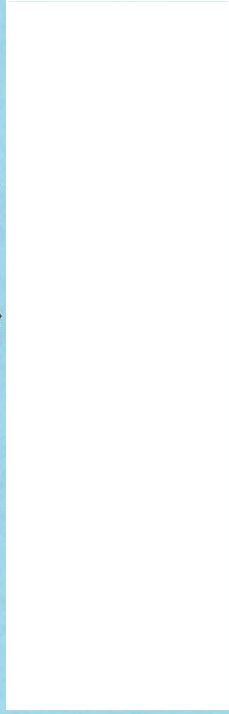

NORTHWOOD'S TOWN PUMP

In an article in the April 1992 Texas Carnival Glass Newsletter, Tom Mordini stated, "Every collection deserves an example of this Carnival Glass." We couldn't agree more. The pump novelty first appeared in the Crockery and Glass Journal's Northwood ads around 1894. Shown in a much slimmer style with a bucket hanging from its spout. This example had a tree bark and hobs pattern. Shown on page 94, Harry Northwood - The Early Years 1881-1900, by Heacock, Measell and Wiggins.

Later around the turn of the century, Northwood again made the pump. This time combined with a matching trough in opalescent glass. This version was somewhat heavier and carried a similar pattern (tree trunk and hobs), but now stood on four naturalistic branch-like feet. The top is pulled up into a castellated shape. Reproductions exist and have non castellated tops. Some iridized and signed by Crider.

And finally, we have the carnival glass version. Now it carries a stippled background with an Ivy leaves pattern upon a collar base. The handle still has hobs



similar to the earlier pumps with the addition of a tree bark effect. Made in three colors; green, marigold and amethyst. The amethyst Town Pump is the most obtainable today and sells in the \$700 to \$900 range. Marigold are seen less often and green pumps can be considered somewhat rare.

Now please consider this. According to the book Harry Northwood The Wheeling Years 1901-1925, also written by Heacock, Measell and Wiggins, (p. 154) a meeting was held in 1912 between the union leaders and the National Glass management to set the move and wages for producing Northwood's Pump vase. If we understand this right, the move, number of pumps made per turn (4½ hour work time), was set at 650 vases for which they would be paid at the rate of \$1.30 to \$2.00 per turn. We would surmise that this was only the presser's wage.

Glass workers worked as a crew. About four or five people were involved in "the dance." Assuming that four men received the top \$2.00 wage per turn, which we would guess would not be the true case. And if they made 650 Town Pumps per turn at a labor cost of \$8.00 dollars per turn (\$2.00 x 4 workers), that would mean pressing an average of 2.4 vases per minute. Where are all those pumps today? And at today's prices those 650 pumps, selling for \$700 to \$900 each, add up to \$455,000 to \$585,000 worth of amethyst pumps made in one 4½ hour turn. Now double and triple those prices for the marigold and green pumps.

If those glass workers could only envision today's prices for Town Pumps, they surely would have renegotiated their work contract. Enjoy your pump, and if you don't yet have one, you better buy one soon. They don't seem to be getting any cheaper. But then again none of us, especially those former glass workers knew what tomorrow's prices would be. Maybe they will get cheaper? Only wishful thinking?

March 20, 1999: J & J Auction, Columbus, Ohio. There were three carnival glass auctions within driving distance this Saturday. No buyers fee and no sales tax made the J & J auction an easy choice and the brochure looked inviting. This sale was well advertised and they had many mail bids to show for it.

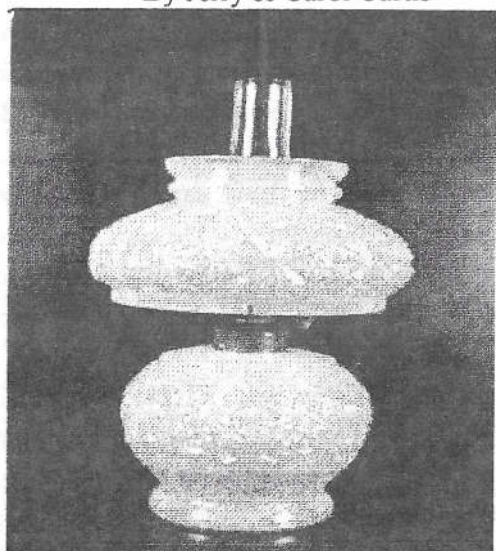
I walked into the auction room two hours early and saw a good crowd and many friendly faces. People were from Florida, Missouri, New Jersey, Wisconsin, and points in between. Best of all they came to buy the glass. Did they get what they wanted? Not always. The competition was keen on many pieces and in a few cases some unexpected damage hurt.

Some good Imperial glass sold very well. Mail bidders got the blue Imperial Grape 7" deep round bowl (\$2,000) and the purple Chrysanthemum chop plate at \$3,100. Several people were interested in the blue Imperial mid-sized Morning Glory funeral vase which sold for \$15,500. Probably the most talked about piece was the green Corn Vase that someone in the audience paid \$1,750 for. There were several complete table sets and a few extra pieces that sold at normal prices except for the one that I wanted. I didn't need the whole set and when it went beyond "normal", I decided to go home empty handed.

The auction was well conducted and the central location drew a good crowd. Good weather prompted me to go early and stop at many antique shops, several mid-sized malls and three super sized malls. Some carnival, but I left it there.

DAISY & BUTTON WITH THUMBPRINT

Here is another of those interesting geometric patterns that several different glass companies have used in different variations and applications. This little miniature "Hurricane Lamp" is shown on page #334 in Dave Doty's excellent new book, "A Field Guide to Carnival Glass." The treatment of this piece is unusual in that it is milk glass with a soft, "fired on" golden iridescence. It stands 7" from the base to the top of the hurricane shade, and 8 3/4" from the base to the chimney top. The hurricane shade is 4 1/2" wide and 3" tall. The kerosene lamp itself stands 3" tall with a base diameter of 2 3/4". The accompanying "nutmeg" burner gives no clue as to the hardware manufacturer and there are no identifying marks on the glass itself. In Molly McCain's Encyclopedia of Pattern Glass, this pattern is shown and attributed to Adams and Co., established in 1885 this later became one of the U.S. Glass affiliates. Strangely, no reference was made to this pattern in either Marion Hartung or Rose Presznick's publications. This lamp appears on page #179, (fig. 419) of a book entitled, "Miniature Lamps", by Frank R. & Ruth E. Smith but they offer no information as to the maker. Although this lamp is made of milk glass with golden iridescence, I would not be surprised if they were also made in Crystal with a "fired on" marigold iridescent treatment.

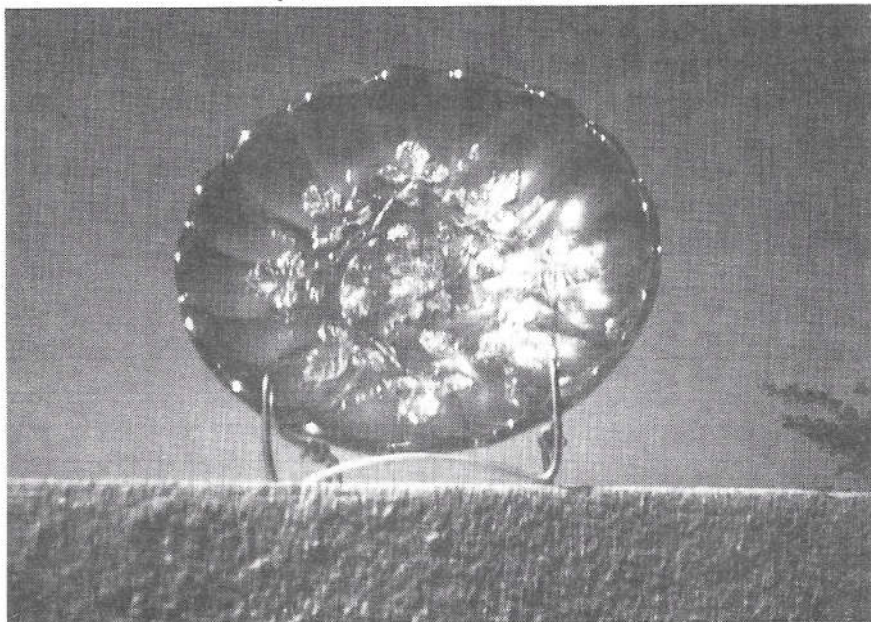

BLACKBERRY WREATH VARIANT

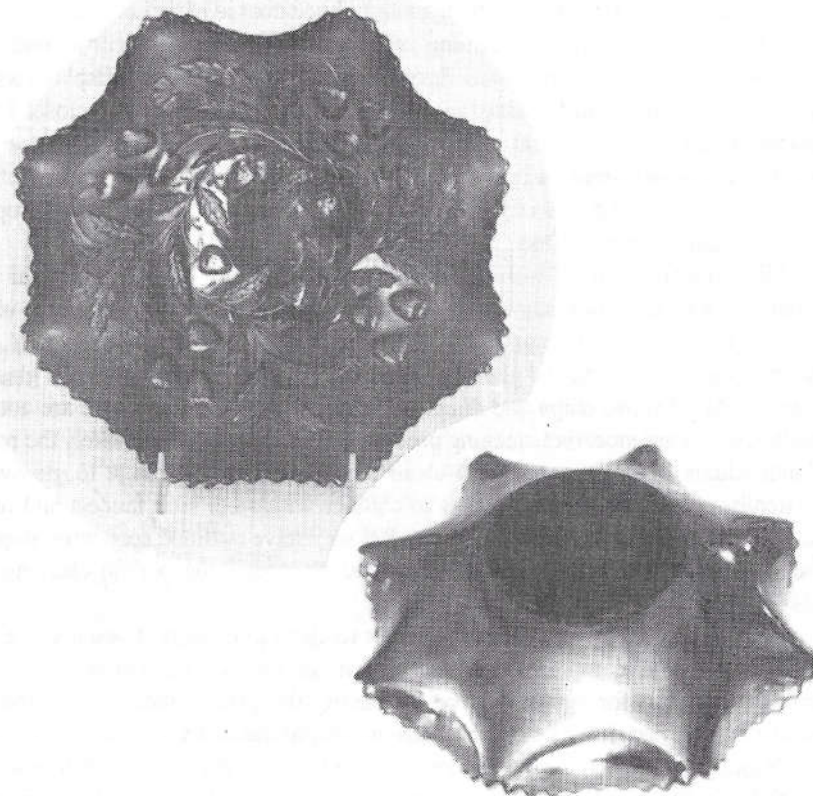

SPRING CLEANING

The "Proper" Way to Clean Carnival Glass

Several years ago I visited a small antique shop situated in picturesque Bayonne, New Jersey. Inside the shop among relics and collectibles were two mid size carnival vases. Spying the vases through the glass of a locked display case, I asked the sales attendant for assistance so I could inspect the vases up close. I was disappointed to see large flat chips about the size of a dime on each vase and therefore declined to make a purchase. This particular shopping experience left an impression on me and it served as the catalyst for my narrative - The "Proper" Way to Clean Carnival Glass.

The shopping list of well-known cleaning products both commercial and homemade for cleaning glassware is extensive. However, the proper way to clean Carnival Glass does not begin with the proper selection of cleaning products, but with the person cleaning the glassware and the environment in which the glass is cleaned. All of those chips and dings we frequently see on glassware are not the result of choosing incorrect cleaning products. The chips are most likely the result of individuals being in a hurry to clean the glassware. Damage to glassware frequently occurs when glass comes in contact with steel sink faucets and other hard objects residing in the kitchen sink. Below, I have outlined sequential steps to clean glassware properly. The most critical element - the person cleaning the glass.

A proper frame of mind - Don't attempt to clean glassware if you are in a bad mood, or if you have unpleasant thoughts, or if you are in a hurry such as trying to clean the house before guests arrive. Cleaning the glass collection and routine house cleaning just don't mix. These are incompatible tasks.

Prepare a good work environment - I like to clean my glassware when I am ALONE. In this way I don't have to worry about being distracted, bumping into other people or people bumping into glass I have placed on a kitchen counter top or table. This is a process best accomplished when children and/or grandchildren are in school, the spouse is out of the house for the day, the dog is sent to the local boarding house for a haircut and the cat is sent to the basement. Toys, small furniture, chairs, vacuum cleaners and the like should not be in the way. Give yourself a clean path to walk from where you display your glass to where you will actually clean the glass. Ensure you have adequate lighting for the task at hand.

Proper dress - Sorry, this is not the time to wear jewelry, watches, baggy pants, slippers, long sleeved shirts or shoes with elevated heels. Be comfortable, but don't wear clothing that might interfere with cleaning or snagging on a piece of furniture.

Where to clean the glass - My preference is to use a large flat table, NOT the kitchen sink. I have a one half-inch thick vinyl pad that covers the surface of my dining room table. These pads are practical. If a piece of glass falls over by accident, the chances of damage are reduced. I advocate using large Tupperware plastic dishpans place on the table, one for the initial washing and the second for a quick final rinse. Inside each dishpan I usually place an old dish towel on the bottom to protect the glass. A few additional comments here. Clean only one piece of glass at a time. To clean punch bowl tops and other large bowls that won't fit inside dishpans, I recommend the following. Simple use a damp cloth and wipe down the punch bowl top inside and out while it is removed from the punch bowl base AND the punch bowl is resting firmly on a table or other flat surface such as a bed. Always use extreme care when cleaning these objects, otherwise the collector may end up with only a giant candle stick holder and lots of material for carnival glass jewelry!

Hot and cold don't mix - Using dishwashers to clean your four piece green Acorn Burr breakfast set is a no-no. Always use lukewarm water to clean glass. If glass is stored where it is extremely hot or cold (which is not recommended) then allow the glass to become acclimated to room temperature before cleaning it.

Cleaning tools - With respect to glass, the tool list is not too long. A clean terry wash cloth, possibly a handi-wipe and in rare situations a wood toothpick to gently remove dirt or grease build up in crevices of glass and a soft bristle toothbrush to scrub away dirt or grease build up. Please - no Brillo pads or abrasive sponges. Removal of excessive dirt or grease should be a one-time task only. It happens when the collector makes an acquisition and the purchaser needs to clean a glassware pieces that has not been cleaned in years.

Cleaning Products - I will start out by saying that abrasive cleaning compounds and products containing acids or solvents should not be used, period. This group includes bathroom cleaning products containing abrasive powders, silver polish or citric acid. Cleaning products for dentures are effective in removing most mineral deposits (in the bottom of vases for example). Vinegar is also effective for removing dirt and grease in hard to reach places. For the most part, just a gentle, mild solution of liquid soap will suffice or possibly a light application of a liquid glass cleaning product. Others who have written articles on this topic recommend ammonia based glass-cleaning solutions.

Final Remarks - As collectors of antique glassware we often wrestle with decisions to buy or not to buy particular glassware items. We evaluate glass color, iridescence, glassware condition and price before making the purchase. Proper cleaning can make a big difference in the appearance of your glassware and it's value. The most important message here is not to damage your glassware while you clean it. Now you know the "proper" way to clean carnival. Good Hunting!

It's finally March, I am anxious to attend our first HOACGA Convention. Last year we had planned to attend, but we had contractors here working on our home. So we were not able to leave. I finally arrived around 7 P.M. When I got out of the car my head was just pounding. But when I walked into that room of glass, who cared. "WOW". I couldn't believe that much good stuff in one place. Spoiled, that's how I felt to be able to attend such an auction. I felt bad my husband couldn't come along. I quickly called him on the phone to describe some of the beautiful pieces of glass.

This was the first time I had seen a master Grape & Cable punch set. And to a new collector, it was hard to believe the beauty and massive piece of glass was right there in front of me. I didn't even touch it, it was just too hard to believe the size. I just took pictures and stared at it many times. (I gotta have one someday!) Another piece I fell in love with was an Aqua Stippled Grape & Cable ruffled bowl, with marigold overlay. It sold for \$1,000. Which was too much for me, but it was beautiful.

Being a new collector, at that time I'd only been collecting almost 1 year, walking into a room displayed with that much of the "Good Stuff" was overwhelming. And the excitement and fun during the auction was just great. I've been to a total of 14 auctions in the almost 2 years we've been collecting and the HOACGA 1998 Auction is by far the most exciting one I have been to.

Now that I have learned about Mickey's auctions in Missouri, I go as much as I can. It's only a 5 hour drive away. The farthest we have traveled was to Ohio, to a Stremming auction (about a 10 hour drive). It was also a wonderful event. A lot of beautiful glass and we got to purchase some very special pieces. We also took the extra time to drive to the Fenton Factory in West Virginia which was well worth the trip - an extra 2 hours.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

- * **Membership Dues** - \$25.00 per year - U.S. & Canada. \$40.00 per year for Foreign. The Membership Year is from the date of joining to one year later. Dues are set by the Board of Directors to support the

publication of the monthly bulletin, typing, printing and mailing.

BUYING & SELLING - RETURN PRIVILEGE ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

By Bob Grissom

One of the many benefits of being a member of HOACGA is the opportunity to buy, and/or sell, and to advertise in the monthly bulletin for pieces that you want. In order for this opportunity to be satisfactory to both the buyer and seller, it has to be one of mutual respect and honesty. To date, the officers of HOACGA have tried to set out some simple guidelines, so the buyer and seller can reach a mutual agreement as to the terms of the sale and purchase. Item #6 of the "HOACGA BULLETIN ADVERTISEMENT POLICY" states "A 5 DAY RETURN PRIVILEGE, AT BUYER'S EXPENSE, PROVIDING IT IS NOT AS ADVERTISED, OR AS DISCUSSED."

In the last few months, several complaints have been received regarding the purchase and returning of unsatisfactory and unacceptable pieces of glass. This subject was discussed at the Annual Meeting on April 23, 1998. Members in attendance generally agreed that those members who do not abide by the return-privilege policy should not be allowed to advertise in the bulletin.

Effective immediately, the HOACGA Board of Directors, in an attempt to deal with complaints, has adopted the following rules.

- If a member receives a piece of carnival, and he exercises his right to return the piece within the allowed time, the sender/seller is obligated to make a complete refund within five days after receipt of the returned piece of glass.
- If the refund is not made, the buyer can write a letter to the Board of Directors (Secretary) stating his complaint.
- This complaint will be reviewed and a letter will then be sent to the seller about the complaint.
- The seller will then be given ten days to notify the HOACGA Secretary of what action was taken to correct the complaint.
- If the complaint is not corrected within the required time, no further advertisements will be accepted from that member. Advertisements will not be allowed again until the problem has been resolved.

It is regretful that this type of action is required. It causes more work for those involved with the administration of the organization. We do not need to tolerate any unfair dealing among collectors/members. Carnival Glass collecting can only survive if members deal fairly with each other. **THERE IS NO PLACE FOR THOSE WHO WISH TO DEAL UNFAIRLY.**

H.O.A.C.G.A. BULLETIN ADVERTISEMENT POLICY

1. All advertisements of glass for SALE or WANTS must be received by the Bulletin Secretary no later than the 28TH DAY OF THE MONTH to insure being published in the next bulletin.
2. Members may advertise ten (10) "For Sale" and/or "Wants" per month. The "For Sale" Glass must be members glass and not the property of a nonmember. Advertising is at no cost.
3. Only "OLD CARNIVAL GLASS" items or H.O.A.C.G.A. Souvenirs will be published.
4. Damage or flaws should be noted.
5. All "For Sale" items must be priced; NO BID ITEMS WILL BE PUBLISHED.
6. A 5 day return privilege, at buyer's expense, providing it is not as advertised, or as discussed.
7. Postage and Insurance is to be the responsibility of the buyer, both when returning and receiving the glass.
8. The sender of the glass (be it the seller or the buyer returning it) is responsible for the proper packaging of the glass.
9. When submitting FOR SALE and WANTED ads, please write legibly so that your ad can be read; spell out words as opposed to using abbreviations. Your ad will be formatted to fit as best as possible. Items will be limited to one line, unless you are advertising less than ten items.
****IMPORTANT**** - be sure to include your name, address & phone number on the ad itself.
