You Can Bank On It!

There are so many fun ways that carnival glass can be collected. We can't all collect Peacocks or Poppy Show, so penny banks may appeal to you. They can be found in various sizes and shapes at reasonable prices. They are seen in most antique mall trips. Marigold is the usual "old carnival" color found. Be aware that the antique malls are being flooded with the small imported piggy banks in various colors. These banks are a poor quality glass and have a larger coin slot. They are easy to spot and should not be a big problem. There doesn't seem to be a lot of documentation on who made the old carnival banks. We feel that Anchor Hocking Glass made many of them. The rabbit and pig banks show here can be found in two sizes. These shown are the small size.

The small pig can also be found with an advertisement for the Marathon Oil Company on it. It reads "Save with Marathon" on one side and "The Ohio Oil Co." on the other side. Like everything else, these Marathon banks have become increasingly scarce in the last couple of years.

The bank almost as common as the small pig and for about the same price is the "Liberty Bell". Do we have one? Not yet, we must be waiting for the price to go up. This bank yet again can be found in a large size. Other banks that can be found range from World Globes to Hoot Owls. The coin bank shown in the picture has 13 stars representing the 13 original states and a heraldic eagle clutching the arrows and olive branch symbolizing strength in war or peace. The reverse is blank.

There is some sage advice for those of us that are smitten with the collecting addiction. Sometimes it is wiser to collect items that are not the hottest thing going, not that we have anything against Peacocks, but buy what's currently out of favor. It may be the next hottest thing. So if you are looking for an enjoyable but inexpensive approach to carnival glass collecting, think penny banks or lamp shades or candle sticks or

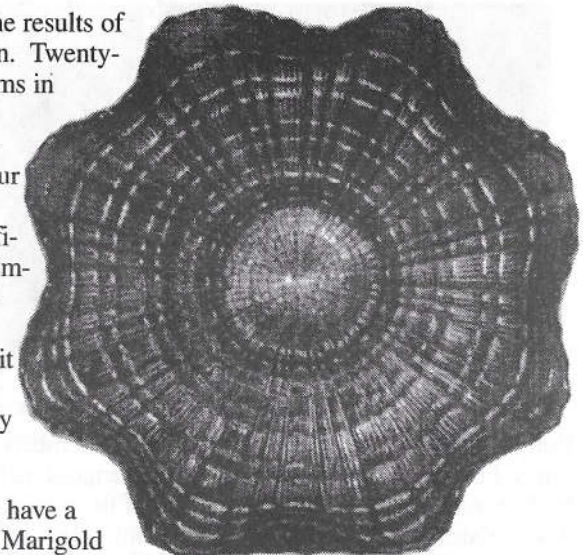

**Fenton – Plaid Pattern
Research Results**

The chart below shows the results of the Fenton “Plaid” pattern. Twenty-six members reported items in their collection, and 24 replied as not having any pieces in this pattern. Your replies to the survey are appreciated and are beneficial information to all members. It is by no means a complete listing of all pieces in collections, but it does give us information to compare the availability of colors and shapes.



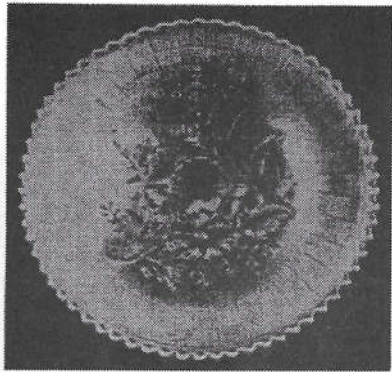
All of the reported pieces have a plain back. the Blue and Marigold pieces seem to be the predominant color, which is what you would expect as being made by Fenton. Both the Emerald Green and Celeste bowls were reported as having been seen, the owner is unknown. No pastel colors have been reported. This pattern can be confused with the Northwood “Nippon” and the Fenton “Peacock Tail” patterns.

If you have pieces that your did not report, please do so, I will add the information to this list.

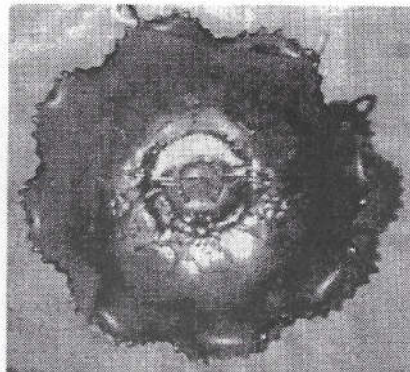

Rudy Kovacs and Fred Warren, HOACGA members living in Pembroke Pines, FL sent the photo showing their marigold ruffled bowl/basketweave back; commenting that it is a variation of the usual design found on these bowls/plates, most of which have continuing leaf and floral design nearly to the sawtooth edge.

They further state: it is their belief that the interior mold used for the 6" Jockey Club plate is the same one used for this variant bowl . . . It is very difficult for us to detect details accurately enough when comparing their photo to our Jockey Club plate . . . Perhaps someone having these same two examples before them, could draw a final conclusion to the case in point?

We're hoping that some member is fortunate enough to have these two "Good Lucks" in their collection, and will submit a follow-up article, so that we can all benefit.

In other words, suppose the plunger design used in the bowl was abandoned, in favor of the more elaborate, customarily found Good Luck pattern on bowls/plates. With the simple addition of Jockey Club lettering to the former bowl design, we might all agree that it better fits and has much better "balance" when applied to the 6" plate shape, rather than the 9" mold?

October 12-15, 2000: It was Air Capital Convention time in Wichita, Kansas, and the convention was a good one. It opened with the get acquainted Early Bird dinner Thursday evening and closed with the Farewell breakfast on Sunday. In between we had many activities I treasure except one — the power failure. The power failed around 4pm Saturday in the room area and didn't come back on until 9:30 in the evening. The business end of the hotel wasn't affected, so the banquet went on as scheduled. Many people were watching the football games when it happened and the hot topic was Oklahoma's beating second ranked Kansas State.

The local Wichita area members looked after every detail, and even the hotel people seemed to welcome us. Good friendly carnival glass people, nice displays, glass in the rooms and the quality of the Mickey Reichel auction made this a memorable convention. But the highlights were the two programs. On Friday afternoon we got a glimpse of a few pieces of Nola Schmoker's collection and heard the stories that went with them. After the banquet we were treated to the stories and glass from the Will and Judy Schutz collection. Both sessions were well worth attending.

I am sure you will read about the auction elsewhere, but I want to mention four pieces that impressed me. All four were round collar base Dragon and Strawberry bowls. The strike was sharp — they looked like they were the first ones out of a new mold. The amethyst one sold for \$4400, the green one (my favorite) \$2400, the blue at \$500, and the marigold one at \$1900 and they all went to the same new home. As for the rest of the auction I thought the Vaseline pieces were soft as were many of the small plates.

And then there was the famous hospitality room. Everything from meatballs, barbecued cocktail wieners, sandwiches, fresh fruit, cookies and candies of every description and everything in between. This falls right in with the friendly atmosphere of the convention and it is the "Meeting Place." Food, drinks, a place to sit and visit — I, and a lot of others, did it all. This convention is a "don't miss" event as far as I am concerned.

The auction in Peoria, Illinois had some rare and unusual carnival glass items. In addition to write-in bids the Ayers Auction Service uses live telephone bidding. Many of the pieces in this auction did have telephone bids, especially many of the Non-U.S. vases. The telephone bidding was well organized and did not slow the auction.

Item # 31 - "Ice G --N Good Luck 9" Rib Back Plate. WOW! We all know how rare this is. Awesome pastels, teenie pinhead. A top piece in this auction." - Sold for \$20,000.00. 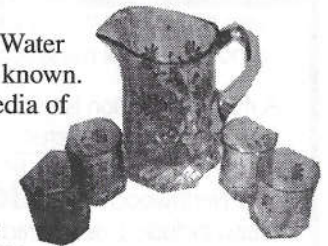

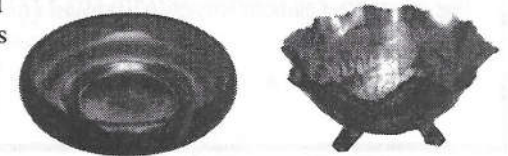
"Our Finds"

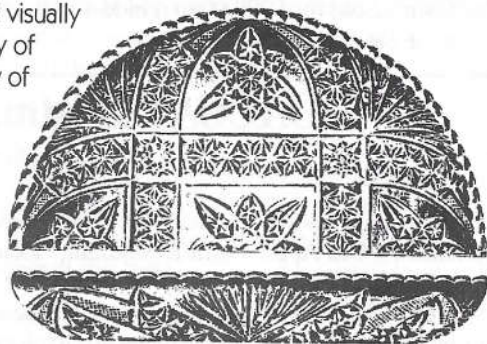

I thought after writing to Fenton about my plate I had one of a kind, but low and behold another plate turned up. This letter refers to the August 2000 Bulletin page 11 Ayers Auction Report for July 22, 2000, Item #53 "Fenton-Super Ice Green Leaf Chain 7 1/2" Plate".

I purchased a 9" Leaf Chain Plate with a Bearded Berry back in Ice Green at a house auction about 10 years ago. I let some beautiful pieces go by waiting for this plate. As collectors we all know the happiness one experiences when we purchase a rare or unusual piece of carnival. At that time I paid \$50.00 for it because it has a heat check or straw mark in it. In hind-sight I wish I had bought more pieces. Enclosed you will find a letter I wrote to Fenton Art Glass Co. in 1996 about my plate.

I also own a Northwood White Poinsettia and Lattice Bowl. It is white with a clear shiny sheen and has a 1" light Blue Opalescent edge that has the light iridescent colors. In describing the white part of the bowl refer to David Doty's (A Field Guide to Carnival Glass) refer to page 167 under carnival colors. "There is also a clear carnival which will have a shiny or radium quality without the frostiness usually associated with most white carnival." This partially describes my bowl. The 1" light blue opalescent edge has pastel iridescence. Where it is shiny or radium it doesn't seem to have iridescence. Are there many white bowls like this?

I enjoy my informative booklet and look forward to it every month.

LETTER FROM FENTON ART GLASS COMPANY

Dear Shirley,

We do not have records of the Leaf Chain plate being produced in ice green carnival. Perhaps you could compare it to a piece of aqua carnival. The current value would probably be close on both colors.

Fenton ice green carnival glass would be considered rare.

A carnival glass auction price would be the most accurate in determining the current value of your plate. The quality of the iridescence and whether the item is in mint condition impact the value. The straw marks should not affect the value of this glass.

- The Convention offers members an opportunity to meet new collectors, renew old friendships and enjoy discussing carnival glass with other knowledgeable collectors.
- A banquet is held with a Carnival Collector as our Speaker.
- A Hospitality time is provided by the club. This is a time of relaxation and visiting with other members.

It takes the support of all collectors and members to promote the hobby in order that its growth and expansion can continue.

In order to obtain our objective, the members must financially support the organization. The Heart of America Carnival Glass Association receives its financial support through the Annual Membership dues and the sale of the following.

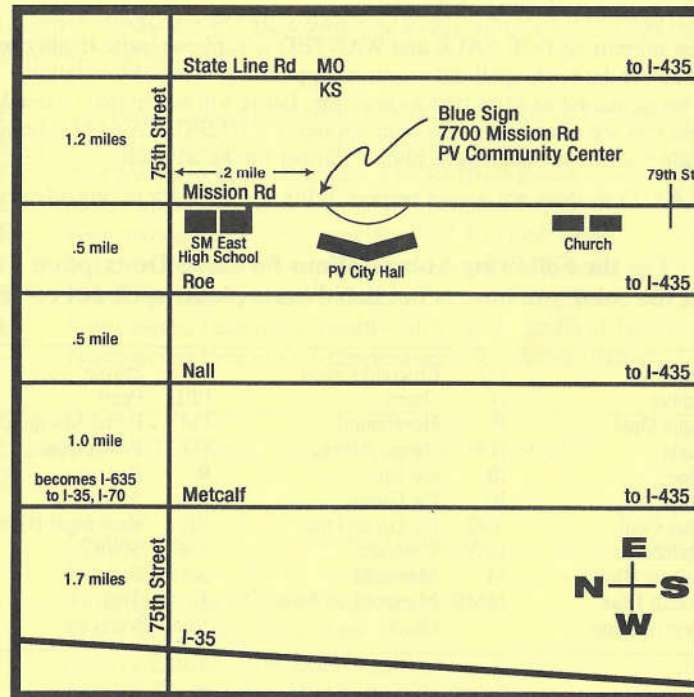
