

IMPERIAL'S HOBSTAR AND ARCHES

This bowl, like many geometric patterns, had us stumped when we found it. We knew that it wasn't Fashion, Diamond Ring, Octagon, Diamond Lace, Royalty, or Blaze to name just a few, but what was it? We were only carrying Dave Doty's handy reference book with us on this day. We searched the book to no avail.

Well the only thing to do was to buy the bowl, take it home and hit the books. We had no trouble finding it in the Carl Burns and the Edwards/Carwile books after a little geometric skipping about. It has been reported that this pattern also occurs as a fruit bowl and base. And the base, that is a Hobstar and Arches, is used as a base for Imperial's Royalty and Long Hobstar punch bowls. We cannot confirm this. Marion Hartung's book 3 page 42 laments on the challenges of recognizing these "near cut" patterns. She wrote that the Hobstar and Arches "stand was also near cut but not an exact match for (the) pattern."

Not a great find, but a find nevertheless. Although described as readily available we cannot find any mention of Hobstar and Arches in the last 12 years of auction reports. We have learned the hard way that passing up carnival glass just because you don't recognize it at the moment is a big mistake. If it isn't ridiculously priced, but it, as it will save you the expense for the trip back. And anyway, it was just too pretty to leave behind.

This attractive eight ruffle exterior pattern bowl, with a marigold radium iridescence, measures 8½" in diameter. And is shown here viewed from the bottom, to make it easier to see the pattern. This is Imperial's No. 302 pattern, and was illustrated in the 1909 catalog.

The price guide range is \$40 to \$50. Naming those very similar geometric patterns must have been truly difficult. Just what is a Hobstar anyway?

MIKADO COMPOTES

The pattern called Mikado was made by the Fenton Glass Company and was made in only one shape, the large compote to be used as a fruit bowl. According to information found in the "Butler Brothers Catalogs", reprinted by the San Diego and Southern California carnival glass clubs, the Mikado pattern was sold between February 1920 and July 1922. They were sold to dealers in an assortment with other shapes of glass.

Rose M. Presznick in her 1966 book, "Carnival and Iridescent Glass with Price Guide Book II" called the pattern "Cherries and Mums."

Marion T. Hartung in her "Fourth Book of Carnival Glass" named the pattern Mikado, and that is the name that has remained to this day. Here is a quote from page 57 of her book when describing this pattern: "Such a combination of chrysanthemums and Rising Sun could only suggest Japan of course. This beautifully designed and executed pattern reflects in every line and in excellent taste the popular vogue for things Oriental which prevailed early in our century."

Bill Edwards in his 1981 book, "Fenton Carnival Glass The Early Years," describes the interior Mikado pattern on page 78 as "This design consists of a center Medallion of stippled rays around which are three large Chrysanthemums and three oriental scroll devices."

In Glen & Stephen Thistlewoods 1998 book, "Carnival Glass The Magic and the Mystery," on page 80 they describe the interior Mikado pattern as "The central flower motif is simplified to a sunburst, but is surround by slightly more recognizable chrysanthemums that have detailed stamens and petals. Interspersed between the three large flower heads are three lozenge shapes festooned with Oriental looking spirals and curlicues."

The exterior pattern is called Fenton's Cherry. Cherry patterns were very popular in the early 1900's. Around the bowl, hanging from a vine that winds around the top of the bowl, are six groups of realistic looking cherries in a bunch of seven cherries. Each group of cherries is separated by two smaller and two larger leaves.

The stem consists of three columns of three sets of three cherries in an elongated circle. The pattern between the columns of cherries is like overlapping scales on a stippled background.

The Mikado compotes were made in a three part mold. All the ones I have seen are between 7" and 8" in height. They all have a 5" base. The width of the bowl ranges from 9½" to 10¼" depending on how flattened out they are. The edges may be ruffled (most common). All the ruffled Mikados I have seen have eight ruffles. The edges may be also smooth with small serrated points. In this edge treatment there are thirteen groupings of five points. The Mikado compote is also found with a rarer Ice Cream Shape (ICS) bowl. In the ICS compotes the bowl is shallower, only 2" in height with the same thirteen groupings of five points, but much deeper point groupings. The normal ruffled and round bowls are usually 3" in depth. The ICS compotes show off the fantastic Mikado interior pattern to its fullest beauty.

The colors I have seen the Mikado compotes in are Marigold (round, ruffled & ICS), Blue (round, ruffled, & ICS), Amethyst/Purple (round & ruffled), Green & the rare Emerald Green (ruffled), Powder (smokey) Blue (with marigold overlay) in ruffled. Rumors are that there is one in red and also in white, but those I have not seen. The round and ruffled compotes come with either a radium or satin finish. I have only seen the ICS compotes with the satin finish.

The Fenton Glass Company also made the Mikado pattern in other glass. In Margaret & Kenn Whitmyer's 1996 book, "Fenton Art Glass 1907-1939 Identification & Value Guide," they have pictured a Mikado compote in black glass on page 165, listed as being made in 1916. I have this one in my collection and it is black and shinny. Very hard to see the pattern on black glass but it is hard to come by. It has a round edge treatment.

Also in the Whitmyer's book on page 197 they have the Mikado pictured in Mandarin Red Slag in the round and ruffled shapes. Mine is in the ruffled edge. The slag effect makes it a stunning piece of glass. They also show a cake plate in Mandarin Red, but I have not seen it in that shape. Red was manufactured in 1934.

Also in the Whitmyer's book on page 219 they have both the round compote and the cake plate in Royal Blue pictured. They state date of production as 1935. I have the compote in ruffled in a deep blue. Again the pattern does not show up well in this color. I have not seen the cake plate in this color.

Finally in the Whitmyer's book on page 198 they state that the Mikado compote was also made in Milk Glass between 1933-34. I have never seen a Mikado in Milk Glass either.

All the Mikado's in my collection that are not iridized carnival glass are identical in shape, size, and pattern content to the carnival glass compotes. It must have been a popular, utilitarian mold that Fenton used for a long time.

Mikado Compotes are large one piece stemmed fruit bowls that would grace anyones collection with beauty and deserve to be represented in everyones collection.


