

ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK

July 8-10, 1999: American Carnival Glass Convention time. I didn't make it, but went to another convention of sorts. Some people will remember I skipped a Burns auction a few months ago to go to Missouri to buy some Yorkshire female hogs—and what a buy that turned out to be. There will always be another carnival convention, but never a hog show and sale quite like the one at the annual Swine Type Conference last week—at least for my brother Don and me.

The \$275 investment in one gilt and a hundred dollars in semen cost to mate her to an absentee sire in Illinois produced a good litter of pigs on January 6, 1999. Don took one boar from this litter to the show. Three exciting days started Thursday when we drove the boar from his pen to the wash rack. Ultra sound scanning followed and he had an estimated whopping 11.3 square inch loin eye. Word quickly spread that there was an unusual one in the barn.

Friday was show competition day. There were 4 classes of boars and we were in class three. The judge apparently didn't like our hog as he ended up in fifth place. As we returned the boar to his pen the visitors followed. All day long we had a steady stream of lookers. Some came back 4 or 5 times. Our pig was the talk of the barn. As I sat near this hog's pen, I watched a scene almost exactly like we see at a HOACGA convention every year when that rare AO piece or one of a kind piece of glass draws a steady stream of visitors to the room.

Saturday morning was sale time. Our pig was to sell as number twelve. The grand champion sold first (\$8,750) and prices went down hill fast—almost like someone slipped a few Stippled Rays bowls into a carnival auction. So bad that the 10th one brought \$800 and the eleventh one \$750. We were next—bidding on our pig started fast and there were many bidders until it got to be tough sledding at around \$17,000. At this point we got a lecture from the sale manager. Sounds almost like a carnival auction doesn't it! Then the auctioneer went to work earning his 15% commission. The bidding stopped at \$24,000. Ours was the top selling Yorkshire boar. Don and I were two happy guys.


What does this have to do with carnival collecting? Nothing, except I get kidded about buying hogs, so I just had to tell the next chapter. And I just wanted you to know the farmers at hog shows act exactly like carnival people at a convention—a lot of looking, a lot of stories, a lot of hype and a high price now and then.

July 24, 1999: Ayres Auction at Carlinville, Illinois. The auction was at a good Holiday Inn located between two corn fields at exit 60 on I-55 south of Springfield. The Holiday Inn is the only thing at this intersection and is a low profile two story building that you would not even see if you were exceeding the speed limit on I-55. Carlinville itself is about 12 miles off the interstate. I liked the location.

This was my first Ayers auction and I was pleasantly surprised when I observed their use of live telephone bidding. It works, and did not seem to slow the auction pace. It beats mail bids when you, the bidder, would like to follow the flow of the bidding and exercise last second judgment. I wished there had been more top end pieces in this auction, which might have created more phone activity. The Eda (Sweden) Kulor 6" vase went to a phone bidder at \$3,500 and the \$3,600 sapphire 14" Thin Rib vase went to a mail bidder, but I believe the backup bidder was on the phone.

I left halfway through the sale, so I don't have a feel for how the whole sale went. Although I enjoyed the overall sale atmosphere, I heard more than a few comments that the bidding and pace were too slow. While I was there I believe the better pieces sold well and when there was damage or lower level pieces the prices seemed to drop off some.

There was a good crowd and they seemed to enjoy the Ayers hospitality. The Saturday morning donuts and coffee were appreciated. There was a fruit tray and punch available throughout the sale. The brochure was first class, the glass was well displayed and the hotel was just about perfect for our needs except for a Saturday morning plumbing problem that was promptly corrected.



RARITIES IN PLATES WANTED

I am doing a survey. This was a request by Bob Grissom. He asked if I would be interested in putting together a list of Plate Rarities? I said I would try, of course I need a lot of help. If you are interested in helping us make this list accurate we would greatly appreciate your time.

If you have Internet excess and wish to help by asking Internet users if they have any unusual or rare carnival plates that would be "GREAT". If you place a copy of the following list on the Internet, you may get an accurate count of how many of each plate is out there and how many are good or damaged. Maybe other colors that are available or different types of back variations (such as basket weave or ribbed back). There are many possibilities on completing the "New Plate Rarity List". If you do get information from the Internet please include as much detail as possible so if others give me information from the Internet we don't mistakenly think 4 people have the same item when really it is only one person that responded to all four of your requests.

I am a new collector and I have attended 21 auctions and 4 conventions, so I have seen a lot of glass in my two years but I don't have the background or knowledge to put together a list of rarities. I am hoping you will share with me and other HOACGA club members your knowledge.

Two plates I have saw that are not mentioned on the following list is one smoke and one marigold Greek Key and Roses plate. "I loved them both".

We are interested in finding the **top rarities in 9" - 10" and 11" plates.** (Not the small plates at this time.) We would like to create a list of the top 50 or so rarities in these plates. **Including maker if known, size, variation and color.** Some plates have plain back, basketweave back, ribbed back, beaded berry, wide panel etc.

By looking in the back of the HOACGA Educational Series Book III there are some rarities already listed. "Rare" meaning 5 or less known. I don't know if the information is still accurate or how complete the listing is. But it is a good place to start. If you can help update this list, please do so.

I am not sure if rare is still considered 5 or less? I do not know who decided this? Do you know? The more information we can gather the more complete and accurate our new list will be. If you have any of the following plates, please note next to it and fill in any missing details.

You can cut out the list from your HOACGA bulletin or write on a blank paper any comments you may have. As I receive results I can start updating the new Plate Rarity List. My hopes are to complete the list within 6 months. The results of the list will be printed in an upcoming bulletin with an appreciation note for each person's name that helped with this research. I hope to add your name to the list. If you would review the list that follows and add comments, I would enjoy hearing from you.

Last month in "On the Auction Trail" I might have been a little critical of the trends in conventions, but some additional things were on my mind that include:

- 1) Name badges. We had none at Keystone. A generous Western collector provided good ones for us at Lincoln-Land. What a contrast! I don't know everyone and I for one sure wish we all could wear badges with LARGE printing so they are easily read.
- 2) Provide some means to get at least a temporary badge to everyone that arrives before the formal registration desk opens. This temporary one might only be a sticker with the person's first name - let's get friendly and make first timers feel welcome.
- 3) I alluded to having the banquet the night before the auction. Auction set up and viewing might interfere, but let us get creative. Set up the glass and rope it off no handling until after the banquet. Do away with the elevated head table if it interferes with the glass set up. Make the auction a one day affair most auctioneers can handle this.
- 4) Maybe fewer programs and seminars, but make sure there is something going on each formal day. A couple of recent conventions had too much "dead" time.
- 5) Recently I heard the comment made that we were running out of speakers and ideas for good and interesting programs. If this is the case, let us try some new things. We have many people full of knowledge and stories. Let's invite them to share. Stories and experiences as presented to our groups do not always have to be accompanied by a large display of out-of-this-world glass.
- 6) It is becoming harder to find suitable hotels and the bigger ones, if they want us at all, are not discounting room rates very much. Possibly the higher cost is causing more "auction only" visitors or at least shorter stays. Also the working people must be back at work on Monday, so this necessitates the early departure for some. Could a change in format accommodate enough people to make it desirable? Could we pack more into the "looking" day to accommodate the members staying only a couple of days?

The above comments are intended only to cause thinking and discussion. They are not all inclusive. Anyone with fresh and additional comments please step forward and let your club leadership know you care and are willing to help carry out any changes. If you are not for change, why not consider some form of contribution to what we already have, or more important, contribute to the club's newsletter. The least you can do might be to encourage more collectors to join your favorite club.

RECOLLECTIONS FROM THE PAST

We enjoyed a wonderful evening visiting with [)on and Barb Chamberlain. They packed up several boxes of old carnival newsletters, antique traders, collection magazines, etc... for us to borrow. We often exchange items of carnival interest and then return the items back. This is a nice way to share information with other collectors. I didn't even want to take time out for sleep last night. There is a lot of fun material to read through.

I find **old articles very interesting** and would like to go through the materials and pick out some things to tell the new collectors, like myself and maybe remind some experienced collectors of things that happened in the past years. I hope using people's names and titles and dates of newsletters is ok. I would like to summarize some of the old articles as accurately as I ran. When you see the title Recollections from the Past you will know that Vicki is going through that old stuff again. If it interests you please read it, and if not just skip it. Sound fair?

One newsletter I read really got my attention. It was a newsletter titled Carnival Glass News & Views, editor was 0. Joe Olson. **His articles are excellent** I wish I had his flare. One newsletter was dated Dec. 1982. It told some of the following information:

Carnival Glass was donated to the Ford Museum at Dearborn, Michigan by Ken and Nellie Moon of Holland Ohio, valued at \$65,000. I wonder if it is still there?

Bob and Dorothy Gallo purchased a Marigold Perfection Water Set at an antique shop near their home for \$300. A Frolicking Bear Tumbler sold for \$2,500 at a Woody Auction to Sam Roebuck of N.C.

Before one of Woody's auctions he went to pick up glass from the Elam's residence. Some of the glass was stored in boxes, wrapped in newspaper, in a damp basement. As they unwrapped the glass they found about 70 pieces of carnival broken and some with internal cracks. They believe the damp newspaper froze and caused the glass to crack. One item broken into five pieces was a Green NuArt Mums plate which cost \$850.

At a Sam Roebuck's auction in Sept. 1982, Woody conducted a large auction, which contained RS Prussia, Carnival and other glass items. The RS Prussia plates and pitchers frequently topping the \$4,000 mark. Also Carnival rarities did very well: Marigold Kittens Cuspidor -

\$5,500, Green Feathered Serpent Cuspidor - \$4,500, Goddess and Harvest bowl, color was not listed sold for \$3,100, Farmyard with candy ribbon edge, color not listed sold for \$2,150, Aqua Opal Singing Birds Mug - \$1,100 and Peach Opal Fisherman's Mug - \$1,500.

Pitcher's sold as follows: Purple Morning Glory - \$6,000, Green Frolicking Bears Pitcher with damage - \$3,000, Marigold Perfection Pitcher - \$2,000, Marigold Harvest Flower - \$1,600 and Marigold Circle Scroll - \$1,100.

A Tom Burns auction for Mr & Mrs Comer of 450 items, some highlights were: Blue Soldier's & Sailors Plate - \$725, Marigold Hobnail Cuspidor - \$600, Diving Dolphin Compote, no color listed - \$800, Cleveland Tray, no color listed - \$1,000, Iridised Custard Rose Show Plate - \$425, Marigold Cosmos and Cane Cuspidor - \$650, Amethyst Trout and Fly bowl - \$340, Green Peter Rabbit bowl - \$450, Amethyst Cherries Compote - \$725, Green Rose Columns Vase - \$700 and Blue Wisteria Tumbler - \$325.

Another newsletter dated August 1983 starts off mentioning this will be the <u>final</u> mailing of the Carnival Glass News and Views. The newsletter has been in existence 20 years. In July all the materials written on carnival glass was sent to the Corning Museum of glass in Corning, New York. Six three ring binders containing approximately 140 file copies. In addition to the bi-weekly and monthly newsletters from time to time we sent a set of features from the Carnival Heritage series. (What was the Carnival Heritage series?) All the materials sent weighed about 130 pounds.

This newsletter also announced the death of Marion Hartung, May, 1983. Also mentioned the death of Rose Presznick who passed away five years earlier. This was before I became aware of carnival glass, but any collector recognizes both of those names. This newsletter had a lot of interesting articles also.

It mentioned the option of purchasing back issues of the newsletter. I wish I still could. If anyone has any of these Carnival Glass News and Views newsletters I would be interested in borrowing or purchasing them. If you chose to let me borrow, I will guarantee they will be returned in the same shape as you loan them to me.

EDA GLASS COMPANY

Last month Imogene and I went to Sweden for a visit with the gentleman, (Per Wahlstrom) and his family, that she had as a Foreign Exchange student about 30 years ago. They live in the central part of Sweden, but we met them on Friday afternoon, on the West coast where they were vacationing. We were planning on going to their home in the central part on Monday. On Sunday morning it was raining, so they suggested that we go to their home today since it was not a good day to be at the ocean. That morning I asked Per if he knew where the Eda glass place was, and if we might be able to go by on the way home. He made some telephone calls and found the location of Eda. He was able to talk with some one that was associated with the Eda Glassbruk museum. The museum had a glass display set up and this was the last day for the showing and they would be closing at 6:00 P.M. It was about an hours drive out of the way to their home, but he thought that we could be there by 4:00 P.M. We wound around through the country and found the town of Eda, Sweden.

We were able to see a very nice display of Eda glass. About half of the display was of Carnival glass, which they refer to it as Luster glass. Per introduced us as collectors from the USA and that we were interested in seeing the display and especially the Carnival glass. They were as excited as we were, and were eager to show and talk about their display. They had all of the carnival glass patterns, except two, that were made by Eda. The Eda Glass Co. was started in 1835 and ceased operations in 1953. We were fortunate to have someone that could be our interpreter, because we did not speak any Swedish and they did not speak much English.

Before we left for our trip, I noticed the KULOR vase that was to be sold at the Ayers auction, I believe this was to be the first one of these vases sold at auction here. At the display they had three large and one small KULOR vases. There were two marigold, one blue and one Moonstone large vases and one marigold small vase. I told them about the one to be auctioned and they were anxious to know the selling price. I understand that the vase sold for \$3,500.00.

During our visit we were told that there was antique (antik) shop about a mile away that possibly had some carnival glass but it would close at 5:00 P.M. So were hurried over there to check it out, and was able to buy a small

marigold KULOR vase, and six small YORK plates. There were some other pieces also but we did not have enough room in our luggage for any more.

We met four very fine gentlemen that were knowledgeable, enthusiastic and were very willing to share their interest. The four were: Lars-Eriu Olsson, the president of the Eda glass collectors organization; Jennart Skoglund, was in charge of the display; Michael Westby, a young man of only twenty, and very interested and knowledgeable about the glass, and Sten-erik Wadelius and his wife. Mr. Wadelius's grandfather was the person that learned and developed the process of iridizing the Eda glass. Mr. & Mrs. Wadelius do not live in Eda, but when they do come, they live in the grandfather's house there. He took us to see the house, and most of the original furniture is still in it. The glass display was supposed to close at 6:00 P.M., but we finally left at 6:30, and were very pleased that we had the opportunity to see their display and to visit with these gentlemen. It was indeed one of the highlights of our trip to Sweden.

Mr. Olsson said that they had about 120 members in the Eda Glass collectors club, and that most of them were interested in the Crystal glass more than they were with the Lustre (Carnival). Mr. Wadelius said that he would write some of the history of the Eda Glass Co. and also information about his grandfather and send the information, so that we could print it in the bulletin.


The four gentlemen, and I am sure there are others also, are in the process of restoring and remodeling a community center in the town to house the Eda glass museum. They are planning to have the project completed by the end of Year 2000. It is interesting to learn that people in other countries are also interested in researching and preserving their glass history.

I did purchase a reference book "Glas fran Eda@', but it is in Swedish. Maybe Swede Tilberg will be able to translate it.

During this trip, we also visited Scotland. We were driving through a small town and I saw something that I thought was an antique shop, so we turned around and went back, and was able to find a piece of carnival in this shop. It was a marigold TOWERS vase. So you do not know where you might find a piece of carnival.

PEACOCK TAIL

Rose M. Presznick in her 1965 book "Carnival & Iridescent Glass price guide book 1" called the pattern Flowering Almond. She states in her book on page 35, "the Flowering Almond" was one of the "Gay 90's" flowers, dainty, ruffly & beautiful. At that time she believed that it was produced by Imperial.

Marion T. Hartung in her 1968 "First Book of Carnival Glass One Hundred Patterns" gave us the name "Peacock Tail" which we now use

today. At that time she also thought it to be made by Imperial.

Today we know that it was made by Fenton. The Peacock Tail pattern must of been a very popular pattern when first introduced in 1910 because it is found in seven different shapes: bowls of all sizes with different edges, plates in both 6" and 9", compotes, bon bons both stemmed and collar based, card trays, hats and tri-cornered (plates/sauces).

The pattern, Peacock Tail, is a simple pattern consisting of 8 to 12 tails with 10 to 21 feathers in each tail. The back pattern is Wide Panel. Bases may be plain or contain a 30 point star. I asked Mr. Frank Fenton about the different bases and he said that probably the plain base came first and then in the later production they put the star in the base to make it more attractive. Base sizes vary from 2 1/16" on some of the hats to 3 7/8" on the larger

bowls.

Bowl collectors enjoy having a wide variety of bowls to include in their collections. The bowls vary in size from small 5 3/8" berry bowls with smooth or ruffled edges to large 10" bowls. Colors that I have seen bowls in are marigold, amethyst, blue, green, vaseline, clambroth, and red. Vaseline and red being the rarest.

I would have to say probably the rarest bowl shape is SQUARE. I have an amethyst one with a 3 1/4" plain collar base, 9" in width, with a tightly crimped edge. The pattern consists of 12 tails with 20 feathers in each tail. Colors I have seen are amethyst, green and marigold. Square is a fantastic shape for this pattern. If you have a square bowl in your collection your are very lucky.

Edge collectors can find ruffled smooth, ruffled saw-toothed, PCE, 3-in-1, tightly crimped CRE, and round. I found the most interesting edge on some of the round bowls and on the bon bons. Some of these pieces contained 12 ruffles, each with 5 points. Some had been smoothed out but you could still see that they had started out as saw-toothed edges.

Plate collectors also can have the Peacock Tail pattern represented in their collections. The plates in both 9" and 6" sizes are highly sought after. This raises the prices on this shape. The 9" plates only have been found in marigold. I know of seven of them at this time. Recently one sold at an Ayers auction for \$3300. The plate that I have has a 3 1/4" plain, collar base, 1 5/8" in height, with the pattern consisting of 12 tails each with 20 feathers in each tail.

I have small plates in both blue and marigold. They are 6 3/8" to 6 1/2" on a 2 1/2" flat collared 30 point starred base. The height is 1" and the pattern has 12 tails each with 10 feathers in each tail. I have also seen the small plate in green. Many of the blue plates have a silvery iridescence and are prettier on the back than on the front. Ones with good color on the front and back have sold for \$1000 to \$1100 recently.

A shape that must of been quite popular was the tri-cornered (plate/sauce?). The colors I have seen are amethyst, green, marigold and the very rare GREEN OPAL. I know of three in Green Opal. They measure 6" to 6 1/2", have a 2 1/2" flat, collared 30 point starred base and are between 1 5/8" to 2 1/4" in height depending on how high the three corners are bent upwards. The pattern has 12 tails with 10 feathers in each tail. I think this is a neat shape for whimsey collectors.

Compote collectors also can have the Peacock Tail pattern in their collections. The compotes I have seen have 6 ruffles with smooth edges. They range in height from 4 5/8" to 4 7/8" depending on if the ruffles are flattened out or not. The width ranges from 6" to 6 1/2" across. They have a 3" round base with 8 scallops. The pattern has 10 tails with 20 feathers in each tail. Colors I have seen are amethyst, blue, green and marigold.

Bon bon collectors can have the Peacock Tail pattern represented in their collections. Bon bons are found in collar bases or stemmed. The ones I have seen have four sides up with two handles. The collar based ones have 12 tails with 18 feathers in each tail. The stemmed ones I have contain 12 tails with 17 feathers in each tail. All the bon bons I have, have 12 ruffles, each with 5 points. The bases on the stemmed bon bons are 3" and are octagon (8 sided) shaped. Colors I have seen are amethyst, green, and marigold.

Another shape was the Card Tray. I have it in green, blue and amethyst. They have two sides up and two handles. Are lower than regular bon bons. The Card Trays have 12 ruffles each with 5 points, and consist of a pattern containing 12 tails with 18 feathers in each tail. A card tray was used to collect calling cards from those people who visited you. They would leave a card with their name and address.

The final shape I have seen Peacock Tail in is the Hat shape. They can be either 4 or 6 ruffled and have smooth edges. They may have either a round or octagon (8 sided) base. All the hats I have contain 8 tails with the round based pieces containing 16 feathers in each tail and the octagon based hats containing 17 feathers in each tail. Colors I have seen in the hat shape are blue, amethyst, green, and marigold with I believe marigold being the hardest to find.

Advertising collectors will need to add Peacock Tail items to their collections also. I have seen advertising on the green hats and the green 7" bowls.

Personally I enjoy the pattern and think it is very well done. A very pretty collection can be acquired without spending a lot of money. But if a person wants to seriously collect the pattern then they will have to open up their pocketbooks for the plates, square bowl, red bowls, and the tri-cornered green opal sauce. I believe that this pattern is very underrated. So think about adding a pretty piece in the inexpensive pattern "Peacock Tail" to your collection.

- * A banquet is held with a Carnival Collector as our Speaker.
- * A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

- * Pattern Notebook A notebook containing sections on Mugs, Table Sets, Rosebowls, Water sets (including painted sets), Plates (small, regular & chop), Compotes (large, regular & small), Punch Sets and Vases. 


