Fenton Fern

A second known piece of Fenton Fern – a ruffled bowl with eight-point crimp – now resides in the Fenton Museum. It's the only one known in Clambroth/White Carnival (the pattern portion in white with the one-inch wide non-pattern edge in Clambroth).

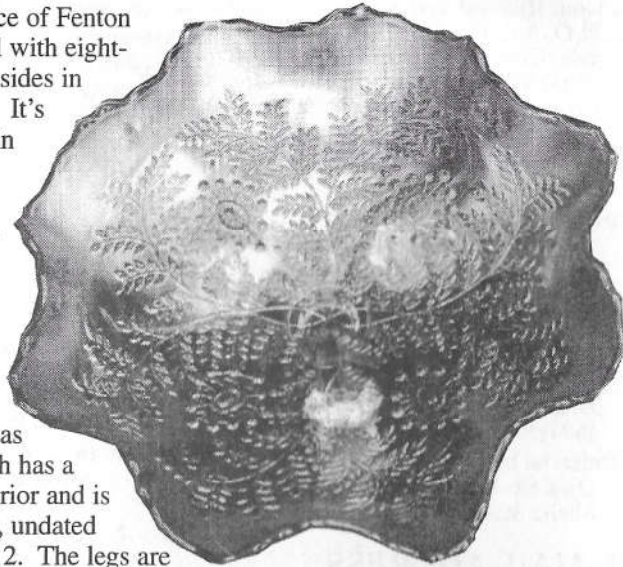
It appears to have been made from a similar styled mould as Fenton's #1746 which has a Grape and Cable interior and is illustrated in an early, undated Fenton catalog c. 1912. The legs are shorter and thicker than the #1746. It matches the description on page 55 of David Doty's Field Guide except the shape is ruffled with an eight-point crimp and the color is different.

How did we acquire it? Beth Seufer, granddaughter of Howard Seufer, was working for us this summer to help organize our historical records. I've asked Beth to tell you the story.

"Bill and Joan Rhodes of Georgia were waiting to enter the Collector's Room during the FAGCA convention on last Wednesday, August 2, and they wanted to know if I could answer a question for them. They had stopped at an antique mall to look for Fenton. The woman working there had a piece of Fenton she didn't know the value for, so they told her they would check at Fenton and contact her after convention. They asked me if I knew anything about Fenton Fern, and from that point on the process flew.

"They gave me the antique store's business card. I called the lady, and she told me the piece was for sale but she wanted to know the current value. After talking with Frank, I called her back and tried to explain that the piece did not have a published value. She did tell me that her highest offer was \$500 (way above my range), and she asked if I would like her to send a picture to me.

"In the message that came with the picture, she said that one of the



dealers would be in the area next week. If Frank was interested and could make a good offer, she would have her bring the piece to the Museum. I wrote her back, told her that if it was indeed Fenton Fern in good condition, Frank would make her an offer. She e-mailed me again yesterday, telling me that the piece was on its way and would be here either Thursday or Friday."

When the piece arrived, I talked to the owner on the phone, made an acceptable offer, and the purchase was made. This Fenton Fern piece is now displayed in the rarities section of the Carnival Glass pieces in the Museum.

Why aren't there more pieces of Fenton Fern?

1. The mould or plunger was damaged early in its life.
2. It was made for a special customer who failed to market it properly.
3. It was made during the Depression when nothing sold.
4. It was sampled but didn't sell.
5. Production problems with the Carnival spray.

Any combination of the above.

Amethyst "**Inverted Feather**" - **water pitcher**

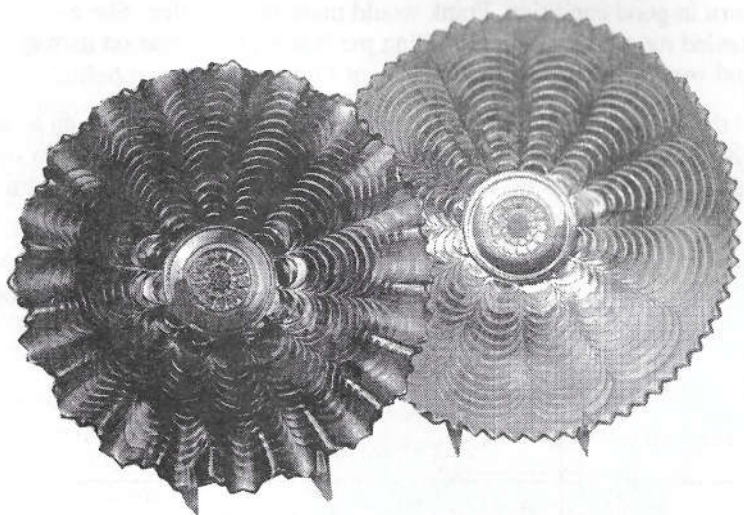
Marigold (second one to come out of Quebec, third one known) "**Inverted Feather**" - **water pitcher**

The HOACGA club has requested input on Northwood's Nippon and Fenton's Plaid patterns for a research project. With the idea of selecting a different carnival glass pattern each month. So far the response seems to be rather sparse. There are still many things to learning the carnival glass-collecting field. Every day new discoveries are presenting themselves and this research project could be just the avenue to uncover another previously unpublicized shape or color variation. But we need your input to make this work.

We all enjoy swapping stories about out glass that we now own or have seen in someone's collection. So let's share with each other and pool our knowledge to our mutual advantage. There are so many good write-ups on the Nippon and Plaid patterns in the different books that we will not repeat any of those details here. But wouldn't it be nice to have a better picture of the availability of certain back patterns versus color and shape combinations. You certainly can't rely on personal opinions published in for sale ads or auction flyers. The word rare is tossed about without any real meaning. Yes, we now have many good books that list the colors and shape of most patterns, but we still find colors and shapes frequently that are not listed in these references.

There is no end to the amount of data that can be gathered when writing about this glass that we love. But the day that every bit of information is know is still a long way off. And we really don't want to know everything, because the thrill of discovery is what drives all collectors. But many times, don't you wish you knew just how available a certain piece was so you can come to a decision as to what it's worth before you buy it? A research project like this is where that knowledge is gathered. Will you help us out with your inputs?

On the Auction Trail with Chuck

And Then There Was The Bowl

September 9, 2000: The ad said among other things “Carnival glass collection over 250 pieces including pitchers and berry sets, fluted bowls, vases, baskets, cream & Sugars, plates, etc.” It was an estate sale and a big one according to the ad. It was near Dover, Indiana, which is close enough to Cincinnati to mean “Ohio” time which meant an early start – it was 95 miles and an hour time change.

When I arrived I was greeted at the door by a couple of heavy hitters, and another collector and another, but not the usual group I expect to see at a quality auction. The first words I hear were “go look at the bowl on the counter.” Why? From the looks of the wall to wall furniture and stuff that at a glance looked old, I didn’t expect much. The four or five tables of carnival were anything but impressive. The few water sets seemed to be displayed as sets, but everything else was scattered about and much in small boxes that indicated it would be sold “box lot” or at best one-choice. Obviously the setup person knew little about carnival glass.

On one of the tables with the glass was a plastic bag with convention badges and ribbons. The top ones were those of Clarence and Gertrude Hueseman of Aurora, Indiana, and were for the 1966 ACGA convention at Akron, Ohio. I believe this was one of the first ACGA conventions. This gave me the picture – this was a real for sure old time collection from an era when damage was accepted and the colors collected were not our current favorites.

And then there was the bowl! I heard one of our collectors rescued it from the “pile” the afternoon before and suggested they clean it. Yes, the glass wasn’t clean – just what one expects from an estate sale, right? The bowl was an ice green opal Rose Show and in perfect but somewhat dirty condition. My first impression was it was an add-in as it didn’t fit in with the rest of the merchandise, but remember pastels were not in vogue in the 60s so it could have been Gertrude’s pride and joy and cost her very little. The auctioneer opened the sale by saying every single piece in the building came from the same house.

To the auctioneer’s credit he didn’t keep us in suspense for too long. He got to it in an hour or so and it went to a good home in Cincinnati at a nice round \$5100. To me the interesting part was the back-up bidder was a young couple comparatively new to carnival collecting. The rest of the old time collectors sat on their hands.

Too bad the auctioneer didn’t do a better job of advertising the contents of the sale. He probably would have had more carnival collectors in attendance, but I doubt if the prices would have been much different

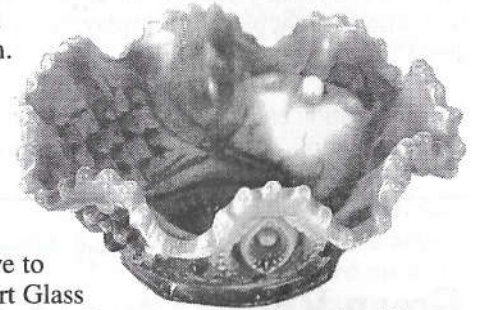

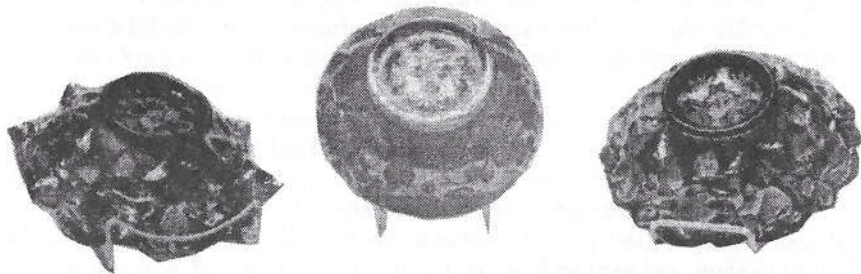
On Friday night we attended the banquet. The food was good, and we had a

Inverted Strawberry Green Ruffled Bowl & Marigold Rosebowl

The colored insert in the July bulletin was about the Cambridge "Inverted Strawberry" pattern. The article said "Ruffled bowls would be an unusual find", and it did not mention a Rosebowl. I have a ruffled bowl, and a Rosebowl, so I decided to write this article to add information to the "Inverted Strawberry" pattern. The photograph shows the green ruffled and round bowl, along with the marigold Rosebowl.

GREEN RUFFLED BOWL: The picture shows both a round and ruffled bowl. Both are collar base and have a diameter of 3 3/4 inches and they come from the same mold. The outside of the bowl has four strawberries, and four branches of three leaves each. The base has four flowers in its center. The inside is plain and signed near cut. They are both green and they have the nice typical Cambridge iridescence.

The round bowl has a 9 inch diameter at the opening and it is flared. The edge is scalloped, one large followed by a small and repeated four times. It is a typical edge that we see often on Cambridge carnival.

The ruffled one is 10 inches across the opening and has eight ruffles. The ruffles were made by pulling down the small scallops.

MARIGOLD ROSEBOWL: The base measures 4 1/2 inches and the opening 8 inches. Regarding the description, it is the same arrangement as the green ruffled bowl. It is signed near cur. It is a rich marigold and the iridescence is gorgeous.

It is interesting the way I got it. In 1996 we were celebrating the 10th anniversary of our club in Quebec with a show and sale. One of the exposition tables was for Cambridge. One of our members had the Marigold Rosebowl and put it on the table. Nobody in the club knew what kind of bowl it was. Of course we knew it was a Cambridge Inverted Strawberry but that is all. Knowing that I liked Cambridge the owner offers my wife an exchange. My birthday was coming soon, so she accepted the exchange.

I had looked in all of my books, except the good one. I did not believe it was a Rosebowl. Dave Doty's book was not yet published. I could not find anything. So I wrote to John Britt and sent him a picture. He answered me that it was a Rosebowl and I would be able to find it in the Rosebowl section of the HOACGA Notebook. I was so happy to have the chance to discover the first Marigold Inverted Strawberry Rosebowl. I sent a picture to Lincoln Land and they published it in May 1997. In July my wife and I attended the ACGA convention in Batavia, NY where we showed the Rosebowl. Both Tom Mordini and Tom Burns said they had never seen one. Imagine the pleasure I had, having a one of a kind piece.

Since that time another member of our club found one in Marigold and one in Amethyst. Two other members each own one in Amethyst. This is a total of two Marigold and three Amethyst all found in Quebec. I have also seen rare Cambridge in Ontario. This makes me believe that Cambridge sold and important part of his Carnival Glass production in Canada.

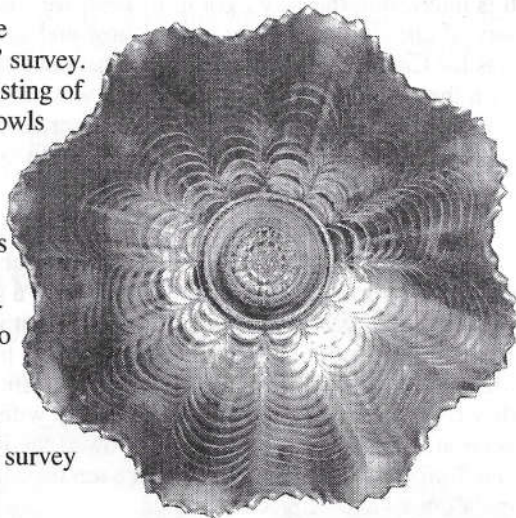

Northwood – Nippon Pattern Research Results

The chart lists the results of the “Northwood’s Nippon Pattern” survey. It is by no means a complete listing of all of the Nippon Plates and Bowls that are in the various collections. The sample is a good representation of the numbers of pieces by color, their various back patterns, and the edge shapes. Thanks to the seventy-one members who responded to the survey request. These results should be helpful in deciding the availability of the various “Nippon” pieces. The survey results are:



- 71 members reported
- 140 total pieces reported
- 17 **Plates** – all plates have the basketweave back
- 123 **Bowls** –
 - 80 with PCE**
 - 4 plain back
 - 52 ribbed back
 - 24 basketweave back
 - 43 ruffled**
 - 1 plain back
 - 15 ribbed back
 - 27 basketweave back

It is obvious, from this survey, that the most plentiful color is Ice Blue. Usually we think of the pastel colors as being the more scarce pieces. Also, the larger percentage of the bowls have the PCE with Ribbed back. Usually the PCE pieces are more scarce than the ruffled ones. All of the plates reported have the Basketweave back.

Thanks to all of the members that responded to the Survey request. We encourage all member to send in their responses to the future surveys.

Fashion Breakfast Set

This is a small set compared to pieces offered in the majority of table sets. This creamer and open sugar stand a mere 3 1/2" tall. These sets are seldom seen in any color, with marigold examples being more prevalent.

Purple sets are extremely rare, and a few years ago, smoke colored sets were "all the rage", with two or three sets changing owners in one given year for some hefty prices . . . The trick is finding the two pieces together at any given time . . . We have heard stories of an owner of either the creamer or sugar, searching for the matching piece over many years, sometimes not able to make a "match".

Smoke is a scarce color, but can be located with a little patience . . . Helios pieces are seldom seen . . . Emerald green sets are mentioned in the Carl O. Burns *Imperial Carnival Glass Book* written in 1996. (There is also an interesting personal story told by Carl about a Fashion Creamer in Smoke which belonged to his Mother. It is written on page 6 of the Book.)

In checking the price results of sales for 1999, only one Smoke set is listed as having sold for \$260 . . . We recall that a Smoke set sold privately about five years ago for \$325 . . . It was a nicely matched pair in dark Smoke, with pink and green hi-lites.

If you become weary of the plate-bowl search, you might want to look for an alternative shape such as this. The Fashion pattern is a desirable one to own.

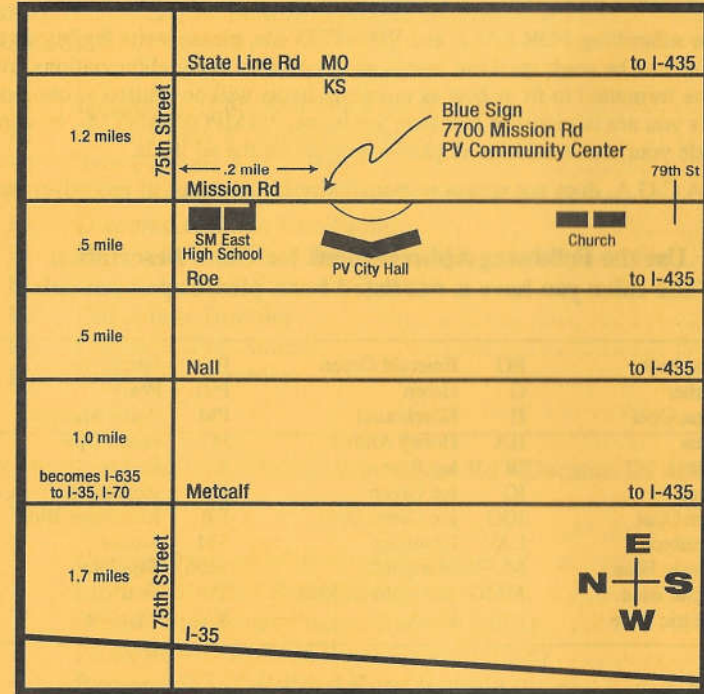
