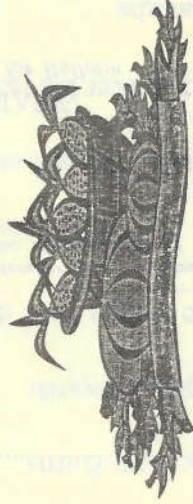

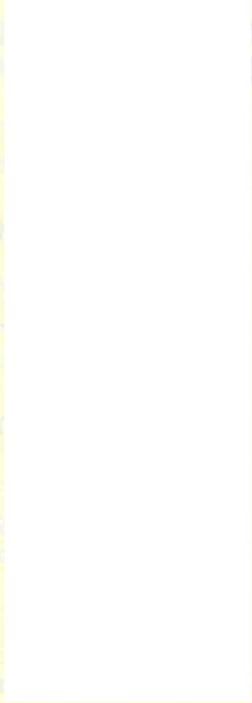

LATE OCTOBER BULLETIN

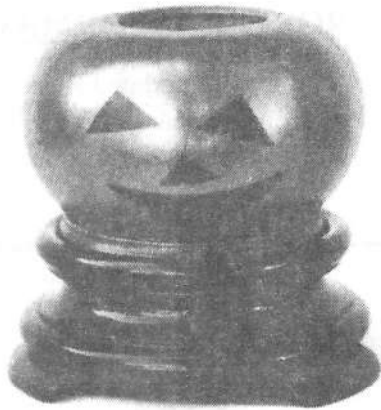

I was shooting a roll of film today and in an attempt to complete the roll, I was grabbing glass to photograph, any glass, just to get done. Why? Well, taking pictures for a couple of hours is a considerable amount of work. Especially when you don't know how to operate the camera, too many bells and whistles.

We know when you read this, you will think that Halloween was last month. You are right, but when I am writing this, Halloween is still a couple of weeks in the future.

Made around 1916, and sporting a beautiful marigold iridescence that was referred to by Imperial Glass as a "Pearl Ruby" finish, inside and out. It also has very faint interior panels, a factory ground base and is signed with the old Imperial "iron cross." It measures about 2 3/4" tall and 4 1/2" across.

The black base glass is only our idea as a nice way to display the hair receiver. We never pass up a black base at the antique malls, if it is priced right. They always come in handy. Put a happy face on your glass and enjoy the glass hobby. We do!

ON THE AUCTION TRAIL WITH CHUCK

October 1-2, 1999: Phil Gilliland and I drove to Boonville, Missouri, for the Reichel Auction. I had seen much of the glass years ago in Ohio and I wanted to see it sell. The white Grape & Cable chop plate was one of a kind and I knew part of its history. It was probably worth the \$5,750 it brought. And the amethyst Grape & Cable vase was a collector's dream - what a rarity.

The rest of the glass was completely overshadowed by the \$15,000 green Frolicking Bears tumbler. The two bidders were seated on the same side of the room and I, like most everyone, watched the action on the floor. Was Mickey excited? I don't know- I forgot to watch him.

After the half dozen or so top-end pieces, the auction was quite normal. I expected there would be some good looking pieces with damage and quite a few with average iridescence, and that is what I thought I saw. Mickey was very relaxed, and the auction was interesting and a pleasure to attend.

October 9, 1999: J & J Auction, Columbus, Ohio. The brochure looked like there was some decent glass in the auction and there was one butter dish I was interested in. So it was off to Columbus in spite of the steady rain and an out-of-the-way route I took to avoid the hours-long delay on I-70 near Richmond, Indiana.

The J & J team did their usual good job in conducting the sale. This time they did something I had not seen for a long time. There was a table of souvenirs and contemporary pieces that they brought to the front of the room and sold bidder's choice intermittently with the early cataloged pieces. I thought this was a good idea - it got these pieces sold while the crowd was all there and at better than average prices and there was time saved while the selection was going on.

Jim Wroda and his helper Jim McClure are very professional auctioneers that run a smooth, quick and relaxed sale. This time they had their work cut out for them as they had a less than top of the line group of glass to sell. While the Millersburg pieces probably sold reasonably well, the number of damaged pieces sure seemed to hurt the rest of the auction. I didn't bid on the butter dish, as it didn't measure up to what I wanted.

Chatelaine water sets are rarely sold, so I was interested when I saw the super color and iridescence on the pitcher and tumblers. The pitcher with quite a bit of base damage brought \$1,000 and the almost perfect tumblers brought \$160 and \$170 - they all had the "look". I enjoyed this J & J auction as usual and look forward to their next one.

October 14-17, 1999: It was Family Reunion time in Wichita, Kansas. In mid-October each year the "Wichita Locals" treat the rest of the family to a super carnival get-together. The head of the family, Don Kime, and a dedicated group of area people plan early and work hard to make us welcome and we leave with a vow to come back next year. I believe this was the 17th reunion, and a whole lot of people were there that had attended most all of them.

In my opinion, this is a convention to go to early and stay to the end. The first official activity is the traditional free Thursday evening Early Bird dinner and the last is the farewell breakfast on Sunday morning. In between there is time for the stories, glass and a trip or two to what has to be the best hospitality room of all. Some of the stories are not all about glass - like Swede Tilberg and his new car, with less than 300 miles on it, hitting a deer on the way over to Wichita. Or seeing "Bronco" Curtis with a hind leg in a cast. Seems he was chasing a cat and injured his leg. Bronco is a huge and beautiful, well-mannered dog that is a friend of everyone and the cast didn't seem to bother him a bit.

What else? Dick and Jennie Hostetler talked about Peacocks at the Friday program, and Friday night was the Early Bird Auction. They had invited Mickey Reichel to bring one of his auctions to Wichita, and he treated us to a good auction Saturday. We couldn't wind down this gathering without a good and well-attended banquet, and this time we had Carl and Eunice Booker sharing some of their collection and collecting stories - all good.

In addition to all the effort that makes this mid-sized convention such a success there is something else in my opinion. First of all, there is an active local group in charge; second we all had badges (no strangers there); and third we were all grouped together in the hotel since we had all the first and second and most of the third floor of the Holiday Inn.

Did I enjoy the convention? You bet I did! If you like a friendly gathering that I think is just about the right size, this Air Capital convention is for you.

October 21-23, 1999: Mid-Atlantic Jamboree, Hagerstown, Maryland. Not a convention sponsored by a national group - just a few dedicated people from the surrounding area that invite us to come for a couple of days of pure "carnival" each fall. Bill Mizell heads the group, and through their efforts we keep coming back each year for more.

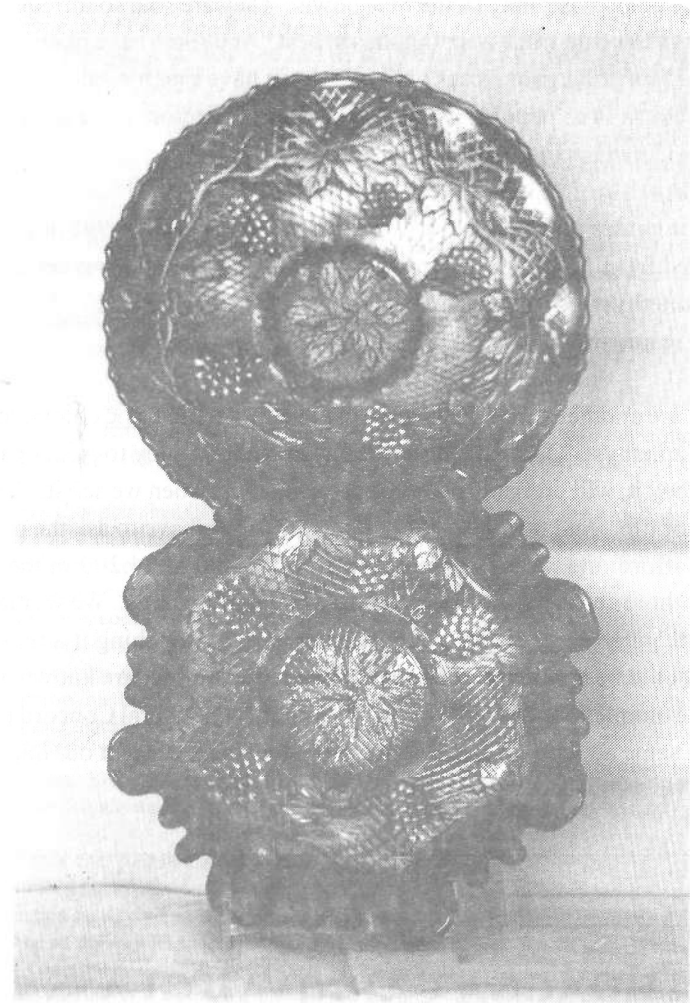
This year Dave Sharp presented a program on compotes to open the formalities, and they closed with a banquet and the traditional white elephant auction. We had the entire hotel, so there was carnival glass all over and much visiting. Room buying was good to me this year, as one of my fellow Hoosiers had an amethyst Millersburg Hobnail spooner. It returned to Indiana with me.

Tom Burns Auction Service usually has an auction in conjunction with the Jamboree. This year they had a one-owner auction of very good glass. There was a good crowd and prices were what I expected - good. The top item was the marigold "Souvenir of J.N. Ledford Company, Cooleemee, N.C." Heart and Vine plate that sold for \$15,000 after spirited bidding. The white 7 piece Cosmos and Cane water set (\$4,500), blue Millersburg Bernheimer Bros. Many Stars six ruffled bowl (\$5,000) and 10 inch blue Millersburg Hanging Cherries 6 ruffled bowl at \$4,250 are other examples of the better pieces sold. The glass sold itself and the auction team zipped right through it. A good job on their part.

If this is the last social-auction event of the year, we sure closed out the century with a good one.

FENTON'S CONCORD PATTERN

Here is a pattern that continues to command the attention of the carnival glass enthusiast. Presumably named after the renowned Concord grapes developed and grown in Massachusetts. Usually found in both ruffled and 3-1 candy edged collar based bowls and scarce plates. The back pattern consists of twelve wide panels. The bowls are readily found in green and marigold. Amethyst bowls are less frequently sold and are sometimes a little pricier than the green bowls. The real

sleeper here color-wise, may be the blue bowls. They are sold so infrequently that determining their true value is ambiguous at best. And some have likely slipped by without fanfare at bargain prices. No, we don't have one for sale. Because the Concord pattern is so popular with carnival glass collectors none of these bowls can be considered inexpensive.

Auction prices reported in the Tom and Sharon Mordini 1998 auction guide book ranged from \$170 to \$400 for marigold, \$175 to \$850 for green bowls and only two amethyst (3-1 edge) changed hands at \$950 and \$1,200. Both of those bowls, we would think, must have been exceptional examples.

Plates are another story. They are found in only three basic colors: marigold, green and amethyst. Our plate, described as lavender, a ploy to push up the price when you buy it, will probably revert back to amethyst when we sell it. A miracle? No, a fact of life. And how does the saying go? If you have to ask the price, then you can't afford one. They have ranged from \$1,800 to \$4,200 in the last few years. All three colors are considered rare by some standards. We would have to say they are much scarcer than the bowls but rare is stretching it a bit. We feel that rare should be applied to glass that only a few examples are known, not glass that a few examples are sold every year. Now and then several Concord plates are sold in the same auction. Please keep in mind that these are just our impressions, and not to be confused with facts.

HOACGA CARNIVAL GLASS CONVENTION 2000 APRIL 27, 28, 29, & 30

I have a horror story to tell you.

AUCTION ACTION - WICHITA CONVENTION REICHEL AUCTION

At most carnival glass auctions there is usually at least one piece of glass that has not been seen before so a price has not been established. There was one such piece in this auction, a Marigold "Moon Print" tumbler. The opening bid was not very high, but the bidding kept increasing in \$100.00 increments until it finally ended at \$1,800.00. Previously known pieces in this pattern are, Table Set (3 pieces), vases, and a pitcher. Since the pitcher is known, it was probably reasonable that a tumbler would eventually surface, and it did with quite a surprise sell price. The Moon Print pattern was made by Brockwitz a German Glass Co.

The green Fenton "Thistle" plate sold for \$4,000.00 The plate had outstanding iridescence. The young couple that bought the plate said they were not going to bid more than \$2,500.00, but the plate was so nice they could not pass it up. Most of us have found ourselves in that situation.

Report of a Green Nesting Swans 10 1/4" chop plate.

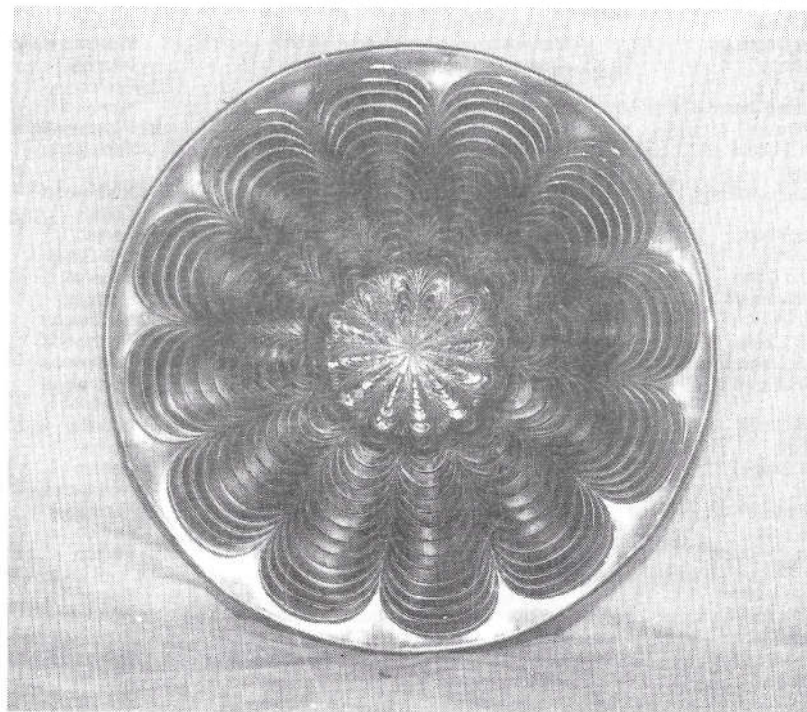

RARE 9" PLATES

The following is a list of the rare 9" plates as compiled by Vicki Gearhart. The next couple of bulletins will list the auction prices realized for 'rare' 9" carnival plates and Vicki's own top 50 list of rare carnival glass plates.

PLATE SURVEY CONTINUES

As I was reading through some old club materials, I came across an article written by Don Moore in the March, 1989 PUMP (ICGA) issue. His topic was on collar base 9" plates. He listed what he felt were the top 25 in his opinion. I hope nobody minds that I am referring to Don Moore's article, but from what I have heard about the man he would not object.

1. Goddess of Harvest (Fenton) Amethyst and Marigold. Rumored for years, at least one in each color has now been confirmed. The amethyst sold privately in 1987.
2. Poppy Show (Northwood) Aqua Opal, also rare in green, ice green and ice blue.
3. Orange Tree (Fenton) Aqua Opal. Only two know and one very rare Peach Opal plate.
4. Peter Rabbit (Fenton) Green, Blue & Marigold.
5. Good Luck (Northwood) Ice Green, Ice Blue.
6. Leaf Chain (Fenton) Aqua Opal, two known.
7. Rose Show (Northwood) Iridized Custard, Lime Green, Opal and Green. Also rare in Ice Green, Vaseline & IB.
8. Absentee Dragon (Fenton) Marigold. Two known.
- 9: Hearts & Flowers (Northwood) Ice Blue, Green, & IG.
10. Holly (Fenton) Aqua Opal, Celeste Blue, & Red.
11. Grape & Cable (Northwood) Ice Blue and Teal.
12. Cobblestone (Imperial) Purple, one known.
13. Greek Key (Northwood) Blue
14. Thistle (Fenton) Green and Amethyst.
15. Three Fruits (Northwood) Aqua Opal & Ice Blue.
16. Peacock on the Fence (Northwood) Ice Blue, Green and a decorated white plate.
17. Embroidered Mums (Northwood) IG, IB & White.
18. Persian Medallion (Fenton) Green & White.
19. Dragon & Lotus (Fenton) Blue, Marigold and two spatula footed plates know in Peach Opal.
20. Nippon (Northwood) in White.
21. Coral (Fenton) in Marigold.
22. Concord (Fenton) Green, Amethyst & Marigold.
23. Autumn Acorn (Fenton) Amethyst & Green.
24. Lotus & Grape (Fenton) Green, Blue, Amy, & Marigold.
25. Shell & Sand (Imperial) in Purple.

Additional comments by Don are as follows:

I did an article on 9" plates in June of 1981 issue of the PUMP. Looking back at that article it is hard to believe the plates that we didn't know about just eight years ago. So it's time to do an update.

There are many plates that are much more rare than the ones listed but they could scarcely be more beautiful. (Don also had a color insert with the article to show the plates.)

There are some 9" plates, which I have eliminated that are very rare but they turn up slightly at the outer edge. Because of this they are a bit "iffy" to be classified as true plates. In this category is the Fenton Plaid and the Millersburg Rosalind & Seaweed. There is also the very rare Roses and Greek Key plate that I have not ranked as it is really square instead of the usual 9" round shape. Neither have I included the 9" advertising plates such as Spectors, Old Rose Distillery, or the very rare Cooleemee. You will think of others, I am sure, that were overlooked and should have been mentioned.

I believe if Don was here today his listing would also be different. We continue to learn more all the time. For example, there are a lot more Ice Green Embroidered Mums plates sold than any other color. But remember this article is 10 years old and does list some interesting items I have yet to hear about.

Examples being: the Goddess of Harvest Plate in either color or the Peach Opal Orange Tree Plate. If these items are truly out there it would be great to see them, or at least a picture, don't you think?

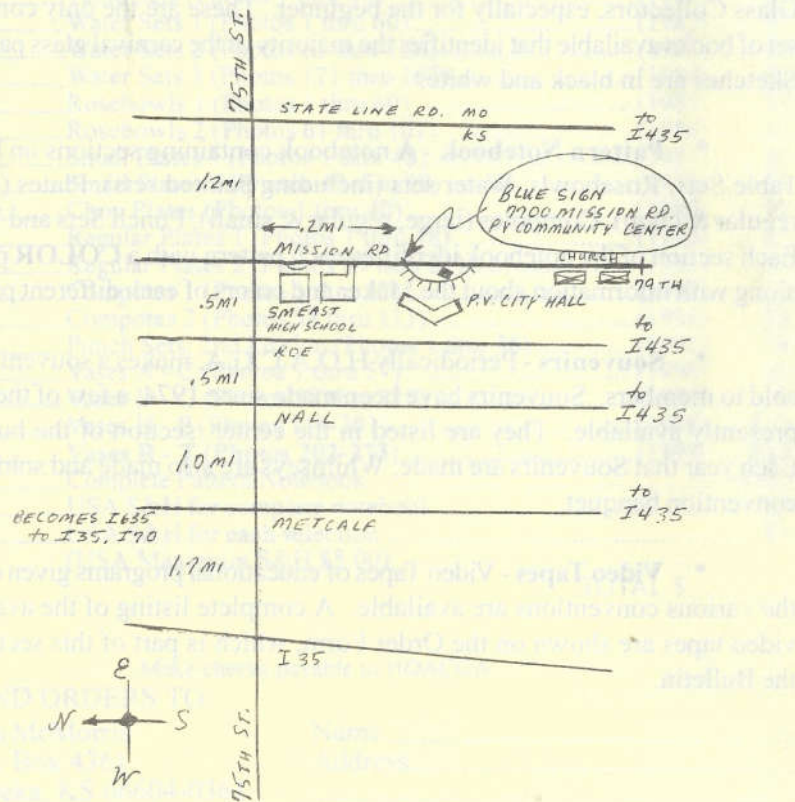

Union: Problems at Plant

Equipment problems and forced overtime at Kansas City's new mail distribution plant have caused employee frustration to build and morale to plummet, a local postal union official said Friday.

At issue is a \$25 million automated system that is supposed to move mail within the plant. Instead, the machines jam or misdirect mail, American Postal Worker Union president Cliff Jones said. That has led to some slower mail deliveries, forced overtime and delayed work breaks.

"People are being burned out," Jones said. "They feel they are not treated with respect or dignity."

Jones said that because of the equipment problems, many employees have been forced to work more than the permissible overtime, including shifts longer than 12 hours. To compound the problems, he said, the office has trouble with a new time clock that doesn't register hours beyond 12. This means some workers have not been paid for their overtime.

Tension is so great, Jones said, that employees have screamed at their supervisors and even thrown objects.

Acting plant manager James Gonzales, who was brought from Chicago to help solve the equipment problems, denied Jones' allegations. He said that problems with the equipment had been resolved and that 100 percent of the mail would be processed with the new equipment beginning Tuesday.

The Kansas City plant handles about 6 million pieces of mail a day. On Aug. 7 the operation moved from cramped quarters at 315 W. Pershing Road to the former Sears warehouse at Truman Road and Cleveland Avenue.

A highlight of the new plant is the automated "tray management system," criticized by Jones. The system has color-coded tracks, rollers and conveyors designed to move mail in trays with labels read by computers. There are 23 such systems around the country, but none as large as Kansas City's, Gonzales said.

"We're comfortable that it is working to our expectations," Gonzales said.

But Jones said that the system doesn't work and that managers have used its failure to declare an emergency, thereby triggering exceptions to the union's contract.

Jones also said 50 to 100 manual sorters had been denied cushioned bars to lean against. Also, workers are not allowed to have water bottles at their work stations or to wear protective gloves, he said.

Gonzales said the cushioned bars were inefficient. He did not respond to Jones' other complaints.

"We made this facility worker-friendly," Gonzalez said. "There have been some issues in the past. I've tried to sit down with the unions."

The local complaints come in the context of the national APWU's contract, which expires next November. The union is upset that another postal union, the National Association of Letter Carriers, recently received better terms in its contract. Traditionally, these two unions had the same or similar contract terms.

APWU President Moe Biller has said his members will do anything, "whether lawful or otherwise, to secure economic justice." A strike would be unlawful.

Meanwhile, the new plant will have an open house for the public from 1-4 p.m. Sunday. Union members plan to organize an informational picket to tell their story about the alleged malfunctioning machines and overtime problems.

APWU spokesman Tom Fahey said the planned picket in Kansas City was unrelated to the national contract situation.
