DIAMONDS ICE GREEN WINDFLOWER NAPPY

What do you do in St. Louis when a freezing rain covers the area with a thick layer of ice? Think of Carnival glass, of course, and forget about the bad weather. Although we did get out yesterday and picked a couple of antique malls clean. However, by today's standards, picking an antique mall clean means that you brought home the only good piece of glass you saw. So today, because of the bad weather, we turned on the old computer and Lorraine and I spent some enjoyable time updating auction price data into the carnival glass file.

Working our way through the alphabet just touching on glass that we have in our collection, the Windflower ice green nappies caught our attention. There are two entries for 1997. The first one is a Windflower gravy boat at \$220. Okay, nothing abnormal about that. The second entry is a nappy for \$1,356. That struck us as a very strange price. We were not at this particular sale, so did not see it sell. Are we missing something here? Has the ice green Windflower nappy/gravy boat actually gone up that much in value, or was this a headstrong case of auction fever? We think that the Windflower nappy shape and a gravy boat are one and the same item.

Referring to Carl Burns latest and most welcome book, **Dugan & Diamond Carnival Glass**, we find that although the ice green nappy is considered rare, it is still somewhat moderately priced.

We can remember just a few years ago when a well know West coast collector advertised a very reasonably priced ice green Windflower nappy in this very newsletter for several months, reducing the price each month, and we presume he eventually sold it. We watched this ad with interest as well had recently purchased one at a local monthly antique show. We hesitate to tell you that its price was only \$11. Which goes to show there is still glass out there just waiting to be found, but it does take lots of sifting through the garage sale items to find it.

Yesterday's find? Not rare, but kind of interesting. A nice purple Northwood Smooth Rays bon bon. The exterior is plain and not signed (N). This bon bon is not listed in most books. We think that this is another example of a glass company taking an existing mould, **Smooth Rays**, and stippling every other ray, adding one butterfly and bingo, a new pattern is born. The Northwood's **Butterfly** pattern. And with this cold weather it might be better to write about Butterflies next time rather than Ice Green.

GOBLET SHAPE LEAF SWIRL

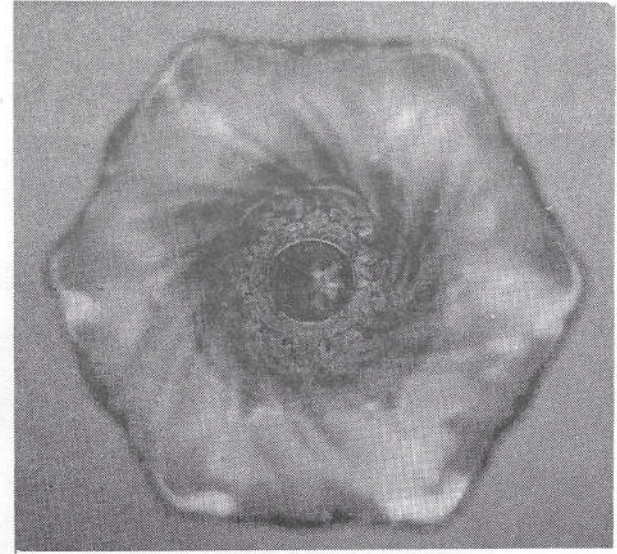


As I read the article by Alan & Lorraine Pickup on the Westmoreland's Leaf Swirl (HOACGA bulletin, December, 1998 page 6), I would like to add a few comments about the Goblet Shape Leaf Swirl. The notion came as a surprise that anyone would want to call them a vase unless they have flat bottoms as most vases do. Referring to them as a compote is a misnomer as either shape was meant to be a novelty in Carnival glass. As fancy and beautiful as they are, the idea of drinking from them is out of the question!

I have enclosed a photo for you to see the difference between the beautiful yellow with clambroth iridescence and a yellow with marigold. Truly beautiful pieces of glass for you to see and compare the differences! Too bad HOAGA can't show them in color.

The colors that I have are amethyst, or, purple if you prefer (The color purple covers a lot of ground.). I also have teal, marigold on yellow, clambroth on yellow, and clambroth on amber. I have heard of other colors being reported, however I have not seen them. I am interested in other colors from anyone and in either shape.

Speaking of colors, the word 'silver' comes to mind as to what does the very word



imply? I just love it when they say it is 'silver' because that just turns everybody off on the piece, right? Well, I have some of the most beautiful 'silver' pieces that you have ever seen although I will pass as to what they are. Now then, it's that word 'silvery' that you should be aware of because it looks like shiny gun metal and keeps the real iridescence from looking its best. I also believe that the beautiful piece with the true 'silver' touch was produced at Christmas time for the Grandmas to receive. What a beautiful gift! However you must decide if the piece is beautiful or not, some are not!

I consider the Leaf Swirl pieces as rare and a great for filling in Carnival glass displays as the quality of a great Leaf Swirl piece is unsurpassed!

I believe the Pickups said the rest best. Thank you.

SPATULA FOOTED CHRYSANTHEMUM BOWL

I'm writing this article in response to Alan and Lorraine Pickup's query in the HOACGA bulletin (January 1998, page 6) about the availability of a small Chrysanthemum bowl with spatula feet. They featured an article about a beautiful large white ice cream shaped, ball footed bowl in the Chrysanthemum pattern, and they also knew about the collar based 9" version.

Pictured above is my Fenton Chrysanthemum bowl with three spatula (or spade) feet. It measures 8" across at the widest point and stands 3 1/8" high at the tallest of the 8 fluted ruffles. The exterior is plain except for three mould marks. The color is a rich marigold.

In the 6th edition of Edwards "Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass", only the 9" collar based bowls and the larger 10" ball footed bowls are mentioned. In "Colors in Carnival Glass", book 2 by Sherman Hand, the large 10 1/2" ruffled ball footed bowl is pictured in marigold. He called the pattern Fenton's Windmill and Mums.

I am happy to be able to verify the existence of a third size of Fenton's Chrysanthemum bowls with you.

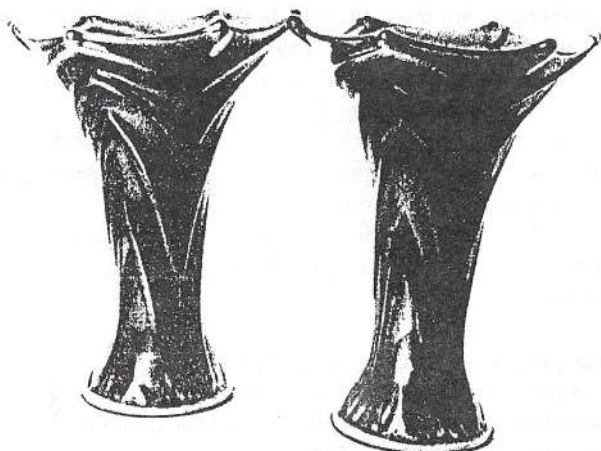

GOTHIC ARCHES VASES

Gothic Arches Vases were made by Imperial. The pattern was first listed in Bill Edwards "The Standard Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass Revised 3rd Edition" on page 90, where he states "the flared or morning glory style top adds to the interest". As of the printing of Mr. Edward's book in 1991 only vases in smoke had surfaced. Today we know that this vase also exists in marigold.

According to Carl O. Burns in his 1996 book, "Imperial Carnival Glass Identification and Value Guide", he states on page 80 that these are rare vases in either color.

In Tom Mordini's "1995 Carnival Glass Auction Price" book he lists one 10" in smoke and three in marigold with heights of 14", 17", and 18". In his "1996 Price" book he lists zero. The "1997 Price" book lists one 18" in marigold sold. During those three years five were sold, one in smoke and four in marigold. Not exactly a common vase I would say.

I also checked Don & Greg's "The Sanctified Cross-Eyed Bear's Price Trend Guide", which went back to 1989. Their guide showed 1989-zero, 1990-zero, 1991-one 10" in smoke, 1992-zero, 1993-one 11" in smoke, and in 1994-zero. In this six year time span only two came up for auction. I would agree with Mr. Burns in that these definitely are rare vases with only seven surfacing at auctions over a nine year period.

According to the auction listings that I receive, I have record of three Gothic Arches Vases that came up for auction this past year in 1998. One was 10" in smoke, one 10" in marigold, and finally a 14" one in marigold. These three vases went for between \$350 and \$460. It seems that most of these rare vases are very affordable as they generally go for between \$300 to \$500. With these three vases we are up to ten total at auctions over the past ten years.

I ran a survey on the internet carnival glass club and found only two other members having a Gothic Arches Vase in their collections. Including myself, the

three of us had four in smoke and three in marigold.

According to Joan Doty, an expert on swung vases, all come from a three part mold. The marigold vases seem to be the taller ones, with most smoke being shorter in the 10" size. Some of the taller marigold vases get clearer as you go to the base. In the smoke vases some have marigold iridescence and others have purple iridescence. All smoke are on a clear base glass. All bases are 4" to 4 1/8" with a 30 point star. Dave Doty in his new book, "A Field Guide to Carnival Glass", has a great picture on page 166 of a marigold vase and two smoke vases with different iridescence. The taller marigold vases tend to be less flared out than the shorter smoke ones. Marigold tend to flare out 5" to 6", while most smoke flare out 7 1/4" to 8". No matter the height of the vases each vase flares out at the top to six knobbed points. The vase itself consists of alternating rows of four arches. Three of the sets of four arches point upward and the remaining three sets of four arches point downward to the base. These alternate up, down, up, down etc. Depending on the height of the vase the arches become more elongated or stretched out. I believe that the vases have a very graceful look to them.

Gothic Arches Vases were reproduced by Imperial in 1969-1970 in Azure Blue or Ice Blue. In Lloyd Reichel's 1971 book, "Modern Carnival Glass Collectors Book 1", he has a picture of the Gothic Arches vase listed as a swung vase 9" to 12" on page 31. I have two of these Ice or Azure Blue vases in my collection. I know of a third person who has one in his collection. They are of the same three part mold as the old ones. They have the same 30 point star 4" base. They are in the 10 1/2" size and flare out around 5" to 6". They are made of much heavier glass than the older ones. The new vases have a domed base of around 1/4" to 1/2" while the old ones have a domed base of almost 1". All the new vases are marked with the Imperial IG mark so you cannot mistake the new for the old. Plus, the new ones were made in colors the old vases were not made in.

According to Scott Ackerman in his "Price Guide for Imperial and Hansen New Carnival Glass 1994-1995", he lists a Gothic Arches Vase was also made in 1982 in the color, Sunburst (Yellow). I have not seen a Gothic Arches Vase in this color.

I would assume there are more of the new IG marked vases around in Ice or Azure Blue or the Sunburst (Yellow) colors but, since the vase is a rather simple pattern many may not realize what they actually have. As for the older versions, because of the morning glory style to the vase some people may own them and not realize that they have a rarer Gothic Arches Vase.

If there are members that have either the old or the new IG versions of these rare Gothic Arches Vases I would be interested in knowing the color, height, base size, and width across the top. Gothic Arches, a rare, affordable vase with a flowing, gentle pattern would make a nice addition to anyone's Carnival Glass collection.

IMPERIAL'S RIPPLE VASE

The following is an updated version of my article from four years ago. It consists of more vases and additional colors that have come to light since then.

The Ripple vase was manufactured by Imperial Glass Company. Marian Klamkin stated in her Carnival Glass guide that the Ripple vase was produced by several different companies. I see no evidence that this is true. I base this on the fact that there are no variance in mold features in any of the vases that I examined.

I believe this vase to be one of the most prolific pieces of Carnival glass available. It is the only pattern that I know of which was produced in the exact same shape, but in five mold sizes. If you multiply the number of mold sizes by the number of colors and heights, you can see that this is a never-ending list of possibilities for a collection.

The Ripple vase all have typical Imperial star design on the base. There are 16, 20 and 24 point stars, depending on the size of the base. One of the most interesting features of the Ripple vase is that all vases from smallest to the largest have 17 horizontal rings or "ripples" that encircle the body of the vase. Many of the vases are stretched to the extent that the exterior rings become invisible. There is also a very fine vertical ribbing on the interior of the vase. The combination of horizontal and vertical patterns produce a very pleasant appearance. Another similarity in appearance is that all vases, regardless of size have a six-ripple top.

Of the 284 vases used in this study, marigold is the most common color. red is the most rare, with blue being just a little less available. If you will study the charts, you will find that certain colors in certain sizes are either very rare or nonexistent. I have added teal and all variations of green into the same category. The reason for this is that there are so many variations of green that it would be impossible to separate them all. There is also the problem of individual opinions of color.

I have only listed the primary colors in the chart. For some reason, there seems to be a very large number of odd colors in these vases. I have had them reported in clambroth, olive, lavender, yellow, powder blue, root beer, coke bottle green and many others. I have seen many of these colors and can assure you that these odd colors do exist. One particular vase that is not in the chart, but needs to be mentioned is a lime green vase without the marigold overlay. I only know of one to exist. It has a 3 3/8" base and is 12 1/2" tall.

Ripple vases were also produced in noniridized form. The colors that I have seen in non-carnival are crystal, amber, vaseline opal and blue opal. I am sure that others must exist.

The following charts will give you a complete break-down on the 284 vases

that were recorded in my research. There is a possibility that some vases were recorded more than once, but I made a great effort to assure that this was kept to a minimum.

The most common size Ripple vase seems to be the 2 7/8 inch base while the most rare appears to be the 3 7/8 inch and 4 3/4 inch base.

In 1969's and 1970's the Ripple molds were brought out of retirement to reproduce the vase. The IG logo was added to the center of the base, but other than that, the vases are very authentic in appearance. They were reproduced in marigold, smoke and pink.

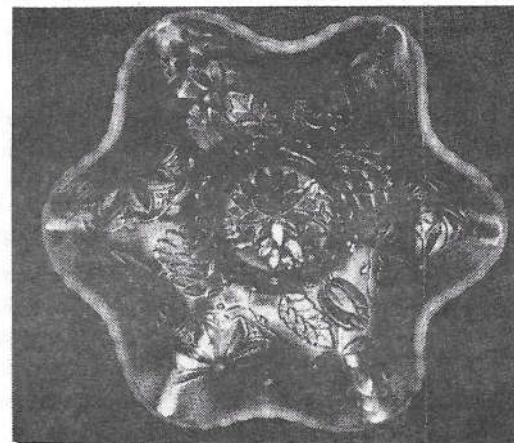

- * Educational Seminars are provided by members.
- * A Major Carnival Glass Auction is provided.
- * The Convention offers members an opportunity to meet new collectors, renew old friendships and enjoy discussing carnival glass with other knowledgeable collectors.
- * A banquet is held with a Carnival Collector as our Speaker.
- * A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

- * **Membership Dues** - \$25.00 per year - U.S. & Canada. \$40.00 per year for Foreign. The Membership Year is from the date of joining to one year later. Dues are set by the Board of Directors to support the

BUYING & SELLING - RETURN PRIVILEGE ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

By Bob Grissom

One of the many benefits of being a member of HOACGA is the opportunity to buy, and/or sell, and to advertise in the monthly bulletin for pieces that you want. In order for this opportunity to be satisfactory to both the buyer and seller, it has to be one of mutual respect and honesty. To date, the officers of HOACGA have tried to set out some simple guidelines, so the buyer and seller can reach a mutual agreement as to the terms of the sale and purchase. Item #6 of the "HOACGA BULLETIN ADVERTISEMENT POLICY" states "A 5 DAY RETURN PRIVILEGE, AT BUYER'S EXPENSE, PROVIDING IT IS NOT AS ADVERTISED, OR AS DISCUSSED."

In the last few months, several complaints have been received regarding the purchase and returning of unsatisfactory and unacceptable pieces of glass. This subject was discussed at the Annual Meeting on April 23, 1998. Members in attendance generally agreed that those members who do not abide by the return-privilege policy should not be allowed to advertise in the bulletin.

Effective immediately, the HOACGA Board of Directors, in an attempt to deal with complaints, has adopted the following rules.

- If a member receives a piece of carnival, and he exercises his right to return the piece within the allowed time, the sender/seller is obligated to make a complete refund within five days after receipt of the returned piece of glass.
- If the refund is not made, the buyer can write a letter to the Board of Directors (Secretary) stating his complaint.
- This complaint will be reviewed and a letter will then be sent to the seller about the complaint.
- The seller will then be given ten days to notify the HOACGA Secretary of what action was taken to correct the complaint.
- If the complaint is not corrected within the required time, no further advertisements will be accepted from that member. Advertisements will not be allowed again until the problem has been resolved.

It is regretful that this type of action is required. It causes more work for those involved with the administration of the organization. We do not need to tolerate any unfair dealing among collectors/members. Carnival Glass collecting can only survive if members deal fairly with each other. **THERE IS NO PLACE FOR THOSE WHO WISH TO DEAL UNFAIRLY.**

H.O.A.C.G.A. BULLETIN ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

1. All advertisements of glass for SALE or WANTS must be received by the Bulletin Secretary no later than the 28TH DAY OF THE MONTH to insure being published in the next bulletin.
2. Members may advertise ten (10) "For Sale" and/or "Wants" per month. The "For Sale" Glass must be members glass and not the property of a nonmember. Advertising is at no cost.
3. Only "OLD CARNIVAL GLASS" items or H.O.A.C.G.A. Souvenirs will be published.
4. Damage or flaws should be noted.
5. All "For Sale" items must be priced; NO BID ITEMS WILL BE PUBLISHED.
6. A 5 day return privilege, at buyer's expense, providing it is not as advertised, or as discussed.
7. Postage and Insurance is to be the responsibility of the buyer, both when returning and receiving the glass.
8. The sender of the glass (be it the seller or the buyer returning it) is responsible for the proper packaging of the glass.
9. When submitting FOR SALE and WANTED ads, please write legibly so that your ad can be read; spell out words as opposed to using abbreviations. Your ad will be formatted to fit as best as possible. Items will be limited to one line, unless you are advertising less than ten items.
****IMPORTANT**** - be sure to include your name, address & phone number on the ad itself.
