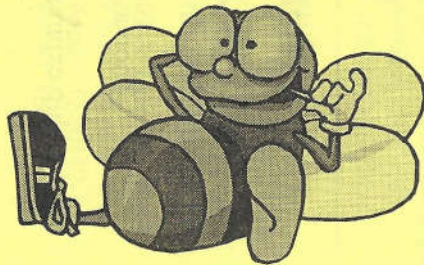
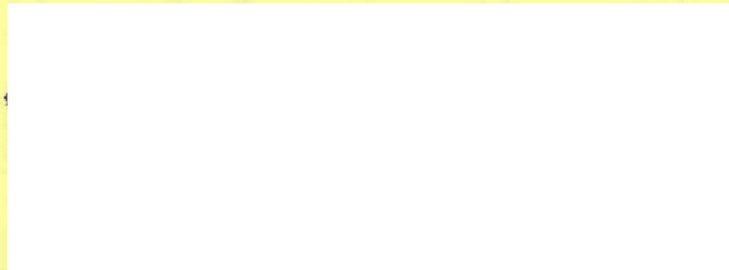

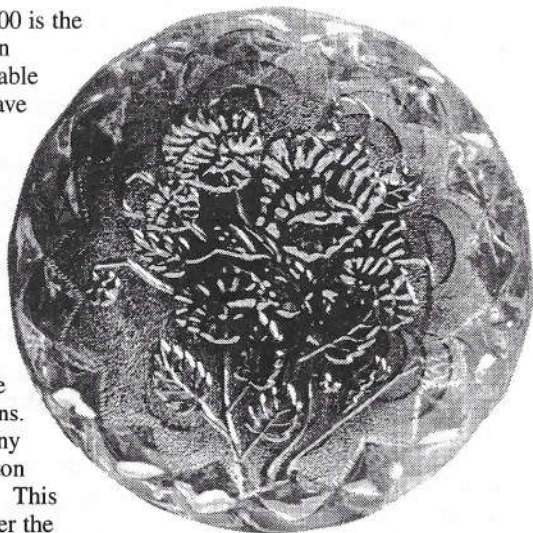

2000 Souvenir Imperial "Pansy" 9 inch Plate

The HOACGA souvenir for 2000 is the Imperial "Pansy" 9 inch Plate in Cobalt Blue. The plate is available now. Since it is here and we have seen it, we can say that it is as pretty a souvenir that has been made. The cobalt blue color and the iridescence are both very nice. Frank Fenton and The Fenton Art Glass Co. did an outstanding job on this souvenir. The plate was from a mold that the L. G. Wright Company made from one of the original Imperial "Pansy" patterns. When the L. G. Wright Company sold all of their molds, the Fenton Art Glass Co. bought the mold. This pattern was never made by either the Imperial Glass Co. or the L. G. Wright Co. in cobalt blue.



If you have not ordered one of these, then you are missing a good souvenir. Only about 220 plates were made, and only 30 plates are still available. The plate is dated "2000". The plates are \$37.50 each plus \$3.50 for shipping. **Do not miss getting one of these souvenirs!**

Members started arriving and setting up their displays and glass for sale as early as Monday. By Tuesday evening there were 25 rooms filled. In all, over 190 of the Embassy Suite rooms were occupied by HOACGA members, socializing, buying and selling, and enjoying all of the convention activities.

In order to provide the activities that we all enjoy at the convention, it requires a lot of help from members. A big "THANK YOU" goes to these people for their help in making the convention enjoyable for all of those attending: Ann McMorris, Gene and Pam Cox, Don Lacock, Shirley Vest, Steve Hazlett, and the others that helped at the registration desk. Cliff and Jo Ann Ball for their help with the registration, making the room location signs, helping with the silent auction and the many other details they always attend to during the convention. Daryl and Norma Strohm, and Charles and Eleanor Mochel for organizing the checking in and out of the plates for the display. Gail Eichorst, Bertie Metzger, Judy Maxwell, and Bob and Geneva Leonard for setting the plates in place and removing them from the display. Bob and Geneva Leonard, Jerry Curtis, and Imogene Grissom for helping with the setting up, and tearing down of the tables, risers, and lights for the display.

We want to give a special thanks to John & Janet Rogers for the "Peanuts" and also to Linda Pendleton for the "Reception Sticks" that were in the "Goodie Bags" that were given to all of those at the Hotel. They are appreciated very much.

Ed Kramer did his usual outstanding job of obtaining, assembling, and organizing the items for the "Silent Auction". Thank you Ed for another job well done. Also, thanks to those members that donated glass, all of the funds obtained from this go to defray some of the expenses of the convention.

The souvenir (Imperial's Pansy plate), room display award (Hobnail Spittoon), and the table favor (Orange Tree wine glass) were all made in cobalt blue. Thanks to Frank Fenton for looking after the making of these pieces, and the Fenton Art Glass Co. for doing a fantastic job. The color and iridescence on all of the pieces is outstanding. The Imperial's "Pansy" plate is one of the prettiest souvenirs that has been made.

Some of the convention highlights were:

A "Dirty Bingo" game was held for those members that arrived on Wednesday. Francis and Janet Tate both won one of the prizes, as did Gary Dilges, and Jerry Curtis. Thirty members attended the Bingo trying to win one of the four prizes (a very nice piece of Fenton Glass).

Thursday evening Galen and Kathi Johnson presented an educational talk about some of the carnival pieces within their collection. Both Galen and Kathi's employment require them to travel, so during some of the times they are working in other parts of the country their spare time is spent looking for carnival glass. Their talk took you on a tour from California to New Zealand and many points in between. One of the pieces in their collection is a Master Grape & Cable Punch Set. It was offered to them, because a person wanted to buy a Harley Davidson motorcycle. Their talk included some reproduced pieces they had bought thinking they were old. They emphasized the need for educating yourself about carnival glass. Their talk was very humorous as well as educational.

Thursday morning the members started bringing their plates for the display. Twenty-eight members participated by bringing plates from their collection. Again, thanks to all of those who were willing to pack up their glass and share part of their collection for this program. Some members came by air, so they had to travel long distances with the plates on their lap, then they had to return the same way. We very much appreciate your effort. When they were all finally in place, there were 210 plates on display, with only two duplicates. It was a very impressive display of Carnival Glass. The willingness of members to participate makes these displays possible.

On Friday morning Tom Burns provided a one and one half hour talk about the plates. We knew we were in for a long talk when he had not discussed the first fifty plates in forty five minutes, but after apprising him of the time restrictions he moved along in a more timely manner. He could have probably talked twice as long, but other planned activities prohibited him from being able to talk longer. His discussion was very interesting and informative. Thanks again Tom for the very interesting and knowledgeable talk. The display and talk by Tom was video taped. It will be available later. See next month's bulletin.

About 150 members attended the luncheon on Friday where the "JOHN AND LUCILE BRITT AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CARNIVAL GLASS" was presented to Richard and Carol Cinclair. Cliff Ball introduced the Cinclairs and reviewed their many accomplishments. Both Richard and Carol have been active in the Texas Carnival Glass club, where they have both served as Bulletin Secretary. Richard also served as Vice-President and President. Richard has been the Vice-President and is now the President of the ICGA. He has given educational programs at many of the carnival glass clubs conventions. Tom Mordini, Nona Glass Taylor, and Floyd Whitley presented some information and amusing anecdotes about the Cinclairs. Floyd Whitley invited a Trumpet player to play the "Eyes of Texas" for the Cinclairs so they would be reminded of their adopted state. The Cinclairs are well deserving of this award.

Friday afternoon Jerry & Carol Curtis selected four members to judge the seventy-three Room Displays. The displays were all outstanding. Much planning

and work had gone into the displays. Most everyone attending the convention wants to get around to see all of the displays. A lot of very rare and unusual patterns are shown in the various displays. They are very much an educational part of any convention. Those judged the best were:

He showed some of his favorite pieces, some of Carol's favorite pieces, and some of their favorite pieces. The presentation was very informative.

April 5-8, 2000: It was spring break time at the school where Cindy teaches, so we took advantage of the location and date to visit some early historical sites and attend the second annual WWW.CGA convention at Williamsburg, Virginia. We thought the time (April beat the influx of tourists) and the location were a good choice. We went a few days early and accomplished what we intended, but only after a somewhat questionable greeting on our arrival at the hotel. We arrived as planned at 3 p.m. and our room was not available. Stork & Rushes Fruit Bowl vs. Punch Bowl

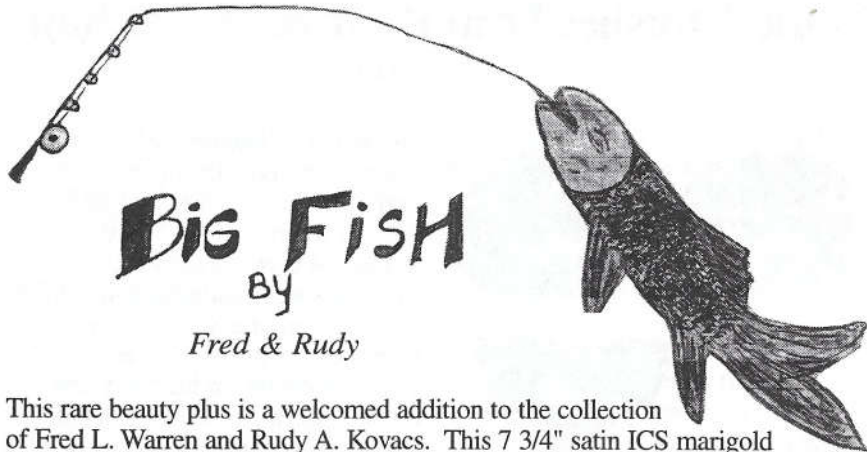
We started collecting carnival glass many years ago with a gift from Lorraine's mother of a marigold Stork & Rushes bowl. Many years and lots of carnival glass later we were the successful bidders in a local glass auction of a Summer Days vase. Knowing that this vase was used as the base for the Stork and Rushes punch set, we were delighted and surprised with a winning bid of \$5.00. And others at the auction were stunned as they were apparently caught dozing. One lady approached us immediately and asked to buy it.

We informed her that we would not even think of selling it as we had the punch bowl top at home. Wrong! To our surprise the Stork & Rushes we had at home turned out to be a large fruit bowl, not the punch bowl.

After several more years of watching and waiting we were finally able to purchase a punch bowl top. This article hopefully will shorten the time it takes others to recognize the difference between the fruit bowl and the larger punch bowl.

The fruit bowl (on the left) is a slightly smaller bowl than the punch bowl that measures 8 1/2" across and 3 3/4" high. But, has a very large collar base that measure some 5 1/2" across. On the other hand the punch bowl is somewhat larger, 9 1/2" in diameter and 4 1/2" deep, with a much smaller 4" collar base. The Summer Days vase fits within this 4" collar. And yes, the vase pattern, a bouquet of flowers, is upside down when used as the punch bowl support.

That one-inch difference in the size of the bowls is very evident when compared side by side but not that obvious when shopping in some remote antique mall. This punch bowl can be found as shown and also found ruffled. This punch set is known in both marigold and amethyst. Amethyst punch cups are readily found, and we have seen one Summer Days vase in amethyst, but we have never personally seen the complete amethyst punch set. Although we have been assured that they do exist. Dugan Glass is credited with making Stork & Rushes. But who made the Summer Days vase used for the base on this so-called Dugan punch set? Angela Hallam's 1981 book "Carnival Glass" states: "A retired Davidson maker can recall turning them out." Davidson Glass was a well-known English glassmaker.

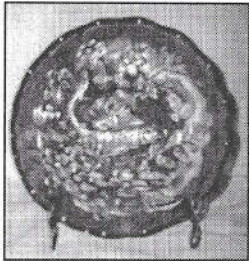


Big Fish

This rare beauty plus is a welcomed addition to the collection of Fred L. Warren and Rudy A. Kovacs. This 7 3/4" satin ICS marigold bowl with depth of 2 3/4" is the second bowl in marigold to surface. Confirmed by Marie McGee, owner of number one Big Fish ICS bowl in marigold which has been in her collection for years. Talk about a great snare!



Comparing the marigold and amethyst Big Fish ICS bowls, there is a marked difference. The amethyst bowl is 8 1/4" in width and 2 1/4" in depth. Both bowls have excellent iridescence and base colors and were difficult catches. As of late, the marigold Big Fish seems to be smiling, can it be? Foster homes are a thing of the past.

Could it be Vaseline?

We just got the HOACGA Bulletin, good reading and info in it. Looking forward to the last vase section for our notebook.

But, the real reason I'm writing about this time: has anyone seen a vaseline orange tree plate marigold overlay? We can't seem to find where or who or if one exists or not. We stopped at a mall at Wautoma, WI the other day and they had a marigold orange tree plate that was so filthy and dirty. We haggled on it and bought it. When we cleaned it with Comet like George says, it became one of the most beautiful plates with beautiful iridescence of red, blue, pink, green & even all over the plate. It is very dark marigold. I put it up to my black light and bang — all of the collar base and 3" up glow and all of the outside edge glows. We need help to see if there is one in existence. The glow is real strong. Could it be vaseline? Hoping so. Thank you.

Annual Treasurers Report

Our HOACGA financial condition continues to be sound. During the fiscal year ending on February 29, 2000, our club's cash receipts totaled \$66,142.67. Our expenses for this same time period were \$58,517.29 . . . giving us an increase of \$7,625.28 in our total cash assets.

It is anticipated that expenses will go up in the new fiscal year, while our receipts could be off . . . since we will not be receiving any additional restitution payments from the former Treasurer . . . and we may see a drop in the sale of closeout souvenirs. In this last fiscal year we received \$4,250 in restitution payments and \$3,525 from the sale of closeout souvenirs. These two sources of income accounted for all of our net gain in cash assets.

The club's expenses will be going up this year since we will be:

- A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

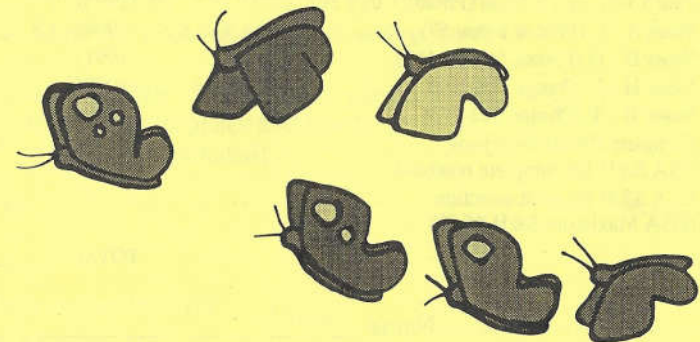
It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

- **Membership Dues** – \$25.00 per year U.S. & Canada. \$40.00 per year for foreign. The Membership Year is from the date of joining to one year later. Dues are set by the Board of Directors to support the publication of the monthly bulletin, typing, printing and mailing.
- **Educational Series – Book I** – 148 articles with pictures (black and white) on a variety of Carnival Glass Patterns.
- **Educational Series – Book II** – 180 articles with pictures (black and white) of Carnival Glass Tumblers.
- **Educational Series – Book III** – 150 articles with pictures (black and white) of Bon Bons, Bowls, Drinking Vessels, Novelties, Rose

Bowls, and Table Sets. Also included is a listing of 500 rarities.

- **Hartung Carnival Glass Pattern Books** – A set of 10 books identifying Carnival Glass Patterns. These books are a must for all Carnival Glass Collectors, especially for the beginner. These are the only complete set of books available that identifies the majority of the carnival glass patterns. Sketches are in black and white.
- **Pattern Notebook** – A notebook containing sections on Mugs, Table Sets, Rosebowl, Water Sets (including painted sets), Plates (small, regular & chop), Compotes (large, regular & small), Punch Sets and Vases. 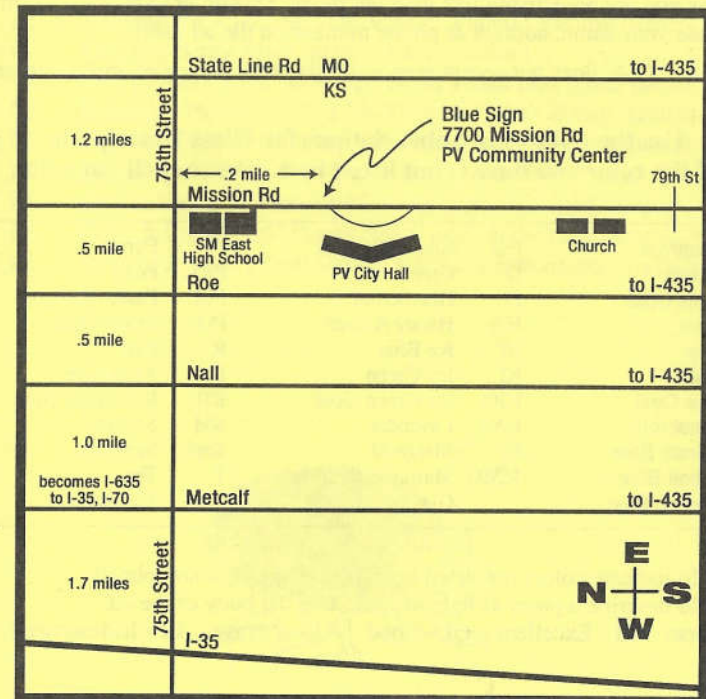

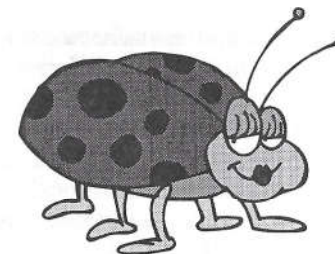
