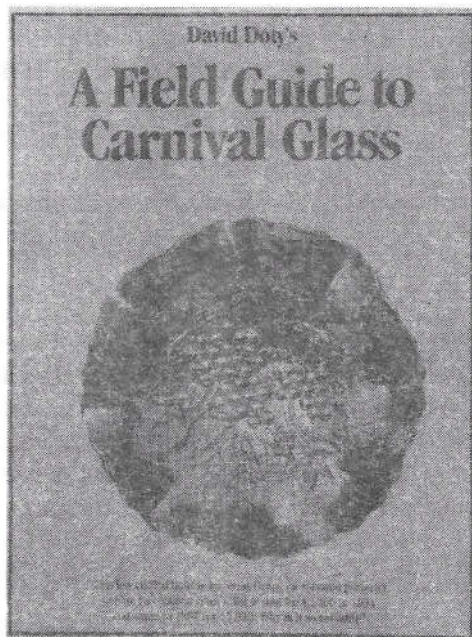

DAVE DOTY ANNOUNCES
CARNIVAL GLASS FIELD GUIDE



HOACGA member Dave Doty has just published a book on Carnival Glass. *A Field Guide to Carnival Glass* is intended as a working tool for the dedicated collector. It is a handy 6" x 9" and has 384 pages. There are 1700 photos, 200 in full color. Each photo is accompanied by a caption and price range for the shapes and colors found in that pattern. The book is available only in paperback.

To make it easier to find patterns, the book is divided into sections covering general shapes (bowls, plates, water sets, punch sets, etc.), lettered pieces, vases, novelties/miniatures, decorated glass, lamps and shades, hatpins, and contemporary glass. There is a special color section that explains shapes, iridescence, colors and other topics of interest to newer collectors.

Prices are stated as ranges — reflecting the realities of the market, not a guess at a single price. Price ranges are based on an extensive analysis of more than 37,000 carnival glass items that have sold at auction during the last several years.

The cost of the book is \$25 postage paid in the U.S. Books may be ordered from PageWorks, Box 2385, Mt. Pleasant, SC 29465-2385.

PINECONE / WREATH OF ROSES MARRIAGE

We recently bought at auction a very pretty green 6½" Fenton Pinecone plate among other things. And, of course, we antiqued our way home, never passing a shop or mall without checking it out. After arriving home and going through the ritual of washing the pieces we bought that day, we found that this small plate was different from other Pinecone items in our mish-mash collection of carnival glass.

This little plate was obviously a saucer. It had a very deep center to accommodate a cup. The other variance observed was that there was a 30 point star or flower impressed in the marie area. A different mould? No, just a different bottom or base plate was used. Checking past auction price lists, we find that 1992 was the last year that these were listed as saucers, by 1993 they became plates. A fair transition we would say. It's certainly easier to just list them all as small plates rather than separate them into two categories. But when you find a group of these to examine you will notice that some 6" to 6½" Pinecone items are



flat and lack the star under the center and others are deeper and have the star. Clearly some are plates and some are saucers.

A quick search in our computer files turned up the story about this Wreath of Roses punch cup and Pinecone saucer marriage by HOACGA member Barbara Chamberlain in the September 1988 Pump. (Pump - ICGA Newsletter) Her nice article referred to the ad in Butler Brothers mid-Spring 1911 catalog showing the cup and saucer combination. We picture that Fenton ad here for you non-believers.

Now that we had the saucer what was needed was a green punch cup to complete this set. So a call was made to HOACGA members Jim and Nan Warren, collectors and glass dealers in Tonawanda, NY. They are always a good reliable source of glass and a green punch cup was soon in the mail. This cup and saucer combo is all old news to most of us but we hope that the many new collectors will find some interest in this story.

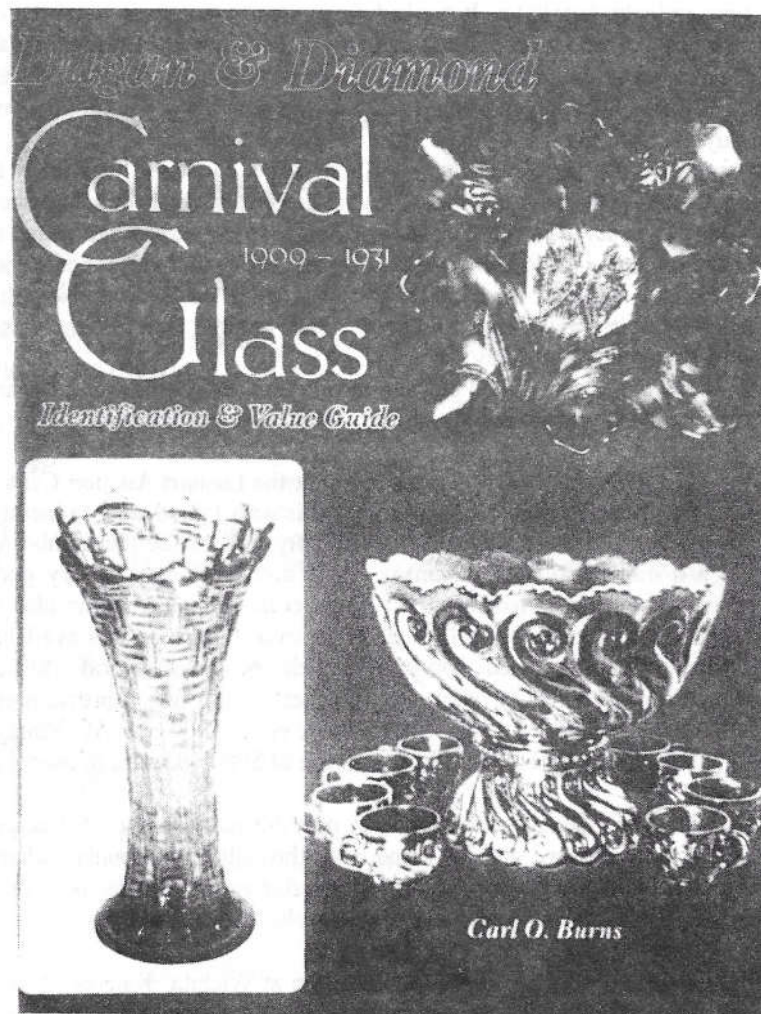

ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK

October 3, 1998: Reichel Auction, Boonville, Missouri. This was an auction I was lucky to be attending, glad I did and wished I hadn't. All rooms at the three motels were taken weeks before the sale date, but a friend called to tell me to try one more time and who to talk to. It worked, I got the room.

Beautiful weather and nice drive until I stopped for lunch. I now have an Illinois city and a restaurant on my "no-go" list. At this point, I didn't care if I went to the auction or not. Saturday morning I felt bad, but did stop at the auction long enough to buy the Split Diamond sugar bowl. I needed the lid.

I didn't even look at the blue Grape & Cable Sweet Meat and was ready to leave when a Colorado friend said I should take it home to go with the white one I have. I couldn't have stayed the extra 3 hours until it sold, but he volunteered to look it over and buy it for me. He bought it - at a fair price - and sent it home with a lady from Texas. I will pick it up later at the Air Capital convention. Now this is what Carnival Glass friendship is all about. Once again it isn't just the glass, but the people that make our hobby what it is.

Oh yes — there was some good glass in the auction and it sold well. I heard about 25% of the glass went to mail bidders.

October 12, 1998: A carnival glass auction at the Lenhart Auction Center, Georgetown, Illinois. A small town in eastern Illinois with a good auction facility. A collection of some 35 years was sold. I was surprised to see the number of people from a distance like Ohio, Kansas, Iowa and Minnesota. Very good auctioneers and a well-conducted sale. A 35 year collection gave me an idea of what to expect. Years ago people collected almost everything that was available and I saw about what I expected from the very cheapest like several whiskey bottles and many piggy banks (a whole litter in fact) with a few depression era pieces to an AO Peacocks bowl with a questionable edge (\$900), an AO Vintage bowl (\$900), and a cobalt blue Imperial Ripple vase at \$600 and a lot of pieces in between.

I enjoyed the sale - beautiful weather and only 90 miles away. A Hoosier collector friend went with me and we came back through Park County Indiana where their famous Covered Bridge Festival was in full swing. We decided not to buck the crowd and didn't even see one of their 25 plus covered bridges.

October 15-18, 1998: Air Capital Convention at Wichita, Kansas. It was still the same super gathering we have come to expect. The format was the same, but again this year more local members were involved, which made it just a little better. They ratcheted up another notch what was in my opinion already the granddaddy of all hospitality rooms.

I got on the plane in late morning on a luncheon flight - no way - just the half ounce pack of dry pretzels and a little sprite to drink. By the time I got to Wichita I was ready for the Early Bird dinner which Air Capital long ago pioneered. A social gathering to start the convention and set the tone.

John Muehlbauer's Friday presentation "Fowl" was eye-catching. We saw bowls and plates in the same pattern and they had matching spectacular color. This plus much more of the birds from his collection.

Too many people left before the banquet and they missed Gale Eichhorst's display and talk on "A Few of My Favorite Things." After Gale's winning displays of epergnes at HOACGA and Mikado compotes at ICGA, I wasn't prepared for this layout and talk. Gale has only been a collector for about four years, but what a collector he has become! Next year I hope more people stay to the end. This convention doesn't end with the auction.

October 22-24, 1998: Mid-Atlantic Carnival Glass Jamboree at Hagerstown, Maryland. For once the date didn't interfere with the Air Capital convention, so my daughter Cindy and I decided five hundred twenty miles wasn't too far especially when the Fenton Glass Factory was a short detour. Cindy found several items at Fenton's that she liked so that stop was well worth it. Also the fall foliage was in full color in West Virginia.

The Jamboree is a fall version of the spring Keystone convention. It is always nice to see the pieces that people have found in their travels. I saw a very different Heisey rose bowl with a Greek Key border, and a maker unknown sugar bowl in one room. Another person had a marigold Apple Tree vase (pitcher with the handle) that he had recently found in Indiana. I found two pieces to buy in rooms and I bid on two more and got one in the auction.

John Resnik had his 6 inch Advertising plates there and made a very interesting presentation on the who-what-where on each one. This is the most complete set of such plates in one collection and the best in color and iridescence he could find.

The Burns auction was a bit above what I expected. When the glass was good and desirable it sold very well, and the rest wasn't far behind. The Peacock at the Um ice cream bowls were numerous and good. Examples were the large green one at \$2,750 and the super aqua opal individual one at \$2,500. The sapphire blue Leaf and Beads rose bowl (\$1,600), the Acorn Burrs 8 piece punch bowl (\$2,400), the 18½ inch Tree Trunk funeral vase (\$2,500), green Poppy Show plate with smoothing on collar base (\$3,500), sapphire 8 ruffled Good Luck bowl (\$1,700), and the blue Butterflies ornament at \$2,200 are more examples.

The windup as usual was the Saturday night banquet. Very good except for the crowd. The social aspect of this type of gathering where the visiting and friendships that offer so much was ignored in favor of the auction. Again in my opinion far too many people left after the auction.

CORRESPONDENCE

We just got back from a Mickey Reichel auction in Boonville, MO. We were not lucky enough to purchase the two bowls we really wanted - Just a little to big for our pocket book. It was still nice to see the beautiful carnival. It was nice to meet Chuck Kremer at the auction and to visit with Arnold Snell. We also got to visit with Mickey Reichel the auctioneer. He is very nice and treats his customers with a lot of respect. I enjoy his auctions.

We have been collecting just over a year now. We have been fortunate enough to attend two conventions and eleven auctions. As new collectors, we have been quite spoiled - seeing so much in such a short period of time. My husband Dan attends with me whenever he can get time off work. I go as much as I can.

As we returned home from the auction, we stopped in Cedar Rapids, IA at the antique show. We got a chance to say "Hi" to Steve Morrow who always sets up a nice display. We stopped at a man's booth who had a lot of colored glass made by Northwood. He specialized in table sets. It was neat to see other things that the big glass makers made. I still prefer the carnival to the colored glass. Anyway, we got to talking. He said he also collected carnival. At one time he had about "3,000" pieces but has sold off a lot, keeping only his favorites. He has only 500 pieces now. He has kept the Northwood Grape & Cable pattern. He has the punch sets as well. He favors his purple one. He had an ice green at one time but didn't really care for it and sold it. He is amazed at how carnival prices have gone so very high. He remembers buying the Christmas compote for \$49.00 back when he was collecting. He can't imagine how hard it would be for a new collector to start at this stage.

I wish I would have gotten his name. He said he used to be very involved in the International Carnival Glass Club. He doesn't attend the conventions or belong to clubs anymore. I am not sure why. I guess his interests have changed. He was a very pleasant man to talk to. I am sure some of the older collectors know him.

With a lot of Carnival Glass auctions in such a short amount of time, it makes you wonder what is in store for 1999. I have overheard other people's opinions on what they think is to come. One man said he thinks the really good glass will be bought up and put in collections to stay for quite some time. The quality offered may not be as good in the years to come, at least until those collections come up for sale. One man said so many auctions are due to illness or a death, then the collections are sold or downsized. This is one reason there are so many auctions right now. Others say it will hurt carnival prices by having so many auctions close together. People can't pay the high prices week after week. I believe this is somewhat true on the low end pieces. The low end pieces seem to stay low or even a little lower than normal. Although the high end pieces stay high. But the very high end that only a handful buy, I am talking the thousands of dollars pieces, I believe are coming down in price because people can't afford them. The handful that are able to spend that much on carnival are not always interested in those pieces. So the really high end glass could hurt the power buyers in the end. That is just the way I, a new collector, view what I have seen and heard. I think the very high end pieces are quite a big risk right now.

I am really quite amazed when I hear people tell their stories of how many pieces they have in their collection. Like that man I talked to at the antique show - 3,000 pieces and only paying \$49 for a Christmas compote. That is hard to imagine. I am sure there are probably others that have that much. It would be neat to hear stories of the big collections, along with some of the prices paid for carnival years ago.

One other thing I want to mention before I close. I am interested in purchasing the Dugan Dahlia pattern. I still don't have that in my collection and would love to add it. I am really interested in the pitcher or possibly pieces found in a table set. I saw a table set and a berry set this weekend but it was to high for me. Until next time,

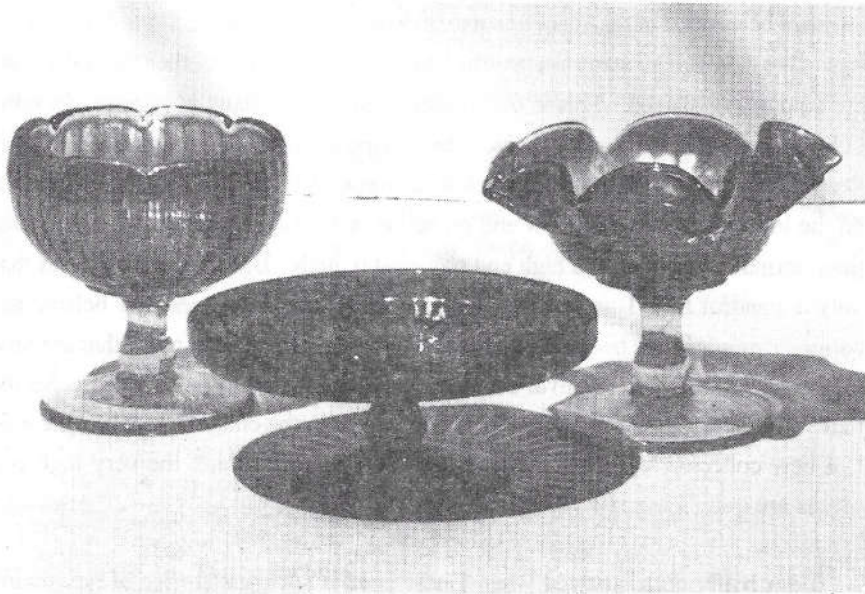

FENTON'S SMALL RIB COMPOTES

Here we go again. We have talked about these Fenton pieces before and we will again venture into what appears to be a never ending question of who made it and when was it made? We first touched on this bulbous stemmed compotes in a September 1994 story "Fenton Rib Compotes", and again in January 1995, "Rib Compotes Revisited". Both stories in past HOACGA bulletins. Why, we asked, was it attributed to Fenton Glass Company in the rose bowl section and to Dugan Glass Company in the compote section of the HOACGA Notebook?

This wandering compote has also been attributed in the 6th edition of Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass as "Small Rib (Northwood)". This was probably determined by the base glass color being green, with a marigold iridescence, a finish that the Northwood company called Alaskan on patterns such as their Paneled Holly and Smooth Rays bon bons and some Flute items. Certainly, guessing at the maker just by the glass color alone can be risky at best.

The above photo shows the three shapes we are familiar with. The illustration above is from a 1909 Mid-Spring Butler Brothers wholesale catalog showing an assortment of Fenton glass. The glass was packed in barrels by Fenton and sold by Butler Brothers the same way. That is, you bought a barrel assortment. In this barrel, you received 7 1/2 dozen items at 80 cents per dozen. The advertisement shows an artist drawing of the Small Rib compotes in two shapes. Also shown are Stippled Rays bowls and a plate, a Coin Dot rose bowl, a Fine Cut Flowers compote, Honeycomb and Clover items, and a miniature Blackberry compote all made by Fenton.

Hopefully this article will put to rest the question of who made these pretty compotes. The cake or doughnut plate shape shown is a very dark green with outstanding iridescence. We have seen these in marigold on clear glass also. These are all quite common items and relatively inexpensive. But if you are a true glass collector you enjoy the glass for its beauty and not just for its dollar value. We do.

BUYING & SELLING - RETURN PRIVILEGE ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

By Bob Grissom

One of the many benefits of being a member of HOACGA is the opportunity to buy, and/or sell, and to advertise in the monthly bulletin for pieces that you want. In order for this opportunity to be satisfactory to both the buyer and seller, it has to be one of mutual respect and honesty. To date, the officers of HOACGA have tried to set out some simple guidelines, so the buyer and seller can reach a mutual agreement as to the terms of the sale and purchase. Item #6 of the "HOACGA BULLETIN ADVERTISEMENT POLICY" states "A 5 DAY RETURN PRIVILEGE, AT BUYER'S EXPENSE, PROVIDING IT IS NOT AS ADVERTISED, OR AS DISCUSSED."

In the last few months, several complaints have been received regarding the purchase and returning of unsatisfactory and unacceptable pieces of glass. This subject was discussed at the Annual Meeting on April 23, 1998. Members in attendance generally agreed that those members who do not abide by the return-privilege policy should not be allowed to advertise in the bulletin.

Effective immediately, the HOACGA Board of Directors, in an attempt to deal with complaints, has adopted the following rules.

- If a member receives a piece of carnival, and he exercises his right to return the piece within the allowed time, the sender/seller is obligated to make a complete refund within five days after receipt of the returned piece of glass.
- If the refund is not made, the buyer can write a letter to the Board of Directors (Secretary) stating his complaint.
- This complaint will be reviewed and a letter will then be sent to the seller about the complaint.
- The seller will then be given ten days to notify the HOACGA Secretary of what action was taken to correct the complaint.
- If the complaint is not corrected within the required time, no further advertisements will be accepted from that member. Advertisements will not be allowed again until the problem has been resolved.

It is regretful that this type of action is required. It causes more work for those involved with the administration of the organization. We do not need to tolerate any unfair dealing among collectors/members. Carnival Glass collecting can only survive if members deal fairly with each other. **THERE IS NO PLACE FOR THOSE WHO WISH TO DEAL UNFAIRLY.**

H.O.A.C.G.A. BULLETIN ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

1. All advertisements of glass for SALE or WANTS must be received by the Bulletin Secretary no later than the 28TH DAY OF THE MONTH to insure being published in the next bulletin.
2. Members may advertise ten (10) "For Sale" and/or "Wants" per month. The "For Sale" Glass must be members glass and not the property of a nonmember. Advertising is at no cost.
3. Only "OLD CARNIVAL GLASS" items or H.O.A.C.G.A. Souvenirs will be published.
4. Damage or flaws should be noted.
5. All "For Sale" items must be priced; NO BID ITEMS WILL BE PUBLISHED.
6. A 5 day return privilege, at buyer's expense, providing it is not as advertised, or as discussed.
7. Postage and Insurance is to be the responsibility of the buyer, both when returning and receiving the glass.
8. The sender of the glass (be it the seller or the buyer returning it) is responsible for the proper packaging of the glass.
9. When submitting FOR SALE and WANTED ads, please write legibly so that your ad can be read; spell out words as opposed to using abbreviations. Your ad will be formatted to fit as best as possible. Items will be limited to one line, unless you are advertising less than ten items.
****IMPORTANT**** - be sure to include your name, address & phone number on the ad itself.
10. H.O.A.C.G.A. does not accept responsibility for accuracy of any advertisement.


