

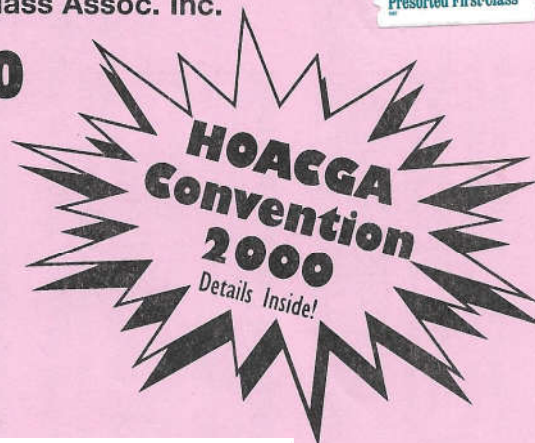

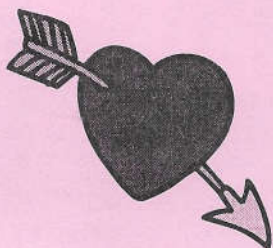

Spiral Diamond Point Vase

Here is a miniature marigold vase, less than six inches tall. Although it is listed twice in the HOACGA Notebook, shown in Bill Edwards' book and illustrated in Marion Hartung's book #4, we still are not sure who made it. It is listed in the vase supplement 2nd section as #76. Diamond Point Spiral, made by Eda Glass Works (Sweden). Next, it is listed in the 4th vase section as #228. Spiraled Diamond Point & Fan, made by McKee Glass. Both the vase name and the maker in conflict.

Marion Hartung's write-up mentions that this vase "has a small flange inside, just below the base of the fans". And she suggested that this vase may have been a container for some product, like powder. She also states that the vase had brilliant marigold iridescence on the inside only. Bill Edwards repeats those remarks and suggests that possibly a lid was intended. That internal flange may be the clue to solving the puzzle on who made this pretty vase.

Recently we were showing and discussing our chocolate glass collection with some fellow Greentown Glass collectors. We discussed several glass items, such as creamers, that had an internal flange as if they were made to support a lid. We were in agreement that none of the items discussed were ever seen or reported with a lid. Then why was the flange present? The internal flange did not necessarily support a glass top. Paper (cardboard) and metal tops were also used. Marion Hartung's speculation that the flange supported a lid of some sort and the Spiraled Diamond Point vase was a container to market a product was right on target and may be an indication as to who made it.

Many glass companies around the turn of the century made glass referred to as "packers goods". These were items made as containers for products. Westmoreland Specialty Co. started by making mugs for mustard containers. Indiana Tumbler and Goblet Company and McKee and Brothers Glass were among the many glass companies making such packer goods products. We have a passion for covered compotes made by Northwood, Fenton and Diamond Glass Companies that we are convinced were sold as a container for ladies bath powders, again packers goods.

So out of the two choices of manufacturers listed in the HOACGA vase sections, we would have to suspect that McKee & Brothers Glass Co. might have been the maker as we know that they make "packers goods". Does anybody really know? Our vase is only the second one we recall seeing over many years of collecting. The iridescence can best be described as a light color and is external, not inside. And if it was a container for some product, you certainly didn't get much!

On the Auction Trail with Chuck

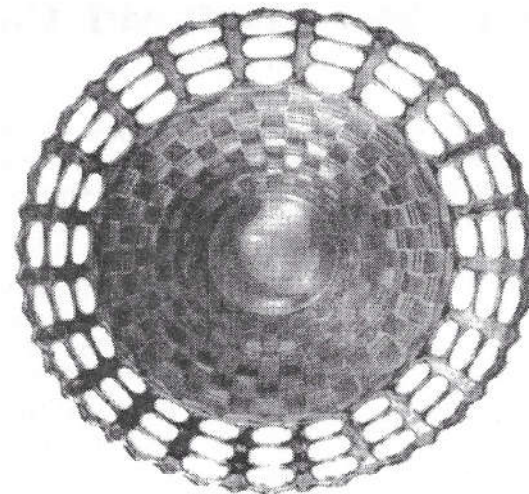
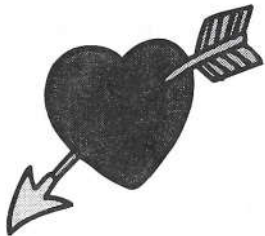

Anyone who has been collecting for awhile, would know that a very flat, very beautiful PLATE of this size would certainly sell for a rarer price than is listed in the current *1999 Mordini Price Guide*, but once in print, it's there forever, unless a correction is made.

Our "Source for Reliable Information", as the mailing envelope states, has slipped a cog on this one! . . . In writing articles, it has always been our habit to review the Mordini Guide to use for reference . . . However, accuracy IS . . . **VERY important when relaying information!** . . .

No one should be misled by a misnomer . . . Therefore, if each of you will please turn to **page 53** of the newly purchased 1999 Price Guide, and add a **0** to the listing which states a price of \$600 for: **OPEN EDGE PLATE, 9 3/4", 3 ROW, 1 KNOWN IN WH. W \$6000.**

Carnival Glass Auction — January 8, 2000

The Reichel Auction Company held its ninth annual New Year's auction on January 8, 2000. As in most of the carnival auctions there were some seldom seen pieces. Some of these pieces were:

Item #25 was described as a "M – ULTRA RARE – 1 of a Kind – 10 1/2" Peacock Tail Chop Plate – WOW". This is the first one known of this plate. You could not say that the iridescence was outstanding, but it was what would be considered above average. The 9" Peacock Tail plates are considered very scarce to rare. The Peacock Tail plates can be found in at least four different sizes now and most of them are scarce. There were two Peacock Tail collectors from Minnesota at the auction but it did not go home with either of them. The Chop plate sold for \$7,000.00. The price of tail feathers seems to be getting more expensive.

Item #104 was a "W – Clear – Pastel 8 1/2" PCE N Strawberry Bowl – Smooth Ext – Rare Beauty". The bowl had good iridescence. The bowl was sitting at the end of the table back in a corner and did not seem to get much attention. It was one of those pieces that you have to think about to realize how rare this bowl is, in White. Since there aren't any past records of sales it is difficult to determine a price. Someone was interested enough to pay \$1,300.00. It went to a write-in bidder.

Item #154 was a "Ultra Rare Emerald G – N Butterfly Threaded Back Bon Bon – Super". I have heard collectors say "they never look at the back side of a piece". This is one of those pieces where the back side makes a considerable difference. Every thing about this piece was nice. The selling price was \$1,100.00.

Item #284 was a "M – Dark Super Radium RARE 6" KULOR VASE – Stunning Rarity". Mickey resorted to several adjectives to describe the vase. It seemed to work, because the vase sold for \$1,600.00 This vase is known in two sizes, and this was the shorter one. The maker of the vase was the Eda Glasbruk in Sweden. This pattern is also known in Blue and Moonstone.

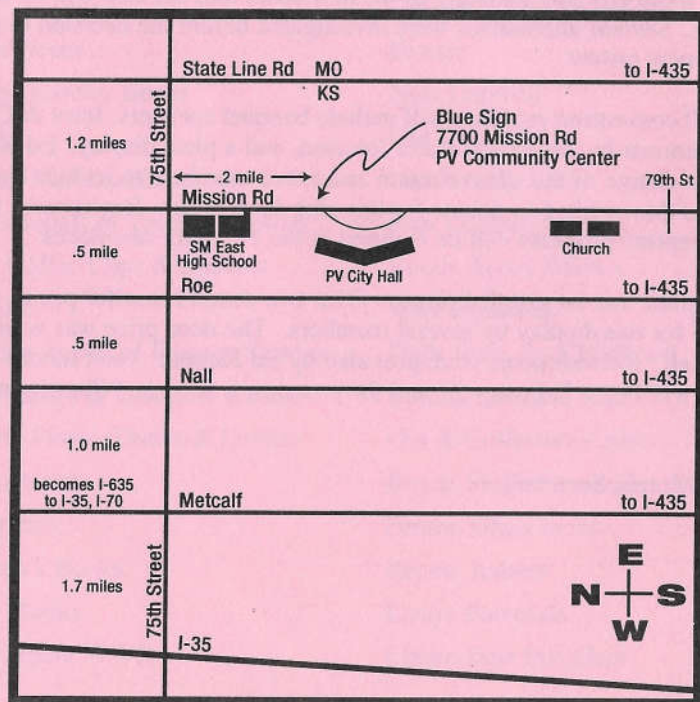

- Members provide Room Displays with glass from their collection.
- Members are encouraged to bring glass for Sale.
- Educational Seminars are provided by members.
- A Major Carnival Glass Auction is provided.
- The Convention offers members an opportunity to meet new collectors, renew old friendships and enjoy discussing carnival glass with other knowledgeable collectors.
- A banquet is held with a Carnival Collector as our Speaker.
- A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

- **Membership Dues** – \$25.00 per year U.S. & Canada. \$40.00 per year for foreign. The Membership Year is from the date of joining to one year later. Dues are set by the Board of Directors to support the publication of the monthly bulletin, typing, printing and mailing.
- **Educational Series – Book I** – 148 articles with pictures (black and white) on a variety of Carnival Glass Patterns.
- **Educational Series – Book II** – 180 articles with pictures (black and white) of Carnival Glass Tumblers.

- **Hartung Carnival Glass Pattern Books** – A set of 10 books identifying Carnival Glass Patterns. These books are a must for all Carnival Glass Collectors, especially for the beginner. These are the only complete set of books available that identifies the majority of the carnival glass patterns. Sketches are in black and white.
- **Pattern Notebook** – A notebook containing sections on Mugs, Table Sets, Rosebowls, Water Sets (including painted sets), Plates (small, regular & chop), Compotes (large, regular & small), Punch Sets and Vases. Each section of the notebook identifies each pattern with a COLOR picture along with information about the Maker and colors of each different pattern.
- **Souvenirs** – Periodically HOACGA makes a souvenir to be sold to members. Souvenirs have been made since 1974, a few of these are presently available. They are listed in the center section of the bulletin. Each year that Souvenirs are made, Whimseys are also made and sold at the convention banquet.

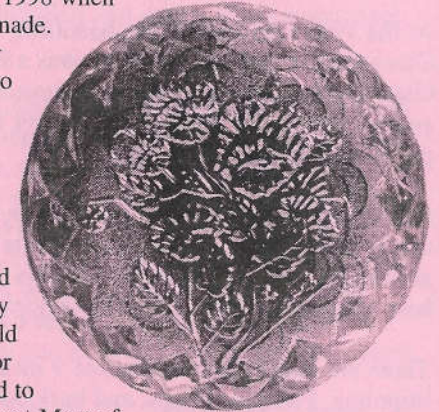

HOACGA has not made a souvenir since 1998 when the White Orange Tree Loving Cup was made. Since this is the new century and the year 2000, it was decided to make a souvenir to commemorate the occasion.

The souvenir for 2000 will be an Imperial "Pansy" Plate. It will be made from the original Imperial mold. The L. G. Wright Company purchased this mold from the Imperial Glass Company when they ceased operation. The Fenton Art Glass Company purchased the mold when L. G. Wright sold their molds. The mold has been around for many years. The mold was originally used to make the "Imperial Pansy" bowls and plates. Most of the original plates were ruffled. The original pieces from this mold were never made in cobalt blue.



Fenton has cleaned the mold and are now ready to make the souvenir plate for HOACGA. The regular size, nine inch, plate will be made in Cobalt Blue and dated for the year 2000. Since blue is one of the colors that has been advertised as one of the millennium colors, maybe we should call this the Millennium Blue "Pansy" plate.

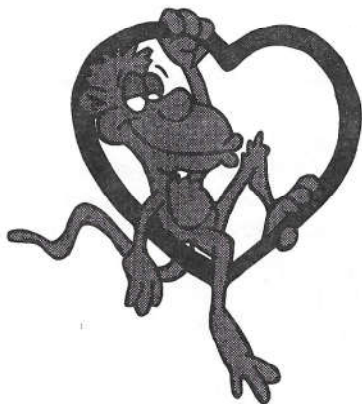
