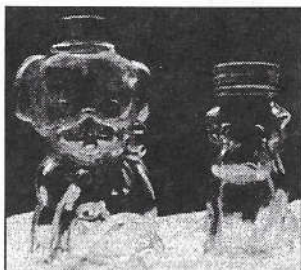

## The Dogs of Carnival

While "snooping" around in some flea markets in New Hampshire, I found these two "Dog" containers. They are clear glass that has been iridized. The dog on the left I have named "Big Brother". It is a cologne or bath oil container. The top is only 1/2" wide with an opening of only about 1/4", the height is 4 3/4" and is 2 1/2" wide. It is signed on the bottom "Manon Freres", which means "Manon Brothers".

The other container is a rather sad looking dog, it looks as if the rabbit just got away. I named him "Poochie". It is a candy container. The dimensions are 3 1/2" tall, with a 2" base. It has a white metal cap and has the letters "ML". Cap size is 5/8". John Britt had one of these with contained candy, and it had a red metal cap.

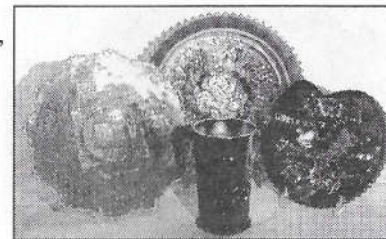

## Illinois Advertising on Carnival Glass

We read with interest Gerald Thomas' article on "Provenance in Your Collection," in last month's HOACGA bulletin. We think that these Illinois advertising pieces are a good example of provenance.



Illinois is also known as the Prairie State. Named after the Illini Indian tribe, Illinois entered the Union in 1818 as the 21st state. With an area of 55,935 square miles, it is profusely speckled with many antique shops and malls. We have spent many a day there seeking out fresh carnival glass treasures.

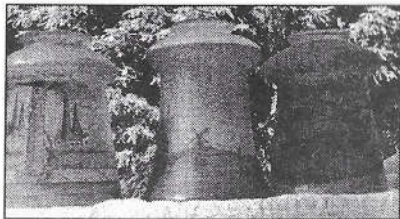
Some carnival glass items can be related directly to this state. The God and Home water set had its beginning in Dorsey, Illinois in Northern Madison County. The late O. Joe Olson researched its origin, segregating the rumors from the facts, and documented it in a book called "God and Home Carnival Glass Superstar." The water set was made available for Kuethe's general store that started in 1893. The tumblers were a premium for paying your grocery bills in a timely manner, and the jug was then sold to the customer to complete the set at a price of 75 cents. A few years ago we visited Dorsey and took pictures of the now crumbling but still standing store. The Kuethe family house and the local church and graveyard were also visited and photographed. The visit gave us a real feeling for the history of the "God and Home" tumbler pictured here. This water set was reproduced for L.G. Wright by Westmoreland Glass Company in 1974 in amethyst using the old Dugan moulds. The original water set is cobalt blue.

The Illinois "Soldiers and Sailors Home" plate is another example of provenance you can still relate to. The main structure of the building that is pictured on the plate can still be seen today in Quincy, Illinois. Then you can visit the many antique malls in the area. These plates are known in blue and marigold and were made by Fenton. The handgrip souvenir plate was a gift from "The Central Shoe Store of East St. Louis, Illinois." Made in amethyst plates and ruffled and ice cream shaped bowls by Fenton Art Glass Company. Then there is Northwood's "Grape and Cable" plate with the advertising legend "Old Rose Distilling Co. Wines and Liquors Chicago" on the back. This is found in a pretty green stippled 9" plate only.

So you can see Illinois has an interesting history of carnival glass, and these carnival glass pieces and the stories connected to them are great examples of "Provenance" and although the home of many carnival glass collectors, it is still "Good Picking."

## Carnival Glass Shades & Lamps

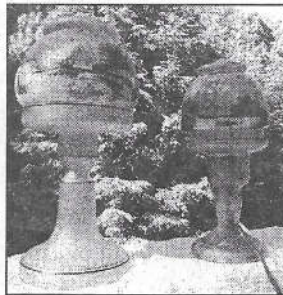

These three shades have not previously been identified. The colors are rather unusual, Pastel Blue. The first shade shows a group of homes with red roofs, bordering on a canal with a large column in front. I have named it "Venetian Village". The second shade

features a blue sailboat and a blue windmill with the ocean in front. I have given it the name of "Painted Blue Dutch". The third one is very simple, with two mallard ducks taking off from a lake with trees around it. It has a well textured surface. The shades are 5 1/2" tall, with a top opening of 2 1/4".

I believe the two boudoir lamps shown here were made in Czechoslovakia, the larger one has a paper label that identifies it as Czechoslovakia. The lamp on the left (larger) has a marigold painted scenery, with a house and lake behind it. This lamp has been electrified. It is 10" tall, 5" across at the widest point, and has a 4" base. The smaller lamp has a painting of a large windmill and trees. It is 9" tall, globe is 4", and base is 3 1/4" wide. These lamps were found in New Hampshire.



The single boudoir lamp is in a rose pattern. It has a band of roses that go around the middle of the shade. The color of the roses alternate in pink and white. There is a white band near the top with white lines going down to the roses. I named this lamp "Kris's Roses" for Kris Dorais of Rhode Island. Kris raises roses and enters them in competition. The dimensions are 10" tall, 5" at the widest point, with a base of 4". This lamp was found in Maine.

## Purple Passion

### An Examination of Imperial's Purple Carnival Glass

The first piece of purple Imperial glass to find its way into my collection happened quite by chance. Several years ago, I spotted a carnival gem, a little purple Imperial Grape plate just dripping with iridescence. I also found an appreciation of the vibrancy of purple found in the base glass color- Imperial's purple glass. Over time, my curiosity and interest with Imperial's purple glass gradually increased. On more than one occasion, I did view a New Jersey collection with a wide assortment of carnival, the focal point of the collection centered on old Imperial Glass in purple. A Field Flower vase with stippled background was captivating in appearance and I do regret not buying it when the owner offered it for sale.

Moving forward, a few pieces of Imperial glass did join my collection this spring. The richness of color, superb iridescence and detailed mold work are first class on most pieces of Imperial carnival. Old Imperial is still in my opinion reasonably priced. If vivid colors and brilliant iridescence have a place in your collection, then may I suggest placing a few pieces of Imperial glass on your shelf, purple being a good first choice of colors. Below are a few "purple" recommendations identified by pattern:

Beaded Bulls Eye	Luster Rose*
Field Flower*	Open Rose*
Imperial Grape*	Pansy*
Hattie	Windmill*

\* Note: Be mindful of contemporary glassware in these patterns trade-marked but not always disclosed as contemporary glassware by casual or unscrupulous dealers.

Sometimes glass with "color" outweighs rarity and has greater broad based collector appeal. If you are serious about vibrant color in your carnival collection, then consider adding a little "purple passion." Good hunting down the carnival glass trail.

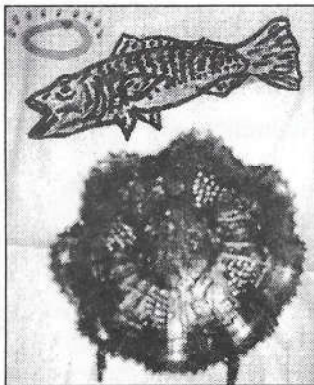
We still need your help in participating in the research project. We have received only 18 replies out of over a 1000 family memberships. This is not an adequate response to make the project meaningful.

was purchased in one of the rooms, not at the auction, so it may not be listed in 2000 price index.

# U.S. Glass Company & "Frolicking Bear"

Recently I was working on a "Cosmos & Cane" colored insert for the HOACGA bulletin. In order to obtain some information on this pattern, I was reading an article from a 1982 "The Glass Collector" magazine on the U.S. Glass Co. The magazine was edited and published by William Heacock. In this article he states "the most startling news - I hesitate using the expression earth shattering, but that was how I felt when I saw it - was the appearance of the FROLICKING BEARS pitcher/tumbler in a circa 1910 U.S. Glass catalogue found at Corning".

Because of so few pieces known, the pattern does not get much discussion. Since my only association with this pattern is from a distance, I was not aware that the pattern was attributed to the U.S. Glass Co. After reading some other articles written on the "Frolicking Bear" pattern they also referred to the same reference as to the maker. I guess that I am just not very observant.

While looking through information about the "Cosmos & Cane" pattern I ran across the following article. I thought it would be of interest to many collectors. I also decided to try and trace the ownership history of the Frolicking Bear pieces.

To some of the newer collectors, O. Joe Olson was instrumental in forming the first carnival glass organization, the "Society of Carnival Glass Collectors" (SCGC). He later published the "Carnival Glass News & Views" & "Carnival Glass Tumbler News".

*The following is an article that appeared in the March 10, 1975, "The Carnival Glass Tumbler News" by O. Joe Olson:*

## Bears Pattern As Pre-Carnival

Facts Reviewed on Discovery and Sale of three known Pitchers and Single Tumbler Together with Views on Pattern by Three Prominent Writers.

The Frolicking Bears pattern must have delighted collectors when introduced in clear and green colored glass in the later Victorian period of pressed glass, circa 1890-1905.

The marvelous detail of the design captured action in a uniquely humorous tableaux, anticipating the world of Walt Disney.

Some sixty years later, when a few specimen pieces were found in carnival glass, the pattern and pieces became highly prized. It became one of the most publicized and discussed patterns in the first decade of the old carnival revival, in 1957-67.

This view of all that is known about the pattern in carnival is timely. It will summarize the finding and sale of the single tumbler and three pitchers confirmed to exist. It is hoped the account may dispel the aura of mystery that has

surrounded the pattern for some time. This confusion probably stems from conflicting reports. Collectors may weigh the facts and form their opinions.

The "Frolicking Bears" pattern was named by two well-known pattern writers in what may have been an accidental dead-heat publishing race in 1962.

Alice Hulet Metz, Chicago, the last of three great pattern glass writers active in the 1935-65 period, featured the tumbler in a full-sized sketch on the front cover of her Booklet No. 5 published early in 1962.

Marion T. Hartung, Emporia, Kansas, drew the tumbler loaned by the Rev. Leslie C. Wolfe, then of Newman, Illinois, and the sketch appeared in her Book 3 published in the Spring of 1962. Both Metz and Hartung called the pattern Frolicking Bears. Was this a coincidence? Was the name obvious, perhaps inescapable? This assumption seems warranted since Mrs. Metz and Mrs. Hartung did not collaborate. But the most difficult question of all to answer is how both of them choose the "humor in glass" category for the pattern?

When Rose Presznick, Lodi, Ohio, caught up with the pattern and drew a sketch and notes four years later published in her Book 2 in 1966, she pulled out all the stops possibly smarting from being scooped in her field. She gave the tumbler pattern three names: Bear, Happy Bears and the Six Clowns. Then she priced the tumbler in marigold, blue, purple, green, white and red! She never amended or corrected in print her notes published in 1966 although they stirred controversy and also cast a shadow on the author's recollections, as will be noted.

## Reluctant To Pay \$10.00

The Frolicking Bears tumbler loaned to Mrs. Hartung for Book No. 3 came to Wolfe in an unusual manner. Wolfe was pastor of the Christian church in Newman and also taught high school science. At the age of 33, in 1951, he also became an art glass dealer. He was attracted to carnival and began buying better pieces.

About 1954, a dealer friend in Joy, Illinois, sold his glass to finance construction of a new home. He offered Wolfe a group of tumblers. Wolfe recalled:

"My friend described a Bears tumbler in green glass which he guaranteed as rare and unusual. He said he had found it in the Indianapolis area. I had never seen one like he described and I was rather reluctant to take it at \$10 since the price of most carnival tumblers was \$1 each at that time. The tumbler became a cherished part of our collection."

The Rev. and Mrs. Wolfe were color specialists. They concentrated on finding the best color possible for every piece. They continually upgraded their tumblers, selling those that were replaced.

The Frolicking Bears tumbler, while undoubtedly rare, was an embarrassment to the Wolfes on account of its poor color. It was kept in the back of the tumbler display case because it was such a contrast in finish to the other tumblers.

Wolfe frequently related his experience in acquiring the tumbler and would give an opinion as to its rarity before apologizing for the iridescence which he described as an oily or smokey finish.

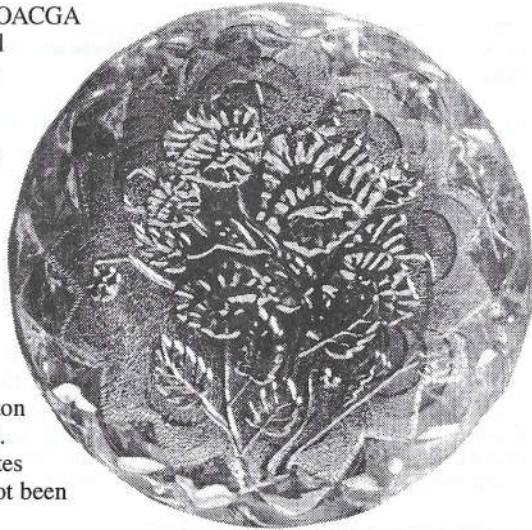

## HOACGA 2000 Souvenir Imperial "Pansy" 9 inch Plate

For the Year 2000 Souvenir HOACGA made a Plate using the Imperial "Pansy" pattern. The plate was made, in cobalt blue, by the Fenton Art Glass Co. It is as pretty as any souvenir made so far. The iridescence is very bright and shows nice on the cobalt blue background. The plate was pressed from the mold that L. G. Wright company made from the original Imperial "Pansy" pattern. When L.G. Wright Company sold all of their molds, the Fenton Art Glass Co. bought this mold. Most of the original Pansy plates were ruffled. The pattern has not been made before in this color.



Only 219 of these souvenir plates were made. Two Hundred have already been sold. If you have not ordered your plate, you should do so before they are all gone. The plate is dated "2000". The price is \$37.50 each plus \$3.50 for shipping. **Do not miss getting one of these souvenirs.**

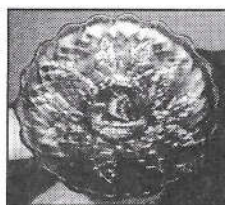

July 22, 2000: Ayres Auction, Carlinville, IL. The Holiday Inn is the only thing at the Interstate exit except for the corn and bean fields – and they sure looked good this year. I like the location and the Ayres auction team had glass waiting for every level of collector.

David and Amy always feature live telephone bidding as well as absentee or mail bids. Some 10 or 12 items went to phone bidders this time. I like the phone bid idea and think it should become more popular. In my opinion it doesn't really affect the flow of the auction. I was surprised that the phone bidding wasn't limited to the high dollar items — this is a good sign.

I bought the amber Lustre Rose Creamer (\$30) and it was nice. David's "WOW!" must have applied only to the color and iridescence, as it did have a small chip. I thought the better pieces sold very well, but there seemed to be some room left on a few of the European pieces. I like the marigold Roundup Ruffled plate (\$355), pastel lime green Hearts and Flowers 9" plate (\$3700), ice green Leaf Chain 7 1/2" plate (\$4100), marigold stippled 9" G & C variant plate (\$1700), and the green (Ayres called it spruce green) 9" Fenton Vintage plate at \$4000.

There was a good crowd, and the glass went to many different bidders. I didn't see glass being returned, which speaks well for the glass and the auction company. A nice gesture was the pizza the auction company provided at the lunch break — thanks David and Amy.

July 25-28, 2000: It was American Carnival Glass Association convention time at Parkersburg, West Virginia. I liked the location as it was only a few miles to the Fenton Art Glass Factory and many of us took advantage of this to tour the glass factory. I always learn something when I go on these tours. My daughter, Cindy, and I were at the convention all four days, but looking back on it all we probably could have chopped a day off the front and visited the factory on our own.

I thought I saw quite a few people arrive Thursday afternoon, which meant they were there only for one night and the auction; as a result they missed a fine seminar by Frank Fenton. Supposedly the members were going to bring glass for Frank to discuss, but not knowing what and how many pieces to expect, Mr. Fenton arrived with a supply of his own glass and was prepared to talk about edges and edge treatments. 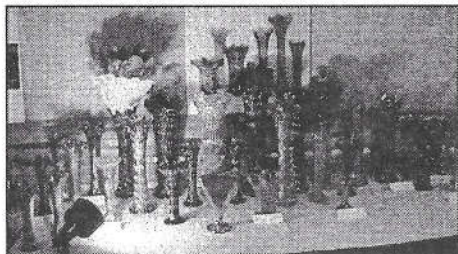

- A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

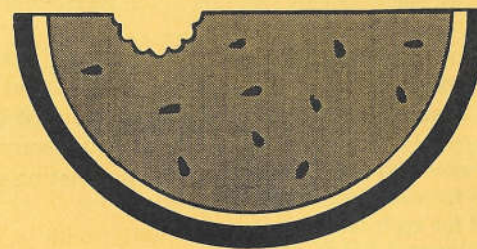
It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

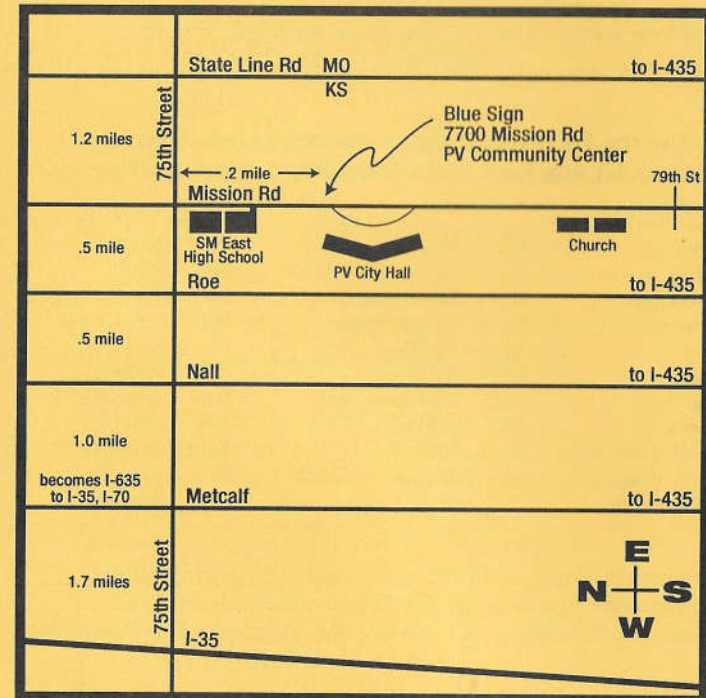

### **Hartung Guessed Fentons**

He brought the Bears and God and Home tumblers to Mrs. Hartung in the summer of 1961 for her Book No. 3. In her notes, Mrs. Hartung cited the "excellence" of detail and the humor captured by the "romping" bears. She wrote: "It ranks with the top few (pieces) in pattern glass, whether iridescent or not."

She thought it might have been made by Fentons because she found a resemblance of the border on the Bears tumbler to that of the Lotus and Grape pattern (H-2 p 114) which was a confirmed Fentons design.

She pointed out an unusual feature of the Bears tumbler - that the pattern at the bottom "ran down over the edge and up underneath. Thus the tumbler has not flat base but rests on the curving vine. There is not straight edge at the bottom. We know of not other pattern like it and the feature adds to the outstanding quality of this piece of glass."

### **Bears Tumbler in Price Guide**

In 1964, in her first price guide, Hartung listed the Bears tumbler at \$50.00, a high price at that time. The Christmas compote in purple was valued at \$65.00 that year.

In 1965, Hartung priced the Bears tumbler at \$125.00 and in 1966, at \$175.00.

In the Spring of 1966, Rex and Phyllis Lyons, Swayzee, Indiana, turned up the first Bears water pitcher in olive green glass with fair iridescence matching the tumbler in the Wolfe Collection.

The pitcher was reported to have appeared at a rural rummage sale in North Central Indiana. It was handled by many collectors, and dealers who passed it up as unattractive. There also was a chip at the top of the handle and the handle appeared to be cracked. The pitcher sold originally for \$5.00 and passed through several hands before the Lyons locked it up. They sold it for a reported \$2,500 - a carnival record at that time - to a collector in Pennsylvania.

The Lyons supplied the pitcher measurements and details on the sale to Mrs. Hartung who listed the Frolicking Bears pitcher at \$2,500.00 and the tumbler at \$900.00 in her 1967 price guide.

This made everyone take notice since the purple Christmas compote had only reached \$265.00 and the Cleveland Centennial tray, \$215.00. The People's vase, which six years later was to bring \$8,200.00 and then \$10,000.00, was not listed by Hartung in 1967.

A second Bears pitcher in olive green carnival was turned up by the Lyons, again reportedly in northern Indiana, in 1970 and sold to Mary Elizabeth Collier for \$3000.00.

The third known Bears pitcher, again in olive green, was bought for \$10.00 by a woman who knew her patterns at a garage sale in northeast Kansas City in October, 1972. The embossed Bears gave her the necessary hint to the pattern, but she wasn't sure it was carnival until she had washed it at her home.

### **Offered to HOACGA President**

The pitcher was offered first to the president of the Heart of America Carnival Society for \$2,500.00. He almost fainted but referred the finder to another club officer (Dorothy Taylor) who made a telephone bid of \$3,000.00. Before this offer was accepted, a third collector (Jim Mogg) drove from northern Missouri to Kansas City and bought the pitcher for about \$3,200.00.

As for the only confirmed carnival Bears tumbler, when Wolfe broke up and sold his fourth and final carnival collection, he advertised the Bears tumbler for \$900.00 in the Antique Trader. It was sold to an Illinois dealer who stored it in a bank vault until she arranged its sale to the Tennessee collector who had bought the second pitcher found by the Lyons couple.

Mrs. Metz, in her front cover report on the Bears tumbler in her Booklet No. 5, published in 1962, said the tumbler in clear had been loaned by an Illinois dealer. She stated the pattern to that time had been unlisted in pattern glass.

She found the tumbler was non-flint and observed that the Grape border reminded her of similar patterns of the 1860's where she was inclined to assign the pattern.

"A water pitcher also has been reported", she wrote, "but that is all." She felt the pattern would fit into many classifications but wrote, "I think the category of humor in pattern glass would be most appropriate."

She repeated these facts in covering the Bears pattern in her Book II published in 1965, containing 1,500 patterns and notes about American pressed glass. She priced the clear tumbler at \$25.00 and the pitcher at \$45.00. Mrs. Metz died Dec. 10, 1969.

### **Notes by Rose Presznik**

In March 1970, the writer visited the Ronald Cox antique show at the Indianapolis fairgrounds. An art glass dealer from Massillon, Ohio, included in her display many pieces from a tumbler collection recently acquired. She had three clear Bear tumblers offered at \$25.00 each.

As for the inimitable Rose Presznick, in covering the Bears tumbler she wrote (book II, p. 7, published in 1966) as follows:

"The Happy Bears (Frolicking Bears) tumbler is very rare. I have personally seen only three, the marigold, blue and green. The tumbler my drawing was made from did not have the design to the bottom of the base but (came to) about 1/2inch above it. The other two had the design rolling under the very edge of the bottom.

Recently I had a Bears tumbler offered (to me) for (my) museum at \$100.00 which is out of line for one in marigold or even the other carnival colors. Perhaps sometime we can present (to) you, my carnival friends, the pitcher. Assumed (the pattern is) Fentons. The names given this tumbler and other items sometimes make believe that the general run of carnival lovers are also a happy lot"

Two years earlier, Mrs. Presznick kindly contributed on request the first article in the first newsletter of the original carnival society, published August 10,

1964. She wrote a general appreciation of carnival. She included a special announcement to appear with the article. Rose wrote:

"We regret to announce the recent losses at the Presznick Carnival Museum in Lodi, Ohio, were a small green (Buzz Saw) cruet, a Bears tumbler, and the J.I. Case souvenir plate. We are now open only by appointment."

These notes written by Mrs. Presznick underline the truth than no one has seen all the rarities in carnival and no one knows it all. It certainly is possible that the Bears tumblers she described exist in someone's collection. It also should be added, however, that no knowledgeable carnival collector has reported seeing any of these Bears tumblers in the last ten years.

As for Presznick's pricing of the Bears tumblers, also in Book II (1966), this was an example of how her mind worked at that time. Her prices on the Bears tumblers were: Marigold, \$30.00; blue, purple and/or green, \$45.00; white, \$60.00; and red, \$75.00.

Of course, this was only a "projection," Rose explained later. The prices she printed would apply only "if and when" the tumblers were manufactured and marketed. It also was Rose's way of saying: Thanks for letting me tickle your fancy. Have a nice day!"

The Rev. Wolfe, who made a significant contribution to the carnival glass hobby, retired from full-scale participation with the sale of his collection in 1970.

### Travels of the "Frolicking Bears" — Pitchers

1966 - Rex & Phyllis Lyons, purchased a pitcher at a rural rummage sale in north central Indiana - Originally sold for \$5.00 - Lyons sold the pitcher for \$2,600.00 to Ray Wishard. This is the one that Mrs. Hartung used to identify the pattern. The Woody Auction Co. sold the Wishard collection on March 10 - 12, 1977, in Louisville, Kentucky. The "Frolicking Bears" pitcher was item # 518 on the auction list, and it sold to Paul Jankauer of Chicago, Illinois for \$3,100.00. This pitcher was sold at his auction on February 17 & 18, 1978. The auction was conducted by the Woody Auction Co. and was held in St Louis Missouri. Cooley Miller of Kansas City, Missouri was the successful bidder for the pitcher. Cooley sold the pitcher at his auction, at the HOACGA convention, on April 25, 1981. The sale was conducted by the Woody Auction Co. It was item #15 "Frolicking Bear pitcher - Green - Chip" on the auction brochure. Carl & Ferne Schroeder were the successful bidders for the pitcher. They now have it in their collection.

1970 - Rex & Phyllis Lyons found this pitcher. They sold it to Mary Elizabeth Collier for \$3000.00. She sold her collection at an auction on February 6 & 7, 1976. The auction was in St. Louis, Missouri, and was conducted by the Woody Auction Co. According to a written notation by John Britt on his copy of the sale bill, the pitcher sold to John Roller, for \$6,100.00. John Roller owned Whitehorse Antiques of Pearisburg, Virginia. According to the October 15, 1982 "Carnival Glass News and Views" John Roller was bidding it for Sam Roebuck. The pitcher was sold in the Roebuck auction on September 4, 1982. The auction was in St. Louis, Mo by the Woody Auction Co. The pitcher was

item #172 "Frolicking Bears Water Pitcher - green; this is the pitcher which sold in the Collier auction in 1976, extremely rare". It sold for \$3,000.00, and the notation on the John Britt auction list has the name of "Jones". The October 15, 1982 "Carnival Glass News and Views" reported that Dr. Allen B. Jones, veterinarian of Bristol, Virginia purchased the pitcher. Presently Rabon & Malphi Hall, Virgi, Kentucky own the pitcher. It came to them from Norene Duran of New Mexico. She purchased it from Dr. Allen Jones. (Dr. Jones said that he purchased the pitcher at the Olson, Herrington, Mogg auction conducted by the Woody Auction Co. in January 1982. But, the "Frolicking Bear" pitcher is not listed on that sale bill).

1972 - The Pitcher that was discovered at a garage sale in Kansas City. It was purchased by a lady for \$10.00. She sold it to Jim Mogg, within 2 days, for \$3,200.00. It was sold at his auction in St. Louis. The Mogg auction was held on June 23, 1979 in St Louis, Mo. It was item # 286 and was listed as "Green Frolicking Bears pitcher, excellent color, extremely rare". The auction was conducted by the Woody Auction Co. Floyd & Cecil Whitley purchased the pitcher at this auction for \$9,200.00. The Whitleys sold the pitcher, in 2000, to Randy & Jackie Poucher.

If anyone has information that is different, please let me know so we can get the facts correct, and we can complete the story.
