EDUCATIONAL TUMBLER SERIES

ROYAL DIAMONDS TUMBLER

The Royal Diamonds is a very pretty tumbler in good medium marigold with very nice iridescence. I have had no luck in finding the maker of this tumbler. We know that it came from England, but that does not mean that it was made in that Country. It is possible that it was made by Inwald, Brockwitz or Riihimaki, but at the present time we can only safely state "Maker Unknown".


The tumbler is 3 3/4 inches high and has a top opening of three inches. It flares in at the base to 2 1/8 inches in diameter. The outer ¼ inch edge of the base has been ground and polished. The rest of the base to the center is depressed about ¼ inch and is perfectly smooth. There is a plain one inch wide band at the top of the tumbler. The area below this band is filled with rows of diamonds with the top and bottom rows being half diamonds.

One thing that I especially noticed with this tumbler is that in holding it to a light, the area between the top band and the base is filled with a network of many tiny circles. I believe you can detect this in the photo of the tumbler. In crystal, this is sometimes referred to as thousand eyes. I have seen it in carnival glass. I thought that this was very unusual in carnival glass. Another thing I noted is that it was made with high quality glass and workmanship. We will continue searching for the making of this pretty tumbler. The photo is courtesy of Dave Doty.

WHITE CHRYSANTHEMUM BOWL

Fenton's Chrysanthemum bowls can be found in two sizes, at least two shapes and various colors. The pattern consists of eight large flowers, presumably Chrysanthemums with foliage, all intermingled with spruce trees, buildings, sailboats, and two large windmills.

The larger 10 inch, three toed or ball footed version is usually found in marigold, blue, and an occasional green. Other colors reported are vaseline, amethyst, and black amethyst. Add to the list this seldom seen white. Pictured in the December 1993 I.C.G.A. color insert is a picture of Don Moore's "so-called" black amethyst bowl. His comment was, "Like most other pieces in this color that I have seen, it is a deep purple when strong light is forced through it."

The Chrysanthemum pattern first appeared in the Butler Brothers wholesale catalogs in April of 1913. It is advertised in a bowl assortment in "Golden and Royal iridescent". (marigold and blue?) The exterior pattern on the large bowl has twelve wide panels arranged around a small 1½" marie, supported by three paneled ball feet.

Some of the large Chrysanthemum bowls are found in both ruffled and ice cream shapes. We have only seen one other large white ice cream shaped bowl and have heard of another damaged bowl seen in Texas. Whether or not the large white bowl was also made ruffled is unknown to us. Of course, some colors may or may not be found in both shapes. The ruffled bowl will measure slightly more due to its shape.

The smaller 9" collar base version can be found in amethyst, blue, marigold, teal, green, red and possibly white. The bowls we have seen were all ruffled. The Bill Edwards' small Fenton book published in 1981 by Collector Books shows a picture of a beautiful marigold ruffled bowl with spade feet, but doesn't give any indication of size. The pictured bowl appears to have no reverse pattern. We will guess that it is the small 8" to 9" bowl, as Fenton made other 8" - 9" bowls such as Stag & Holly and Two Flowers in the spatula footed configuration.

The top edge carries a saw tooth type fluting on both the large and the small bowls. In addition, the edge flutes are also undulating on the large bowls. (See picture) Bill Edwards' small book, "Fenton Carnival Glass, The Early Years", also mentions an ice green bowl. No, we have not seen one as yet but will keep looking.

THE NEW CHRISTMAS COMPOTES

A blessing or a curse? We know many of you ardent collectors are already familiar with this story, but for those who are a little behind the curve we will attempt to bring you up to speed. As reported in the October/November issue of the Glass Collector's Digest, three men, all glass addicts devoted to promoting glass collecting, were on a treasure hunt on a cold January day in an "old warehouse" full of hundreds of old glassmaking moulds. Now this sounds like a scenario that many of us would love to be in. Well, maybe not in an unheated warehouse on a cold day in January. And it is noteworthy that the warehouse location was not in the story. The three men were Dr. James Measell, glass researcher, Dave Richardson, glass digest publisher, and Bud Ward, a retired Fenton glass foreman.

The bottom line to this tale was that the Christmas compote mould was found and it had the Dugan Glass Company D in a diamond logo stamped on it. So another glass "who made it" mystery was solved. It was also determined that the

mould was fit to make glass again and Dave Richardson arranged for Fenton Art Glass to do just that. In June of 1997, the Christmas compotes were made again. Fourteen in mulberry blue, three teal and one topaz opalescent. Most of these compotes were sold at the International Carnival Glass convention in Dayton, Ohio last August. The topaz opal was saved for display at the Glass Press offices in Marietta, Ohio. These compotes are reportedly signed with the block letters G P for Glass Press and a stylized F in an oval for the Fenton Art Glass Company.

Since then compotes were made and sold in Ruby glass with satin finish (111) and radium finish (188) and more in topaz opalescent (152), almost all of which were first quality. Seconds were also sold in ruby glass. These compotes are signed A P for Antique Publications and the F within the oval. And there are plans to make some, possibly a couple of hundred, in green at some future date.

These has been mixed reaction to the remaking of these compotes. Some collectors are very unhappy, feeling it will hurt the price of old compotes. Some of us are glad for the opportunity to own a new Christmas compote. These compotes are not being made in the colors of the original compotes, marigold and purple, and should pose no threat to the value of the old ones. It could make the old ones even more desirable. We will have to wait and see on this. Certainly the Loganberry and Poppy Show vase prices are not very depressed today because of the I/G reissue.

A short video tape was made showing these new compotes being made at the Fenton factory with the old hand side-lever press. We were lucky enough to tour the factory some years ago and the tape was a great reminder of that trip. We could feel the heat and hear the furnaces roar again while viewing this tape. A visit there is a must experience for all carnival glass collectors. And standing in the background looking like proud parents overseeing the work are Frank Fenton, Jim Measell and Dave Richardson. A very enjoyable tape, guys. And a big thank you to the expert glass workers shown plying their trade, as well as the producers of the video.

COMMENTS ON SOME NORTHWOOD REVERSE PATTERNS

In January, 1987, we ran a "Want Ad" in the HOACGA Bulletin asking for plates and bowls with unusual exteriors in the Northwood Peacocks and Hearts & Flowers patterns. Although no one offered us anything for sale, a few people called to ask what we know about the incidence of these exterior patterns. The answer is not very much, but we would be glad to share what we've found out with you.

<u>HEARTS & FLOWERS WITH BASKETWEAVE EXTERIOR</u> - one purple ruffled bowl.

<u>HEARTS & FLOWERS WITH PLAIN EXTERIOR</u> - one white ruffled bowl; one ice-green plate.

<u>PEACOCKS WITH BASKETWEAVE EXTERIOR</u> - one marigold ruffled bowl; one green piecrust bowl; one white plate.

<u>PEACOCKS WITH PLAIN EXTERIOR</u> - one white piecrust bowl; two white ruffled bowls; two white plates; three ice-green plates; one dark green plate.

The Hearts & Flowers compotes were made with both the ribbed and plain exteriors. We have not seen enough of these compotes to make any generalization as to whether one exterior is actually more scarce than the other. To date, we have seen the plain exterior on white, ice-blue, ice-green, and aqua opalescent compotes. The ribbed reverse pattern has been seen on all familiar colors except ice-green.

Peacock's bowls and plates can also be found with a stippled interior pattern. It appears that most of these stippled pieces were made in marigold and blue, although we have seen one stippled ruffled bowl in purple and one in green. Without exception, though, every stippled Peacocks piece that we've seen has had the ribbed exterior. If you have stippled Northwood Peacocks with either basketweave or plain exterior, you probably have a rare item indeed!

RARE NORTHWOOD REVERSE PATTERNS

In the February, 1987 issue of the HOACGA bulletin, we asked readers for additional information regarding the rare basketweave and plain exteriors in the Hearts & Flowers and Northwood Peacocks patterns.

We wish to sincerely thank those of you who took the time to share your knowledge with us, including Ed Binstock, John Britt, Peggy Bullard, Marie Capps, William Coles, Donna Courts, Harold Cox, Norene Duran, Bev Franzen, Nigel Gamble, Bruce Hill, James Key, Mildred Markley, Dale Matheny, Don Moore, and Elvis Randall. Special thanks go to Lamer Sharp, who provided us with a description of every item in his Peacocks collection.

Listed below is a summary of the bowls and plates that were reported to us by other collectors. These reported items do not duplicate anything that was listed in our first article (February, 1987 HOACGA bulletin). If you are keeping a tally, therefore, please add the following items reported by collectors to the ones already mentioned in our first article:

<u>HEARTS & FLOWERS, BASKETWEAVE EXTERIOR</u> - one purple ruffled bowl.

<u>HEARTS & FLOWERS, PLAIN EXTERIOR</u> - one ice-blue ruffled bowl; one ice-green piecrust bowl.

<u>PEACOCKS</u>, <u>NON-STIPPLED</u>, <u>BASKETWEAVE EXTERIOR</u> - one marigold ruffled bowl; one marigold piecrust bowl; one green ruffled bowl; one green piecrust bowl; two white plates.

<u>PEACOCKS, NON-STIPPLED, PLAIN EXTERIOR</u> - one ice-blue ruffled bowl; one white piecrust bowl; one dark green plate; three ice-green plates; five white plates.

When considering the recent input furnished to us, it appears that the basketweave and plain exteriors in the Hearts & Flowers pattern are much more difficult to find than in the Peacocks pattern, especially in plates. This would seem to be reasonable. We have compiled empirical data suggesting that Northwood originally made many more items in Peacocks, as compared to Hearts & Flowers (possibly a 3 to 1 ratio for bowls, and a 9 to 1 ratio for plates).

We would like to close with a trivia question for all of you super sleuths out there. Did Northwood ever make a Hearts & Flowers piece that was trademarked

with their famous N? In her Carnival Glass in Color book, Hartung states specifically that Hearts & Flowers "has been found with the N trademark." We have never seen one. Have you?

With reference to JoEllen & Tom Rotondis' article on "Reverse Patterns" and "Trivia Question" on Hearts & Flowers trademarks, we would like to report the following:

We have seven different piecrust edge Hearts & Flowers bowls. Of these, the ice-green and white are clearly marked with the circled (N), under the collar base. The marking is slightly raised and can be felt as well as seen. The marigold, dark blue, ice-blue, dark green and purple bowls show no trace of this mark. Interestingly, our white and ice-green ruffled bowls are not marked. It is possible that in view of the low relief of the mark, the movement of the bowls over the years may have obliterated the mark, depending on the slight convexity or concavity of the base. Marked or unmarked, we are crazy about these seven bowls!



ROSALIND TALL COMPOTE IN BLUE

This extremely rare tall Millersburg Rosalind compote in blue was found by Rick and Bonnie Boldt of California. It was found in an antique shop for the price of \$50.00. They didn't know the pattern, but they bought it anyway and took it home and looked up the pattern, but couldn't find anything about blue in the Rosalind pattern. They then called a Millersburg collector friend, and this to this friend, it sounded like the real thing. They later took it to the Southern California Carnival Glass quarterly meeting. All the members in attendance were very excited about this great find. To the best of my knowledge, this is the only one that has ever been found in blue.



In the above photo, we show the tall Rosalind compote in green alongside the shorter example in amethyst. These tall compotes are almost 9" tall and have a nine sided foot. Each of the sides represents a panel that extends from the very outside of the base up the stem and bowl to the very top of the compote. In contrast to this one, the base on the smaller example is round and smooth. This size is 6" tall. The tall compote in green has the radium iridescence.

We purchased the tall green Rosalind compote from Mr. Hagen of Kentucky while at the 1988 I.C.G.A. convention at LaCrosse, Wisconsin. The price was \$1,750.00 We later sold it to Bob Allaire in April of 1991 for \$2,200.00 This super radiant green compote sold for \$4,500.00 at the Allaire auction held at the H.O.A.C.G.A. convention on April 27, 1996. The photo of the rare blue Rosalind compote is courtesy of Rick & Bonnie Boldt. We wish to congratulate them on their great find.

KEEPING AN HISTORICAL RECORD

Since we began collecting Carnival Glass, we have noticed that many serious collectors keep a mental or written history on many of their better pieces of glass. They can tell you where and when they acquired a particular item and often recite several previous owners. Sometimes they know the amount of money that the piece commanded down through its history.

To follow up on cleaning glass (page 14 of the September HOACGA bulletin), to clean my glass, I use Fantastic, a toothbrush for cleaning all crevices in the patterns and a moistened sponge to finish the raised parts. To clean hard to reach areas, as in vases or bottles, I again use Fantastic and add small steel punched blanks, which I ordinarily use in a tumbler to clean toy train parts and shake. Fine stone pebbles or shotgun pellets do fine as a substitute. Keep Polishing!
