WESTMORELAND'S LEAF SWIRL


This Westmoreland Leaf Swirl shape, when pulled up from the usual lower compote configuration, looks more like a footed vase to us. We know some folks refer to these as goblet shape, but we think that anyone would have trouble trying to drink from either of the two items pictured. If there is a goblet shape, we have not yet seen one. The colors pictured are amethyst and yellow (yellow/amber). Some authors list these in deep purple, lavender, marigold and teal. We have had a teal compote, but really can't say that we have seen the other colors listed. Yellow carnival glass is somewhat out of the ordinary and makes an attractive addition to any collection.

The glass is of a sparkling quality and stands on its own merits. However, the iridescence is typical Westmoreland. Only a smidgen on the interior surfaces and we would have to describe it as a silvery sheen on the yellow glass. The amethyst vase has more of a magenta interior, blending to a silver sheen at the top. The pattern, all on the exterior, is very well executed and befittingly named. Starting with two groups of leaves on the bottom with long stems swirling towards to top rim where they terminate in additional leaves.

So whether you want to call these a tall compote shape or a footed vase, they are not only colorful but also graceful and do look great on our windowsill.

November 5-7, 1998: Great Lakes Club "Glass Bash" at Troy, Michigan. This convention started off with a submarine social Thursday evening followed by a Carnival Glass Trivia game in the well-stocked hospitality room. Throw in a trick question and a questionable answer or two and you have a lively game.

Harold Cox had 40 super chop plates from his collection to show us and talk about in a Friday seminar. Chop plates do not get a lot of publicity as a group, but after seeing these one has to wonder why not. Also on Friday there was the "Carnival Stories" session where four collectors told of and showed us some of their favorite or interesting pieces.

This is one of the mid-sized conventions and there was a good crowd at the Burns Auction Friday and Saturday. Not too many high end pieces in the auction, but a great number in the midrange area and they sold very well. A few examples were the six ruffled Farmyard bowl at \$6,000, marigold Poppy Show plate (\$2,050), pastel amethyst Good Luck bowl (\$800), purple Wishbone chop plate (\$2,750), amethyst Thistle plate (\$2,600), amethyst ice cream shaped Courthouse bowl (\$1,000), good dark marigold Rose Show plate (\$1,300), purple Many Fruits 7 piece punch bowl set (\$2,000), and a marigold Grape & Cable Perfume bottle at \$450.

This year Tom brought some of the best glass I can remember seeing at the Glass Bash. The sale was quick and smooth. Some glass isn't suited for a convention, and if he could have left 50 or so pieces out of this would have been somewhat better. In all fairness to Tom, part of the auction was an estate and the glass had to be sold, which accounted for these few pieces.

This was my last conventions for the year and was a very enjoyable way to end 1998.



THE WAY WE DO BUSINESS A COMMENTARY ON CARNIVAL GLASS

By Gerald Thomas

As 1998 comes to a close, I thought it would be useful to share several observations concerning the carnival glass market. Over the past few years, numerous articles and discussions have ensued within the HOACGA bulletin and elsewhere discussing the pluses and minuses of price guides, authors and occasional problems associated with buying and selling glass. While most of these discussions have left the pages of the HOACGA bulletin, they certainly have not left the pages of the Internet or the editorial pages of major antique newspapers.

Earlier this year, there were numerous discussions and debates about the reliability of antique and collectible price guides. By late spring these discussions evolved into criticism of auctioneers and the auction process. After attending a major carnival auction in October and talking to an Antique Mall operator specializing in carnival, I realized that something needed to be said about "The Way We Do Business" rather than focusing on price guides and glass auctions.

A lot of criticism has been voiced at price guides ranging from inaccurate research, authors "promoting" certain patterns and published prices not reflecting "current" market values, too high or too low. As a collector, I feel we are asking too much from the authors in this area. Glass prices do vary based on a number of factors- where the glass is sold, how well an auction is promoted and attended, and the CONDITION of the glassware. To clarify this point and to provide an example, I reviewed 1997 and 1998 prices of purple Farmyard bowls, selling from an approximate low of \$1250 to a high of \$8000. If I were an author of a price guide how could I realistically publish the price of a purple Farmyard bowl? The variances are too great. Is the bowl round or square? Crimped edge? Ruffled, - six or eight scallops, and what about iridescence quality? Price guides should be used as reference books and are most useful when market information is not available elsewhere. I did read several articles on this topic and I was surprised to see editors in antique newspaper commentaries downplay the reliability of antique price guides. I found this to be somewhat hypocritical because the newspapers had previously promoted price guides and specialized books on collecting. These individuals I feel failed to acknowledge that the antique and collectible marketplace is not perfect and certainly it is not structured. A lot of personal desires, egos and emotions are involved in buying decisions. Many purchases are made with discretionary income. If we want to arrive at correct values for glassware then we should direct our attention and focus on carnival auctions where most carnival

glass is bought and sold. In this area, I believe there must be better "marketing practices" and "rules" which we should promote. Consider the following: Scheduling Carnival Auctions: With approximately 36 carnival auctions each year, why is it necessary to have 2 or 3 auctions scheduled on the same weekend, especially when they are in close geographical proximity to one another? As a potential buyer, I cannot attend more than one auction at a time and as a seller of glass, I don't believe I would be a "happy camper" knowing that two other collections are being sold on the same day as my collection. This is a true scenario, on many occasions I have held two or three auction brochures in my hand deciding which auction to attend or not attend. Carnival auctioneers should not schedule auctions on the same weekend unless the auctions are far apart- East Coast or West Coast.

Marketing: A lot of improvement has taken place in this area from the introduction of color catalogs, e-mail bids, phone bids, videos of merchandise being sold and Internet marketing. I'm a firm believer in using the Internet as a marketing tool and at a minimum the expensive glassware should be posted maximizing exposure to potential buyers prior to the actual auction. All color photos should have a lot number placed adjacent to the picture. Credit card purchases would make a difference.

Recognized grading standards for glassware. What standards should or should not be implemented is not for me to say. I do feel "grading" glassware prior to a sale by a disinterested third party is something that is needed. Think about it for a minute. Eggs purchased at the grocery store are graded (size and quality) which sell for under \$2.00 per dozen. Carnival glass, which sells for much more money, is not! The question is why? What is the difference between scarce, rare or not often seen as it pertains to carnival? Is a heat check one-eighth inch long next to a mold mark significant? What about a scratch the size of a caraway seed? Is a piece of glass investment quality or not? Who decides? Consider the example of the Farmyard bowls discussed above.

Managing damaged glassware: I discussed several topics in this article, but to me this is the biggest hurdle we in the Carnival glass hobby need to confront and ultimately resolve. Marketing practices in dealing with damaged glassware cause problems that it seems just won't go away. People selling glassware want to obtain the best price. Most individuals selling glass or the seller's agent (the auctioneer) will want to ethically disclose yet downplay glassware damage as being insignificant. The objective being to maximize the sales prices of glassware sold at auction. As buyers, we scrutinize glassware for any imperfection, with the objective of not getting burnt, paying too much or possibly hoping to make a purchase on the best possible terms in our favor. The ultimate question is how do

we reconcile these opposing business practices. When does immaterial or minute damage truly affect value? The old carnival we collect is 80 to 95 years old. When it was manufactured, it was done with the intent of making inexpensive glassware affordable to the masses. Old carnival does frequently contain bubbles, open bubbles near the surface, cinders, impurities, peeling on the base, hand tool marks, straw marks and yes a few minor dings here and there. Many pieces of glass are in perfect condition. I'm stressing this point because I see far too many people returning glass to the auctioneer while an auction is in progress. This practice seems to take place even when two to three hours of preview are provided prior to the auction. While I understand why a buyer would return glass when damage is undisclosed or not readily apparent. I have to question the motivation of those making large dollar purchases and not inspecting the glassware carefully prior to bidding. Adding to this controversy, I'm not sure how a pin chip the size of a black pepper ball on the base of a bowl warrants a price decrease of thirty percent or more. I believe a few recommendations in selling damaged glassware are in order:

Damaged glassware should be segregated from the perfect glassware. If a 300 piece collection is being sold and fifty pieces have some form of noticeable damage, then these pieces should be sold say in lot numbers 200 through 250, not at the beginning of the auction nor at the end. This would make auctions go faster and the auctioneers would not have to comment on each piece of glass as being perfect or imperfect.

When damage is discovered after glassware piece is sold, the glass item should not be resold but turned over to a staff member of the auction service, not to the auctioneer for resale. Returning glass to the auctioneer is a disruptive practice, which is getting out of hand. The glassware item should be offered "for sale" at the end of the auction at the high bid price or returned to the consignor for disposition.

The concepts and marketing efforts I described in the preceding paragraphs take time, effort and money to implement. It all boils down to having better quality information and care in managing the carnival glass market. The carnival glass clubs fought off trademark infringements, unethical business practices and deceptive reproductions in the past. We need to take the next step to protect glass values and the carnival glass marketplace. Your hobby and glassware investment depends upon ethics and sound marketing practices. "The Way We Do Business" depends upon you. Best Holiday Wishes and Good Hunting.

BUYING & SELLING - RETURN PRIVILEDGE ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

By Bob Grissom

One of the many benefits of being a member of HOACGA is the opportunity to buy, and/or sell, and to advertise in the monthly bulletin for pieces that you want. In order for this opportunity to be satisfactory to both the buyer and seller, it has to be one of mutual respect and honesty. To date, the officers of HOACGA have tried to set out some simple guidelines, so the buyer and seller can reach a mutual agreement as to the terms of the sale and purchase. Item #6 of the "HOACGA BULLETIN ADVERTISEMENT POLICY" states "A 5 DAY RETURN PRIVILEGE, AT BUYER'S EXPENSE, PROVIDING IT IS NOT AS ADVERTISED, OR AS DISCUSSED."

In the last few months, several complaints have been received regarding the purchase and returning of unsatisfactory and unacceptable pieces of glass. This subject was discussed at the Annual Meeting on April 23, 1998. Members in attendance generally agreed that those members who do not abide by the returnprivilege policy should not be allowed to advertise in the bulletin.

Effective immediately, the HOACGA Board of Directors, in an attempt to deal with complaints, has adopted the following rules.

- If a member receives a piece of carnival, and he exercises his right to return the piece within the allowed time, the sender/seller is obligated to make a complete refund within five days after receipt of the returned piece of glass.
- If the refund is not made, the buyer can write a letter to the Board of Directors (Secretary) stating his complaint.
- This complaint will be reviewed and a letter will then be sent to the seller about the complaint.
- The seller will then be given ten days to notify the HOACGA Secretary of what action was taken to correct the complaint.
- If the complaint is not corrected within the required time, no further advertisements will be accepted from that member. Advertisements will not be allowed again until the problem has been resolved.

It is regretful that this type of action is required. It causes more work for those involved with the administration of the organization. We do not need to tolerate any unfair dealing among collectors/members. Carnival Glass collecting can only survive if members deal fairly with each other. THERE IS NO PLACE FOR THOSE WHO WISH TO DEAL UNFAIRLY.

H.O.A.C.G.A. BULLETIN ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

- 1. All advertisements of glass for SALE or WANTS must be received by the Bulletin Secretary no later than the 28TH DAY OF THE MONTH to insure being published in the next bulletin.
- Members may advertise ten (10) "For Sale" and/or "Wants" per month. The "For Sale" Glass must be members glass and not the property of a nonmember. Advertising is at no cost.
- Only "OLD CARNIVAL GLASS" items or H.O.A.C.G.A. Souvenirs will be published.
- Damage or flaws should be noted.
- All "For Sale" items must be priced: NO BID ITEMS WILL BE PUBLISHED.
- A 5 day return privilege, at buyer's expense, providing it is not as advertised. or as discussed.
- Postage and Insurance is to be the responsibility of the buyer, both when returning and receiving the glass.
- The sender of the glass (be it the seller or the buyer returning it) is responsible for the proper packaging of the glass.
