Fenton's Pinecone

We were bidding on a 6 1/4" Pinecone twelve sided smooth edge plate recently on eBay and became involved in the age old question, what is it worth? Checking the price guides didn't help as we found there didn't seem to be any listings of a 6 1/4" size, 12 sided smooth edge plate. We have several Pinecone plates and sauce dishes around the house. After a quick check we were satisfied that all our pieces have saw tooth edges, some with small variations in edge treatment, but definitely not a smooth edge like this eBay plate. Okay, time for a little research on the Pinecone pattern. A write up in a 1997 San Diego County Carnival Glass bulletin mentions two edge variations without going into any detail. A phone call to a very knowledgeable small plate collector in Texas produced mixed results. She was not sure if she had one or had seen such a plate as her small plates were at the time packed away. (Thanks Eleanor)

The shapes listed in various publications cover 6 1/4" plates, 7 1/2" plates, sauce dishes and somewhat larger 7 to 8 inch bowls, ruffled, round and ice cream shaped. The small plate section of the HOACGA notebook shows the standard plates and lists the Pinecone/Wide Panel plate, but unfortunately doesn't have the picture. So we will include a picture of this saucer in this article. We consider the Pinecone 6 inch plate with the Wide Panel reverse a saucer that was sold with a Wreath of Roses punch cup in Fenton's advertisements shown in the 1911 Butler Brothers catalog. The two regular plate sizes have no pattern on the reverse, other than the three mold marks. The saucer on the other hand has a reverse pattern, Wide Panels, and also has a multi rayed pattern in the Marie area. This Pinecone saucer has a smooth 1/4" band surrounding the pinecone pattern. Bill Edward's 7th edition shows this Pinecone saucer. We believe that this can be found either flat or with a slightly rolled up edge. This is also found in ruffled sauce. See our November 1998 article on the Pinecone/Wreath of Roses cup and saucer marriage.

All the usual colors can be found. Colors listed are blue, amethyst, green, marigold and amber. There is also a listing of a Russet bowl? Russet was an exclusive Northwood color, we thought. Other colors that have to raise your eyebrows are lavender and sapphire. Did we get the eBay plate? No, although we had the high bid, the plate didn't meet the seller's reserve price. So we end up still not knowing what the value is on that twelve-sided smooth edge plate.



Frolicking Bear Tumbler

Last month's bulletin contained an article about the Frolicking Bears pattern, taken from the "Carnival Glass News and Views" written and published by O. Joe Olson.

This month's bulletin contains some additional information written about the Frolicking Bears tumbler. This information appeared in the October 15, 1982 "Carnival Glass News and Views" by O. Joe Olson.

BACKGROUND OF THE BEARS TUMBLERS

The first Bears tumbler appeared at an Ohio flea market about 1950 and then found its way from a collector in Indianapolis into the Rev. Leslie C. Wolfe's collection then in Newman, IL. For over 15 years, only one Bears tumbler was known. It reigned supreme from about 1960 to 1975. Wolfe accepted the tumbler as part trade in a business transaction. He accepted the tumbler with little enthusiasm because it had poor color and because in that day the average tumbler cost was only \$1 to \$2.

Mrs. Dorothy Willrett, dealer in DeKalb, IL, purchased the tumbler and put it in a bank safety deposit box. After a few months, she sold the rarity to Mary Elizabeth Collier.

Sam Roebuck outbid everyone for the Bears tumbler at the mammoth 1976 Collier auction. The price paid was \$3,500.00.

THREE BEARS TUMBLERS FOUND WITHIN A YEAR

The unhappy scarcity of Bears tumblers lingered on. Then, within an Il-month period, the spell was broken and three additional tumblers were found.

A second tumbler was found by Hazel Rawls, a dealer of Orange, Texas. She was enroute to the 1981 Chicago Mart antique show when she stopped in Indianapolis to visit a former collector who was selling her glass. The tumbler Mrs. Rawls found was reported in September 1981.

The third and fourth tumblers were the direct result of a sketch written and circulated by Terry Kovel in her, May 1982, syndicated column which "rang a bell" for two persons. They corresponded with the Kovels who put them in touch with carnival collectors who enabled them to sell their Bears tumblers at good market prices.

The third tumbler was found in Atlanta, Georgia. It came from a farm auction near Hunterstown, Indiana. Ten miles north of Fort Wayne, which Bleke attended as a teenager. Robert C. Bleke was born at Hunterstown and attended the Eel-Perry Consolidated school near Hunterstown. He recalled the auction sale that took place about 40 years ago. He said, "Farm sales were one of the relatively few interesting events on the farm."

He said that teenagers of that day were primarily drawn by the old furniture. "Few glass items came up at our auctions," but Bleke was drawn to a tumbler, light green color. The joyful mood of the bears was captured in the pattern of the piece. He had no competition for the tumbler which was sold to him upon a bid of 25 cents. His grandmother, who lived with the family, was partial to pretty glass. She had a shelf over the kitchen sink and the tumbler remained there about fifteen years.

Bleke enrolled at Swarthmore College, Swarthmore, Pa., where he earned a degree in management psychology. When he went to college the tumbler remained at home in Indiana. When his grandmother died, he gathered some of his personal belongings, including the tumbler, and took them to Durham, N.C., where he took graduate work at Duke University.

He became associated with a mid-west firm as management psychologist and remained there until ten years ago when he organized his own firm with offices on Peachtree street in Atlanta.

Upon reading the Kovel feature about the Bears, the Blekes wrote to Kovel in Cleveland, Ohio, enclosing a color print of their tumbler. The Kovels referred Bleke to the Editor who gave them an update on the market for Bears carnival glass.

The discovery of the fourth Bears tumbler had read the Kovel feature in the Kansas City Star. They were Mr. and Mrs. Leroy F. Lightheiser, a retired couple residing in Raymore, Mo (suburb south of Kansas City). (Note: There is no listing for any one with this last name in the present Kansas City Telephone directory)

They had obtained the tumbler from and estate sale of her nephew, William (Bill) Godfrey of Independence. "I went over to see what Bill had to sell," she recalled. He had a large display of various items including an unusual tumbler priced at \$1.00 that turned out to be the Bears pattern. "I bought it because I thought it was attractive and interest provoking," she explained.

When visited at his home in Independence, Bill Godfrey explained he was not a carnival collector and not a collector of any kind of glass at that time. He traced some of his relatives, including a grandfather and grandmother, who had lived most of their lives in Indiana, and another relative who had worked as a glassmaker, also in Indiana.

Mrs. Lightheiser wrote to the Kovels in Cleveland asking for a competent appraiser. She was directed to John Woody in Douglass, Kansas. Woody made an appointment with the couple at their home in Raymore. They considered Woody's offer and accepted cash for the tumbler. Mrs. Lightheiser was asked if she considered herself a carnival collector. She replied: "Not really, although I have ten or twelve pieces that have been in the family."

Neither of the owners were carnival collectors.

The rare tumblers were pursued separately by John Woody, well-know auction manager and auctioneer of Douglas, Kansas. He paid a large sum for each rarity.

TUMBLERS INVENTORY

According to and article in the HOACGA "Educational Series II", by John Britt, there are six known tumblers. All of the tumblers are the same color, a smokey olive green.

1 - Tumbler - Owned by Cecil Whitley. This is probably the first tumbler found and was the one owned by The Reverend Leslie Wolfe. It was originally sold to Mary Elizabeth Collier of Tennessee. Sam Roebuck bought it at the Collier auction. Sam sold the tumbler to Cecil Whitley. All Floyd & Cecil wanted to buy from Roebuck was the tumbler. In order to get the tumbler they had to also pur-

chase the Green "Peoples" vase (only one known) and Peach Opal "Farmyard" bowl (only one known).

- 1- Tumbler Owned by Randy & Jackie Poucher. They bought it from an ad in the Antique Trader. Mrs Rawls of Orange, Texas was the owner.
- 1 Tumbler Bob Smith purchased it at the auction of the Bob Gallo estate, Burns auction, in 1999.
- 1 Tumbler Jim & Yolinda Lewis purchased it at the Joe Corruthers auction, by Mickey Reichel.
- 1 Tumbler Sold at a Woody auction in 1999 to a Missouri collector. This tumbler is damaged. (This was not one of the two original tumblers Woody purchased)
- 1 Tumbler Bob & Geneva Leonard purchased their tumbler from Bob Gallo. This was the first tumbler that Bob Gallo owned. He purchased it from an Antique dealer in Indiana.

If anyone has any additional information to add to that presented here, please send it so we can update the Frolicking Bears history and inventory.

THE MARIGOLD FROLICKING TUMBLER FACT OR FICTION?

This article appeared in the November 15, 1977 "Carnival News & Views" by O. Joe Olson.

This is the story about the only known marigold Bears tumbler that had a life-span like a falling star. It is a far-out tale. It is stranger than fiction.

The first and only known marigold Frolicking Bears tumbler was discovered by Mr. and Mrs. Joe C. Corrothers of Maumee, Ohio, in a home in north-central Indiana in mid-September, 1977. Joe Corrothers, a director of the International Carnival Glass Association, described the circumstances and the tumbler.

He said the owner had a few pieces of carnival for sale, none priced over \$20.00. Obviously he did not recognize the pattern of the rare tumbler which he sold for "a few dollars."

The tumbler might have been easy to overlook for an average collector since none was known in marigold. All three Bears water pitchers are in dark green base glass, mostly with poor iridescence. The only known Bears tumbler is also in dark green glass.

Possessed Great Iridescence

Corrothers said the marigold Bears tumbler had "fantastic" iridescence on the body of the specimen but the raised figures of the bears were nearly bald as though the iridescence either had worn off or the color had never taken properly.

Mr. & Mrs. Corrothers, who have one of the outstanding collections in the nation, do not specialize in tumblers. For the last year or so they have been assisting Mr. & Mrs. Floyd M. Whitley of Houston, Texas, find better tumblers for their specialized collection. The Whitleys began collecting seriously after attending the Gaida auction in February 1977. Mr. Whitley is in the oil and gas business.

Joe Corrothers telephoned Whitley about the rarity. Whitley expressed an interest in owning it and Corrothers promised to send it along for inspection. Corrothers was aware the only known green Bears tumbler had sold for \$3,500.00 at the Collier auction in February 1976 at St. Louis, so Corrothers put a ball park figure of \$5,000.00 on the marigold tumbler. The tumbler, incidentally, had a small chip on the base, Corrothers said.

A week or so earlier, Mrs. Whitley had purchased two corn vases and another small carnival piece from Mrs. Faye Corrothers. Her husband, Joe, packed these for shipment. He used a double corrugated box, nested the pieces in foam rubber and placed each piece in a coffee can. He placed the three cans on a layer of ball-crumpled paper at the bottom and filled in with more crumpled paper. There was plenty of room, so he placed the marigold Bears tumbler in foam rubber in a fourth coffee can on top of the bottom layer. He said he thought no one could miss seeing it there.

The package was sealed and addressed on top. It was registered and value declared at \$3,300.00.

Corrothers was not aware that Whitley had not told his wife about the marigold Bears tumbler. Whitley later told Corrothers that he thought he would receive the tumbler in a separate box addressed to him and that he planned to hold it back for a Christmas surprise.

Mrs. Whitley signed for the package at their Houston home. Her husband was at the office. She thought the package might open more readily from the bottom, so she flipped it over and opened it that way. Beneath the crumpled paper she found the three coffeed cans containing the three items she was anticipating. Since a trash pickup was near, she removed the cans, replaced the packing paper in the box and put the box outside near the garage.

Three to four days later, when the Corrothers had not heard from the Whitleys, Joe Corrothers telephoned. The Whitleys were astounded to learn that the rare tumbler also had been in the box which had gone to the city dump the same day it arrived.

Woody Learned by Accident

Auctioneer John Woody accidentally learned about the discovery of the marigold Bears tumbler when he telephoned Corrothers about other business in mid-September. A week later, when Woody called again, the tumbler had been lost.

The Corrothers and Whitleys were shaken by the incident. Joe and Faye Corrothers, apparently, were the only collectors who saw and handled the rare piece outside of the original owner in Indiana. They did not take a picture of it before sending it off to Houston.

While the Corrothers had only a few dollars invested in the tumbler, it was valued by them at upwards of \$5,000.00. The post office could not be held liable for the loss since the registered package was delivered presumably in good shape and properly signed for. Obviously there was a breakdown in communication and a misunderstanding.

Whitley, who confirmed his version of the loss in telephone talks with the editor and Charles Mochel of Kansas City, Kansas, said that he and Corrothers were negotiating the loss. However, one thing was certain. Whatever the monetary consideration agreed upon, both Whitley and Corrothers would much prefer to have the tumbler than the cash.

Millersburg Compotes

Motif Series

Heart of America Carnival Glass Association

September 2000

Many collectors prefer glass made by Millersburg, often considered the "crown jewels" of carnival. Compotes are among the prized shapes. They range in size from some of the smallest to some of the largest pieces in carnival glass; from the Leaf & Little Flowers and Olympic compotes to the giant Peacock and Urn. The Big Thistle punch bowl could also be considered a compote; it is a one-piece affair and no cups have ever been found.

The book Millersburg Glass by Marie McGee identifies twenty different compote patterns. Compotes were made in the common Millersburg colors of amethyst, green and marigold, plus an occasional blue and vaseline.

Some information for this article has been provided by Charles Mochel and Tom Mordini.





Acorn (top). The most common color here is vaseline, with perhaps eight known. There are also examples in amethyst, green, and marigold.

Fleur de Lis. This one is green and the only example known in any color.



Peacock and Urn. One of the most dramatic pieces known in carnival, this compote is always ruffled and found mostly in amethyst and green-marigold is quite rare.



Hanging Cherries is 7" tall and found with three different top shapes: square, round, and oblong. The round comes in amethyst, green, and marigold with one blue known. Two known with the square top. The oblong has been shown in a book on carnival.




Tulip stands about 9" tall and has no pattern other than the exterior flutes. Known in amethyst and marigold, it is the same shape as the Flowering Vine.



Ohio Star. This pattern is usually associated with the more often seen vase. About six of these compotes are known—only in marigold.









Rosalind variant (above). A very rare compote, 6" tall, and known in amethyst and green.

Rosalind. This one is 9" tall. Two each are known in amethyst and blue, three in green, and one in marigold.





Flowering Vine is 9 inches tall. One each is known in amethyst, green, and marigold.



Deep Grape (right) is 7 inches tall and known in three different top shapes: Square and round which are found in amethyst, green, and marigold and a rosebowl shape known only in green. In addition, there is one ruffled example in amethyst.

Hobstar and Feather whimsey compote in amethyst is probably close to the shape of the piece of glass as it came out of the mold. It is seen most often in a rosebowl shape and infrequently in a spittoon shape or a pulled up vase.





Hobstar and Feather.
This compote, 5" tall, was made only in marigold. The pattern was made in more shapes than any other Millersburg pattern.



Dolphin. Obviously this compote was named for the three dolphins that support the bowl, not the pattern on the interior—which is Rosalind. Colors known are amethyst, blue, and marigold, with only two known in blue.



Boutonniere. One of the more common Millersburg compotes, the Boutonniere is found in the typical colors of amethyst, marigold and green.

Poppy (at right) is also found in the standard Millersburg colors, though marigold is difficult to find, and the compote is occasionally seen in a flattened salver shape.





Wildflower. Two shapes are known in this 6" tall compote; straight and flared sides. The flared are found in amethyst, green, marigold, and a single vaseline example.


