PICTORIAL PATTERN PARADE

THE FENTON'S FERN BOWL

The Fenton's Fern pattern bowl should certainly be rated as one of the true rarities in carnival glass. It hasn't had much publicity, in our opinion, for such a rare and beautiful piece of carnival glass. It is still the only one ever reported. We did write about it in the February 1982 HOACGA bulletin. It is also shown in Hartung book #10 on page 93.

Mrs. Hartung described it as a 9" footed bowl in blue. There are four of the little web-like motifs equally spaced around the surface of the interior, with sprays of fern-like foilage curving around them. All of the pattern is raised from the background. The exterior of the bowl contains the wide panels pattern and the



three scroll type feet. The reverse side is much like Fentons Stag and Holly pattern. Hartung stated that it was definitely a Fenton piece. This was probably due to the similarity to the Stag and Holly bowl. I understand that Frank Fenton, in searching through their old records, was unable to find anything that indicated that they had ever made this pattern.

We first saw this bowl at an ICGA convention in 1981. It impressed me so much I had Lucile take a photo with me holding the bowl. That photo is shown above. The bowl was owned by E. E. and Bernice Allen of Hopewell, Virginia at that time. After they had passed away it became a part of the Don and Connie Moore collection. It now adds charm and beauty to the Floyd and Cecil Whitley collection. Photo on opposite page is courtesy of Dave Doty.

PASTEL AQUA OPAL DAISY & DRAPE VASES

Most aqua opal Daisy and Drape vases that appear in auctions today seem to be the "heavy on the butterscotch" variety. Butterscotch being the adjective applied to the marigold iridescent spray used on aqua opal glass patterns. But every now and then you will see one that leans toward the pretty pastel aqua opal look with only a slight hint, if any, of marigold spray.

The vase on the left is one of those infrequent exceptions. We spotted this vase in a Springfield, Ohio antique mall display case. We were told by another collector friend passing through that area previously that it had been there for awhile as it was kind of pricey. We have always liked our aqua opal Daisy and Drape with the butterscotch treatment and have no plans to replace it. But when we spotted this pastel vase, it was love at first sight.

At first we thought that it was an ice blue opal color but on closer examination decided it was "just" a beautiful pastel aqua opal, and oh so nice. Just about the time you get to feeling that antique malls are a complete waste of effort, something like this shows up to restore your faith.

There are still some "homeless" treasures out there somewhere intermingled with the garage sale items and Beanie Babies, just waiting to be discovered. It does take some perseverance and lots of luck.

ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK

August 29-30, 1997: Burns Auction, Hudson, Ohio. I got the brochure too late to shift gears. I had already made plans to attend a hog sale at Wellsville, Missouri, on August 29th where I bought 5 Yorkshire gilts (seven month old white females.)

September 1, 1997: Sullivan, Illinois. The ad listed only one piece of carnival glass - an ice green Grape & Cable butter dish marked N. Really? I was interested in this super rare butter dish. I called the owner and his reply was, "Yes, the ad is correct and I have about 10 other pieces of carnival in the sale." More questioning determined he bought it in 1974. A red flag went up. Is this a repro? What kind of edge did the butter base have? It was scalloped. Now I knew I wouldn't attend this sale as I was reasonably sure it was a repro. But ice green! Mosser supposedly made this butter dish about 1975 in ice blue and amber. In 1976 they listed it in their catalog in cobalt blue.

Friends attending this auction confirmed it was ice green with the "N" in the base only and had a scalloped edge. Now it appears like the ice green butter dish can join the ice blue, amber and cobalt blue ones as being reissues from the mid 1970's era.

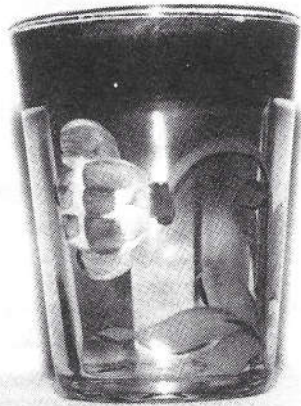
September 20, 1997: Decision time again. Either the Ayers Auction in Peoria, Illinois, or the Fultz Auction at Scottsburg, Indiana. I knew the background of the Fultz collection and there was a white Peacock at the Fountain table set listed, so I went to at least look at the table set. A phone call determined there was only minor damage on the set and it was "real pretty". There was a good crowd with many familiar faces at the auction. There was also a Hoosier Carnival Club meeting at Fort Wayne, but I saw six "regulars" that also skipped the meeting. We had our own little meeting minus the good food.

The brochure left a little to be desired because of misidentified items, but the extreme number of damaged pieces was the crowning blow. When the piece was good, it sold well and some of the damaged ones did well also. Dealers took a large part of the offering. The table set had way too much damage for me. Only the spooner was undamaged and it sold for \$90.

The day wasn't a total loss. I had an invitation to stop at the home of one of our Hoosier collectors on my way back. I saw a very nice collection. Phil, the cantaloupe was good.

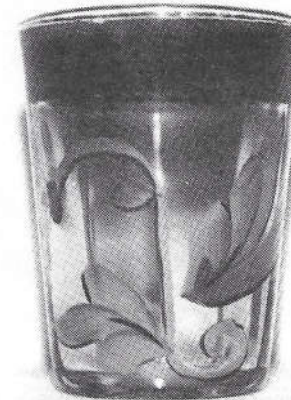
EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

SINGLE FLOWER SPRIG TUMBLER

This is a rather unusual enameled type tumbler. It is the only example that we have ever seen. It has ten interior panels that get smaller towards the base and then continue on through the bottom of the base to a distinct point at the inside center of the base. Some other enameled tumblers such as Silver Queen, Double Daisy and Silver Band contain the ten panels, but the panels in those examples go to the bottom of the tumbler's base which is 2 1/8" in diameter and do not continue through the base. Our featured tumbler bevels in at the bottom to a 1 3/4" base. There is a perfect "O" in the bottom of the base. I have no idea what this "O" means, if anything.



The Sprig on this tumbler contains a single flower and three leaves. Notice the curved up half circle at the bottom end of the stem. The 3/4's of an inch wide band at the top of the tumbler is a sort of cranberry color. At the very top is a narrow gold band. The base glass color is clear and the tumbler has excellent iridescence. The enameling has great color and workmanship.

The Flower Sprig design covers more than half the distance around the tumbler. We were unable to get the complete design in one photo. The first photo shows the front part of the sprig with the flower and part of the leaves. The above photo illustrates the bottom end of the sprig with the curved up stem.

The Single Flower Sprig is #237 in our Educational Tumbler Series. Next month we will feature the Silver Band tumbler.

THE IMPERIAL PROCLAMATIONS

The term "Salver" is one that is not often heard today. It was one that our parents and grandparents were no doubt far more familiar with. From the Victorian Period, through the Edwardian era, and up until the Depression Years, it was a term often used by glasshouses to describe a shape that is rarely used now. What is a "Salver"? Basically, it is a true, flat plate, with one major difference. The edge is turned up sharply, at a near 90 degree angle, all the way around. This differs from an Ice Cream shaped bowl in that the turning up of the edge is not gradual. It is a true, flat plate and ONLY the very edge is turned up sharply. These were intended as an "Occasional Serving Piece". They had all the advantages of a flat serving plate, plus the bonus of having whatever you served in them stay put!

Shown in the photo here is a Marigold Imperial's Grape Salver. It measures 8 7/8" in diameter and the top of the turned up edge stands just 1 1/2" high. It was shaped from the same mold used for the 9 1/2" flat plate. This is the first and only one of these I have ever seen, and it just recently surfaced. HOACGA member Sharon Mizell purchased this piece from a local home in her area and called me

about it. We discussed the piece and she then surprised me with a gracious offer to sell it to me. I was delighted to add it to my collection, and I'm pleased to be able to share this previously unlisted piece with you.

Very few Salviers exist in Carnival Glass. One other one that comes to mind is a very mysterious one indeed. Fenton produced one in the Ten Mums pattern. It is shown in a 1911 Fenton Factory Catalog as Fenton's #1057, so there is virtually no doubt that it was made. However, in all my years of Carnival collecting I have never seen one! None are listed in the carnival auction price reports going all the way back to 1981! Where are they?

MARION HARTUNG

CARNIVAL GLASS PATTERN REFERENCE BOOKS

Marion Hartung of Emporia, Kansas published a series of Ten spiral bound carnival glass pattern reference books, the first book of the series was published in 1960. As the various carnival glass patterns were found they were given a name and the pattern was sketched and recorded along with the known pertinent information in this series of ten books. These books were the first resource information for the carnival glass collector. They are still the most complete pattern information of any resource information. She held the copyright to each of these books.

Mrs. Ione E. Hinshaw was the recipient of all of Mrs. Hartung's books upon her death. Mrs. Hartung died May 11, 1983. Mrs. Hinshaw was the source for these books until 1988, when HOACGA contracted to purchase her interest in the copyrights and the books.

Glen Fortney, a HOACGA member and the club secretary at the time, went to Mrs. Hinshaw's antique shop in Emporia, Kansas to obtain a set of the Hartung books. Complete sets were not available because some of the books were out of print and she was not going to have them reprinted. Since she did not want to maintain sufficient copies so the collector could obtain a complete set or get some of the individual books, Glen discussed the possibility of HOACGA being able to purchase the remaining books and to obtain their copyrights. Glen presented the idea to the Board of Directors of HOACGA. They agreed that these valuable pattern reference books and that HOACGA should make them available to the collectors.

HOACGA was able to sign an agreement with Mrs. Hinshaw to transfer the copyright ownership and to purchase the remaining 5684 carnival glass books which she had. The club had to obtain the 1017 copies of the "Northwood Pattern Glass in Color" from her also. This book was also published by Mrs. Hartung.

The original copyright was for 25 years. Since HOACGA has had the books, the copyright for each book has been renewed, except book ten, it is now in the process of being renewed. The renewal is for 25 years.

The HOACGA Board of Directors believe that the series of books remain one of the most valuable sources of "carnival glass pattern" information that should be maintained and made available for all present and future collectors.

The complete set of the Hartung books or any one of these books can be purchased by members. Ordering information is included within the bulletin each month. Because of HOACGA's charter as a Not-For-Profit Corporation, these books can only be sold to members.

The following poem was written in 1973 by Joy Dunbaugh to celebrate a birthday of Ed Gaida's. He was an early member of HOACGA and lived with his wife, Marilyn, in Victoria, Texas. We thought that you might enjoy seeing Joy's poem.
