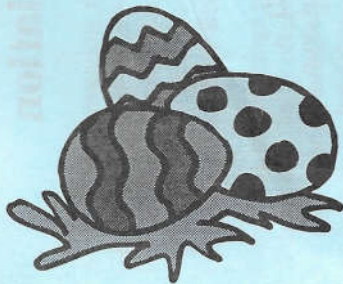
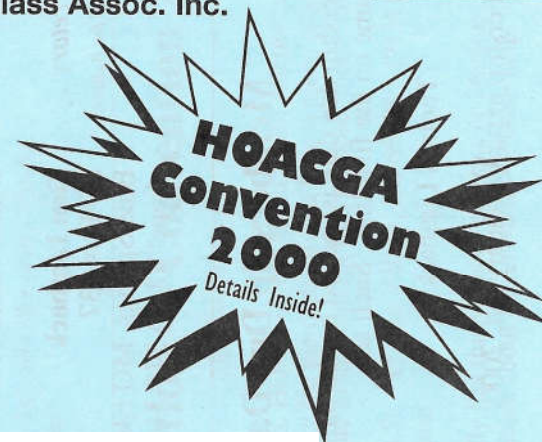

Plates have always been some of the most sought after pieces in Carnival Glass. **Your help is needed for this special display.**

If we had all of the possibilities of these five patterns it would be a very impressive display.

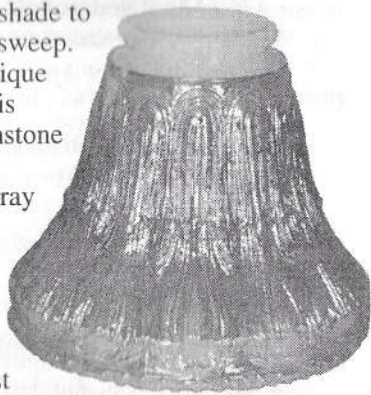

We need help with this one. This is a new shade to us that was found on a recent antique mall sweep. Yes, we have not given up on searching antique malls and occasionally find something. This time we found a pretty marigold over moonstone glass shade with a very pleasing pattern. I would have to describe it as an attractive array of draped tassels. This is not a lightweight shade. A generous amount of glass was used in the making.



The bottom edge has a peculiar pattern of two rows of three dots and a dash. The first row is on the lower edge and the second row is right above it with an alternating arrangement. This shade is very nice to look at but putting light inside it doesn't do much for its overall appearance.

We are impressed at how many different unnamed light shades appear on the eBay web site. And with the current gasoline prices we may have to spend more time shopping on line. We enjoy the many old carnival lampshades and display them prominently in our home. If you have any information as to the maker or name of this shade we would like to hear from you. On the Auction Trail with Chuck

March 1-5, 2000: If you thought Grape and Cable was dead you should have been at the San Diego-Southern California convention for its resurrection. The Seck Auction in conjunction with the convention had some of the prettiest G & C I had ever seen – and the prices reflected the quality.

The convention was a very good one and a prime example of a team effort. These two clubs work together and everything was well planned and first rate. A good example was Shirley Patterson hosting the extra special hospitality room. She thought of everything from the muffins and fruit for breakfast, to the sandwiches for lunch on Thursday and Friday, the donuts on Saturday prior to the auction and the endless supply of coffee and soft drinks. Needless to say, the hospitality room was the “Meeting Place”. Shirley spent so much time in the hospitality room I don't think she really had time to go “looking”. By the way, this was not a one-shot deal since Shirley does this every year.

Programs – they had them. The ice cream social and Hillbilly Bingo on Wednesday evening was a real convention opener. BoBo, Bubba, Willie and Daisy Mae entertained us, called a few games of bingo, and gave us a backwoods version of carnival glass collecting. Bubba told us what we didn't know about a few patterns. One example he used was the “Chicken Wire” bowl. I now have a better appreciation of my Feather Stitch bowl – I guess I read the wrong book!

Thursday Joyce Middleton showed us her collection of purses – large, small, odd shaped and not all carnival. She called them “Antique Purses: Fascinating Works of Art”. Sound like a ladies program? Not at all. In the evening it was pie social time. On Friday, Dennis and Anne Swafford gave us an “Indifferent Look at Opalescent Glass”. Dennis brought special display shelving that really showed off the glass and the red background was a good choice. A lively and entertaining seminar with the glass to go with it.

Contrary to what we see at some conventions, there was a very good attendance at the banquet. The feature was Richard Cinclair talking about “Breaking the Rules”. There was a nice display of glass as Richard explained why each piece didn't fit the norm. I wish I had a video of this one as I thought there were many good thoughts expressed.

The auction was decision time. I had my eye on the purple G & C pin tray for Cindy and I got it for \$250. I struck out when the purple large G & C ruffled open compote came up. It was a super example, but when the bidding got to \$1000 I said “enough”. The 14 piece purple master G & C punch set (\$4000), the purple G & C cracker jar (\$750), and the stippled G & C sapphire plate at \$6500 are examples of the very pretty Grape and Cable pieces that sold. Two Rare Plates

Members of the San Diego – Southern California clubs supplied some of the pieces for the Banquet talk by Richard Cinclair. One of those pieces was an Amethyst “WINDFLOWER” plate. Marigold plates in this Dugan pattern are quite common. Even though Dugan pieces in blue are difficult to find, blue “WINDFLOWER” plates do come up for sale at auctions periodically. This plate has been in the collection of this west coast collector for several years. The Dugan Diamond Carnival Glass book by Carl Burns lists the blue as being one of the scarce colors. How many collectors have one or have seen an amethyst plate? It would be interesting to know.

A “STIPPLED STRAWBERRY” Ice Blue plate was brought to the convention by Lou & Liz Rommel of Australia and offered for sale. Another West coast collector, Judy Maxwell, is now the proud owner. This is the second plate known in this color, with one other rumored to be in Australia also. Congratulations to Judy. It was good to be able to see the amethyst “Windflower” plate!

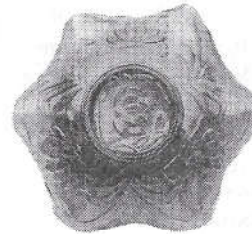

Unusual and Rare Bowls

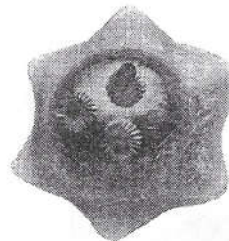

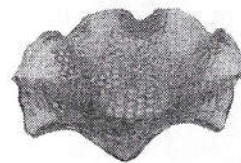
Probably one of the earliest patterns Fenton made was the “Waterlily and Cattails”. This pattern was made in a lot of different non-carnival colors. Water Sets, Table Sets, Bowls, and some vases were made in this pattern. All of the carnival glass pieces are marigold. I have had this ten inch, 6 ruffle, iridized green bowl in my collection for approximately 20 years. As with all of the “Waterlily and Cattails”, the pattern is on the outside, with a Waterlily and Lotus flower on the base. Frank Fenton said that he did not know this bowl was ever made in green, carnival or non-carnival. There are three of these bowls known. They are iridized on the outside only. Maybe these bowls were made for the Lunch Box trade only. Northwood made their version of a “Waterlily and Cattails” water set also.



Another rare bowl is because of the shape. It is a “Dragon and Lotus”, collar base, nut bowl (or Berry Bowl) shape. It is in a pumpkin marigold color and is 7 1/2" wide and 2 3/4" deep. Almost all “Dragon and Lotus” pieces are either ruffled or ice cream shape. This is a rare shape in a common pattern. There are 2 others known in this shape, one in blue and one in marigold. This bowl was found in New Hampshire about two months ago.



Westmoreland's “Louisa” in Peach Opal is a very unusual shape along with it being a rare color. The bowl is 7 1/2" wide and 3 1/2" deep and has six ruffles. The pattern to the “Louisa” pieces is on the outside with the inside being plain. As usual with this pattern, it is only iridized on the inside. The opalescence is quite good on this piece. Only about five of these bowls are known. I have had this bowl for at least fifteen years.



Another Peach Opal bowl that is very scarce is the “Imperial Grape”. Just recently I was able to obtain this bowl on eBay. It was listed as marigold. The opalescence is only on the ruffled edges and on the collar base. It is 8" wide and 2 1/2" deep with eight ruffles. I know of about twelve of these bowls.

Announcing a New Carnival Discovery

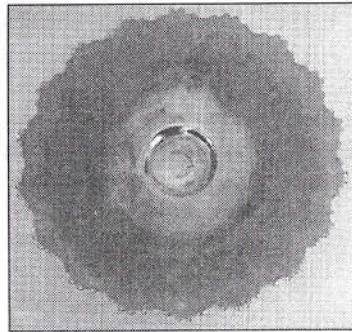
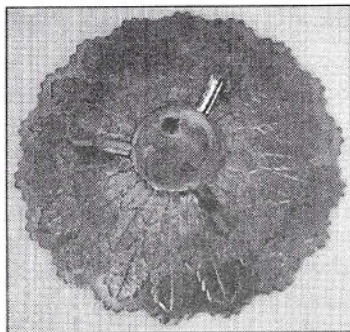
Drum roll please. I bought this piece last month hoping it was an old piece of carnival in a previously unreported shape. After taking my find to the Keystone Carnival Show and Sale I was pleasantly surprised when Mr. Tom Burns looked at it and proceeded to tell me he had never seen or heard of one before. (end drum roll).

How about a 12 inch Fenton unsigned chop plate in their Leaf Tiers pattern? How about a leaf tiers chop plate in cobalt blue? Yes it does exist and it is footed with three twig feet common on the bowl shapes found in this pattern. The pattern comes in a variety of non-iridized shapes and colors, yet somehow this piece has been overlooked till now. The woman I purchased this from had told me that she had bought it at auction and was told by the auctioneer that he had consulted with Bill Edwards regarding it's rarity. Allegedly Mr. Edwards told the auctioneer that he never heard of such a piece.

Because this pattern was produced by Fenton in the 1920's I will place production of this piece at that time. This may well be an experimental piece or a one of a kind since another has yet to surface. The iridescence is heavy on the exterior and has a stretch effect on the outer portion of the plate. The top is plain with the pattern on the underside. The underside is lightly iridized with a silvery effect on the leaves and a hint of stretch effect toward the outer edge. The plates edge is scalloped which is a common Fenton design element. Although I say cobalt blue I understand that the factory color would be Fenton's Royal Blue as listed in factory catalogues of the time. There is a small chip on the collar base near one of the feet and when held to a strong light a dark line is present in the foot. I say this so if any one has a better one we would all appreciate hearing from you.

Plates are scarce and desirable. Chop plates are rarer yet, so if you can add to the list and document as much as possible, carnival glass collectors can only be enriched with the knowledge shared.

- A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

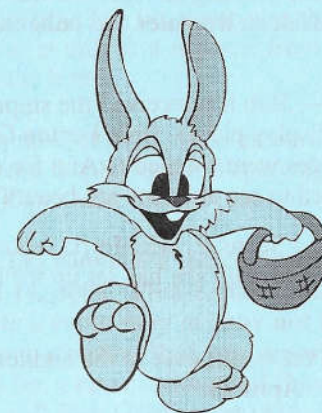
It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

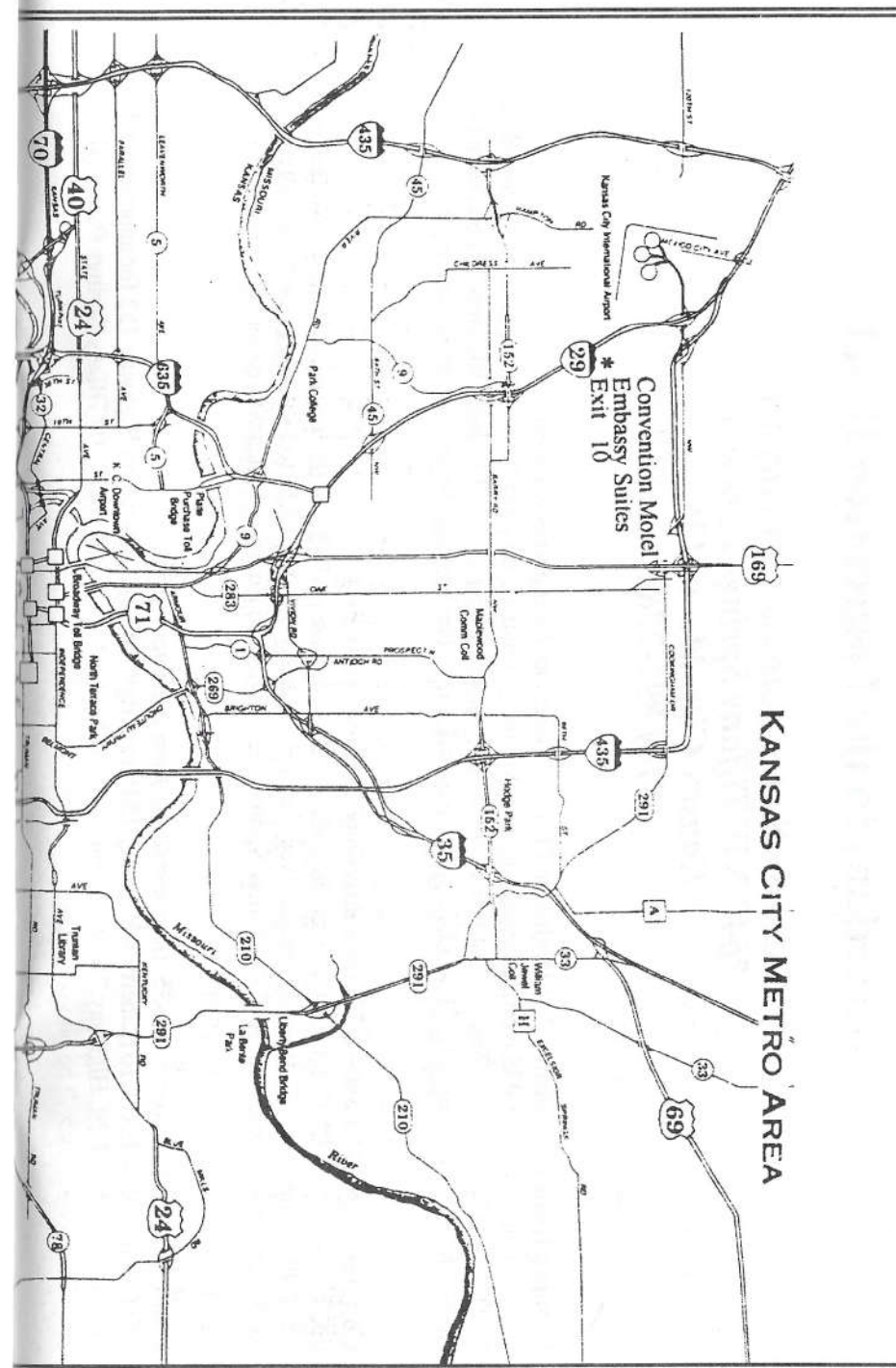

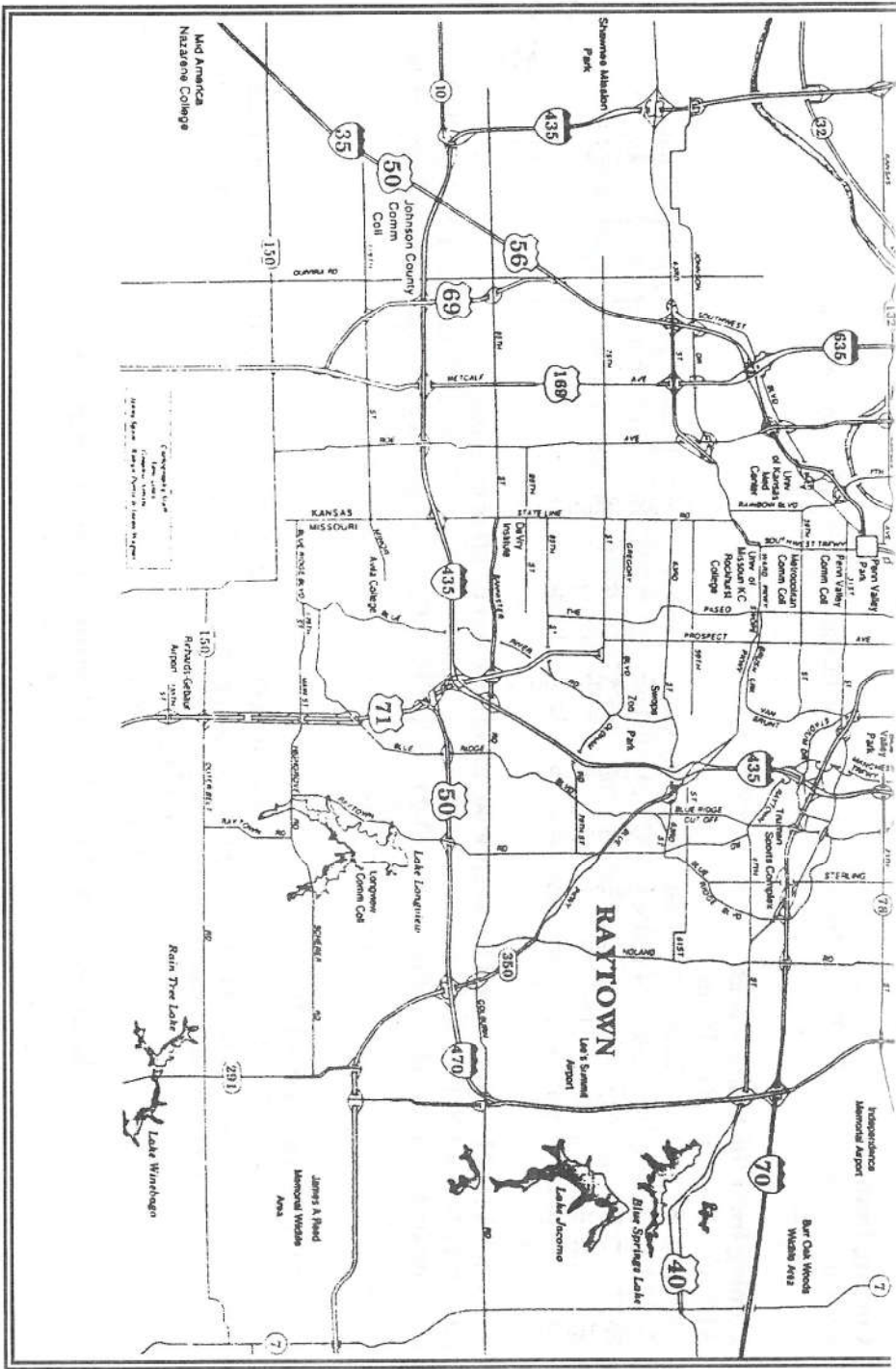

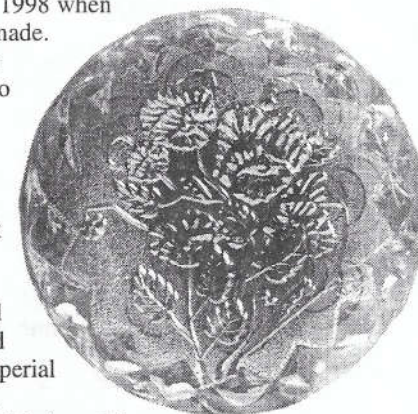

2000 Souvenir

HOACGA has not made a souvenir since 1998 when the White Orange Tree Loving Cup was made. Since this is the new century and the year 2000, it was decided to make a souvenir to commemorate the occasion.

The souvenir for 2000 will be a "Pansy" Plate. It is being made from a mold owned by the Fenton Art Glass Co. Frank Fenton originally thought this was the original Imperial Glass Co. mold. After some investigation he discovered the mold used was one that the L.G. Wright Co. had made to exactly duplicate the original "Imperial Pansy" pattern. The Fenton Art Glass Co. purchased the mold when L.G. Wright sold their molds. The mold was originally used to make the custard plates of the L.G. Wright pieces, which Fenton made for them. Most of the original "Imperial Pansy" plates were ruffled. The "Pansy" plates from either mold were never made in cobalt blue.



Fenton has cleaned the mold and is now ready to make the souvenir plate for HOACGA. The regular size, nine inch, plate will be made in Cobalt Blue and dated for the year 2000. Since blue is one of the colors that has been advertised as one of the millennium colors, maybe we should call this the Millennium Blue "Pansy" plate.

Samples of the plate have been made, and the color and iridescence are outstanding. We are sure that you will want to own one of these souvenirs. Only 200 plates will be made, when these are sold there will not be any more made in this color. The plates are \$37.50 each plus \$3.50 for shipping. A member may order as many as they want.

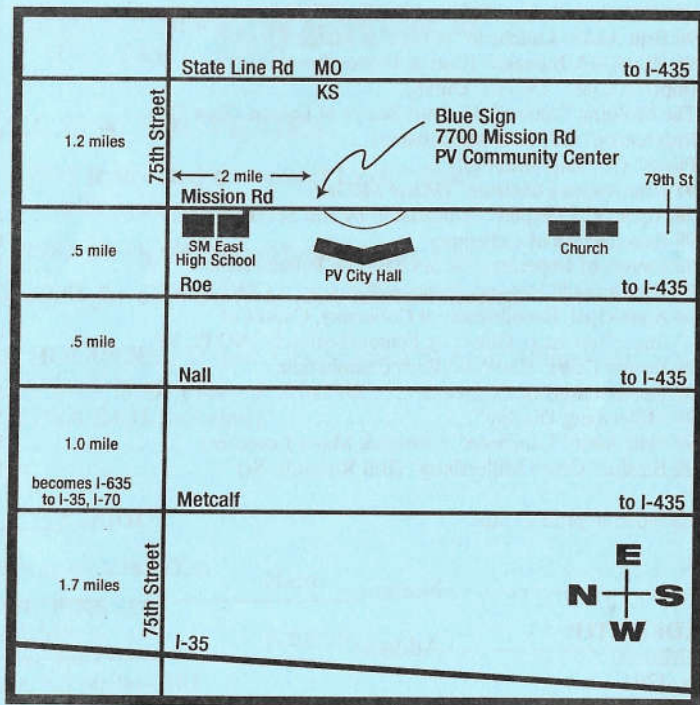
