the second example that we had ever seen in aqua opal. The other one was in the Harold and Virginia Ludeman collection. That example is shown in color in the Northwood book, "The Wheeling years 1901-1925" on page 115.

The featured aqua opal example that is shown above is the same bowl that is illustrated in Carl Burns Northwood Carnival Glass book on page 111. Carl reports that there are only three or four of these known in that color and lists them as extremely rare. After enjoying this beautiful bowl for a while, we later sold it to Rick Kojis of West Allis, Wisconsin at one of the carnival glass conventions. We are not sure, but we suspect that they still have it in their collection.

The first Poinsettia and Lattice bowl that we ever owned was purchased when we were just getting started collecting carnival glass back in 1969. Someone at an antique show had told us that a lady in Halstead, Kansas had 2 dark carnival glass bowls that she would sell. We lost no time in looking her up. Sure enough, she had two purple carnival glass bowls. One was a Grape and Cable and the other was a Poinsettia and Lattice. They were priced at \$30.00 each, so we bought them both. Even though we knew very little about values back then, we never could figure out whu the Poinsettia and lattice bowl was priced the same as the Grape and Cable, because it sure looked a lot prettier to us. Anyway, we were very happy with the purchases and from then on we were looking for Poinsettia & Lattice bowls.

Even though we have never seen one of these bowls signed, you can be assured that they were definitely made by Northwood. In our opinion, they are certainly one of Harry Northwood's finest creations. We believe that we have seen more of these bowls in amethyst and cobalt blue than any of the other colors. A cobalt blue example, however, with electric blue iridescence, is absolutely fantastic and would be a bright star in any collection. Marigold examples are harder to find, but they too are super pieces of carnival glass. We have seen only two examples in white and the ice blue bowls are considered rare. As yet, we have never seen an ice green or green example of this pattern, but it is possible that one might exist out there somewhere. At the present time, we are enjoying our beautiful ice blue Poinsettia and Lattice bowl.
