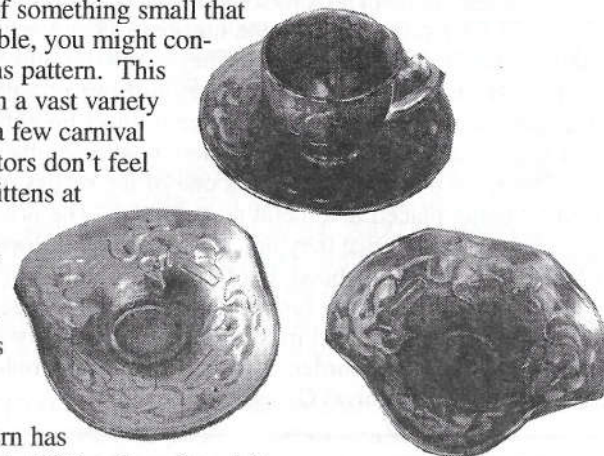
## Fenton's Kittens

If you are thinking of something small that is also quite collectable, you might consider Fenton's Kittens pattern. This cute pattern comes in a vast variety of shapes and quite a few carnival colors. Some collectors don't feel that these are little kittens at all, but really mice.

However, these little critters are drinking out of a pan or feeding dish. The shapes run from cup and saucers to ultra rare

spittoons. This pattern has been listed as Fenton's #299 and we found it illustrated in a 1919 Butler Brothers ad under "Glass Toys and Novelties." The ad shows the cup and saucer and states that the pattern was made especially for children. It sold then for \$1.25 per dozen. Today you can see prices all the way to \$1750 (HOACGA auction in 1999) for a blue cup and saucer. What will they sell for ten years from now?



The known shapes found are numerous. Cups and saucers, plates, banana dishes, card trays, cereal bowls, four ruffle and six ruffle bowls, toothpicks, vases, and the rare spittoons. The colors range from common marigold, blue, amethyst, aqua, vaseline, teal, amethyst opal and crystal glass. Sherman Hand's book, "The Collectors Encyclopedia of Carnival Glass" states that "green is almost impossible to find." There are possibly other colors that we have missed. There is also a variation in the pattern. Most pieces have four groups of Kittens and some shapes like the cup have only two groups.

Children's sets are very collectable and sought after by many collectors. We recently managed to buy a child's table set (Wild Rose with Scrolling in chocolate glass) that we have searched for for many years. So it only stands to reason that Kittens pieces are treasured by other than just carnival glass collectors. When selling a dish with two sides up, call it a banana dish, as they bring more money according to the auction guides. One of the many quirks of carnival glass pricing.

They wanted to offer him an Ice Green, 10 ruffled, Horse Head bowl. The bowl had a small chip on one of the ruffles, which was probably caused by being placed in a metal plate holder. The price for the bowl was \$4.98. That was the price they had paid at a Thrift Store that day. Ed tried to pay them more for the bowl, but they would only take the same amount they paid for it. Ed did pay for lunch though. Other than the small chip, the bowl has excellent color and iridescence. Maybe a trip to the Thrift Store periodically would be in order. How many people would believe you were there shopping for Carnival Glass?

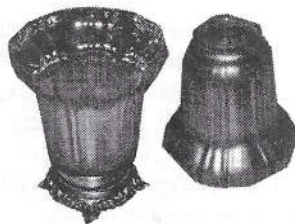

## Another Fabulous Plate

Item #105 on the Auction brochure for the ICGA convention on July 1 was a "Fenton Leaf Chain 9 1/4" plate, yellow base glass, great pastel iridescence". There was no doubt about the base glass being a yellow color. The listing in the brochure was very descriptive. This is only the second yellow plate that has been reported. This plate and the other one, the "Orange Tree" are Fenton patterns. The plate sold for \$5,100.00. This plate could be properly listed as a "Rarity".

Item #25 was listed as "Northwood Hearts & Flowers compote, custard w/ marigold overlay, GREAT". It sold for \$4,000.00. It was more of a moonstone than a custard. A few, four or five, of these pieces are known.

Item #88 was listed as "Northwood Grape & Cable creamer, amethyst". It sold for \$325.00. The iridescence was outstanding. If the buyer has other pieces to this set with the same iridescence, they have an outstanding set. This would be close to a record price for the table set piece.

Item #304 was listed as "Northwood Stippled Grape & Cable Variant 9" plate w/ ribbed back, pastel marigold, beautiful, has outer rings as on the Stippled Strawberry bowls". This plate had outstanding color and iridescence. It sold for \$2,000.00.

itage and culture of Holmes County, Ohio, a rural community with the second largest Amish population in the United States.

On the eastern seaboard, I am tempted to carry the concept of provenance one step further by mentioning the J.H. Ledford Cooleemee, N.C. and Spector's Department Store plates, both manufactured by Fenton. The Cooleemee, NC plate is an example of a rare advertising plate, deep rich marigold in color that sold last year in Hagerstown, MD for \$15K. The price I believe attributed to rarity and influenced by provenance- a fine glassware item symbolic of the southern or rural merchant trade of the Carolina region. The Spector's Department store plate, I find highly desirable and also possesses provenance. This plate and the history behind is a testimonial to the retail trade of a small rural General Store in Pennsylvania, hardly a department store by today's standards. These plates are superb examples of carnival advertising and both have nice patterns-Heart and Vine.

Internationally, examples of Australian provenance are readily available, especially if the collector seeks to collect fine examples of Australian wildlife portrayed in glass. For collectors with an interest in Australian carnival, I recommend considering these glass patterns Emu, Kangaroo, Kingfisher, Kookaburra, Kiwi, Magpie and Swan. The animals portrayed in the glass are mostly native to Australia and New Zealand.

A new century it is, and the savvy carnival glass collector will look for new opportunities. I recommend putting a little provenance in your collection. Good hunting.

**Sixth Vase Section:** Some of the vases were not included in the first five sections, because they were not available at the time the section was being prepared. If you do not know anything about the vase please send a photograph of the vase, maybe I can find someone that will know something about it. The intent is to identify as many vases as is possible. If you have a vase and do not send a photograph it cannot be included. This section may have a lot of "Maker & Pattern Unknown" listed but it would be good to at least show the vase. Most of the carnival glass started out as unknown but with the continuing research it will be identified. **SO GET THAT VASE OUT AND SEND IT'S PHOTOGRAPH FOR THE NEXT SECTION:** This next section will probably conclude the vase information.

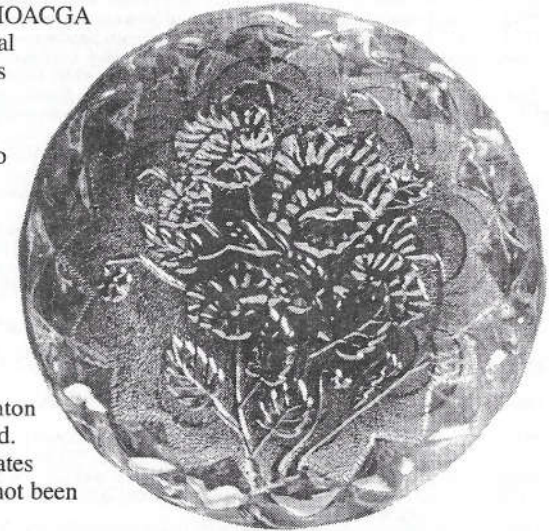

## HOACGA 2000 Souvenir Imperial "Pansy" 9 inch Plate

For the Year 2000 Souvenir HOACGA made a Plate using the Imperial "Pansy" pattern. The plate was made, in cobalt blue, by the Fenton Art Glass Co. It is as pretty as any souvenir made so far. The iridescence is very bright and shows nice on the cobalt blue background. The plate was pressed from the mold that L. G. Wright company made from the original Imperial "Pansy" pattern. When L.G. Wright Company sold all of their molds, the Fenton Art Glass Co. bought this mold. Most of the original Pansy plates were ruffled. The pattern has not been made before in this color.



Only 219 of these souvenir plates were made. Two Hundred have already been sold. If you have not ordered your plate, you should do so before they are all gone. The plate is dated "2000". The price is \$37.50 each plus \$3.50 for shipping. **Do not miss getting one of these souvenirs.**

- A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

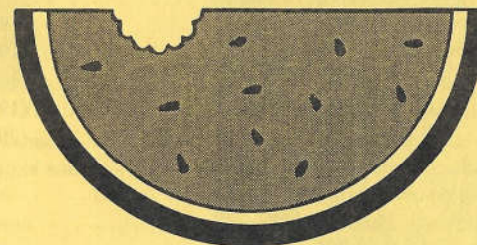
It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

- **Hartung Carnival Glass Pattern Books** – A set of 10 books identifying Carnival Glass Patterns. These books are a must for all Carnival Glass Collectors, especially for the beginner. These are the only complete set of books available that identifies the majority of the carnival glass patterns. Sketches are in black and white.

## Inverted Strawberry

by Robert Grissom

### Motif Series

### Heart of America Carnival Glass Association

June 2000

Inverted Strawberry was made by the Cambridge Glass Company. The "Inverted" part of the pattern name came from the fact that the pattern is pressed into the glass rather than raised as are most carnival glass patterns. Most pieces in this pattern are considered scarce to rare.

Cambridge is perhaps better known for their fine crystal and non-iridized glassware. Originally they used a "C" in a triangle as their trademark, but in 1906 they adopted "Near Cut." Many, but not all, of their carnival glass pieces contain this mark. The company was the second one to make carnival glass and went out of business in 1959.

Principal colors made were amethyst, green, and marigold with green being somewhat scarce. Blue is probably the least often seen color. No pastel colors are known.



**Water sets.** Sets are known in amethyst and marigold and are considered scarce. Tumblers have also been reported in green and an especially rare blue. Tumblers have been reproduced but do have the makers marks, so there should be no confusion. Milk pitchers, like that shown on the right, are reported only in amethyst with fewer than ten known.





**Celery vase and whimsy bonbon.** Both unusual pieces; the celery is one of just a couple known in green; a couple are also known in blue. The green bonbon whimsy is the only one so far reported.



**Compotes.** There are three different sizes of compotes, the giant, tall, and jelly. The giant (shown above) was made in amethyst, blue, green, and marigold—and none of the colors are seen very often. The tall compote, 6" high, are very rare and only marigold is known. One of these compotes is known with a ruffled top. The jelly compote (like that shown at the left) is about 3½" tall and known only in blue. It is rare.



**Table sets.** Table sets contain the usual four pieces: a covered butter dish, a covered sugar, a creamer, and a spooner. They are known in amethyst and marigold and any would be considered scarce. In 1983 an antique publication reported a blue set, but none have been confirmed.

**Breakfast sets.** These consist of a creamer and sugar with no lid, both being stemmed pieces. They are considered quite rare and found in blue.



**Spittoons and spittoon shapes.** The large bowl above was probably made from the large berry bowl. Whether it can be considered a spittoon or not is at question. It does cup in and then flare out as a spittoon must, but whether it was intended to be a spittoon remains a mystery. This one is amethyst. At the left is a small ladies spittoon, found in sufficient quantities in both marigold and green to suggest that it was a production item, not a whimsy.





**Bowls.** These are usually found in 7" or 10" round or slightly cupped in pieces. They will come in the usual amethyst, green, and marigold. Amethyst bowls are probably the most difficult to find. Because the pattern is only on the exterior, bowls are perceived as not being as desirable as other shapes. Ruffled bowls would be an unusual find. The sauce above measures 5" across and is blue. Note the Near Cut mark in the bottom.

**Berry sets.** These sets can be found in amethyst, green, and marigold. A complete set is seldom seen in any of the colors.

**Candlesticks.** These are 7" tall and are found in green and marigold. They're considered scarce to rare in either color.

**Powder Jar.** This is the only piece made that would be considered part of a dresser set. It is found in marigold and green.

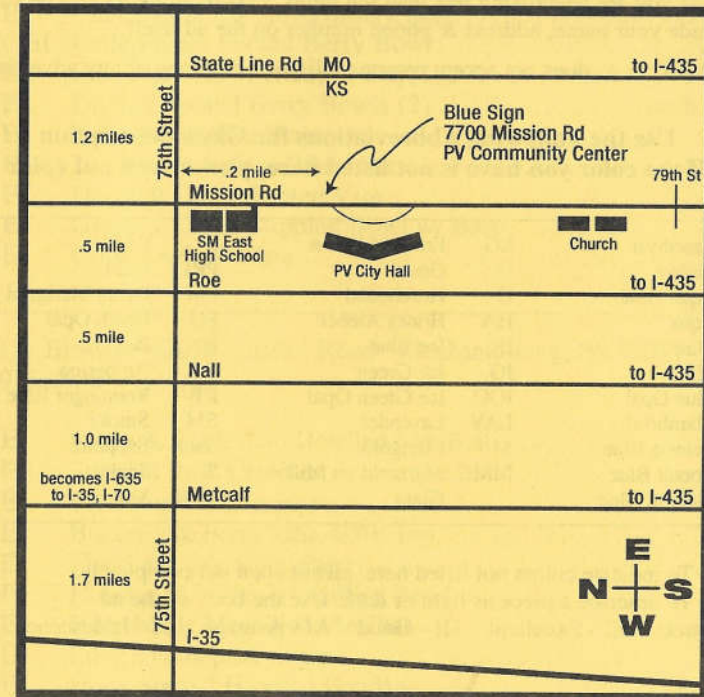
